Indians secured a series win over Toronto in dramatic fashion » The Indians secured a series win over Toronto in dramatic fashion once again, taking Sunday's rubber match from the Blue Jays by a score of 3-2...JOSE RAMIREZ erased a 2-1 deficit with a two-out, two-run HR in the bottom of the 8th off Brett Cecil, his 10th big fly of the season and second of the series (also a game-tying solo HR in Friday's 3-2 win)...FRANCISCO LINDOR started the rally with a two-out single, this after driving in the Tribe's first run with an RBI-single in the 6th inning...COREY KLUBER continued his recent stretch of effectiveness, pitching deep into the 7th (6.2IP, 6H, 2R-ER, 4BB, 8SO, HR)...MIKE CLEVINGER picked up the victory out of the bullpen, fanning 3 over 1.1 frames...CODY ALLEN notched his 24th save...the Indians finished the season series against Toronto at 4-3. Cleveland's first winning season season series against Toronto at 4-3, Cleveland's first winning season vs. the Jays since 2013.

» Will be pitching on regular four days' rest after making his last start on Aug. 17 against the Chicago White Sox at Progressive Field...did not factor in the decision, allowing five

» Set to make his third career start, fourth career appearance, against the Athletics, and his first start against them this season...is 1-0 with a 1.69 ERA (3ER/16.0IP) in two career starts against Oakland.

» Will be making his 10th start away from Progressive Field this season...has gone 5-3 with a 1.75 ERA (13ER/50 JIP) in his gine home starts.

LAST TIME OUT

» Did not factor in the decision in his last start on Aug. 17 against the White Sox at Progressive Field...allowed five runs, four earned, on eight hits, including a two-run homer by Tim Anderson, with 11 strikeouts and no walks over 6.2 innings of work in Chicago-AL's 10-7 win over the Tribe.

» His 11 strikeouts were his second-most in a game this season (14SO at TOR)...marked the first career game in which Carrasco has fanned 10-or-more without issuing a walk.

» Has now fanned at least eight batters in three consecutive starts, tied for the longest active streak in MLB.

VS. OAKLAND | AL WEST

» Set to make his third career start, fourth career appearance, against the Athletics, and his first start against them this season...is 1-0 with a 1.69 ERA (3ER/16.0IP) in two career starts against Oakland.

» Both career starts against Oakland came in July of last season...did not factor in the decision in his first start against the A's on July 11 in Cleveland, allowing just two runs on six hits and one walk with seven strikeouts over 7.0 innings in a 5-4 Oakland win...earned the win in a complete game on July 30 at Oakland, allowing just one run on two hits and one walk with seven strikeouts over 9.0 innings in a 3-1 Indians win.

» Will be his 26th career appearance, 18th career start, against an AL West opponent...is 7-4 in his 17 career starts against the AL West with a 3.02 ERA (39ER/116.0IP)...has gone 2-1 with a 3.60 ERA (8ER/20.0IP) in three starts against the AL West this season (2 vs. SEA, 1 vs. LAA).

HOME AWAY FROM HOME

» Has made nine starts away Progressive Field this season, going 5-3 with a 1.97 ERA (13ER/59.1IP), compared to his 3-3 record and 4.76 ERA (30ER/56.2IP) in 10 home starts.

S Carrasco's 1.97 road ERA ranks 3rd in MLB (2nd in the AL), trailing only Colorado's Tyler Chatwood (1.82) and Texas' Cole Hamels (1.91)...is also 4-1 with a 1.50 ERA (6ER/36.0IP) in his last five road starts, with a 0.69 WHIP and a 29.5% strikeout rate (39SO/132BF) over that span.

ROUGH ON RIGHTIES

» Has held right-handed hitters to a .210 average against this season...among 102 hurlers with at least 60.0 innings pitched, it is the 4th-lowest mark in the AL, 14th in MLB.

Throughout his career, Carrasco has been a more effective pitcher after the All-Star Break, despite not having the wins to show it...in 76 career first-half appearances, 57 starts, is 25-23 with a 4.15 ERA (169ER/366.1IP), compared to his 16-21 record with a 3.71 ERA (126ER/305.2IP) in 61 career appearances, 46 starts, after the break.

» After going 5-2 with a 2.47 ERA (20ER/73.0IP) in 12 starts before the All-Star break this

season, is just 3-3 with a 4.81 ERA (23ER/43.0IP) in seven starts since the All-Star break... however, excluding his start on Aug.2 vs. Minnesota (8ER/3.2IP), has gone 3-2 with a 3.43 ERA (15ER/39.1IP) since the break.

2016 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

» Made his 2016 season debut on April 6 at Progressive Field against Boston...did not factor into the decision after allowing four runs on seven hits with one walk, five strikeouts & three home runs in 5.0 innings of work.

» Posted an ERA of 1.06 ERA (2ER/17.0IP) over a span of three starts from April 13

through April 24 with 15 strikeouts and just four walks in that span.

» Recorded five-or-more strikeouts in 21 straight games dating back to June 13th of last season, which was snapped in his injury-shortened start on April 24 at Detroit...it was the second-longest active streak in the majors at the time and the second-longest such streak in Indians history behind Bob Feller's record of 28 consecutive games (September 9, 1945-July 20, 1946).

» Strained his left hamstring while covering first base in the 3rd inning on April 24 at Detroit and was placed on the 15-day Disabled List on April 25...marked Carrasco's fifth career stint on the Major League Disabled List...spent 38 days on the DL and was activiated before his start on June 2.

» Tossed his seventh career complete game & third career complete game shut-out on June 25 at Detroit...limited the Tigers to just four hits with one walk and seven strikeouts.

» Fanned a season-high 14 batters on June 30 at Toronto, one shy of his career-high 15 punchouts on Sept. 25, 2015, at Kansas City.

» His start on July 10 vs. NYY (3.2IP, 5H, 5R-1ER, 1HR, 2BB, 4SO) marked his first loss at Progressive Field this season, and snapped a streak of five consecutive quality starts (June 13 through July 5), over which he went 4-1 with a 1.51 ERA (6ER/35.2IP).

» Earned the win on July 20 at Kansas City, holding the Royals scoreless on one hit and two walks with six strikeouts over 6.0 innings...marked the fourth time Carrasco has allowed one or fewer hits in an outing of 6.0 innings or more.
