OAKLAND ATHLETICS (51-64) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (60-53)

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their three-game winning streak snapped yesterday and are now 4-9 over the last 13 games...are 13-13 since the All-Star Break...are 51-64 (.443) overall, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...it matches the worst record by an A's team after 115 games over the last 19 years (2009, 2015)...are in fourth place in the AL West and trail first place Texas by 16½ games, which is ½ game short of the season high of 17 (twice, last: June 22)...have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 43 days in fourth, 16 days tied for fourth and 30 days in fifth.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have gone four consecutive games without issuing a walk (24.1 ip), which is tied for the second longest such streak in Oakland history...the longest is a five-game streak from Sept. 24-28, 2014 (Lester, Hammel, Kazmir, Samardzija, Gray)...have not walked a batter in six of the last seven games (2 bb in 38.1 ip, 0.47 per nine innings)...Sean Manaea will end an Oakland record streak of eight consecutive games with eight different starting pitchers tonight...it was the longest streak by an A's team since June 7-12, 1961, also an eight-game streak...the A's have used 12 different starting pitchers, which is tied with Los Angeles for the most in the American League and tied for fourth most in the majors...used 13 starters last year, which were their most since 2009 (14)...starters are 3-3 with a 2.29 ERA (9 er in 35.1 ip) and .227 (30-for-132) opponents batting average over the last six games after going 0-4 with a 13.11 ERA and .430 opponents batting average over the previous six contests...are 31-49 with a 5.09 ERA (351 er in 620.2 ip) for the season...are tied with Los Angeles for the fewest innings pitched in the AL and have the second highest ERA, the second most losses and the second fewest wins.

PITCHING: The A's allowed nine runs yesterday after allowing 10 runs over the previous five games...now have a 4.09 ERA (115 er in 253.1 ip) over the last 28 games...logged a 3.55 ERA over the first 27 games and had a 5.38 ERA over a 60-game stretch from May 3 to July 8...have a 4.63 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second most wild pitches (57), the third highest opponents batting average (.268) and slugging percentage (.431) and the fourth highest on-base percentage (.330)...have surrendered at least one home run in 15 of the last 17 games (28 home runs total).

OFFENSE: The A's scored six runs yesterday and lost after scoring six runs total in the previous three games, all wins...are now batting .191 (41-for-215) with 15 runs scored in seven games on the homestand (2.1 runs per game)...are hitting .237 (468-for-1972) at home for the season, which is third lowest in the American League...have a .260 (504-for-1939) average on the road, which is fourth best in the AL...for the season, rank last in the AL in on-base percentage (.303), second in fewest walks (293) and fewest strikeouts (777) and fourth in lowest slugging percentage (.399), fewest runs scored (461) and fewest doubles (184).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have made 18 errors in the last 42 games after committing 53 for the first 73 contests...have 71 errors for the season, which is fourth most in the American League...A's outfielders have 16 assists, which is tied for second fewest in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-4 on this 10-game homestand against Chicago-NL (0-3), Baltimore (3-1) and Seattle (three games)...it is the A's second consecutive 10-game homestand as they went 7-3 on the last homestand against Toronto (2-1), Houston (2-1) and Tampa Bay (3-1)...are 27-33 (.450) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...leave following the game Sunday for a six-game road trip to Texas (three games) and Chicago-AL (three games)...went 3-6 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1), Cleveland (0-3) and Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and are 24-31 (.436) on the road...started the year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 12-11 since then...have a 5.32 ERA (281 er in 475.1 ip) on the road compared to 4.02 (244 er in 546.0 ip) at home.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND MARGIN OF VICTORY: Each of the A's last three wins have been by one run and Oakland has now won 10 of their last 14 one-run games...are 19-17 (.528) in one-run games for the season...are tied for third in the American League in one-run wins and rank fourth in one-run games...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year, which was

the second worst record in the majors...each of the A's last 16 wins have been by three runs or fewer (10 one-run, four two-run, two three-run)...have not won a game by more than three runs since a 7-1 win over San Francisco on June 29...have won just 13 games by four or more runs, which is the fewest in the AL.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have made a total of 153 player moves in 131 days dating back to Opening Day, April 4 (42 recalls, 12 selections, 42 options, three designated for assignments, 19 placed on the 15-day disabled list, 10 transferred to the 60-day DL, 10 reinstated from the DL, one placed on the family medical leave list, one reinstated from the FMILL, four lost on waivers, one claimed on waivers and three trades involving eight players on the 40-man roster)...the A's have used 45 players, which marks the 10th straight season Oakland has employed at least 44 players...that includes 25 pitchers...used a franchise record 30 pitchers last year...10 of the 25 pitchers have been rookies, which is tied for the fourth most rookie pitchers in Oakland history...the Oakland record for most rookie pitchers is 12 (2009, 2012, 2015)...seven of those 10 have made their Major League debut this year...overall, the A's have used 13 rookies, 10 of which have made their ML debuts (Eibner with the Royals).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list an Oakland record tying 25 times (also 2008)...the 25 players have combined to miss 1167 games (46.7 games per stint) and the games missed will set an Oakland record...the current mark is 1397 in 2010...have a season-high 14 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Gray, Hahn, Lambo, Lowrie, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard), including 10 on the 60-day DL (all but Doolittle, Gray, Hahn and Lowrie)...prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4, at least nine every day since May 6 and at least six all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

THIS AND THAT: A's pinch hitters rank second in the American League in hits (19), RBI (13) and plate appearances (86) to Seattle (24 hits, 14 RBI, 112 plate appearances)...A's designated hitters have the second fewest RBI (44) and second lowest batting average (.223) in the AL...the A's have lost 12 of the last 16 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...the A's opponent has been in first place in their division 12 of their last 17 games (includes today)...are 5-7 in those 12 games.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's trail in the season series, 4-5...are 0-3 in Oakland and 4-2 in Seattle...have lost each of their last seven games in Oakland, which is the second longest home losing streak against the Mariners in Oakland history (8, July 6, 2007-April 17, 2008)...have won six of the last nine games in Seattle...13 of the A's last 21 losses to Seattle have been by one run and 21 of the last 30 have been by two runs or fewer...the A's lost the season series last year for the third consecutive season and fourth time in the last five years...are now 48-56 against the Mariners over the last six years...all-time, the A's are 331-263 against Seattle...that includes 179-117 in Oakland, 151-145 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 75-81 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Butler is hitting .441 (15-for-34) with two home runs, seven RBI and six multiple hit games over his last 10 games...**Coco Crisp** is batting a Major League leading .448 with runners in scoring position...started the season 0-for-9 with RISP but is 26-for-49 (.531) since then...**Marcus Semien** has a consecutive games played streak of 117, which is the third longest active streak in the American League...**Jake Smolinski** has not committed an error in 140 career games as an outfielder (including 88 with Oakland).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1996** Geronimo Berroa has his second three-homer game of the season in the A's 11-1 win over Minnesota...the two three-homer games tie a Major League record...Mark McGwire adds two home runs, giving him 40 for the season in just 294 at bats, the fewest at bats ever to 40 home runs...in **2001** Jason Giambi hits his first career "walk-off" home run for his 1000th career hit as the A's defeat the Yankees, 4-2, for their 11th consecutive win.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (3-7, 4.58 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 1-3 with a 3.12 ERA (17 er in 49.0 ip) in eight games, including seven starts, since he was reinstated from the disabled list June 29...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day DL June 14 with a left pronator strain...was selected from Triple-A Nashville April 29 and is making his Major League debut.

RUN SUPPORT: Is 0-2 despite a 2.58 ERA (11 er in 38.1 ip) over his last six games...has just eight runs of support over that span (1.88 RSA)...has received two runs of support or fewer in 12 of his 16 starts and seven runs or more in three of his starts.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Ranks second among American League rookies in strikeouts (83), innings pitched (98.1) and games started (16) and tied for 10th in wins (3).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-3 with a 3.36 ERA (24 er in 64.1 ip) and .245 (59-for-241) opponents batting average in 11 games at home compared to 0-4 with a 6.88 ERA (26 er in 34.0 ip) and .317 (45-for-142) opponents average in six starts on the road...is the second pitcher in Oakland history to start his career with a losing streak of four or more games on the road...the other is Mike Morgan, who lost each of his first six road starts from June 17, 1978-July 24, 1979...has surrendered nine home runs in 34.0 innings on the road (2.38 per nine innings), seven in 64.1 innings in Oakland (0.98 per nine innings)...has a .924 OPS on the road, .695 at home.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has held left-handed hitters to a .176 (13-for-74) batting average and four extra base hits (two doubles, two home runs)...right-handers are batting .294 (91-for-309) with 14 of his 16 home runs and 21 of his 25 walks...the batting average against lefties is second lowest in the American League among pitchers with 90 or more innings (Perez, TEX .175) as is his .512 OPS (Duffy, KC .462)...has an .843 OPS against righties.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-2 with a 2.98 ERA (15 er in 45.1 ip) in seven starts on four days rest, 2-5 with a 6.19 ERA (33 er in 48.0 ip) in nine starts on five days rest or more.

DON'T WALK: Has walked just nine batters in 49.0 innings (1.65 per nine innings) since he was reinstated from the DL June 29...has 43 strikeouts over that span for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.79...had 40 strikeouts and 16 walks in 49.1 innings before going on the DL (2.50 strikeout-to-walk ratio)...walked Yunel Escobar with two outs in the fifth inning on Aug. 2 at Los Angeles (AL) to snap a streak of four games, 30.2 innings and 126 batters faced without a walk...the streak of 30.2 innings without a walk was the longest single season streak in Oakland history, topping the previous mark of 29.0 by Lary Sorensen (July 8-31, 1984)...it was fifth longest overall in Oakland history.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 2.36 ERA (13 er in 49.2 ip) and .235 (43-for-183) opponents batting average over innings one through three and a 6.84 ERA (37 er in 48.2 ip) and .305 (61-for-200) opponents batting average from the fourth inning on.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .207 (17-for-82) with runners in scoring position, including .167 (6-for-36) with RISP and two outs...has a .231 (34-for-147) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .263 (36-for-137) the second time and .343 (34-for-99) after that...has allowed a .435 (20-for-46) batting average to the opponents number four hitter, which is the highest in the majors among pitchers with 90 or more innings...the nine hitter is batting .143 (5-for-35), which is fifth lowest in the American League...opponents are 30-for-64 (.469) with seven doubles, six home runs and 19 RBI when putting the first pitch in play...the batting average is tied for second highest in the AL.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Made his Major League debut on **April 29** and had a no decision in a 7-4 A's win over Houston...had just 42 minor league appearances, all starts, in three professional seasons...became the 45th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the first since Dan Straily on Aug. 3, 2012 against Toronto...issued a career-high four walks...left with an 8-4 lead in his second start on **May 4** against Seattle but the bullpen allowed two runs in the sixth inning and three more in the seventh for the blown save (Axford)...yielded a career-high eight runs on 10 hits in a career-low 2.2 innings for the first decision of his career, a loss in a 13-5 decision at Boston **May 10**...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to allow at least four runs in each of his first three Major League appearances...the other is Vida Blue (July 20-Aug. 3, 1969)...picked up his first Major League win in the A's 3-1 victory over Texas **May 16** in Oakland...had a no decision in the A's 14-5 win over Texas on **June 13** in Oakland...had a 10-2 lead when he left the game after 4.1 innings with a left pronator muscle strain...went on the DL the next day...made one start on a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton on **June 24** against San Jose and had a no decision (3.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 3 so, 1 hr, 64

itches)...tossed a career-high 106 pitches in 7.0 innings and did not allow a run or walk a batter on **July 10** at Houston...ended up with a no decision in the A's 2-1, 10-inning loss...made his first career relief appearance **July 17** against Toronto...entered the game to start the second inning in relief of Andrew Triggs, who left the game with a left shin contusion...Triggs relieved Rich Hill who left after five pitchers with a blister...Manaea had been scheduled to start two days later...tossed 5.0 innings, which is a season-high for an A's reliever...had a no decision in the A's 1-0, 13-inning win over Tampa Bay **July 22** in Oakland...tossed a career-high 8.0 scoreless innings and allowed just five hits and no walks, but Odorizzi did the same for the Rays...struck out a career-high nine batters but allowed a career-high 11 hits in 6.2 innings in a no decision at Texas **July 27**.

LAST START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 3-1 loss to Chicago (NL) last Sunday in Oakland...blanked the Cubs on four hits and two walks over the first five innings...then allowed lead off home runs to Bryant in the sixth and Soler in the seventh...left after the Soler home run trailing 2-0 as Hendricks shutout the A's on two hits over the first seven innings

RHP Kendall Graveman (8-7, 4.29 ERA): Is 7-1 with a 3.67 ERA over his last 13 starts after going 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts...six of those wins have come since June 23, which is tied for fifth most in the American League over that span...is 4-0 with a 2.25 ERA over his last five home starts after going 0-3 with a 3.47 ERA over his first four starts at home...has not lost in Oakland since May 19...is now 4-3 with a 2.73 ERA in nine starts at home compared to 4-4 with a 5.64 ERA in 13 starts on the road...has surrendered just three home runs in 59.1 innings at home compared to 13 in 68.2 innings on the road...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 3-2 A's win over Baltimore last Monday here in Oakland (7.0 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 1 er, 4 so)...is 1-1 with a 3.05 ERA (20.2 ip, 24 h, 7 r, 7 er, 4 bb, 13 so, 0 hr) in five career appearances, including three starts, against Seattle...is 0-1 with a 5.06 ERA in two starts this year.

- The A's bullpen allowed six runs yesterday (5.0 ip, 10.80 ERA), its most since June 28 at San Francisco when it yielded seven...allowed a total of eight earned runs over its previous 14 contests (1.49 ERA).
- Has tossed 400.2 innings, which is the most in the American League and second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 405.0).
- Has allowed 44-of-191 (23.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the best percentage in the AL (Houston, 23.3%) and third best in the majors.
- Ranks third in the AL in opponents grounded into double plays (38), fourth in strikeouts (378) and on-base percentage (.307) and fifth in wins (20) and fewest losses (15)...ranks second in most wild pitches (25), third in walks (136), tied for third in blown saves (15) and tied for fifth in home runs (48).
- First batters faced are 78-for-337 (.231) with 24 walks (.281 on-base percentage)...leads the AL in first batter slugging percentage (.329), ranks second in on-base percentage and strikeouts (91) and fourth in batting average.

- Has not allowed an earned run in 12 of his last 14 games for a 1.93 ERA (3 er in 14.0 ip)...however, has a 6.75 ERA (15 er in 20.0 ip) over his last 24 games after logging a 2.70 ERA over his first 26 contests.
- Recorded the save in his last appearance on Wednesday, his second of the year and his first since May 31 against Minnesota.
