### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (52-64) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (60-54)

SAUTRDAY, AUGUST 13, 2016 — OAKLAND ALAMEDA COLISEUM — 6:05 P.M. PDT RHP KENDALL GRAVEMAN (8-7, 4.29) VS. RHP HISASHI IWAKUMA (13-7, 3.79) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won four of the last five games but are 5-9 over the last 14 contests...are 14-13 since the All-Star Break...are 52-64 (.448) overall, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are in fourth place in the AL West and trail first place Texas by 16½ games, which is ½ game short of the season high of 17 (twice, last: June 22)...have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 44 days in fourth, 16 days tied for fourth and 30 days in fifth.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 4-3 with a 2.61 ERA (12 er in 41.1 ip) and .221 (33-for-149) opponents batting average over the last seven games after going 0-4 with a 13.11 ERA and .430 opponents batting average over the previous six contests...are 32-49 with a 5.08 ERA (354 er in 626.2 ip) for the season...rank second in the American League in highest ERA, most losses and fewest innings pitched and tied for second in fewest wins...had their streak of four consecutive games without issuing a walk snapped last night...have walked just five batters in 44.1 innings (1.02 per nine innings) over the last eight games...used eight different starting pitchers over an eight-game stretch from Aug. 4-11, which was the longest such streak by an A's team since June 7-12, 1961, also an eight-game streak...have used 12 starting pitchers for the season, which is tied with Los Angeles and Seattle for the most in the AL.

**PITCHING:** The A's compiled a 3.55 ERA over the first 27 games, a 5.38 ERA over a 60-game stretch from May 3 to July 8 and have a 4.05 ERA (118 er in 252.1 ip) over the last 30 contests...have a 4.61 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second most wild pitches (57), the third highest opponents batting average (.267) and slugging percentage (.430) and the fourth highest on-base percentage (.329)...have surrendered at least one home run in 16 of the last 18 games (29 home runs total).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .213 (53-for-249) with 21 runs scored in eight games on the homestand (2.6 runs per game)...are hitting .239 (480-for-2006) at home for the season, which is third lowest in the American League...have a .260 (504-for-1939) average on the road, which is fourth best in the AL...for the season, rank last in the AL in on-base percentage (.304), second in fewest walks (293) and fewest strikeouts (781) and fourth in lowest batting average (.249), lowest slugging percentage (.400), fewest runs scored (467) and fewest doubles (185)...are on pace for 409 walks, which would break the Athletics record for fewest walks in a 162-game season (421 in 1966).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed just one error in their last six games...now have 18 errors in the last 43 games after making 53 over the first 73 contests...A's outfielders have 16 assists, which is tied for second fewest in the American League.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 4-4 on this 10-game homestand against Chicago-NL (0-3), Baltimore (3-1) and Seattle (1-0)...it is the A's second consecutive 10-game homestand...went 7-3 on the last homestand and are 28-33 (.459) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...leave following the game tomorrow for a six-game road trip to Texas (three games) and Chicago-AL (three games)...went 3-6 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1), Cleveland (0-3) and Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and are 24-31 (.436) on the road...started the year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 12-11 since then...have a 5.32 ERA (281 er in 475.1 ip) on the road compared to 4.01 (247 er in 555.0 ip) at home.

**MARGIN OF VICTORY:** Each of the A's last 17 wins have been by three runs or fewer (10 one-run, four two-run, three three-run)...have not won a game by more than three runs since a 7-1 win over San Francisco on June 29...are 39-35 (.527) in games decided by three runs or fewer compared to 13-29 (.310) in games decided by four runs or more...the record in games decided by four or more is second worst in the majors (Atlanta, 12-31)... have a run differential of -91, which is the worst in the American League.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's have won 10 of their last 14 one-run games and are 19-17 (.528) in one-run games for the season...are tied for third in the American League in one-run wins and rank fourth in one-run games... went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year, which was the second worst

record in the majors...are 6-7 in walk-off games and the 13 games are tied for second most in the AL (Houston, 14)...are 13-11 in games decided in the last at bat...have won each of their last three extra inning games and are 5-3 (.625) in extra innings overall, which is the fourth best record in the AL.

**ROSTER NOTES:** The A's have made a total of 153 player moves in 132 days dating back to Opening Day, April 4...have used 45 players, including 25 pitchers...employed a franchise record 30 pitchers last year...10 of the 25 pitchers have been rookies, which is tied for the fourth most rookie pitchers in Oakland history...the Oakland record for most rookie pitchers is 12 (2009, 2012, 2015)...seven of those 10 have made their Major League debut this year...overall, the A's have used 13 rookies, 10 of which have made their ML debuts (Eibner with the Royals).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list an Oakland record tying 25 times (also 2008)...the 25 players have combined to miss 1181 games (47.2 games per stint) and the games missed will set an Oakland record...the current mark is 1397 in 2010...have a season-high 14 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Gray, Hahn, Lambo, Lowrie, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard), including 10 on the 60-day DL (all but Doolittle, Gray, Hahn and Lowrie)...prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4, at least nine every day since May 6 and at least six all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's defeated the Mariners in 2 hours and 19 minutes last night, matching the quickest game of the season (June 19 vs. Los Angeles-AL)...are averaging 2:33 over the last five games (767 minutes)...A's pinch hitters rank second in the American League in hits (19), RBI (13) and plate appearances (86) to Seattle (24 hits, 14 RBI, 114 plate appearances)...A's designated hitters have the second lowest batting average in the AL (.225) and are tied for the second fewest RBI (46)...the A's have lost 12 of the last 16 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...the A's opponent has been in first place in their division 12 of their last 18 games (includes today)...are 5-7 in those 12 games.

**A's vs. MARINERS:** The season series is even at five games each...the A's are 1-3 in Oakland and 4-2 in Seattle...the win last night snapped a seven-game losing streak in Oakland, which is the second longest home losing streak against the Mariners in Oakland history (8, July 6, 2007-April 17, 2008)...have won six of the last nine games in Seattle...13 of the A's last 21 losses to Seattle have been by one run and 21 of the last 30 have been by two runs or fewer...the A's lost the season series last year for the third consecutive season and fourth time in the last five years...are now 49-56 against the Mariners over the last six years...all-time, the A's are 332-263 against Seattle...that includes 180-117 in Oakland, 151-145 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 75-81 at Safeco Field.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Billy Butler** is hitting .441 (15-for-34) with two home runs, seven RBI and six multiple hit games over his last 10 games...*Coco Crisp* is batting a Major League leading .448 with runners in scoring position...started the season 0-for-9 with RISP but is 26-for-49 (.531) since then...*Khris Davis* hit his 28th home run of the season last night, which is a new career high...also has a career-high 72 RBI...**Ryan Dull** has a 1.27 ERA (5 er in 35.1 ip) and .138 (17-for-123) opponents batting average over his last 35 games...*Marcus Semien* went 4-for-4 last night for his third career four-hit game...has five hits in his last five plate appearances.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1977** Mitchell Page steals his 26th consecutive base without being caught, setting an American League record...the record comes to an end two days later when he is picked off by Cleveland's Rick Waits...in **1989** Dave Parker's first inning home run off California's Bert Blyleven is the 3000th home run in Oakland A's history...in **2005** Dennis Eckersley becomes the fourth player in Oakland history to have his number retired when the A's honor him by retiring number 43.

### TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (8-7, 4.29 ERA)

**LAST 13, FIRST NINE:** Is 7-1 with a 3.67 ERA (33 er in 81.0 ip) over his last 13 starts after going 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts...six of those wins have came since June 23, which is tied for fifth most in the American League over that span (four players tied for first with seven)... has allowed six home runs (0.67 per nine innings) and issued 17 walks (1.89 per nine innings) over his last 13 starts after allowing 10 home runs (1.91 per nine innings) and walking 19 (3.64 per nine innings) over his first nine starts.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 4-0 with a 2.25 ERA (9 er in 36.0 ip) over his last five home starts after going 0-3 with a 3.47 ERA over his first four starts at home...has not lost in Oakland since May 19...is now 4-3 with a 2.73 ERA (18 er in 59.1 ip) in nine starts at home compared to 4-4 with a 5.64 ERA (43 er in 68.2 ip) in 13 starts on the road...has surrendered just three home runs in 59.1 innings at home compared to 13 in 68.2 innings on the road.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Has the sixth highest opponents batting average in the American League (.280) and the ninth highest on-base percentage (.331)...ranks fourth in fewest strikeouts per nine innings (5.48), fifth in fewest pitches per game (90.2), tied for sixth in opponents reaching on an error (7) and tied for ninth in grounded into double plays (15)

**SUPPORT:** Has left with the lead in four of his starts only to have the bullpen blow the save (April 12 vs. Los Angeles-AL, June 17 vs. Los Angeles, June 28 vs. San Francisco, July 29 at Cleveland)...is averaging 5.44 (49 rs in 81.0 ip) runs of support over his last 13 starts after receiving an average of 2.30 runs of support over his first nine starts...is 0-5 with two runs of support or fewer, 8-1 with three runs of support or more...is now 1-14 in 20 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 13-2 in 23 starts with three runs of support or more.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has walked just five batters to lead off an inning, which is tied for third fewest in the American League among pitchers with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title...has allowed a .153 (31-for-202) batting average with two strikes...has issued 28 of his 36 walks this year and 52 of 74 in his career to left-handed hitters.

**MONTH BY MONTH:** Is 1-0 with a 5.73 ERA (7 er in 11.0 ip) over his first two starts in August...went 4-1 with a 2.68 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in five starts in July...the wins tied for third in the American League and were his most ever in a month...had just three wins over the first three months of the season...went 1-0 with a 4.33 ERA in five starts in June...was 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in six starts in May...his May loss total tied for second in the AL...it was the first time he has lost four games in a month in his career...went 1-2 with a 4.03 ERA in four starts in April.

THIS AND THAT: Is scheduled to make his 23rd start of the season today, which is an on-going career high...is in his second full season and has career highs in every category except losses and walks...his ERA, opponents batting average and OPS are higher that his marks from last year...has a 1.64 ERA (4 er in 22.0 ip) in the first inning, 4.84 (57 er in 106.0 ip) after that...has walked one batter or fewer in 12 of his 22 starts... has tossed seven or more innings just five times this year and 11 times in 43 career starts...went 1-2 with a 7.29 ERA over the first nine games (four starts) of his career through April 25, 2015, 5-2 with a 1.78 ERA over a nine-start stretch from May 23-July 4, 2015, 1-11 with a 5.57 ERA over a 17-start stretch from July 10, 2015-May 24, 2016 and is 7-1 with a 3.67 ERA (33 er in 81.0 ip) over his last 12 starts.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Allowed four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts, joining John Odom (1969) and Mike Norris (1980) as the only pitchers in Oakland history on an Opening Day roster to allow four hits or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of their first three starts...picked up his first win of the season and struck out a career-high eight batters April 20 at New York (AL)...it snapped a career-high six-game losing streak dating back to July 10, 2015...compiled a 5.52 ERA and .276 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned nine starts...struck out in the fifth inning in his first professional at bat that day...then lost each of his next five starts from April 25 to May 19...logged a 7.92 ERA and .361 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which fell one short of his career high of six...allowed a career-high 10 hits in back-to-back starts on April 25 at Detroit and May 2 against Seattle...is the first A's pitcher with at least 10 hits in back-to-back starts since Brandon McCarthy (April 16-21, 2012)... yielded a career-high four home runs in an 11-3 loss at Baltimore May 8...snapped his five-game losing streak in a 3-2 win over Minnesota May 30...issued a career-high tying four walks but allowed just one run in 6.2 innings of work in a 3-1 win at Minnesota July 4...tossed 8.0 innings July 9 at Houston, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer dating back to June 18 of last year...that was the fifth longest such streak in Oakland history...tossed a career-high 112 pitches in 7.0 innings in a 7-4 win over Houston July 18...fired his second

career complete game in the A's 4-3 win over Tampa Bay on July 23 in Oakland...it was his first complete game win...allowed nine hits, which were the most by an A's pitcher in a complete game since Mark Redman allowed 12 on May 13, 2004 against Detroit...had his career high six-game winning streak come to an end in the A's 5-3 loss at Cleveland July 29...the streak doubled his previous best (3, June 24-July 4, 2015) and matched the longest by an A's pitcher this year (Hill)...compiled a 3.25 ERA and .264 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 10 starts from May 30 to July 23.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-2 win over Baltimore last Monday in Oakland...allowed a single to Jones to start the game but then retired each of the next seven batters before loading the bases on three consecutive one out singles in the third inning...Machado followed with a sacrifice fly but that was the only run he would allow in seven innings of work.

four games, two starts, in his home ballparks...is 1-1 with a 3.06 ERA (6 er in 17.2 ip) in his three starting assignments...is 0-1 with a 5.06 ERA (10.2 ip, 17 h, 6 r, 6 er, 3 bb, 9 so) in two starts this year...the loss came in a 4-3 decision in Oakland on May 2...allowed a career-high tying 10 hits...had a 1-0 lead when allowed a RBI single to Lind in the fourth and two more runs in the sixth on a Seager RBI double and an lanetta RBI single...yielded a one-out double to Aoki in the seventh and was relieved by Rzepczynski who allowed Aoki to score...then had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Seattle May 24...tossed just 4.2 innings and allowed two runs...yielded a RBI double to Cano in the first and a RBI single to Cruz in the third...was relieved Coulombe with one out in the fifth inning and runners on first and second with the A's trailing 2-1...the A's scored four times in the fifth to get him off the hook.

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Zach Neal (2-1, 4.60 ERA):** Is scheduled to make his 13th appearance and third start of the season...was recalled from Nashville July 21 for his fourth stint with the A's this year and is 1-0 with a 0.66 ERA and .130 opponents batting average in four games, including one start, since his return...is 2-0 with a 1.04 ERA and .213 opponents batting average over his last seven games dating back to June 18...went 0-1 with a save, a 9.75 ERA and .340 opponents batting average over his first five contests...has issued just one walk in 29.1 innings, an average of 0.31 walks per nine innings...that is the lowest mark in the majors among pitchers with 25 or more innings...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 2-1 A's win over Baltimore last Tuesday here in Oakland (5.1 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 so)...was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance against the Mariners, a start earlier this year on May 25 at Seattle (4.0 ip, 8 h, 7 r, 7 er, 1 so).

### ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

#### 20-15, 3.88 ERA (174 er in 403.2 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 34-for-49 (69.4%)

- The A's bullpen has allowed one earned run or less in 14 of the last 16 games for a 2.24 ERA (14 er in 56.1 ip).
- Has tossed 403.2 innings, which is the most in the American League and second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 408.0).
- Has allowed 44-of-191 (23.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the best percentage in the AL (Houston, 23.3%) and third best in the majors.
- Ranks third in the AL in opponents grounded into double plays (38), fourth in strikeouts (382) and on-base percentage (.306) and fifth in wins (20) and fewest losses (15)...is tied for second in most wild pitches (25), third in walks (136), tied for third in blown saves (15) and tied for fifth in home runs (48).
- First batters faced are 78-for-340 (.229) with 24 walks (.279 on-base percentage)...leads the AL in first batter slugging percentage (.326), ranks second in on-base percentage and strikeouts (92) and fourth in batting average.

### 61 RHP JOHN AXFORD


