OAKLAND ATHLETICS (52-68) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (71-50)

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 17, 2016 — GLOBE LIFE PARK — 7:05 P.M. CDT LHP SEAN MANAEA (4-7, 4.57) VS. RHP YU DARVISH (3-3, 2.77) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost each of the last four games to fall to a season-high 16 games under .500 at 52-68 (.433)...that is the fourth worst record in the American League and tied for sixth worst in Oakland history after 120 games (were 51-69 last year and won game 121)...are now 5-13 dating back to July 29...are in fourth place in the AL West and trail first place Texas by a season-high 18½ games...have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 48 days in fourth, 16 days tied for fourth and 30 days in fifth.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Tyler Ladendorf on the 15-day disabled list today to set an Oakland record for using the DL...it marks the 26th time the A's have placed a player on the DL, breaking the Oakland record of 25 set in 2008...the 26 players have combined to miss 1237 games (47.6 games per stint) and the games missed will set an Oakland record...the current mark is 1397 in 2010...have a season-high 15 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Gray, Hahn, Ladendorf, Lambo, Lowrie, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard), including 11 on the 60-day DL (all but Doolittle, Gray, Hahn and Ladendorf)...prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4, at least nine every day since May 6 and at least six all year.

ROSTER NOTES: Chad Pinder will become the 46th player to appear in a game for the A's this year...he will be the 14th rookie and the 11th to make his Major League debut in 2016 (including Eibner, who debuted with the Royals)...the A's have made a total of 156 player moves in 136 days dating back to Opening Day, April 4 (42 recalls, 13 selections, 42 options, three designated for assignments, 20 placed on the 15-day disabled list, 11 transferred to the 60-day DL, 10 reinstated from the DL, one placed on the family medical leave list, one reinstated from the FMLL, four lost on waivers, one claimed on waivers and three trades involving eight players on the 40-man roster)...have employed 25 pitchers, 10 of which have been rookies...that is tied for the fourth most rookie pitchers in Oakland history...the Oakland record for most rookie pitchers is 12 (2009, 2012, 2015)...seven of those 10 have made their Major League debut this year.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their eighth walk-off loss of the season last night, their fifth in the state of Texas (Houston 3, Texas 2)...all eight losses have come against American League West teams...are tied with Houston and Texas for the AL lead in walk-off games (14) and are tied with Chicago for second in walk-off losses (Texas, 9)...fell to 5-4 in extra inning games and 13-12 in games decided in the last at bat...have won 10 of their last 16 one-run games and are 19-19 (.500) for the season...rank fourth in the American League in one-run games (38)...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year, which was the second worst record in the majors.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-10 with a 6.36 ERA (61 er in 86.1 ip) and .304 (106-for-349) opponents batting average over the last 17 games...have tossed fewer than 5.0 innings seven times over that span and have 36 such games for the season, which are the most in the majors and the most by an A's team since 1999 (37)...are 32-52 with a 5.12 ERA (369 er in 648.1 ip) for the season...are tied with Minnesota for the American League lead in losses, have the second highest ERA, the second fewest wins and the third fewest innings pitched...have not walked a batter in seven of the last 12 games (11 bb in 66.0 ip, 1.50 walks per nine innings)...used eight different starting pitchers over an eight-game stretch from Aug. 4-11, which was the longest such streak by an A's team since June 7-12, 1961, also an eight-game streak.

PITCHING: The A's have the second highest ERA (4.64) and second most wild pitches (58) in the American League, the third highest opponents batting average (.267) and the fourth highest slugging percentage (.429) and on-base percentage (.330)...have allowed two grand slams in the last six games and four for the season, which is tied with Boston and Toronto for the most in the AL.

OFFENSE: The A's walked eight times last night after drawing just two free passes over the previous four games...have 303 walks for the season, which is second fewest in the American League...are on pace for 409 walks, which would break the Athletics record for fewest walks in a 162-game season (421 in 1966)...are batting .229 (90-for-393) with 34 runs

scored over the last 12 games (2.8 runs per game)...for the season, rank last in the AL in on-base percentage (.304), second in fewest strikeouts (816), third in fewest runs scored (480) and fourth in lowest batting average (.250) and lowest slugging percentage (.400).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just two errors in their last 10 games...now have 19 errors in the last 47 games after making 53 over the first 73 contests...A's outfielders have 17 assists, which is tied for second fewest in the American League.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-2 on this six-game road trip to Texas (0-2) and Chicago-AL (three games) and have now lost seven of their last eight road games...went 3-6 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1), Cleveland (0-3) and Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and are 24-33 (.421) on the road...went 4-6 on the last homestand against Chicago-NL (0-3), Baltimore (3-1) and Seattle (1-2) and are 28-35 (.444) at home, which is the third worst home record in the American League...have a 5.32 ERA (291 er in 492.2 ip) on the road compared to 4.07 (259 er in 573.0 ip) at home...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Cincinnati, 5.36)...are batting .259 (521-for-2010) on the road compared to .241 (500-for-2079) at home...have the fourth highest road batting average in the AL and the third lowest home average.

MARGIN OF VICTORY: Each of the A's last 17 wins have been by three runs or fewer (10 one-run, four two-run, three three-run)...have not won a game by more than three runs since a 7-1 win over San Francisco on June 29...are 39-38 (.506) in games decided by three runs or fewer compared to 13-30 (.302) in games decided by four runs or more...the record in games decided by four or more is second worst in the majors (Atlanta, 12-32)... have a run differential of -100, which is the worst in the American League and fifth worst in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: Today marks the 15th time in the last 22 games the A's opponent has been in first place in their division...are 5-9 over the previous 14 games...are 0-2 in this five-series stretch where the A's will play in five different cities (Texas, Chicago, Oakland vs. Cleveland, St. Louis and Houston)...A's pinch hitters are 2 for their last 19 (.105)...rank second in the American League in hits (19), RBI (13) and plate appearances (91)...A's designated hitters have the second fewest RBI in the AL (47), the third lowest batting average (.229) and the fourth fewest home runs.

A's vs. RANGERS: The season series is even at six games each...the A's are 2-3 in Texas and 4-3 in Oakland...have lost the first two games of this series and have not been swept in a three-game series in Texas since Sept. 7-9, 2007 (were swept in a four-game series July 7-10, 2011)...are in their third of five straight road trips to the state of Texas, and the second straight trip that includes a visit to Globe Life Park...the A's have won three of the previous four season series and are 46-42 against Texas over the last five years...are 338-349 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 177-167 in Oakland and 161-182 in Texas...are 94-94 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 435-431 against the Rangers/ Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Butler is hitting .408 (20-for-49) with two home runs, eight RBI and seven multiple hit games over his last 14 games... *Coco Crisp* is batting a Major League leading .450 with runners in scoring position...started the season 0-for-9 with RISP but is 27-for-51 (.529) since then... *Marcus Semien* has a consecutive games played streak of 122, which is the longest by an Athletic since 2005 (Chavez, 123) and the second longest active streak in the majors.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1934 Ed Coleman hits three consecutive home runs in the first game of a doubleheader against Chicago, a 9-8, 10 inning A's win...in 1980 Brian Kingman tosses the A's Oakland record ninth consecutive complete game in the A's 4-3 loss at Seattle...in 1987 Reggie Jackson hits the 563rd and final home run of his career against his teammates from the previous season, the California Angels...he homers off Mike Witt, but the A's would go on to lose, 6-4...in 1990 Bob Welch wins his 20th game of the season en route to a club record 27 wins and the AL Cy Young... the 27 wins are the most by an American League pitcher since Denny McClain's 31 in 1968.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (4-7, 4.57 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 2-3 with a 3.27 ERA (20 er in 55.0 ip) in nine games, including eight starts, since he was reinstated from the disabled list June 29...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day DL June 14 with a left pronator strain...was selected from Triple-A Nashville April 29 and is making his Major League debut.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Ranks second among American League rookies in strikeouts (87), innings pitched (104.1) and games started (17) and tied for eighth in wins (4).

RUN SUPPORT: Received six runs of support in his last start after tallying eight runs of support over his previous seven starts (9 rs in 43.1 ip, 1.87 RSA)...has received two runs of support or fewer in 12 of his 17 starts and five runs or more in the other five.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 0-4 with a 6.88 ERA (26 er in 34.0 ip) and .317 (45-for-142) opponents average in six starts on the road compared to 4-3 with a 3.45 ERA (27 er in 70.1 ip) and .240 (62-for-258) opponents batting average in 12 games at home...is the second pitcher in Oakland history to start his career with a losing streak of four or more games on the road...the other is Mike Morgan, who lost each of his first six road starts from June 17, 1978-July 24, 1979...has surrendered nine home runs in 34.0 innings on the road (2.38 per nine innings), eight in 70.1 innings in Oakland (1.02 per nine innings)...has a .924 OPS on the road, .701 at home.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has held left-handed hitters to a .173 (14-for-81) batting average and five extra base hits (two doubles, three home runs)... right-handers are batting .292 (93-for-319) with 14 of his 17 home runs and 24 of his 28 walks...the batting average against lefties is second lowest in the American League among pitchers with 100 or more innings (Perez, TEX .170) and his .530 OPS ranks fourth...has an .843 OPS against righties.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 2.22 ERA (13 er in 52.2 ip) and .228 (43-for-189) opponents batting average over innings one through three and a 6.97 ERA (40 er in 51.2 ip) and .303 (64-for-211) opponents batting average from the fourth inning on...has allowed three runs in the first inning (17.0 ip, 1.59 ERA), all on May 10 at Boston...has allowed just two runs in innings one through three in nine games since returning from the DL June 29 (26.0 ip, 0.69 ERA) and just one run over the first four innings of his last five starts (20.0 ip, 0.45 ERA).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 2-2 with a 3.16 ERA (18 er in 51.1 ip) in eight starts on four days rest, 2-5 with a 6.19 ERA (33 er in 48.0 ip) in nine starts on five days rest or more.

BASES ON BALLS: Has walked eight batters in his last three starts (17.2 ip, 4.08 per nine innings) after walking no batters over his previous four games (26.2 ip)...has walked 12 batters in 55.0 innings (1.96 per nine innings) since he was reinstated from the DL June 29 and is averaging 2.42 walks per nine innings for the season (26 bb in 104.1 ip)...walked Yunel Escobar with two outs in the fifth inning on Aug. 2 at Los Angeles (AL) to snap a streak of four games, 30.2 innings and 126 batters faced without a walk...the streak of 30.2 innings without a walk was the longest single season streak in Oakland history, topping the previous mark of 29.0 by Lary Sorensen (July 8-31, 1984)...it was fifth longest overall in Oakland history.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .207 (17-for-82) with runners in scoring position, including .167 (6-for-36) with RISP and two outs... has a .222 (34-for-153) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .262 (38-for-145) the second time and .343 (35-for-102) after that...has allowed a .417 (20-for-48) batting average to the opponents number four hitter, which is the highest in the majors among pitchers with 100 or more innings...opponents are 30-for-66 (.455) with seven doubles, six home runs and 19 RBI when putting the first pitch in play...the batting average is fourth highest in the American League.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Made his Major League debut on *April 29* and had a no decision in a 7-4 A's win over Houston...had just 42 minor league appearances, all starts, in three professional seasons...became the 45th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the first since Dan Straily on Aug. 3, 2012 against Toronto...issued a career-high four walks...left with an 8-4 lead in his second start on *May 4* against Seattle but the bullpen allowed two runs in the sixth inning and three more in the seventh for the blown save (Axford)...yielded a career-high eight runs on 10 hits in a career-low 2.2 innings for the first decision of his career, a loss in a 13-5 decision at Boston *May 10*...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to allow at least four runs in each of his first three Major League appearances...the other is Vida Blue (July 20-Aug. 3, 1969)...picked up his first Major League win in the A's 3-1 victory over Texas *May 16* in Oakland...had a no decision in the A's 14-5 win over Texas on *June 13* in Oakland...had a 10-2 lead when he left the game after 4.1 innings with

a left pronator muscle strain...went on the DL the next day...made one start on a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton on *June 24* against San Jose and had a no decision (3.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 3 so, 1 hr, 64 pitches)...tossed a career-high 106 pitches in 7.0 innings and did not allow a run or walk a batter on *July 10* at Houston...ended up with a no decision in the A's 2-1, 10-inning loss...made his first career relief appearance *July 17* against Toronto...entered the game to start the second inning in relief of Andrew Triggs, who left the game with a left shin contusion...Triggs relieved Rich Hill who left after five pitchers with a blister...Manaea had been scheduled to start two days later...tossed 5.0 innings, which is a season-high for an A's reliever...had a no decision in the A's 1-0, 13-inning win over Tampa Bay *July 22* in Oakland...tossed a career-high 8.0 scoreless innings and allowed just five hits and no walks, but Odorizzi did the same for the Rays...struck out a career-high nine batters but allowed a career-high 11 hits in 6.2 innings in a no decision at Texas *July 27*.

LAST START: He snapped a career-high three-game losing streak in a 6-3 win over Seattle last Friday in Oakland...walked the leadoff batter in each of the first three innings but faced the minimum as he got a double play in each inning...did not allow a hit until Seager homered with two outs in the fifth...took a 3-1 lead in the sixth but allowed an O'Malley RBI triple and a Gutierrez sacrifice fly to tie the game...the A's scored three in the bottom of the sixth for the win.

RHP Kendall Graveman (8-8, 4.37 ERA): Is 7-2 with a 3.83 ERA over his last 14 starts after going 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts... however, is 1-2 with a 5.40 ERA and .292 opponents batting average over his last four starts... is averaging 1.67 walks per nine innings over his last 13 starts after averaging 3.74 over his first 10... is 4-4 with a 3.03 ERA in 10 starts at home compared to 4-4 with a 5.64 ERA in 13 starts on the road... has the eighth lowest home ERA in the American League and the fifth highest road ERA...has a 1.57 ERA in the first inning, 4.95 after that... has the fourth lowest ERA in the first inning in the AL... was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-3 A's loss to Seattle last Saturday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 2 so)... was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance against Chicago, a 6-1 A's loss in Oakland earlier this year on April 7 (5.1 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 4 so).
