OAKLAND ATHLETICS (52-69) VS. CHICAGO WHITE SOX (57-63)

FRIDAY, AUGUST 19, 2016 — U.S. CELLULAR FIELD — 7:10 P.M. CDT RHP KENDALL GRAVEMAN (8-8, 4.37) VS. RHP JAMES SHIELDS (5-14, 5.78) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Were swept in a three-game series at Texas to start the road trip and now have a five-game losing streak...this is the A's fourth losing streak of five or more games this year and is two short of the season high of seven (June 3-11)...are now 5-14 over the last 19 games and are a season-high 17 games under .500 at 52-69 (.430)...that is the fourth worst record in the American League and it matches the 2015 A's for the fifth worst record after 121 games in Oakland history...with a loss tonight, the A's would have their worst record after 122 games since 1997 (49-73)... are in fourth place in the AL West and trail first place Texas by a seasonhigh 191/2 games...have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3... have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 50 days in fourth, 16 days tied for fourth and 30 days in fifth.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-11 with a 6.43 ERA (66 er in 92.1 ip) and .306 (115-for-376) opponents batting average over the last 18 games...have tossed fewer than 5.0 innings seven times over that span and have 36 such games for the season, which are the most in the majors and the most by an A's team since 1999 (37)...are 32-53 with a 5.14 ERA (374 er in 654.1 ip) for the season...have the fewest innings pitched in the American League, are tied for the most losses, have the second highest ERA and the second fewest wins...have not walked a batter in eight of the last 13 games (11 bb in 72.0 ip, 1.38 walks per nine innings).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.87 ERA (40 er in 61.1 ip) over the last seven games and now have a 4.66 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...are tied for second in the AL in most wild pitches (58), have the third highest opponents batting average (.267) and the fourth highest slugging percentage (.430) and on-base percentage (.331)...have allowed two grand slams in the last seven games and four for the season, which is tied for the most in the AL.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .230 (98-for-427) with 36 runs scored over the last 13 games (2.8 runs per game)...have walked one time or fewer in five of the last six games and have 304 walks for the season, which is second fewest in the majors to Kansas City (276)...are on pace for 407 walks, which would break the Athletics record for fewest walks in a 162-game season (421 in 1966)...have a .303 on-base percentage, which is the lowest mark in the American League and third lowest in the majors... rank second in the AL in fewest runs scored (482) and fewest strikeouts (829) and fourth in lowest batting average (.250), lowest slugging percentage (.401) and fewest extra base hits (342).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 20 errors in the last 48 games after making 53 over the first 73 contests...A's outfielders have 17 assists, which is tied for second fewest in the American League.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-3 on this six-game road trip to Texas (0-3) and Chicago-AL (three games) and have now lost eight of their last nine road games...went 3-6 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1), Cleveland (0-3) and Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and are 24-34 (.414) on the road...return home following the game Sunday for a three-game homestand against Cleveland...went 4-6 on the last homestand against Chicago-NL (0-3), Baltimore (3-1) and Seattle (1-2) and are 28-35 (.444) at home, which is the second worst home record in the American League...have a 5.34 ERA (297 er in 500.2 ip) on the road compared to 4.07 (259 er in 573.0 ip) at home... have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Cincinnati, 5.36)...are batting .259 (529-for-2044) on the road compared to .241 (500-for-2079) at home...have the fourth highest road batting average in the AL and the third lowest home average

MARGIN OF VICTORY: Each of the A's last 17 wins have been by three runs or fewer (10 one-run, four two-run, three three-run)...have not won a game by more than three runs since a 7-1 win over San Francisco on June 29...are 39-38 (.506) in games decided by three runs or fewer compared to 13-31 (.295) in games decided by four runs or more...the record in games decided by four or more is second worst in the majors (Atlanta, 12-34)... have a run differential of -104, which is the worst in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...the last time the A's were outscored by more than 44 runs in a season was in 1997 (-182).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have eight walk-off losses, all against American League West opponents...are tied for the AL lead in walk-off games (14) and rank third in walk-off losses...have won 10 of their last 16 one-run games and are 19-19 (.500) for the season...rank fourth in the American League in one-run games (38)...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year, which was the second worst record in the majors...are 5-4 in extra inning games and 13-12 in games decided in the last at bat.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Tyler Ladendorf on the 15-day disabled list Wednesday to set an Oakland record for using the DL...it marks the 26th time the A's have placed a player on the DL, breaking the Oakland record of 25 set in 2008...the 26 players have combined to miss 1252 games (48.1 games per stint) and the games missed will set an Oakland record...the current mark is 1397 in 2010...have a season-high 15 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Gray, Hahn, Ladendorf, Lambo, Lowrie, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard), including 11 on the 60-day DL (all but Doolittle, Gray, Hahn and Ladendorf)... prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once... have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4, at least nine every day since May 6 and at least six all year ...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

ROSTER NOTES: Chad Pinder, who was called up on Wednesday but did not play, will become the 46th player to appear in a game for the A's this year...he will be the 14th rookie and the 11th to make his Major League debut in 2016 (including Eibner, who debuted with the Royals)...the As have made a total of 156 player moves in 138 days dating back to Opening Day, April 4...have employed 25 pitchers, 10 of which have been rookies...that is tied for the fourth most rookie pitchers in Oakland history...the Oakland record for most rookie pitchers is 12 (2009, 2012, 2015)...seven of those 10 have made their Major League debut this year.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 0-3 in this five-series stretch where they will play in five different cities (Texas, Chicago, Oakland vs. Cleveland, St. Louis and Houston)...have lost 14 of the last 18 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 13-19 (.406) in those games for the season, which is the worst record in the American League...are 17-28 (.378) in day games, which is the second worst record in the majors (San Diego, 10-29)...A's pinch hitters are 2 for their last 20 (.100)...rank second in the AL in hits (19), RBI (13) and plate appearances (92) \dots A's designated hitters have the second fewest RBI in the AL (47), the third lowest batting average (.228) and the fourth fewest home runs (14)...15 of the A's previous 22 games have been against teams that were in first place in their division at the time of the game...are 5-10 in those games.

A's vs. WHITE SOX: The A's trail in the season series 1-3 after losing three of four games in Oakland to start the season...have lost the season series in each of the previous two seasons and are 6-12 against the White Sox over the last three years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 301-284 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 159-137 in Oakland and 142-147 in Chicago...including 60-59 at U.S. Cellular Field...all-time, the A's are 978-1039 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Butler is hitting .400 (20-for-50) with two home runs, eight RBI and seven multiple hit games over his last 15 games... Coco Crisp is batting a Major League leading .443 with runners in scoring position...led off the game with a home run for the second time this year and 15th time as an Athletic on Wednesday...in Athletics history, only Rickey Henderson (43) and Eddie Joost (19) have more... *Marcus Semien* has a consecutive games played streak of 123, which is the second longest active streak in the majors...it matches the longest such streak by an Athletic over the last 13 years (Chavez, 2005)...the last longer streak is Miguel Tejada's Oakland record streak of 594 (June 2, 2000-Sept. 28, 2003).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1931 Lefty Grove wins his 16th consecutive game, tying the American League record set by Walter Johnson and Joe Wood in 1912...in 1989, in the midst of a 19-game hitting streak, Carney Lansford records his 1000th hit in an A's uniform...in 1991 Jose Canseco hits his 200th career home run in the A's 8-7 win at Minnesota...he becomes the second Oakland Athletic and fifth Athletic all-time to reach the 200 plateau...in 2010 Trevor Cahill allows seven hits, ending a modern major league record tying stretch of 20 consecutive starts with six hits or fewer and five innings or more

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (8-8, 4.37 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 7-2 with a 3.83 ERA (37 er in 87.0 ip) over his last 14 starts after going 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts...six of those wins have came since June 23, which is tied for fifth most in the American League over that span...however, is 1-2 with a 5.40 ERA (14 er in 23.1 ip) and .292 (28-for-96) opponents batting average over his last four starts.

DON'T WALK: Has walked two batters or fewer in 12 of his last 13 starts and has 15 walks in 81.0 innings over that span for an average of 1.67 per nine innings...walked 22 batters over his first 10 starts and 53.0 innings (3.74 per nine innings)...has walked just five batters to lead off an inning, which is tied for fourth fewest in the American League among pitchers with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title...has walked just eight right-handed batters compared to 29 left-handers...has walked one batter or fewer in 13 of his 23 starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has the fifth highest opponents batting average in the American League (.281) and the seventh highest on-base percentage (.330)...ranks third in fewest strikeouts per nine innings (5.37), fifth in fewest pitches per game (89.7), tied for seventh in opponents reaching on an error (7) and tied for ninth in grounded into double plays (16).

THE LONG BALL: Allowed 10 home runs over his first seven starts and 37.0 innings through May 14 (2.43 per nine innings), two over his next 10 starts and 57.2 innings from May 19 to July 9 (0.31 per nine innings), and six over his last six starts and 39.1 innings (1.37 per nine innings)

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-4 with a 3.03 ERA (22 er in 65.1 ip) in 10 starts at home compared to 4-4 with a 5.64 ERA (43 er in 68.2 ip) in 13 starts on the road...has the ninth lowest home ERA in the American League and the fifth highest road ERA...has surrendered just five home runs in 65.1 innings at home compared to 13 in 68.2 innings on the road.

SUPPORT: Has left with the lead in four of his starts only to have the bullpen blow the save (April 12 vs. Los Angeles-AL, June 17 vs. Los Angeles, June 28 vs. San Francisco, July 29 at Cleveland)...is averaging 5.38 (52 rs in 87.0 ip) runs of support over his last 14 starts after receiving an average of 2.30 runs of support over his first nine starts...is 0-5 with two runs of support or fewer, 8-2 with three runs of support or more...is now 1-14 in 20 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 13-3 in 24 starts with three runs of support or more.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 1-1 with a 5.82 ERA (11 er in 17.0 ip) and .310 (22-for-71) over his first three starts in August after going 4-1 with a 2.68 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in five starts in July...the July wins tied for third in the American League and were his most ever in a month...had just three wins over the first three months of the season... went 1-0 with a 4.33 ERA in five starts in June...was 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in six starts in May...his May loss total tied for second in the AL...it was the first time he has lost four games in a month in his career...went 1-2 with a 4.03 ERA in four starts in April.

THIS AND THAT: Is scheduled to make his 24th start of the season to-day, which is an on-going career high...is in his second full season and has career highs in every category except losses and walks...his ERA, opponents batting average and OPS are higher that his marks from last year...has a 1.57 ERA (4 er in 23.0 ip) in the first inning, 4.95 (61 er in 111.0 ip) after that...has the fourth lowest ERA in the first inning in the American League...has allowed a .154 (32-for-208) batting average with two strikes...has tossed seven or more innings just five times this year and 11 times in 43 career starts...went 1-2 with a 7.29 ERA over the first nine games (four starts) of his career through April 25, 2015, 5-2 with a 1.78 ERA over a nine-start stretch from May 23-July 4, 2015, 1-11 with a 5.57 ERA over a 17-start stretch from July 10, 2015-May 24, 2016 and is 7-2 with a 3.83 ERA (37 er in 87.0 ip) over his last 12 starts.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Allowed four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts, joining John Odom (1969) and Mike Norris (1980) as the only pitchers in Oakland history on an Opening Day roster to allow four hits or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of their first three starts...picked up his first win of the season and struck out a career-high eight batters April 20 at New York (AL)...it snapped a career-high six-game losing streak dating back to July 10, 2015...compiled a 5.52 ERA and .276 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned nine starts...struck out in the fifth inning in his first professional at bat that day...then lost each of his next five starts from April 25 to May 19...logged a 7.92 ERA and .361 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which fell one short of his career high of six...allowed a career-high 10 hits in back-to-back starts on April 25 at Detroit and May 2 against Seattle...is the first A's pitcher with at least 10 hits in back-to-back starts since Brandon McCarthy (April 16-21, 2012)...yielded a career-high four home runs in an 11-3 loss at Baltimore May 8...snapped his five-game losing streak in a 3-2 win over Minnesota May 30...issued a career-high tying four walks but allowed just

one run in 6.2 innings of work in a 3-1 win at Minnesota July 4...tossed 8.0 innings July 9 at Houston, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer dating back to June 18 of last year...that was the fifth longest such streak in Oakland history...tossed a career-high 112 pitches in 7.0 innings in a 7-4 win over Houston July 18...fired his second career complete game in the A's 4-3 win over Tampa Bay on July 23 in Oakland...it was his first complete game win...allowed nine hits, which were the most by an A's pitcher in a complete game since Mark Redman allowed 12 on May 13, 2004 against Detroit...had his career high six-game winning streak come to an end in the A's 5-3 loss at Cleveland July 29...the streak doubled his previous best (3, June 24-July 4, 2015) and matched the longest by an A's pitcher this year (Hill)...compiled a 3.25 ERA and .264 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 10 starts from May 30 to July 23.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss to Seattle last Saturday in Oakland...blanked the Mariners on three hits over the first three innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Cruz in the fourth...allowed three more runs in the fifth on a Smith RBI single and a Cano two-run homer.

LHP Ross Detwiler (1-1, 4.15 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville Aug. 10 and is 1-1 with a 3.55 ERA in two starts in his A's debut...was a non-roster invitee with Cleveland this spring and made the Indians Opening Day roster...logged a 5.79 ERA in seven relief appearances before he was designated for assignment April 29...was outrighted to Triple-A Columbus May 1 and traded to the A's in a minor league deal for cash considerations on July 17...is 1-1 with a 3.55 ERA in his two starts compared to 0-0 with a 5.79 ERA in seven relief appearances...is 18-35 with a 4.24 ERA in 78 career starts and 4-3 with a 4.04 ERA in 104 career relief appearances...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 5-2 A's loss at Texas on Monday (4.2 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 3 so)...is 0-0 with a 6.75 ERA (2.2 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 1 so, 0 hr) in two career appearances against Chicago, both in relief last year at U.S. Cellular Field while pitching for Texas.

- The A's bullpen has allowed 14 runs over its last seven games (23.2 ip, 5.32 ERA) after allowing a total of eight earned runs over its previous 14 contests (1.49 ERA).
- Has tossed 419.1 innings, which is the most in the American League and third most in the majors.
- Has allowed 49-of-201 (24.4%) inherited runners to score, which is the best percentage in the AL (Tampa Bay, 25.7%) and third best in the maiors.
- Is tied for third in the AL in opponents grounded into double plays (40), ranks fourth in strikeouts (393), fifth in fewest losses (15) and tied for fifth in wins (20)...is tied for second in most wild pitches (26) and ranks third in walks (149) and blown saves (17).
