OAKLAND ATHLETICS (53-70) VS. CHICAGO WHITE SOX (58-64)

SUNDAY, AUGUST 21, 2016 — U.S. CELLULAR FIELD — 1:10 P.M. CDT RHP ZACH NEAL (2-2, 5.19) VS. LHP JOSE QUINTANA (9-9, 2.85) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have now lost six of their last seven games and are 6-15 over the last 21 games...have the fourth worst record in the American League and it matches the 2015 A's for the fifth worst record after 123 games in Oakland history...with a loss today, the A's would keep pace with last year's team for the fifth worst record in Oakland history after 124 games...are in fourth place in the AL West and trail first place Texas by a season-high tying 19½ games...have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 52 days in fourth, 16 days tied for fourth and 30 days in fifth.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 5-12 with a 6.15 ERA (72 er in 105.1 ip) and .290 (127-for-438) opponents batting average over the last 20 games...have tossed fewer than 5.0 innings eight times over that span and have 37 such games for the season, which are the most in the majors and the most by an A's team since 1999, when they also had 37... are 33-54 with a 5.12 ERA (380 er in 667.1 ip) for the season...have the second fewest innings pitched in the American League, are tied for the most losses, have the second highest ERA and the second fewest wins... however, have not walked a batter in nine of the last 15 games (12 bb in 85.0 ip, 1.27 walks per nine innings).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.29 ERA (46 er in 78.1 ip) over the last nine games and now have a 4.64 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...are third in the AL in most wild pitches (58), have the third highest opponents batting average (.266) and the sixth highest slugging percentage (.427) and on-base percentage (.329)...have allowed two grand slams in the last nine games and four for the season, which is tied for the most in the AL.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .231 (115-for-498) with 47 runs scored over the last 15 games (3.1 runs per game)...have walked one time or fewer in five of the last eight games and have 311 walks for the season, which is second fewest in the majors to Kansas City (285)...are on pace for 409 walks, which would break the Athletics record for fewest walks in a 162-game season (421 in 1966)...have a .304 on-base percentage, which is the lowest mark in the American League and third lowest in the majors... are tied for second in the AL in fewest runs scored (493) and are second in fewest strikeouts (845)...are fourth in lowest batting average (.249) and slugging percentage (.402) and fifth in fewest extra base hits (349).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just four errors in their last 13 games but have 21 errors in the last 50 games...made 53 over the first 73 contests...A's outfielders have 17 assists, which is the second fewest in the American League.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-4 on this six-game road trip to Texas (0-3) and Chicago-AL (1-1) and have lost nine of their last 11 road games... went 3-6 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1), Cleveland (0-3) and Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and are 25-35 (.417) on the road...return home following today's game for a three-game homestand against Cleveland...went 4-6 on the last homestand against Chicago-NL (0-3), Baltimore (3-1) and Seattle (1-2) and are 28-35 (.444) at home, which is the second worst home record in the American League...have a 5.27 ERA (303 er in 517.2 ip) on the road compared to 4.07 (259 er in 573.0 ip) at home...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Cincinnati, 5.36)...are batting .258 (546-for-2115) on the road compared to .241 (500-for-2079) at home...have the sixth highest road batting average in the AL and the third lowest home average.

MARGIN OF VICTORY: Prior to Friday's 9-0 win, each of the A's last 17 wins had been by three runs or fewer (10 one-run, four two-run, three three-run)...Friday's win was their first by more than three runs since a 7-1 win over San Francisco on June 29...are 39-38 (.506) in games decided by three runs or fewer compared to 14-32 (.304) in games decided by four runs or more...the record in games decided by four or more is second worst in the majors (Atlanta, 12-34)...have a run differential of -99, which is the worst in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...the last time the A's were outscored by more than 44 runs in a season was in 1997 (-182).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have eight walk-off losses, all against American League West opponents...are tied for the AL lead in walk-off games (14) and rank third in walk-off losses...have won 10 of their last 16 one-run

games and are 19-19 (.500) for the season...rank fourth in the American League in one-run games (38)...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year, which was the second worst record in the majors...are 5-4 in extra inning games and 13-12 in games decided in the last at bat.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Tyler Ladendorf on the 15-day disabled list Wednesday to set an Oakland record for using the DL...it marks the 26th time the A's have placed a player on the DL, breaking the Oakland record of 25 set in 2008...the 26 players have combined to miss 1282 games (49.3 games per stint) and the games missed will set an Oakland record...the current mark is 1397 in 2010...have a season-high 15 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Gray, Hahn, Ladendorf, Lambo, Lowrie, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard), including 11 on the 60-day DL (all but Doolittle, Gray, Hahn and Ladendorf)... prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once... have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4, at least nine every day since May 6 and at least six all year ...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

ROSTER NOTES: Chad Pinder, who was called up on Wednesday and made his Major League debut last night, became the 46th player to appear in a game for the A's this year...he was the 14th rookie and the 11th to make his Major League debut in 2016 (including Eibner, who debuted with the Royals)...the A's have made a total of 156 player moves in 138 days dating back to Opening Day, April 4...have employed 25 pitchers, 10 of which have been rookies...that is tied for the fourth most rookie pitchers in Oakland history...the Oakland record for most rookie pitchers is 12 (2009, 2012, 2015)...seven of those 10 have made their Major League debut this year.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 1-4 in this five-series stretch where they will play in five different cities (Texas, Chicago, Oakland vs. Cleveland, St. Louis and Houston)...have lost 15 of the last 19 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 13-20 (.394) in those games for the season, which is the worst record in the American League...are 17-28 (.378) in day games, which is the second worst record in the majors (San Diego, 10-29)...A's pinch hitters are 2 for their last 20 (.100)...rank second in the AL in hits (19), RBI (13) and plate appearances (92) ...A's designated hitters have the second fewest RBI in the AL (50), the fourth lowest batting average (.235) and are have the fifth fewest home runs (16)...15 of the A's last 24 games have been against teams that were in first place in their division at the time of the game...are 5-10 in those games.

A's vs. WHITE SOX: The A's have lost the season series to the White Sox (down 4-2 with one game left) and have now lost the season series for the third straight year...are 7-13 against the White Sox over the last three years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 302-285 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 159-137 in Oakland and 143-148 in Chicago...including 61-60 at U.S. Cellular Field...all-time, the A's are 979-1040 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp is batting a Major League leading .435 with runners in scoring position...Marcus Semien has a consecutive games played streak of 125, which is the longest by an Athletic since Miguel Tejada set the Athletics record with a 594-game streak from June 2, 2000-Sept. 28, 2003...Danny Valencia has six straight multiple hit games, which ties a career high (also August 4-September 1, 2013 with Baltimore).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1983 Rickey Henderson steals the 399th base of his career, breaking Bert Campaneris' Oakland record of 398...in 1997 Jason Giambi, Ernie Young, Jason McDonald and Jose Canseco all homer in the third inning of the A's 13-6 win over Boston...the four home runs in an inning sets an Oakland record...in 2002 Cory Lidle tosses his second complete game one-hitter of the season in the A's 6-0 win at Cleveland, extending his scoreless streak to 31 innings...the streak would end at 32 innings in his next start on August 26...in 2006 the A's tie what was then an Oakland record by overcoming an eight-run deficit to defeat Toronto, 12-10...Dan Haren allows eight runs in the first two innings and nine runs total, setting an Oakland record for runs allowed in a win.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Zach Neal (2-2, 5.19 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 14th appearance and fourth start of the season and his career...was recalled from Nashville July 21 for his fourth stint with the A's this year and is 1-1 with a 2.84 ERA (6 er in 19.0 ip) and .200 (14-for-70) opponents batting average in five games, including two starts, since his return...was first selected from Nashville May 11 and made his Major League debut that night at Boston...was optioned back to the Sounds May 13...returned May 25 and made his first ML start that day at Seattle, a loss...pitched once more in relief before he was optioned to Nashville May 31...joined the A's for a third time June 10 and compiled a 4.70 ERA in five relief appearances while recording his first win and save before he was optioned to Nashville June 30.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 1-2 with a 7.98 ERA (13 er in 14.2 ip) in his three starting assignments compared to 1-0 with a 3.15 ERA in 10 relief appearances...first batters faced are 4-for-10 (.400)...has not inherited any runners...has tossed at least one inning in nine of his 10 relief appearances, including a season-high 3.0 innings on four separate occasions.

LAST EIGHT, FIRST FIVE: Is 2-1 with a 2.78 ERA (7 er in 22.2 ip), .247 (21-for-85) opponents batting average and two home runs in 22.2 innings over his last eight games dating back to June 18...went 0-1 with a save, a 9.75 ERA, .340 opponents batting average and four home runs in 12.0 innings over his first five contests.

DON'T WALK: Has issued just two walks in 34.2 innings, an average of 0.52 walks per nine innings...that is the lowest mark in the majors among pitchers with 30 or more innings pitched...has struck out just 12, an average of 3.12 per nine innings, which is also the lowest in the majors using the 30.0 innings minimum...issued his first walk with two outs in the sixth inning on July 30 at Cleveland to snap a career-opening nine-game, 18.2-inning, 80-batter faced streak without a walk...the career-opening streak of 18.2 innings without a walk was the longest such streak by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1913...the previous high was 15.1 by Paul Lindblad (Sept. 15, 1965-April 28, 1966).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has yielded five of his six home runs and issued his only two walks to left-handed hitters...has an .894 OPS against left-handers compared to .647 against right-handers...opponents are 13-for-36 (.361) with five doubles and three home runs (.750 slugging percentage) when leading off an inning...has yielded a .250 (22-for-88) batting average with the bases empty, .340 (17-for-50) with runners on...opponents are 12-for-31 (.387) with runners in scoring position, including 6-for-13 (.462) with RISP and two outs.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-1 with a 3.92 ERA (9 er in 20.2 ip) and .238 (19-for-80) opponents batting average in seven games at home compared to 1-1 with a 7.07 ERA (11 er in 14.0 ip) and .345 (20-for-58) opponents average in six games on the road.

2016 IN RELIEF: Made his Major League debut May 11 at Boston, tossing three innings of relief in the A's 13-3 loss...entered the game to start the sixth inning with the A's trailing 10-3...fanned Bradley, Jr. with one out in the sixth inning for his first Major League strikeout...struck out a careerhigh two batters in his debut...picked up his first Major League save June 13 against Texas when he tossed the final three innings of the A's 14-5 win...was credited with his first Major League win June 28 at San Francisco when he tossed a scoreless seventh inning in the A's 13-11 win... did not allow a run over his final four relief appearances from June 28 to Aug. 4 (9.1 ip).

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 13-3 loss at Seattle May 25...allowed a career high seven runs...retired the first five batters before Lind homered in the second inning...the scored was tied at 1-1 when he allowed six runs in the bottom of the third...Martin, Smith and Seager had RBI singles and Lind capped the scoring with a three-run home run...retired the side in order in the fourth and was relieved by Rzepczynski to start the fifth.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win over Baltimore on August 9 in Oakland...tossed a career high 5.1 innings...retired each of the first nine batters he faced and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Jones in the fourth...then retired seven of his final eight batters, yielding a leadoff double to Schoop in the sixth.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-4 loss to Seattle last Sunday in Oakland...tossed a career-high 74 pitches and matched his career highs in innings (5.1) and hits (8)...allowed a lead off home run to Lind in the second but the A's came back to tie the game with a run in the bottom of the second...then allowed two runs in the third on a Seager RBI double and a Cano RBI single, and another run in the fourth on an O'Malley RBI single...was relieved by Coulombe after allowing a one-out single to Zunino in the sixth and Coulombe allowed that run to score.

NASHVILLE: Went 7-2 with a 3.21 ERA in 11 starts with Triple-A Nash-ville...walked just eight batters in 61.2 innings, an average of 1.17 per nine innings...had five starts with no walks, four with one walk and two with two walks...took the loss in his first start but then went 6-0 with a 2.95 ERA over his next seven starts...went 1-1 with a 4.50 ERA over his final three starts...posted a 3-0 record and a 0.84 ERA in three starts in May...issued just one walk in 21.1 May innings.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .259 opponents batting average, including .233 (24-for-103) against left-handed hitters compared to .279 (38-for-136) against right-handers...surrendered all five of his home runs to right-handed hitters...had a .551 OPS against lefties, .735 against right-handers...opponents were 12-for-63 (.190) with one walk (.203 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...opponents hit .318 with runners in scoring position.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Was originally selected by the Florida organization in the 17th round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft and was 17-14 with a 3.24 ERA in 59 games, including 46 starts, in three seasons in the Marlins farm system...was released March 26, 2013 and signed with the Oakland organization two days later...is 34-34 with a 3.93 ERA (243 er in 556.0 ip) in 93 games, including 91 starts, in four seasons in the A's farm system...is 51-48 with a 3.71 ERA (338 er in 819.2 ip) in 152 games, 137 starts, in seven seasons in the minors overall...has issued just 164 walks in 819.2 innings, an average of 1.80 per nine innings.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Andrew Triggs (0-1, 4.98 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 22nd appearance and fourth start of the season and his career...was recalled from Triple-A Nashville August 5 for his eighth stint with the A's this year...that is believed to be the most stints in one season in Oakland history...is 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA (5 er in 11.2 ip) in four games, including two starts, during his most recent stay...compiled an 8.00 ERA and .312 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over his first four stints through June 3... is 0-1 with a 2.84 ERA and .247 opponents batting average in 11 games, including three starts, over his last four stints...has not allowed an earned run over innings one through three (12.1 ip)...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-4 A's loss at Texas in 10 innings on Tuesday (5.2 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 so)...has never faced the Indians in his career...was 2-1 with two saves and a 2.95 ERA in 16 appearances with Nashville.
