OAKLAND ATHLETICS (53-71) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (71-51)

MONDAY, AUGUST 22, 2016 — OAKLAND ALAMEDA COLISEUM — 7:05 P.M. PDT RHP ANDREW TRIGGS (0-1, 4.98) VS. RHP CARLOS CARRASCO (8-6, 3.34) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight, seven of the last eight and 16 of the last 22 games to fall a season-high 18 games under .500 at 53-71 (.427)...that is the fourth worst record in the American League and it matches the 2015 A's for the fifth worst record in Oakland history after 124 games...a loss today would give the A's their worst record after 125 games since 1997 (50-75)...are in fourth place in the AL West and trail first place Texas by a season-high 19½ games for the fifth consecutive day...have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 53 days in fourth, 16 days tied for fourth and 30 days in fifth

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than five innings in back-to-back games for the 10th time this year...have 38 games this year with fewer than 5.0 innings, which is the most in the majors and the most by an A's team since 1997 (52)...have not walked a batter in 10 of the last 16 games and have fewer walks (12) than home runs (13) over that span...are 5-13 with a 6.22 ERA (76 er in 110.0 ip) and .302 (135-for-447) opponents batting average over the last 21 games...are 33-55 with a 5.14 ERA (384 er in 672.0 ip) for the season...are tied for the most losses in the American League, have the second highest ERA, the second fewest innings pitched and the second fewest wins...have finished the season with an ERA of 5.00 or more four times in Oakland history (5.94 in 1997, 5.57 in 1996, 5.31 in 1995, 5.19 in 1993).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.21 ERA (50 er in 86.1 ip) over the last seven games and now have a 4.64 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...rank third in the AL in most wild pitches (58) and highest opponents batting average (.267) and fourth in fewest strikeouts (908).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .234 (125-for-534) with 49 runs scored over the last 16 games (3.1 runs per game)...have scored 495 runs for the season, which is tied for second fewest in the American League...rank last in the AL and third to last in the majors in on-base percentage (.304)... have the second fewest walks (312) to Kansas City (286)...are on pace for 408 walks, which would break the Athletics record for fewest walks in a 162-game season (421 in 1966)...rank second in the AL in fewest strikeouts (854) and fourth in lowest batting average (.250) and lowest slugging percentage (.402).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 22 errors in the last 51 games after making 53 over the first 73 contests...have 75 for the season, which is fourth most in the American League...A's outfielders have 18 assists, which is second fewest in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a brief three-game homestand tonight against Cleveland...went 4-6 on the last homestand against Chicago-NL (0-3), Baltimore (3-1) and Seattle (1-2) and are 28-35 (.444) at home, which is the second worst home record in the American League...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Texas (0-3) and Chicago-AL (1-2) and have now lost 10 of their last 12 road games...are 25-36 (.410) on the road for the season...leave on Thursday for a six-game road trip to St. Louis (three games) and Houston (three games)...are batting .241 (500-for-2079) at home compared to .258 (556-for-2151) on the road...have the third lowest home batting average in the AL...have a 4.07 (259 er in 573.0 ip) at home compared to 5.26 ERA (307 er in 525.2 ip) on the road...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Cincinnati, 5.36).

MARGIN OF VICTORY: The A's 9-0 win at Chicago (AL) on Friday snapped a streak of 17 consecutive wins by three runs or fewer (10 one-run, four two-run, three three-run)...it was the A's first win by more than three runs since a 7-1 win over San Francisco on June 29...are 39-39 (.500) in games decided by three runs or fewer compared to 14-32 (.295) in games decided by four runs or more...the record in games decided by four or more is second worst in the majors (Atlanta, 12-34)...have a run differential of -101, which is the worst in the American League and fifth worst in the majors... the last time the A's were outscored by more than 44 runs in a season was in 1997 (-182).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have won 10 of their last 16 one-run games and are 19-19 (.500) for the season...rank fourth in the American League in one-run games (38)...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year, which was the second worst record in the majors...the A's have six walk-off wins and eight walk-off losses...the 14 walk-off games are tied for the most in

the majors...the eight losses are third most in the AL and all have come against AL West competition...are 5-4 in extra inning games and 13-12 in games decided in the last at bat.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Billy Butler on the seven-day concussion disabled list today and have now used the DL an Oakland record 27 times...the previous mark of 25 was set in 2008...the 27 players have combined to miss 1297 games (48.0 games per stint) and the games missed will set an Oakland record...the current mark is 1397 in 2010... have a season-high 16 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Butler, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Gray, Hahn, Ladendorf, Lambo, Lowrie, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard), including 11 on the 60-day DL (all but Butler, Doolittle, Gray, Hahn and Ladendorf)...prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4, at least nine every day since May 6 and at least six all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

ROSTER NOTES: Chad Pinder became the 46th player to appear in a game for the A's this year on Saturday...he is the 14th rookie and the 11th to make his Major League debut in 2016 (including Eibner, who debuted with the Royals)...the A's have made a total of 158 player moves in 141 days dating back to Opening Day, April 4...have employed 25 pitchers, 10 of which have been rookies...that is tied for the fourth most rookie pitchers in Oakland history...the Oakland record for most rookie pitchers is 12 (2009, 2012, 2015)...seven of those 10 have made their Major League debut this year.

THIS AND THAT: Today's game marks the 16th time in the A's last 26 games that their opponent has been in first place in their division at the time of the game...are 5-10 in those games...are 1-5 in this five-series stretch where they will play in five different cities (Texas, Chicago, Oakland vs. Cleveland, St. Louis and Houston)...have lost 16 of the last 20 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 13-21 (.382) in those games for the season, which is the worst record in the American League...are 17-29 (.370) in day games, which is the second worst record in the majors (San Diego, 11-29)...A's pinch hitters are 2 for their last 21 (.095)...rank second in the AL in hits (19), RBI (13) and plate appearances (93)...A's designated hitters have the third fewest RBI in the AL (52) and the fourth lowest batting average (.235).

A's vs. INDIANS: The A's were swept in a three-game series at Cleveland at the end of July to open the season series...over the previous five seasons, the A's have won three seasons series (2012, 14, 15) and lost two (2011, 13)...are 20-20 against the Indians dating back to 2011...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 268-235 against the Indians...that breaks down to 141-103 in Oakland and 127-132 in Cleveland...including 42-63 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 903-1028 against the Indians

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp is batting a Major League leading .429 with runners in scoring position...started the season 0-for-9 with RISP but is 27-for-54 (.500) since then...Khris Davis hit his 32nd home run of the season yesterday, which matches the most by an Athletic over the last eight years (Reddick, 2012)...Liam Hendriks has a 1.99 ERA (7 er in 31.2 ip) and .212 (25-for-118) opponents batting average in 26 games since he was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list on June 19...Marcus Semien has a consecutive games played streak of 126, which is the second longest active streak in the majors and is the longest by an Athletic since Miguel Tejada's Athletics record streak of 594 (June 2, 2000-Sept. 28, 2003)... Danny Valencia has six straight multiple hit games, which matches his career high and the longest streak by an Athletic over the last 17 years.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1971** the A's and the Red Sox are tied at 1-1 entering the bottom of the ninth of the first game of a doubleheader when Reggie Jackson hits an inside the park home run with two outs to give the A's the win...in **1990** Rickey Henderson scores his 744th run in an A's uniform, breaking Reggie Jackson's Oakland record...Rickey finished his A's career with 1270 runs scored.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Andrew Triggs (0-1, 4.98 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 22nd appearance and fourth start of the season and his career...was recalled from Triple-A Nashville August 5 for his eighth stint with the A's this year...that is believed to be the most stints in one season in Oakland history...is 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA (5 er in 11.2 ip) in four games, including two starts, during his most recent stay.

FIRST FOUR STINTS, LAST FOUR STINTS: Compiled an 8.00 ERA and .312 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over his first four stints through June 3...is 0-1 with a 2.84 ERA (8 er in 25.1 ip) and .247 (24-for-97) opponents batting average in 11 games, including three starts, over his last four stints.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 0-1 with a 3.55 ERA (5 er in 12.2 ip) and .208 (10-for-48) opponents batting average in three starts compared to 0-0 with a 5.58 ERA and .302 opponents batting average in 18 relief appearances…has not walked a batter in 12.2 innings as a starter.

INNING BY INNING: Has not allowed an earned run over innings one through three (12.1 ip) and opponents are batting .178 (8-for-45)...has a 6.97 ERA (24 er in 31.0 ip) and .310 (40-for-129) opponents batting average from the fourth inning on.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has issued eight of his 12 walks to left-handed hitters...has yielded a .246 (32-for-130) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .364 (16-for-44) after that...opponents are 6-for-14 (.429) with a double and triple when putting the first pitch in play.

EIGHT STINTS: His stints with the A's this year are from April 26-26, April 29, May 7 (26th man for doubleheader), May 10-June 3, June 18, June 30-July 1, July 4-August 3 (includes stay on the DL from July 18-August 1) and August 5-present...five of his eight stints began less than eight days following his previous option...has three one-day stints and two two-day stints

IN RELIEF: Tossed at least one inning in 17 of his 18 relief appearances, including two or more 10 times...allowed 4-of-8 (50.0%) inherited runners to score...first batters faced were 3-for-17 (.176) with a walk (.222 on-base percentage)...struck out 33 batters in 30.2 innings of relief (9.68 per nine innings)...pitched just once in a game the A's won (May 18 vs. Texas)... made his Major League debut April 25 at Detroit and retired the side in order in the eighth inning (1.0 ip, 1 so)...struck out the first batter he faced (Tyler Collins)...was sent back to Nashville two days later...did not pitch during his second stint and worked just once during his third...was recalled a fourth time May 10 and allowed at least one run in seven of his eight appearances for a 9.00 ERA and .338 opponents batting average...including June 3 at Houston when he had career highs in hits (7), runs (5), strikeouts (6) and pitches (76)...made just one appearance during his fifth stint and it was his only start on June 18 against Los Angeles-AL...did not allow a run during stint number six from June 30 to July 1 (3.2 ip)...then allowed one run in each of the first three games of his seventh stint (2 er in 4.2 ip, 3.86 ERA) before going on the 15-day disabled list July 19 retroactive to July 18 with a right shin contusion...was reinstated Aug. 2, tossed 2.1 scoreless innings Aug. 3 at Los Angeles (AL), was optioned Aug. 4 and then recalled Aug. 5 when Jesse Hahn went on the DL.

FIRST START: Had a no decision in the A's 7-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on June 18 in Oakland...shutout the Angels on two hits over the first three innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Trout in the fourth...was relieved by Dull after tossing 3.0 innings and 50 pitches.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-6 loss to Baltimore on August 11 in Oakland...retired each of the first seven batters before Schoop singled with one out in the third...then allowed three runs in the fourth inning on a RBI single by Trumbo and a two-run double by Alvarez... left after four innings with the A's trailing 3-0.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 10-inning loss at Texas last Tuesday...tossed a career-high 5.2 innings...the A's scored a run in the second inning and he shut out the Rangers on two hits over the first five innings...hit Chrinos with one out to start the sixth and retired the next two batters with Chrinos moving to second...was relieved by Dull who allowed a RBI single to Beltran for the blown save...the A's tied the game in the ninth and scored twice in the top of the 10th before Texas scored three times in the bottom of the 10th for the win.

NASHVILLE: Was 2-1 with two saves and a 2.95 ERA in 16 appearances with Nashville, all in relief...struck out 21 and walked five in 18.1 innings... did not allow a home run...logged a 5.14 ERA in six games before his first promotion to Oakland on April 25...compiled a 1.59 ERA in 10 games after that...did not allow a run in seven games on the road (8.0 ip)

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .225 batting average, including .130 (3-for-23) against left-handed hitters compared to .271 (13-for-48) against right-handers...opponents hit .125 when leading off an inning...yielded a .273 batting average with runners in scoring position

THIS AND THAT: Tossed one or more innings in 15 of his 16 appearances, including a season-high 2.0 innings April 23 against New Orleans and July 28 against Colorado Springs...did not allow a run 12 times...including each of his first three games (3.0 ip) when he picked up his only two runs of the season (April 8 against Oklahoma City and April 13 against Colorado Springs...surrendered a season-high four runs on a season-high four hit in a season-low 0.1 innings for his only loss April 14 against Colorado Springs...his most pitches in a game came on April 20 at Colorado Springs (40)...recorded his first save of the season May 1 at Round Rock... matched his season-high with three strikeouts in the second game of a double header on June 9 at Oklahoma City (also April 11 against Colorado Springs)...was credited with his second save June 12 at Oklahoma City.

- Has allowed 49-of-204 (24.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the best percentage in the AL and second best in the majors (San Francisco. 21.5%).
