OAKLAND ATHLETICS (52-66) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (69-50)

MONDAY, AUGUST 15, 2016 — GLOBE LIFE PARK — 7:05 P.M. CDT LHP ROSS DETWILER (1-0, 2.13) VS. LHP MARTIN PEREZ (7-8, 4.22) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four of the last seven games but are 5-11 over the last 16 contests...are 14-15 since the All-Star Break...are 52-66 (.441) overall, which is the fourth worst record in the American League... are in fourth place in the AL West and trail first place Texas by 16½ games, which is ½ game short of the season high of 17 (twice, last: June 22)... have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 46 days in fourth, 16 days tied for fourth and 30 days in fifth.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-5 with a 3.59 ERA (21 er in 52.2 ip) and .244 (48-for-197) opponents batting average over the last nine games after going 0-4 with a 13.11 ERA and .430 opponents batting average over the previous six contests...are 32-51 with a 5.12 ERA (363 er in 638.0 ip) for the season...rank second in the American League in highest ERA, most losses, fewest innings pitched, and fewest wins...have walked just seven batters in 55.2 innings (1.13 per nine innings) over the last 10 games...used eight different starting pitchers over an eight-game stretch from Aug. 4-11, which was the longest such streak by an A's team since June 7-12, 1961, also an eight-game streak...have used 12 starting pitchers for the season, which is tied with Los Angeles and Seattle for the most in the Al

PITCHING: The A's compiled a 3.55 ERA over the first 27 games, a 5.38 ERA over a 60-game stretch from May 3 to July 8 and have a 4.17 ERA (130 er in 280.1 ip) over the last 31 contests...have a 4.64 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have the second most wild pitches (58), the third highest opponents batting average (.267), and the fourth highest slugging percentage (.431) and on-base percentage (.330)...have surrendered at least one home run in 18 of the last 20 games (32 home runs total).

OFFENSE: The A's went gone back-to-back games without a walk on Friday and Saturday for the first time in exactly two years (Aug. 12-13, 2014) ...have one walk in their last three games and have just 294 walks for the season, which is second fewest in the American League...are on pace for 403 walks, which would break the Athletics record for fewest walks in a 162-game season (421 in 1966)...batted .227 (73-for-322) with 28 runs scored in 10 games on the most recent homestand (2.8 runs per game)... are hitting .241 (500-for-2079) at home for the season, which is third lowest in the AL...have a .260 (504-for-1939) average on the road, which is fourth best in the AL...for the season, rank last in the AL in on-base percentage (.303), second in fewest strikeouts (797) and fourth in lowest batting average (.250), lowest slugging percentage (.401), fewest runs scored (474) and tied for fourth in fewest doubles (188).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just one error in their last eight games...now have 18 errors in the last 45 games after making 53 over the first 73 contests...A's outfielders have 17 assists, which is the third fewest in the American League.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's went 4-6 on the recently completed 10-game homestand against Chicago-NL (0-3), Baltimore (3-1) and Seattle (1-2)... it was the A's second consecutive 10-game homestand...went 7-3 on the last homestand and are 28-35 (.444) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...tonight is the first game of a six-game road trip to Texas (three games) and Chicago-AL (three games)...went 3-6 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1), Cleveland (0-3) and Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and are 24-31 (.436) on the road...started the year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 12-11 since then...have a 5.32 ERA (281 er in 475.1 ip) on the road compared to 4.07 (259 er in 573.0 ip) at home.

MARGIN OF VICTORY: Each of the A's last 17 wins have been by three runs or fewer (10 one-run, four two-run, three three-run)...have not won a game by more than three runs since a 7-1 win over San Francisco on June 29...are 39-36 (.520) in games decided by three runs or fewer compared to 13-30 (.302) in games decided by four runs or more...the record in games decided by four or more is second worst in the majors (Atlanta, 12-32)... have a run differential of -96, which is the worst in the American League.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have won 10 of their last 15 one-run games and are 19-18 (.514) in one-run games for the season...rank fourth in the American League in one-run games...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year, which was the second worst record in the majors...are 6-7 in walk-off

games and the 13 games are tied for second most in the AL (Houston, 14)...are 13-11 in games decided in the last at bat...have won each of their last three extra inning games and are 5-3 (.625) in extra innings overall, which is the fourth best record in the AL...the Oakland record for fewest extra inning games in a non-strike season is nine in 1974 and 1975.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have made a total of 153 player moves in 134 days dating back to Opening Day, April 4...have used 45 players, including 25 pitchers...employed a franchise record 30 pitchers last year...10 of the 25 pitchers have been rookies, which is tied for the fourth most rookie pitchers in Oakland history...the Oakland record for most rookie pitchers is 12 (2009, 2012, 2015)...seven of those 10 have made their Major League debut this year...overall, the A's have used 13 rookies, 10 of which have made their ML debuts (Eibner with the Royals).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list an Oakland record tying 25 times (also 2008)...the 25 players have combined to miss 1209 games (48.4 games per stint) and the games missed will set an Oakland record...the current mark is 1397 in 2010...have a season-high 14 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Gray, Hahn, Lambo, Lowrie, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard), including 10 on the 60-day DL (all but Doolittle, Gray, Hahn and Lowrie)...prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4, at least nine every day since May 6 and at least six all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have lost 13 of the last 17 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...tonight, the A's begin a stretch where they will play five straight series in five different cities...travel to Texas and Chicago, return home for a three-game series against Cleveland and then take to the road again to St. Louis and Houston...A's pinch hitters rank second in the American League in hits (19), RBI (13) and plate appearances (90) to Seattle (24 hits, 14 RBI, 114 plate appearances)...A's designated hitters have the second fewest RBI in the AL (46) and have the fourth lowest batting average (.231)...the A's opponent has been in first place in their division 13 of their last 20 games (includes today)...are 5-7 in those 12 games entering today.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lead the season series, 6-4...have won two out of three in Texas after going 4-3 in two series in Oakland...are beginning the third of five straight road trips to the state of Texas, and the second straight trip that includes a visit to Globe Life Park...the A's have won three of the previous four season series and are 46-40 against Texas over the last five years...are 338-347 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 177-167 in Oakland and 161-180 in Texas...are 94-92 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 435-429 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Butler is hitting .452 (19-for-42) with two home runs, seven RBI and seven multiple hit games over his last 12 games... Coco Crisp is batting a Major League leading .458 with runners in scoring position... started the season 0-for-9 with RISP but is 27-for-50 (.540) since then... Khris Davis hit his 30th home run yesterday...is the first A's player to hit 30 home runs in a season since Brandon Moss in 2013 (30)...30 home runs are an ongoing career high (27 last season)...has homered in three-straight games for the second time in his career... Ryan Dull has a 1.27 ERA (5 er in 35.1 ip) and .138 (17-for-123) opponents batting average over his last 35 games... Liam Hendriks has a 1.91 ERA (6 er in 28.1 ip) and .192 (20-for-104) opponents batting average in 23 games since he was reinstated from the DL June 19.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

in **1980** Rick Langford pitches a six-hitter as the A's defeat Seattle 11-3... it is his club record ninth consecutive complete game victory...the win comes in the midst of a club record 22 consecutive complete games...in **2009** Adam Kennedy is a perfect 5 for 5 in the A's 8-1 loss to Chicago... it is Kennedy's second of two five-hit games in 2009.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Ross Detwiler (1-0, 2.13 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville last Wednesday and tossed 8.0 shutout innings for the win in his A's debut that night against Baltimore...was a non-roster invitee with Cleveland this spring and made the Indians Opening Day roster...logged a 5.79 ERA in seven relief appearances before he was designated for assignment April 29...was outrighted to Triple-A Columbus May 1 and traded to the A's organization in a minor league deal for cash considerations on July 17.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Picked up the win in his first start this year last Wednesday against Baltimore...it was his first win as a starter since May 10, 2013 against Chicago (NL)...made 69 starts with Washington from 2009-13 but has just eight since then, including seven with Texas last year...has made 181 career appearances with Washington (2007, 09-14), Texas (2015), Atlanta (2015), Cleveland (2016) and Oakland...is 18-34 with a 4.18 ERA (194 er in 417.1 ip) in his 77 career starts and 4-3 with a 4.04 ERA (56 er in 124.2 ip) in 104 career relief appearances

WITH CLEVELAND: Opponents were 3-for-16 (.188) with Cleveland but he issued four walks in 4.2 innings for a .333 on-base percentage...all three of the hits were for extra bases (two doubles, one home run) for a .500 slugging percentage...allowed 1-of-4 (25.0%) inherited runners to score...first batters faced were 2-for-6 (.333) with a walk...tossed fewer than one inning in six of his seven appearances and his season high was 1.0 on April 17 against New York (NL).

LAST START: Combined with Axford on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win over Baltimore last Wednesday in Oakland...tossed a career-high eight innings and allowed six of the hits...matched his career high with 108 pitches...did not walk a batter...is the third pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least 8.0 scoreless innings in his A's debut (Mike Norris, 9.0 on April 10, 1975 and Tommy Milone, 8.0 on April 9, 2012)...allowed four base runners to advance into scoring position but retired each of the final 12 batters that he faced.

MINORS: Went 2-4 with a 4.60 ERA in 12 starts with Triple-A Columbus in the Indians farm system...was assigned to Triple-A Nashville following his July 17 trade and went 4-0 with a 3.86 ERA in four games, including three starts, with the Sounds...combined for a 6-4 record and a 4.40 ERA in 16 games, 15 starts, overall at Triple-A...issued 21 walks in 62.2 innings with the Clippers (3.02 per nine innings) but then walked just four batters in 23.1 innings with the Sounds (1.54 per nine innings...struck out 24 at Nashville for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 6.0...went 0-4 with a 5.84 ERA over his first eight starts through June 11...finished the Triple-A portion of his campaign by going 6-0 with a 3.31 ERA over his final eight games, seven starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .256 opponents batting average, including .252 (58-for-230) against right-handed hitters compared to .265 (26-for-98) against left-handed hitters...surrendered nine of his 10 home runs to righties...nine were solo shots...opponents batted .229 with the bases empty compared to .301 with runners on base...allowed a .357 average with runners in scoring position with Columbus, .118 with Nashville...yielded a .313 batting average to batters leading off an inning.

THIS AND THAT: Tossed six or more innings in nine of his 16 appearances, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer 11 times...had a 7.20 ERA (12 er in 15.0 ip) in the first inning, a 3.80 ERA (30 er in 71.0 ip) after that...Columbus was 4-8 in his starting assigments and Nashville was 3-0...his one relief appearance came in his first outing with the Sounds on July 20 at Albuquerque...Jesse Hahn started that game and tossed 1.0 innings prior to a July 24 call-up to Oakland.

MINOR LEAGUE HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed just 2.0 innings and 35 pitches in his first start May 7 at Toledo as he began to build up his pitch count following his relief role with the Indians...logged fewer than five innings in each of his first four starts...then tossed 7.0 scoreless innings against Durham May 27 but had a no decision in a 2-0 win...was 0-3 with a 3.42 ERA over his first six starts...then allowed 14 runs in 10.2 innings over his next two starts (11.81 ERA)...yielded six runs on a season-high 10 hits in 6.2 innings in a 7-1 loss to Indianapolis June 6 and a season-high eight runs in 4.0 innings in a no decision in a 15-12 loss to Scranton/Wilkes-Barre on June 11...walked four batters in that game, which was a season-high until he issued five free passed in 4.0 innings in his next start June 17 at Syracuse...picked up his first win of the season June 22 against Rochester when allowed one run in 7.0 innings in a 7-2 victory...tossed a season-high 7.1 innings in each of his final two starts with Columbus on June 27 at Lehigh Valley and July 8 at Louisville...allowed one run in 5.0 innings of relief in his first outing with Nashville on July 20 at Albuquerque...struck out a season-high nine batters in 6.0 innings in his first start, a 12-5 victory over Omaha July 25...combined with Brasier and Healy on a six-hit 2-0 shutout at New Orleans July 30...tossed 6.1 innings and allowed four of the hits.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Andrew Triggs (0-1, 5.50 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 21st appearance and third start of the season and his career...was recalled from Triple-A Nashville August 5 for his eighth stint with the A's this year...that is believed to be the most stints in one season in Oakland history...is 0-1 with a 6.00 ERA (6.0 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 7 so) in three games, including one start, during his most recent stay...compiled an 8.00 ERA and .312 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over his first four stints through June 3...is 0-1 with a 3.20 ERA and .282 opponents batting average in 10 games, including two starts, over his last four stints...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 9-6 A's loss to Baltimore last Thursday in Oakland (4.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 so)...has faced the Rangers one in his career (May 18, 1.0 ip, 1 so)...was 2-1 with two saves and a 2.95 ERA in 16 appearances with Nashville.
