ABOUT THE A'S: Last night's win snapped a five-game losing streak, which was the A's fourth losing streak of five or more games this year (season high is seven, June 3-11...are now 6-14 over the last 20 games... have the fourth worst record in the American League and it matches the 2015 A's for the fifth worst record after 122 games in Oakland history... with a loss tonight, the A's would keep pace with last year's team for the fifth worst record in Oakland history after 123 games...are in fourth place in the AL West and trail first place Texas by a season-high 19½ games... have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 51 days in fourth, 16 days tied for fourth and 30 days in fifth.

STARTING PITCHING: Despite last night's shutout, A's starting pitchers are just 5-11 with a 5.86 ERA (66 er in 101.1 ip) and .290 (117-for-404) opponents batting average over the last 19 games...have tossed fewer than 5.0 innings seven times over that span and have 36 such games for the season, which are the most in the majors and the most by an A's team since 1999 (37)...are 33-53 with a 5.07 ERA (374 er in 663.1 ip) for the season...have the third fewest innings pitched in the American League, are tied for the most losses, have the second highest ERA and the second fewest wins...have not walked a batter in nine of the last 14 games (11 bb in 81.0 ip, 1.22 walks per nine innings).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.12 ERA (40 er in 70.1 ip) over the last eight games and now have a 4.62 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...are tied for second in the AL in most wild pitches (58), have the third highest opponents batting average (.266) and the sixth highest slugging percentage (.427) and on-base percentage (.329)...have allowed two grand slams in the last eight games and four for the season, which is tied for the most in the AL.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .234 (109-for-465) with 45 runs scored over the last 14 games (3.2 runs per game)...have walked one time or fewer in five of the last seven games and have 308 walks for the season, which is second fewest in the majors to Kansas City (283)...are on pace for 408 walks, which would break the Athletics record for fewest walks in a 162-game season (421 in 1966)...have a .304 on-base percentage, which is the lowest mark in the American League and third lowest in the majors...rank third in the AL in fewest runs scored (491) and second in fewest strikeouts (836)...are fourth in lowest batting average (.250) and slugging percentage (.403) and fifth in fewest extra base hits (348).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 21 errors in the last 49 games after making 53 over the first 73 contests...A's outfielders have 17 assists, which is tied for second fewest in the American League.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-3 on this six-game road trip to Texas (0-3) and Chicago-AL (1-0) and have lost eight of their last 10 road games...went 3-6 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1), Cleveland (0-3) and Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and are 25-34 (.424) on the road...return home following tomorrow's game for a three-game homestand against Cleveland...went 4-6 on the last homestand against Chicago-NL (0-3), Baltimore (3-1) and Seattle (1-2) and are 28-35 (.444) at home, which is tied for the second worst home record in the American League...have a 5.24 ERA (297 er in 509.2 ip) on the road compared to 4.07 (259 er in 573.0 ip) at home...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Cincinnati, 5.36)...are batting .259 (540-for-2082) on the road compared to .241 (500-for-2079) at home...have the fourth highest road batting average in the AL and the third lowest home average.

MARGIN OF VICTORY: Prior to last night, each of the A's last 17 wins had been by three runs or fewer (10 one-run, four two-run, three three-run)...last night's win was their first by more than three runs since a 7-1 win over San Francisco on June 29...are 39-38 (.506) in games decided by three runs or fewer compared to 14-31 (.311) in games decided by four runs or more...the record in games decided by four or more is second worst in the majors (Atlanta, 12-34)...have a run differential of -95, which is the worst in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...the last time the A's were outscored by more than 44 runs in a season was in 1997 (-182).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have eight walk-off losses, all against American League West opponents...are tied for the AL lead in walk-off games (14)

and rank third in walk-off losses...have won 10 of their last 16 one-run games and are 19-19 (.500) for the season...rank fourth in the American League in one-run games (38)...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year, which was the second worst record in the majors...are 5-4 in extra inning games and 13-12 in games decided in the last at bat.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Tyler Ladendorf on the 15-day disabled list Wednesday to set an Oakland record for using the DL...it marks the 26th time the A's have placed a player on the DL, breaking the Oakland record of 25 set in 2008...the 26 players have combined to miss 1267 games (48.7 games per stint) and the games missed will set an Oakland record...the current mark is 1397 in 2010...have a season-high 15 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Gray, Hahn, Ladendorf, Lambo, Lowrie, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard), including 11 on the 60-day DL (all but Doolittle, Gray, Hahn and Ladendorf)...prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4, at least nine every day since May 6 and at least six all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

ROSTER NOTES: Chad Pinder, who was called up on Wednesday but has not played yet, will become the 46th player to appear in a game for the A's this year...he will be the 14th rookie and the 11th to make his Major League debut in 2016 (including Eibner, who debuted with the Royals)...the A's have made a total of 156 player moves in 138 days dating back to Opening Day, April 4...have employed 25 pitchers, 10 of which have been rookies...that is tied for the fourth most rookie pitchers in Oakland history...the Oakland record for most rookie pitchers is 12 (2009, 2012, 2015)...seven of those 10 have made their Major League debut this year.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 1-3 in this five-series stretch where they will play in five different cities (Texas, Chicago, Oakland vs. Cleveland, St. Louis and Houston)...have lost 14 of the last 18 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 13-19 (.406) in those games for the season, which is the worst record in the American League...are 17-28 (.378) in day games, which is the second worst record in the majors (San Diego, 10-29)...A's pinch hitters are 2 for their last 20 (.100)...rank second in the AL in hits (19), RBI (13) and plate appearances (92)...A's designated hitters have the second fewest RBI in the AL (49), the fourth lowest batting average (.233) and are tied for the fourth fewest home runs (15)...15 of the A's last 23 games have been against teams that were in first place in their division at the time of the game...are 5-10 in those games.

A's vs. WHITE SOX: The A's trail in the season series 2-3 after losing three of four games in Oakland to start the season...have lost the season series in each of the previous two seasons and are 7-12 against the White Sox over the last three years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 302-284 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 159-137 in Oakland and 143-147 in Chicago...including 61-59 at U.S. Cellular Field...all-time, the A's are 979-1039 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp is batting a Major League leading .435 with runners in scoring position...**Marcus Semien** has a consecutive games played streak of 124, which is the longest by an Athletic since Miguel Tejada set the Athletics record with a 594-game streak from June 2, 2000-Sept. 28, 2003...**Khris Davis** is tied for third in the American League with 31 home runs, an ongoing career high...last night, **Kendall Graveman** threw the A's first nine-inning shutout with fewer than 100 pitches since Rich Harden on July 14, 2005 vs. Texas (two hits, 80 pitches).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1959 Bob Cerv hits three home runs in Kansas City's 11-10 loss to Boston...in 1963 the A's sweep a doubleheader from Washington...Moe Drabowsky tosses a one-hit shutout in a 9-0 win in Game 1 and Jerry Lumpe hits a two-run home run in the bottom of the 14th inning of Game 2, a 7-5 victory...in 1987 Jose Canseco ties an Oakland record with three doubles, but the A's lose 7-6 to Toronto.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Ross Detwiler (1-1, 4.15 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville Aug. 10 and is 1-1 with a 3.55 ERA (5 er in 12.2 ip) in two starts in his A's debut...was a non-roster invitee with Cleveland this spring and made the Indians Opening Day roster...logged a 5.79 ERA in seven relief appearances before he was designated for assignment April 29...was outrighted to Triple-A Columbus May 1 and traded to the A's organization in a minor league deal for cash considerations on July 17.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 1-1 with a 3.55 ERA (5 er in 12.2 ip) in his two starts compared to 0-0 with a 5.79 ERA (3 er in 4.2 ip) in seven relief appearances...picked up the win in his first start this year on Aug. 10 against Baltimore...it was his first win as a starter since May 10, 2013 against Chicago (NL)...made 69 starts with Washington from 2009-13 but has just nine since then, including seven with Texas last year and two with the A's this year...has made 182 career appearances with Washington (2007, 09-14), Texas (2015), Atlanta (2015), Cleveland (2016) and Oakland (2016)...is 18-35 with a 4.24 ERA (199 er in 422.0 ip) in his 78 career starts and 4-3 with a 4.04 ERA (56 er in 124.2 ip) in 104 career relief appearances.

WITH CLEVELAND: Opponents were 3-for-16 (.188) with Cleveland but he issued four walks in 4.2 innings for a .333 on-base percentage...all three of the hits were for extra bases (two doubles, one home run) for a .500 slugging percentage...allowed 1-of-4 (25.0%) inherited runners to score...first batters faced were 2-for-6 (.333) with a walk...tossed fewer than one inning in six of his seven appearances and his season high was 1.0 on April 17 against New York (NL).

FIRST START: Combined with Axford on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win over Baltimore on August 10 in Oakland...tossed a career-high eight innings and allowed six of the hits...matched his career high with 108 pitches...did not walk a batter...is the third pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least 8.0 scoreless innings in his A's debut (Mike Norris, 9.0 on April 10, 1975 and Tommy Milone, 8.0 on April 9, 2012)...allowed four base runners to advance into scoring position but retired each of the final 12 batters that he faced.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-2 loss at Texas on Monday...the A's scored single runs in each of the first two innings and he blanked the Rangers on two hits and two walks over the first three innings...then allowed a RBI single to Andrus in the fourth and a grand slam to Beltre in the fifth for the loss.

the Clippers (3.02 per nine innings) but then walked just four batters in 23.1 innings with the Sounds (1.54 per nine innings...struck out 24 at Nashville for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 6.0...went 0-4 with a 5.84 ERA over his first eight starts through June 11...finished the Triple-A portion of his campaign by going 6-0 with a 3.31 ERA over his final eight games, seven starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .256 opponents batting average, including .252 (58-for-230) against right-handed hitters compared to .265 (26-for-98) against left-handed hitters...surrendered nine of his 10 home runs to righties...nine were solo shots...opponents batted .229 with the bases empty compared to .301 with runners on base...allowed a .357 average with runners in scoring position with Columbus, .118 with Nashville...yielded a .313 batting average to batters leading off an inning.

THIS AND THAT: Tossed six or more innings in nine of his 16 appearances, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer 11 times...had a 7.20 ERA (12 er in 15.0 ip) in the first inning, a 3.80 ERA (30 er in 71.0 ip) after that...Columbus was 4-8 in his starting assignments and Nashville was 3-0...his one relief appearance came in his first outing with the Sounds on July 20 at Albuquerque...Jesse Hahn started that game and tossed 1.0 innings prior to a July 24 call-up to Oakland.

MINOR LEAGUE HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed just 2.0 innings and 35 pitches in his first start **May 7** at Toledo as he began to build up his pitch count following his relief role with the Indians...logged fewer than five innings in each of his first four starts...then tossed 7.0 scoreless innings against Durham **May 27** but had a no decision in a 2-0 win...was 0-3 with a 3.42 ERA over his first six starts...then allowed 14 runs in 10.2 innings over his next two starts (11.81 ERA)...yielded six runs on a season-high 10 hits in 6.2 innings in a 7-1 loss to Indianapolis **June 6** and a season-high eight runs in 4.0 innings in a no decision in a 15-12 loss to Scranton/Wilkes-Barre on **June 11**...walked four batters in that game, which was a season-high until he issued five free passes in 4.0 innings in his next start **June 17** at Syracuse...picked up his first win of the season **June 22** against Rochester when allowed one run in 7.0 innings in a 7-2 victory...tossed a season-high 7.1 innings in each of his final two starts with Columbus on **June 27** at Lehigh Valley and **July 8** at Louisville...allowed one run in 5.0 innings of relief in his first outing with Nashville on **July 20** at Albuquerque...struck out a season-high nine batters in 6.0 innings in his first start, a 12-5 victory over Omaha **July 25**...combined with Brasier and Healy on a six-hit 2-0 shutout at New Orleans **July 30**...tossed 6.1 innings and allowed four of the hits.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Jesse Hahn (2-4, 6.02 ERA): Will be reinstated from the 15-day disabled list tomorrow and is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season...was placed on the DL August 5 with a strained right shoulder...made one rehab start with Triple-A Nashville on Tuesday and had a no decision (4.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 6 so, 79 pitches)...is in his fourth stint with the A's this year...has allowed eight home runs in 46.1 innings this year (1.55 per nine innings) after surrendering nine home runs in 170.0 innings over his first two seasons (0.48 per nine innings)...is 2-1 with a 3.90 ERA in five starts during the day compared to 0-3 with a 9.92 ERA in four starts at night...had a no decision in his last Major League start, an 8-6 A's win in 10 innings at Los Angeles (AL) on Aug. 4 (4.0 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 2 so)...had a no decision in his only career appearance against Chicago, a start in the A's 7-6 loss in Oakland last year on May 15 (6.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 5 so).

- Is tied for 11th among American League relievers in games pitched (53)...is tied for the second most blown saves in the majors (6).
