OAKLAND ATHLETICS (52-67) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (70-50)

TUESDAY, AUGUST 16, 2016 — GLOBE LIFE PARK — 7:05 P.M. CDT RHP ANDREW TRIGGS (0-1, 5.50) VS. RHP LUCAS HARRELL (1-0, 5.74) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost each of the last three games to fall to a season-high tying 15 games under .500 for the second time this year (48-63 on Aug. 7)...are 4-4 over the last eight games but are 5-12 over the last 17...are 52-67 (.437) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League and tied for sixth worst after 119 games in Oakland history (were 51-68 last year and lost game 120)...are in fourth place in the AL West and trail first place Texas by a season-high 17½ games...have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 47 days in fourth, 16 days tied for fourth and 30 days in fifth.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-10 with a 6.69 ERA (60 er in 80.2 ip) and .315 (104-for-330) opponents batting average over the last 16 games...have tossed fewer than 5.0 innings seven times over that span and have 36 such games for the season, which are the most in the majors and the most by an A's team since 1999 (37)...are 32-52 with a 5.15 ERA (368 er in 642.2 ip) for the season...are tied with Minnesota for the American League lead in losses, have the second highest ERA, the second fewest losses and the third fewest innings pitched...have walked nine batters in the last four games (22.0 ip) after issuing two free passes over the previous seven contests (38.1 ip)...used eight different starting pitchers over an eight-game stretch from Aug. 4-11, which was the longest such streak by an A's team since June 7-12, 1961, also an eight-game streak...have used 12 starting pitchers for the season, which is tied with Los Angeles and Seattle for the most in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's allowed their second grand slam in the last five games last night (Trumbo on Aug. 11) and now have four for the season, which is tied with Boston and Toronto for the most in the American League...have surrendered at least one home run in 19 of the last 21 games (33 home runs total)...compiled a 3.55 ERA over the first 27 games, a 5.38 ERA over a 60-game stretch from May 3 to July 8 and have a 4.21 ERA (135 er in 288.1 ip) over the last 32 contests...have a 4.64 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League...have the second most wild pitches (58), the third highest opponents batting average (.268) and slugging percentage (.431) and the fourth highest on-base percentage (.331).

OFFENSE: The A's have walked one time or fewer in each of the last four games (two walks total), which matches the second longest such streak in Oakland history (6, May 5-11, 1994)...have just 295 walks for the season, which is second fewest in the American League...are on pace for 402 walks, which would break the Athletics record for fewest walks in a 162-game season (421 in 1966)...are batting .224 (79-for-353) with 30 runs scored over the last 11 games (2.7 runs per game)...for the season, rank last in the AL in on-base percentage (.303), second in fewest strikeouts (805), third in fewest runs scored (476) and fourth in lowest batting average (.249) and lowest slugging percentage (.401).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just two errors in their last nine games...now have 19 errors in the last 46 games after making 53 over the first 73 contests...A's outfielders have 17 assists, which is tied for second fewest in the American League.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on this six-game road trip to Texas (0-1) and Chicago-AL (three games) and have now lost six of their last seven road games...went 3-6 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1), Cleveland (0-3) and Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and are 24-32 (.429) on the road...went 4-6 on the last homestand against Chicago-NL (0-3), Baltimore (3-1) and Seattle (1-2) and are 28-35 (.444) at home, which is the third worst home record in the American League...have a 5.33 ERA (286 er in 483.1 ip) on the road compared to 4.07 (259 er in 573.0 ip) at home...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Cincinnati, 5.36)...are batting .259 (510-for-1970) on the road compared to .241 (500-for-2079) at home...have the fourth highest road batting average in the AL and the third lowest home average.

MARGIN OF VICTORY: Each of the A's last 17 wins have been by three runs or fewer (10 one-run, four two-run, three three-run)...have not won a game by more than three runs since a 7-1 win over San Francisco on June 29...are 39-37 (.513) in games decided by three runs or fewer compared to 13-30 (.302) in games decided by four runs or more...the record in games decided by four or more is second worst in the majors (Atlanta, 12-32)...

have a run differential of -99, which is the worst in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...the last time the A's were outscored by more than 44 runs in a season was in 1997 (-182).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have won 10 of their last 15 one-run games and are 19-18 (.514) for the season...rank fourth in the American League in one-run games (37)...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year, which was the second worst record in the majors...are 6-7 in walk-off games and the 13 games are tied for second most in the AL (Houston, 14)...are 13-11 in games decided in the last at bat...have won each of their last three extra inning games and are 5-3 (.625) in extra innings overall, which is the fourth best record in the AL...the Oakland record for fewest extra inning games in a non-strike season is nine in 1974 and 1975.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list an Oakland record tying 25 times (also 2008)...the 25 players have combined to miss 1223 games (48.9 games per stint) and the games missed will set an Oakland record...the current mark is 1397 in 2010...have a season-high 14 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Gray, Hahn, Lambo, Lowrie, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard), including 10 on the 60-day DL (all but Doolittle, Gray, Hahn and Lowrie)...prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4, at least nine every day since May 6 and at least six all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

THIS AND THAT: Today marks the 14th time in the last 21 games the A's opponent has been in first place in their division...are 5-8 over the previous 13 games...are 0-1 in this five-series stretch where the A's will play in five different cities (Texas, Chicago, Oakland vs. Cleveland, St. Louis and Houston)...have made a total of 153 player moves in 135 days dating back to Opening Day, April 4...A's pinch hitters are 2 for their last 19 (.105)... rank second in the American League in hits (19), RBI (13) and plate appearances (91)...A's designated hitters have the second fewest RBI in the AL (47) and have the fourth lowest batting average (.231)...have lost 14 of the last 18 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lead the season series, 6-5...are 2-2 in Texas and 4-3 in Oakland...are in their third of five straight road trips to the state of Texas, and the second straight trip that includes a visit to Globe Life Park...the A's have won three of the previous four season series and are 46-41 against Texas over the last five years...are 338-348 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 177-167 in Oakland and 161-181 in Texas...are 94-93 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 435-430 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Butler is hitting .435 (20-for-46) with two home runs, eight RBI and seven multiple hit games over his last 13 games... Coco Crisp is batting a Major League leading .458 with runners in scoring position...started the season 0-for-9 with RISP but is 27-for-50 (.540) since then...Khris Davis hit his 30th home run Sunday and is the first A's player to hit 30 home runs since Brandon Moss in 2013 (30)...Ryan Dull has a 1.27 ERA (5 er in 35.1 ip) and .138 (17-for-123) opponents batting average over his last 35 games...Liam Hendriks has a 1.82 ERA (6 er in 29.2 ip) and .200 (22-for-110) opponents batting average in 24 games since he was reinstated from the DL June 19...Marcus Semien has a consecutive games played streak of 121, which is the longest by an Athletic since 2005 (Chavez, 123) and the second longest active streak in the majors.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1930 Lefty Grove wins his 20th game of the season, defeating St. Louis in Philadelphia, 4-2...in 1983 Chris Codiroli and Dave Beard combine on a 4-0 shutout against California, the A's third consecutive shutout...the shutout comes as part of an Oakland record 37 consecutive scoreless innings...in 1991 Dennis Eckersley strikes out Chili Davis at Minnesota for his 2000th career strikeout...in 1996 Geronimo Berroa hits two home runs in the first game of a doubleheader against Boston, the A's 199th and 200th of the season...that broke the A's franchise record of 199.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Andrew Triggs (0-1, 5.50 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 21st appearance and third start of the season and his career...was recalled from Triple-A Nashville August 5 for his eighth stint with the A's this year...that is believed to be the most stints in one season in Oakland history...is 0-1 with a 6.00 ERA (6.0 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 7 so) in three games, including one start, during his most recent stay.

EIGHT STINTS: His stints with the A's this year are from April 26-26, April 29, May 7 (26th man for doubleheader), May 10-June 3, June 18, June 30-July 1, July 4-August 3 (includes stay on the DL from July 18-August 1) and August 5-present...five of his eight stints began less than eight days following his previous option...has three one-day stints and two two-day stints.

FIRST FOUR STINTS, LAST FOUR STINTS: Compiled an 8.00 ERA and .312 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over his first four stints through June 3...is 0-1 with a 3.20 ERA (7 er in 19.2 ip) and .282 (22-for-78) opponents batting average in 10 games, including two starts, over his last four stints.

INNING BY INNING: Has not allowed an earned run over innings one through three (9.1 ip) and opponents are batting .200 (7-for-35)...has a 7.31 ERA (23 er in 28.1 ip) and .325 (39-for-120) opponents batting average from the fourth inning on.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has issued eight of his 12 walks to left-handed hitters...has yielded a .256 (31-for-121) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .441 (15-for-34) after that...opponents are 6-for-12 (.500) with a double and triple when putting the first pitch in play.

IN RELIEF: Tossed at least one inning in 17 of his 18 relief appearances, including two or more 10 times...allowed 4-of-8 (50.0%) inherited runners to score...first batters faced were 3-for-17 (.176) with a walk (.222 on-base percentage)...struck out 33 batters in 30.2 innings of relief (9.68 per nine innings)...pitched just once in a game the A's won (May 18 vs. Texas). made his Major League debut April 25 at Detroit and retired the side in order in the eighth inning (1.0 ip, 1 so)...struck out the first batter he faced (Tyler Collins)...was sent back to Nashville two days later...did not pitch during his second stint and worked just once during his third...was recalled a fourth time May 10 and allowed at least one run in seven of his eight appearances for a 9.00 ERA and .338 opponents batting average...including June 3 at Houston when he had career highs in innings (4.0 ip), hits (7), runs (5), strikeouts (6) and pitches (76)...made just one appearance during his fifth stint and it was his only start on June 18 against Los Angeles-AL... did not allow a run during stint number six from June 30 to July 1 (3.2 ip)... then allowed one run in each of the first three games of his seventh stint (2 er in 4.2 ip, 3.86 ERA) before going on the 15-day disabled list July 19 retroactive to July 18 with a right shin contusion...was reinstated Aug. 2, tossed 2.1 scoreless innings Aug. 3 at Los Angeles (AL), was optioned Aug. 4 and then recalled Aug. 5 when Jesse Hahn went on the DL.

FIRST START: Had a no decision in the A's 7-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on June 18 in Oakland...shutout the Angels on two hits over the first three innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Trout in the fourth...was relieved by Dull after tossing 3.0 innings and 50 pitches.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-6 loss to Baltimore last Thursday in Oakland...retired each of the first seven batters before Schoop singled with one out in the third...then allowed three runs in the fourth inning on a RBI single by Trumbo and a two-run double by Alvarez... left after four innings with the A's trailing 3-0.
