OAKLAND ATHLETICS (52-65) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (61-54)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four of the last six games but are 5-10 over the last 15 contests...are 14-14 since the All-Star Break...are 52-65 (.444) overall, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are in fourth place in the AL West and trail first place Texas by 16½ games, which is ½ game short of the season high of 17 (twice, last: June 22)...have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 45 days in fourth, 16 days tied for fourth and 30 days in fifth.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-4 with a 3.04 ERA (16 er in 47.1 ip) and .231 (40-for-173) opponents batting average over the last eight games after going 0-4 with a 13.11 ERA and .430 opponents batting average over the previous six contests...are 32-50 with a 5.09 ERA (358 er in 632.2 ip) for the season...rank second in the American League in highest ERA, most losses and fewest innings pitched and tied for second in fewest wins...have walked just six batters in 50.1 innings (1.07 per nine innings) over the last nine games...used eight different starting pitchers over an eight-game stretch from Aug. 4-11, which was the longest such streak by an A's team since June 7-12, 1961, also an eight-game streak...have used 12 starting pitchers for the season, which is tied with Los Angeles and Seattle for the most in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's compiled a 3.55 ERA over the first 27 games, a 5.38 ERA over a 60-game stretch from May 3 to July 8 and have a 4.05 ERA (122 er in 271.1 ip) over the last 30 contests...have a 4.61 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League...have the second most wild pitches (58), the third highest opponents batting average (.267) and slugging percentage (.431) and the fourth highest on-base percentage (.329)...have surrendered at least one home run in 17 of the last 19 games (31 home runs total).

OFFENSE: The A's have gone back-to-back games without a walk for the first time in exactly two years (Aug. 12-13, 2014) and have just 293 walks for the season, which is second fewest in the American League...are on pace for 406 walks, which would break the Athletics record for fewest walks in a 162-game season (421 in 1966)...are batting .224 (64-for-286) with 24 runs scored in nine games on the homestand (2.7 runs per game)...are hitting .240 (491-for-2043) at home for the season, which is third lowest in the AL...have a .260 (504-for-1939) average on the road, which is fourth best in the AL...for the season, rank last in the AL in on-base percentage (.304), second in fewest strikeouts (787) and fourth in lowest batting average (.250), lowest slugging percentage (.400), fewest runs scored (470) and fewest doubles (187).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just one error in their last seven games...now have 18 errors in the last 44 games after making 53 over the first 73 contests...A's outfielders have 16 assists, which is tied for second fewest in the American League.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-5 on this 10-game homestand against Chicago-NL (0-3), Baltimore (3-1) and Seattle (1-1)...it is the A's second consecutive 10-game homestand...went 7-3 on the last homestand and are 28-34 (.452) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...leave following the game today for a six-game road trip to Texas (three games) and Chicago-AL (three games)...went 3-6 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1), Cleveland (0-3) and Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and are 24-31 (.436) on the road...started the year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 12-11 since then...have a 5.32 ERA (281 er in 475.1 ip) on the road compared to 4.01 (251 er in 564.0 ip) at home.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 35-38 (.479) in night games compared to 17-27 (.386) during the day...have the second worst day record in the majors (San Diego, 10-27)...are batting .263 (663-for-2522) and averaging 4.42 runs per game at night (323 runs) compared to .227 (332-for-1460) and 3.34 runs per game during the day (147 runs)...have the second lowest day batting average in the majors (San Diego, .218) and the second fewest runs per game (Atlanta, 3.26).

MARGIN OF VICTORY: Each of the A's last 17 wins have been by three runs or fewer (10 one-run, four two-run, three three-run)...have not won a game by more than three runs since a 7-1 win over San Francisco on June 29...are 39-36 (.520) in games decided by three runs or fewer compared to

13-29 (.310) in games decided by four runs or more...the record in games decided by four or more is second worst in the majors (Atlanta, 12-31)...have a run differential of -92, which is the worst in the American League.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have won 10 of their last 15 one-run games and are 19-18 (.514) in one-run games for the season...rank fourth in the American League in one-run games...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year, which was the second worst record in the majors...are 6-7 in walk-off games and the 13 games are tied for second most in the AL (Houston, 14)...are 13-11 in games decided in the last at bat...have won each of their last three extra inning games and are 5-3 (.625) in extra innings overall, which is the fourth best record in the AL...the Oakland record for fewest extra inning games in a non-strike season is nine in 1974 and 1975.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list an Oakland record tying 25 times (also 2008)...the 25 players have combined to miss 1195 games (47.8 games per stint) and the games missed will set an Oakland record...the current mark is 1397 in 2010...have a season-high 14 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Gray, Hahn, Lambo, Lowrie, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard), including 10 on the 60-day DL (all but Doolittle, Gray, Hahn and Lowrie)...prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4, at least nine every day since May 6 and at least six all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have lost 12 of the last 16 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...tomorrow, the A's begin a stretch where they will play five series in five different cities...travel to Texas and Chicago, return home for a three-game series against Cleveland and then take to the road again to St. Louis and Houston...A's pinch hitters rank second in the American League in hits (19), RBI (13) and plate appearances (87) to Seattle (24 hits, 14 RBI, 114 plate appearances)...A's designated hitters are tied for the second fewest RBI in the AL (46) and have the fourth lowest batting average (.231)...the A's opponent has been in first place in their division 12 of their last 19 games (includes today)...are 5-7 in those 12 games.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's trail in the season series, 5-6...are 1-4 in Oakland and 4-2 in Seattle...have lost eight of the last nine games in Oakland but have won six of the last nine in Seattle...the A's have homered in each of their last 21 games against the Mariners, which matches their most consecutive games with a home run against one team (New York, July 22, 1992-April 30, 1994)...14 of the A's last 22 losses to Seattle have been by one run and 22 of the last 31 have been by two runs or fewer...the A's lost the season series last year for the third consecutive season and fourth time in the last five years...are now 49-57 against the Mariners over the last six years...all-time, the A's are 332-264 against Seattle...that includes 180-118 in Oakland, 151-145 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 75-81 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Butler is hitting .474 (18-for-38) with two home runs, seven RBI and seven multiple hit games over his last 11 games...**Coco Crisp** is batting a Major League leading .458 with runners in scoring position...started the season 0-for-9 with RISP but is 27-for-50 (.540) since then...**Khrist Davis** has hit six home runs against Seattle, which is one short of the Oakland record for home runs in a season against the Mariners (Canseco, 1988; Chavez, 2001; Moss, 2013)...**Ryan Dull** has a 1.27 ERA (5 er in 35.1 ip) and .138 (17-for-123) opponents batting average over his last 35 games...**Liam Hendriks** has a 1.91 ERA (6 er in 28.1 ip) and .192 (20-for-104) opponents batting average in 23 games since he was reinstated from the DL June 19.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1933** Jimmie Foxx hits for the cycle and drives in nine runs in the A's 11-5 win over Cleveland...in **1987** Mark McGwire breaks the Major League rookie home run record with his 39th of the season, a two-run shot in the sixth inning of the A's 7-6 win at California...he would go on to hit what was then an Oakland record 49 round trippers.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Zach Neal (2-1, 4.60 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 13th appearance and third start of the season...was recalled from Nashville July 21 for his fourth stint with the A's this year and is 1-0 with a 0.66 ERA (1 er in 13.2 ip) and .130 (6-for-46) opponents batting average in four games, including one start, since his return...was first selected from Nashville May 11 and made his Major League debut that night at Boston...was optioned back to the Sounds May 13...returned May 25 and made his first ML start that day at Seattle, a loss...pitched once more in relief before he was optioned to Nashville May 31...joined the A's for a third time June 10 and compiled a 4.70 ERA in five relief appearances while recording his first win and save before he was optioned to Nashville June 30.

LAST SEVEN, FIRST FIVE: Is 2-0 with a 1.04 ERA (2 er in 17.1 ip), .213 (13-for-61) opponents batting average and one home run in 17.1 innings over his last seven games dating back to June 18...went 0-1 with a save, a 9.75 ERA, .340 opponents batting average and four home runs in 12.0 innings over his first five contests.

DON'T WALK: Has issued just one walk in 29.1 innings, an average of 0.31 walks per nine innings...that is the lowest mark in the majors among pitchers with 20 or more innings pitched...issued his only walk with two outs in the sixth inning on July 30 at Cleveland to snap a career-opening nine-game, 18.2-inning, 80-batter faced streak without a walk...the career-opening streak of 18.2 innings without a walk was the longest such streak by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1913...the previous high was 15.1 by Paul Lindblad (Sept. 15, 1965-April 28, 1966).

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 1-1 with a 7.71 ERA (8 er in 9.1 ip) in his two starting assignments compared to 1-0 with a 3.15 ERA in 10 relief appearances...first batters faced are 4-for-10 (.400)...has not inherited any runners...has tossed at least one inning in nine of his 10 relief appearances, including a season-high 3.0 innings on four separate occasions.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-0 with a 2.35 ERA (4 er in 15.1 ip) and .196 (11-for-56) opponents batting average in six games at home compared to 1-1 with a 7.07 ERA (11 er in 14.0 ip) and .345 (20-for-58) opponents average in six games on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has yielded four of his five home runs and issued his only walk to left-handed hitters...has an .834 OPS against left-handers compared to .655 against right-handers...opponents are 10-for-31 (.323) with four doubles and two home runs (.645 slugging percentage) when leading off an inning...has yielded a .221 (17-for-77) batting average with the bases empty, .378 (14-for-37) with runners on...opponents are 9-for-25 (.360) with runners in scoring position, including 5-for-10 (.500) with RISP and two outs.

2016 IN RELIEF: Made his Major League debut May 11 at Boston, tossing three innings of relief in the A's 13-3 loss...entered the game to start the sixth inning with the A's trailing 10-3...fanned Bradley, Jr. with one out in the sixth inning for his first Major League strikeout...struck out a career-high two batters in his debut...picked up his first Major League save June 13 against Texas when he tossed the final three innings of the A's 14-5 win...was credited with his first Major League win June 28 at San Francisco when he tossed a scoreless seventh inning in the A's 13-11 win...did not allow a run over his final four relief appearances from June 28 to Aug. 4 (9.1 ip).

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 13-3 loss at Seattle May 25...had career highs in runs (7) and hits (8)...retired the first five batters before Lind homered in the second inning...the scored was tied at 1-1 when he allowed six runs in the bottom of the third...Martin, Smith and Seager had RBI singles and Lind capped the scoring with a three-run home run...retired the side in order in the fourth and was relieved by Rzepczynski to start the fifth.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win over Baltimore last Tuesday in Oakland...had career highs in innings pitched (5.1) and pitches (72)...retired each of the first nine batters he faced and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Jones in the fourth...then retired seven of his final eight batters, yielding a leadoff double to Schoop in the sixth.

NASHVILLE: Went 7-2 with a 3.21 ERA in 11 starts with Triple-A Nashville...walked just eight batters in 61.2 innings, an average of 1.17 per nine innings...had five starts with no walks, four with one walk and two with two walks...took the loss in his first start but then went 6-0 with a 2.95 ERA over his next seven starts...went 1-1 with a 4.50 ERA over his final three starts...posted a 3-0 record and a 0.84 ERA in three starts in May...issued just one walk in 21.1 May innings.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .259 opponents batting average, including .233 (24-for-103) against left-handed hitters compared to .279 (38-for-136) against right-handers...surrendered all five of his home runs to right-handed hitters...had a .551 OPS against lefties, .735 against right-handers...opponents were 12-for-63 (.190) with one walk (.203 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...opponents hit .318 with runners in scoring position.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Was originally selected by the Florida organization in the 17th round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft and was 17-14 with a 3.24 ERA in 59 games, including 46 starts, in three seasons in the Marlins farm system...was released March 26, 2013 and signed with the Oakland organization two days later...is 34-34 with a 3.93 ERA (243 er in 556.0 ip) in 93 games, including 91 starts, in four seasons in the A's farm system...is 51-48 with a 3.71 ERA (338 er in 819.2 ip) in 152 games, 137 starts, in seven seasons in the minors overall...has issued just 164 walks in 819.2 innings, an average of 1.80 per nine innings.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Ross Detwiler (1-0, 2.13 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville last Wednesday and made his A's debut that day against Baltimore in 1-0 win (8.0 ip, 6 h, 2 so)...became the third pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least 8.0 scoreless innings in his debut...was a non-roster invitee with Cleveland this spring and made the Indians Opening Day roster...logged a 5.79 ERA in seven relief appearances before he was designated for assignment April 29...was outrighted to Triple-A Columbus May 1 and traded to the A's organization in a minor league deal for cash considerations on July 17...went 2-4 with a 4.60 ERA in 12 starts with Columbus in the Indians farm system...was assigned to Nashville following his July 17 trade and went 4-0 with a 3.86 ERA in four games, including three starts, with the Sounds...combined for a 6-4 record and a 4.40 ERA in 16 games, 15 starts, overall at Triple-A...has never faced the Rangers in his career.

- The A's bullpen has allowed one earned run or less in 15 of the last 17 games for a 2.12 ERA (14 er in 59.1 ip).
- Has tossed 406.2 innings, which is the most in the American League and second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 411.2).
- Has allowed 44-of-192 (22.9%) inherited runners to score, which is the best percentage in the AL (Houston, 24.6%) and third best in the majors.
- Is tied for third in the AL in opponents grounded into double plays (38), ranks fourth in strikeouts (383) and on-base percentage (.306) and fifth in wins (20) and fewest losses (15)...ranks second in most wild pitches (26), tied for fourth in walks (137) and blown saves (15) and tied for fifth in home runs (48).
- First batters faced are 79-for-342 (.231) with 25 walks (.282 on-base percentage)...ranks second in the AL in first batter on-base percentage and slugging percentage (.330), tied for second in strikeouts (92) and third in batting average.

- Has not allowed an earned run in 13 of his last 15 games for a 1.80 ERA (3 er in 15.0 ip)...however, has a 6.43 ERA (15 er in 21.0 ip) over his last 25 games after logging a 2.70 ERA over his first 26 contests.
- Has allowed nine of his 24 runs in sixth inning (2.2 ip, 30.38 ERA)...has a 2.80 ERA (14 er in 45.0 ip) from the seventh inning on.
- Has 499 strikeouts in his career and needs one more for 500 strikeouts.
- Is tied for fifth among American League relievers in blown saves (5).
