Baltimore Orioles (63-50) at Oakland Athletics (51-63)

RHP Chris Tillman (14-4, 3.50) vs. RHP Andrew Triggs (0-0, 5.35)



BEASTS OF THE EAST: The Orioles own a record of 63-50 (.558) and are in second place of the American League East division behind the Toronto Blue Jays (65-50, .565)...According to STATS, LLC., the Orioles have spent 109 days (of 130 days) in first place (or tied) of the AL East this season...The Orioles lead AL East clubs with a 26-19 (.578) record in games within the division.

TWO SCHOOPS: According to STATS, LLC., **2B Jonathan Schoop** owns the second-longest active games started streak in the majors with 113 starts...He trails Alcides Escobar (KC) with 122 starts...According to STATS, LLC., Schoop is the only player in the majors to play every inning and each out of his team's games this season.

QUALITY IS JOB ONE: Orioles starting pitchers have tossed Quality Starts in each game of this current road trip, dating to August 5...According to STATS, LLC., the streak of six consecutive Quality Starts is the longest for the Orioles since a stretch of seven straight, April 25-May 5, 2015...The Orioles' (since 1954) longest streak of consecutive Quality Starts is 20 straight, which was done August 3-22, 1961.

ZACH ATTACK: LHP **Zach Britton** recorded his 34th consecutive save to begin the season on Friday, going 34-for-34...According to STATS, LLC., Britton has the longest save streak in as many chances to start a season by a left-handed pitcher in Major League history and he ranks seventh all-time...Britton leads the AL and is tied for second in the majors in saves and his 0.57 ERA (3 ER/47.0 IP) leads Major League relievers...He ranks third on the O's all-time saves list with 107 and is one of two left-handers in O's history with at least 100 career saves (also Tippy Martinez)...Britton is the active Major League leader with 36 consecutive saves, dating to October 1, 2015.

EASY AS ONE, TWO, THREE: **3B Manny Machado** went 3-for-6 on Sunday with three home runs and seven RBI in the 10-2 win at Chicago...His three home runs came in each of the first three innings of the game...According to STATS, LLC., Machado is one of nine players in Major League history to homer in three consecutive innings in a game and the first since Kevin Mench did so for the Texas Rangers on June 30, 2005 vs. Los Angeles (AL)...He is also one of two players in Major League history to hit a home run in each of the first three innings of a game joining Carl Reynolds, who did so for the Chicago White Sox on July 2, 1930 at New York (AL).

ROAD WARRIORS: The Orioles are currently on a 10-day, 10-game road trip with stops at Chicago (2-1), Oakland (0-3), and San Francisco (three games)...Beginning on Friday, August 5, the Orioles began a stretch in which they will play 15 of 23 games on the road...Following this current road trip, the Orioles will return home for games against Boston (two games), Houston (four games), and Washington (two games) before hitting the road for games at Washington (two games) and New York (three games).

VS. OAKLAND: The Orioles and Athletics play the final game of seven matchups between the two clubs this season...The A's lead the season series, 4-2...The Orioles won the season series in 2015, 6-1, including a four-game series sweep at Oriole Park...The Athletics visited Baltimore, May 7-8...The all-time series is tied, 260-260, with the Orioles trailing 128-129 at home and leading 132-131 at Oakland.

PITCH PERFECT: Orioles relievers lead the American League and rank second in the majors with a 3.05 ERA (129 ER/380.1 IP)...The Orioles bullpen ranks second in the majors with 26 wins while their record of 26-9 (.743) leads the majors...The Orioles' 40 saves are tied to rank second in the majors.

HOMER'S ODYSSEY: The Orioles lead the majors with 170 home runs...**OF Mark Trumbo** is tied for the Major League lead with 31 homers...**3B Manny Machado** ranks eighth in the American League with 26 home runs.

HOMER HAPPY: Since the beginning of the 2012 season, four current Orioles rank among Major League leaders in home runs...**1B Chris Davis** (182) is tied for the Major League lead, while **OF Adam Jones** (143) ranks ninth, **OF Mark Trumbo** (133) is tied for 12th and **INF/DH Pedro Álvarez** ranks 16th with 129.

HOME COOKIN': The Orioles are tied to lead the majors with 39 wins at home this season...At 39-17 (.696), the Orioles lead the American League and are tied with the Chicago Cubs for the best home record in the majors...The Orioles have hit 89 home runs at home this season to lead the majors.

BETTER LATE THAN NEVER: The Orioles have scored 171 runs this season in the seventh inning or later to rank third in the American League and sixth in the majors...The Orioles' 52 home runs in the seventh inning or later lead the AL and rank second in the majors.

FOUR-PLUS SEASONS: Since the beginning of the 2012 season, the Orioles lead all American League clubs and rank fourth in Major League Baseball with 418 wins, finishing with a .500 or better record in each of the last four seasons...In that span, Orioles hitters lead the majors with 1,024 home runs, 70 more than the Toronto Blue Jays (2nd, 954)...The Orioles have also committed the fewest number of errors (379) since 2012.

THIS DATE IN ORIOLES HISTORY: On this date in 1991, **LHP Wilson Alvarez** of the Chicago White Sox tossed the last no-hitter at Memorial Stadium by defeating the Orioles, 7-0...Alvarez fanned seven and walked five...It marked last of six no-hitters at Memorial Stadium and the second thrown against the Orioles.

DISABLED LIST: Three Orioles are currently on the disabled list...**LHP T.J. McFarland** (left knee inflammation, retroactive to June 29) was placed on the 15-day DL on June 30...**LHP Brian Duensing** (left elbow inflammation, retroactive to June 20) was transferred to the 60-day DL on July 3...**OF Joey Rickard** (right thumb ligament injury, retroactive to July 21) was placed on the 15-day disabled list on July 22.

THE SKIPPER: Three-time Manager of the Year (1994, 2004, 2014), **Buck Showalter** is currently in his seventh season as Orioles manager...He has managed the Yankees (1992-95), D-backs (1998-2000), Rangers (2003-06) and Orioles (August 2010-current)...Showalter's 1,403 career victories rank 28th all-time...His 521 wins as Orioles manager are second-most in club history (ahead of **Paul Richards**, 517) and he ranks behind **Earl Weaver** (1,480)...Showalter ranks fourth among active managers behind Bruce Bochy, Dusty Baker, and Mike Scioscia.

How Acquired: Along with OF Adam Jones, LHP George Sherrill, RHP Kam Mickolio and LHP Tony Butler from the Seattle Mariners in exchange for LHP Erik Bedard

QUICK HITS: He is 2.2 innings away from 1,000.0 career innings pitched... He will become the 14th Orioles pitcher (since 1954) to accomplish the feat... With his victory on June 19 against Toronto, he moved into sole possession of 13th place (currently has 70 career wins) on the Orioles all-time wins list (since 1954), surpassing **RHP Dick Hall**... On April 4, against the Twins (Opening Day), Tillman made his 150th career start, becoming the 14th Orioles pitcher to accomplish the feat (since 1954)... Leads all Orioles pitchers and ranks tied for 12th among AL pitchers with 14 Quality Starts this season... He ranks 14th among qualifying AL starting pitchers with a 3.50 ERA (56 ER/144.0 IP) this season.

WINNING WAYS: He owns the ninth-highest winning percentage (.778) among qualifying Major League pitchers this season (min. 15 decisions)... Tillman posted a career-high nine-game winning streak from April 27-June 19... He went 9-0 with a 2.78 ERA (22 ER/71.1 IP) over 11 outings (eight Quality Starts) in that span... The Birds went 10-1 in those games during his streak... Last season, during the 12-start stretch in which Tillman did not lose (June 5-August 17, 2015), he went 7-0 with a 3.47 ERA (27 ER/70.0 IP) and eight Quality Starts.

LAST START: He suffered the loss on August 6 at Chicago-AL (6.0 IP, 7 H, 3 ER, 2 BB, 4 K, 1 HR)... It was his 14th Quality Start of the season (matches his 2015 season total)... It was the 16th time this season in which he tossed at least 100 pitches in a start... He surrendered a solo home run to Tyler Saladino in the bottom of the third inning.

CAREER VS. OAKLAND: Tillman faced the Athletics once this season on May 8 at Oriole Park (W, 6.1 IP, 6 H, 3 ER, 4 BB, 7 K, 1 HB)... He has gone 3-0 with a 2.58 ERA (11 ER/38.1 IP) in six career starts (five Quality Starts) against Oakland... In three career starts at the Oakland Coliseum, he is 1-0 with a 2.65 ERA (5 ER/17.0 IP)... Last pitched at the Oakland Coliseum on July 18, 2014 (ND, 6.2 IP, 4 H, 2 ER, 1 BB, 6 K, 1 HR).

AGAINST THE AL WEST: He has gone 3-2 with a 4.42 ERA (18 ER/36.2 IP) in six outings (four Quality Starts) against AL West opponents this season... Last faced an AL West club on July 10 vs. the Angels... Tillman is 18-5 with a 3.29 ERA (73 ER/200.0 IP) in 33 career starts (22 Quality Starts) against AL West teams.

RARE BIRD: He improved to 12-2 this season after his win vs. Los Angeles-AL on July 10... According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Tillman became the first Orioles pitcher with a record at least 10 games above .500 at the All-Star break since 1971, when **LHP Mike Cuellar** had a 13-1 record at the break.

AT THE TOP: Tillman (14-4) is currently one of five pitchers in the majors with at least 14 wins this season (also: Toronto LHP J.A. Happ, 16-3; Nationals RHP Stephen Strasburg, 15-2; Red Sox RHP Rick Porcello, 15-3; and White Sox LHP Chris Sale, 14-5).

PERFECT 11: In 11 starts from April 27-June 19, he went 9-0 with a 2.78 ERA (22 ER/71.1 IP) and 71 strikeouts... According to the Elias Sports Bureau, only four other O's pitchers (since 1954) went 8-0 or better with at least 60 strikeouts over a span of 11 starts within a single season - **RHP Pat Dobson** (1971), **RHP Jim Palmer** (1972 and 1973), **RHP Mike Mussina** (1997), and **LHP Erik Bedard** (2007).

HOT START: He went 9-1 with a 2.87 ERA in his first 14 starts of the season... According to the Elias Sports Bureau, only three other Orioles pitchers over the last 25 years won nine or more of their first 14 starts of a season with an ERA that low: **RHP Mike Mussina** in 1994 (9-3, 2.73), **LHP Jimmy Key** in 1997 (11-1, 2.47) and Tillman in 2012 (9-2, 2.78).

QUALI-TILLY: He posted a career-high seven consecutive Quality Starts from April 21-May 24... In those seven outings, he went 5-0 with a 1.94 ERA (10 ER/46.1 IP) and 47 strikeouts... He held opponents to a .182 batting average and tossed at least 100 pitches in each outing in that span... His 1.94 ERA during that span ranked third among qualifying AL pitchers (min. 30.2 IP).

HOME COOKING: From September 12, 2015-July 10, 2016, he went 9-0 with a 3.39 ERA (33 ER/87.2 IP) in 15 outings (eight Quality Starts) at Oriole Park... The Birds went 13-2 in those 15 games.

AT ORIOLE PARK: He is 8-1 with a 3.74 ERA (31 ER/74.2 IP) in 13 home starts (seven Quality Starts) this season... The Birds are 12-1 in Tillman's 13 home outings this season... According to STATS, LLC., he became the first pitcher in the majors whose team started 10-0 or better in his home starts this season... He is 35-22 with a 3.90 ERA (224 ER/516.2 IP) in 88 career starts (50 Quality Starts) at Oriole Park... The Birds are 58-30 in those 88 games.

ON THE ROAD: He is 6-3 with a 3.25 ERA (25 ER/69.1 IP) in 11 road starts (seven Quality Starts) this season... He has allowed three or fewer earned runs in 48 of his last 66 road starts since July 4, 2012... In 85 career road starts, he has gone 35-24 with a 4.31 ERA (230 ER/480.2 IP) and 41 Quality Starts.
