STATUS

- ▶ Signed as a free agent on December 5, 2014, to a four-year contract, extending through the 2018 season.

CAREER NOTES

- ▶ Since becoming a full-time reliever in 2012, is 12-11 with 37 saves and a 2.40 ERA (195.0IP, 119H, 52ER, 74BB, 302K) in 223 appearances...among relievers with at least 100.0IP over the four-year stretch (2012-15), his ratio of 13.94 K/9.0IP ranks third in the Majors and his 5.49 H/9.0IP is fifth.
- ▶ Has made five career Opening Day rosters (2008-09 and '13-15) and one with the Yankees.

2015

- ▶ Went 3-2 with 36 saves (in 38 chances), a 2.04 ERA (61.2IP, 14ER) and 100K in 60 relief appearances in his first season as a closer...opponents batted .151 (33-for-218, 5HR); LH .233 (10-for-43, 1HR), RH .131 (23-for-175, 4HR)...retired 46-of-60 first batters faced (76.7%)...allowed just 1-of-12 inherited runners to score (8.3%).
- ▶ Had an AL-best 14.59 K/9.0IP ratio (61.2IP, 100K), the second-best mark among Major League relievers in 2015...ranked third among Major League relievers with 100K.
- ▶ Following the season, was named the 2015 Mariano Rivera American League Reliever of the Year, presented annually to the league's top relief pitcher as voted on by eight of Baseball's all-time great relievers (Mariano Rivera, Dennis Eckersley, Rollie Fingers, John Franco, Trevor Hoffman, Bruce Sutter, Lee Smith and Billy Wagner).
- ▶ Reached the 100K plateau for the second straight season (103K in 2014 w/ Boston-69K and Baltimore-34K)...with Dellin Betances (131K), became the sixth bullpen duo all time (first since the 2004 Angels: Francisco Rodriguez-123K/Scot Shields-109K)—and first Yankees duo—with 100K each...according to *Elias*, he and Betances became the first duo to finish with a league's top-two reliever strikeout totals since the 2009 A's (Michael Wuertz-102K/Andrew Bailey-91K).
- ▶ Tied the Dodgers' Kenley Jansen for third in the Majors—and tops in the AL—with a 94.7% save conversion rate (36 saves in 38 chances), trailing only the Pirates' Mark Melancon (96.2%) and the Brewers' Francisco Rodriguez (95.0%).
- ▶ Is the fourth Yankees pitcher in the last four seasons to record at least 35 saves, joining David Robertson (39 in 2014), Mariano Rivera (44 in 2013) and Rafael Soriano (42 in 2012)...according to *Elias*, the Yankees are the first Major League team since saves became an official stat in 1969 to have four different pitchers record at least 35 saves in four consecutive seasons.
- ▶ Is the first Yankees left-hander to record at least 25 saves in a season since Dave Righetti reached the figure in seven consecutive seasons from 1984-90...is the third left-handed pitcher to record a 30-save season with the Yankees, joining Righetti (4x: 1984, '86-87, '90) and Sparky Lyle (1972).
- ▶ Did not allow a run in his first 17G this season (17.2IP) from 4/8-5/16...according to *Elias*, was the longest such streak for any pitcher to begin his Yankees career, and the second-longest streak for a Yankees pitcher to begin a season (Lee Guetterman-19G in 1989)...allowed 1-or-0 hits in each of those 17 games, becoming one of nine pitchers since 1914—and the only Yankee—to hold his opponent scoreless while allowing no more than 1H in each of his first 17 games of a season...his 31K were the most strikeouts by a pitcher prior to allowing his first run of the season in Yankees history (credit: *Elias*).
- ▶ Became the third pitcher in Baseball history to allow three-or-fewer hits while pitching at least 15.0 innings over his first 15 games of a season (4/8-5/8, 15.2IP, 3H, 26K), joining the A's Ryan Cook in 2012 and the Dodgers' Chris Withrow in 2014 (credit: *Elias*).
- ▶ Is one of eight pitchers in Major League history (and the only Yankee) to record at least 13 saves in his team's first 30 games of a season...became the first pitcher in Yankees history to earn at least eight saves in the club's first 20 games of a season and the second in team history with 10 saves in the club's first 25 games (Mariano Rivera, 10 saves through 25 team games in 2011).
- ▶ Became the first pitcher in franchise history to convert each of his first 24 save chances with the club (4/8-8/6)—credit: *Elias*...since the inception of saves in 1969, was the third-longest save streak to begin a career with a new team and second-longest such streak by an AL pitcher (Brad Lidge - first 44 save chances with Philadelphia from 2008-09 and Willie Hernandez - first 32 save chances with Detroit in 1984)...according to *Elias*, became just the second player to convert each of his first 10 save opportunities with the club, joining Tippy Martinez, who converted 10-of-10 saves over a three-year stretch with the Yankees from 1974-76.
- ▶ Made his Yankees debut in 4/8 win vs. Toronto, tossing a perfect ninth (1.0IP, 1K) for his first save of the season and second of his career (also 9/7/14 at Tampa Bay w/ Baltimore).

▶ 2015



- ▶ Became the first pitcher in Yankees history to record a save and at least 3K in three consecutive relief outings from 4/13-19 (4.0IP, 9K)...the streak was the 15th of its kind in the Majors since saves became an official stat in 1969 and the first since the Dodgers' Eric Gagne from 7/10-17/04 (also three games).
- ▶ Recorded his 500th career strikeout (Rene Rivera, swinging) in 4/19 win at Tampa Bay.
- ▶ Allowed a two-out, two-run "walk-off" HR in the 10th on 5/19 at Washington to suffer his first loss (0.2IP, 1H, 2ER, 1BB, 2K, 1HR)...were the first runs allowed in 2015 after 17 consecutive scoreless appearances.
- ▶ Allowed 2H and 1ER in 1.0IP (2K) to record the save in 6/2 win at Seattle...the two-out, RBI single by Robinson Cano in the 11th inning marked his first earned run allowed in a save situation in his career (18.1IP)...had permitted three unearned runs in a blown save on 6/23/13 at Detroit w/ Boston...snapped a career-long streak of 32 games (9/6/14-5/30/15) with 1-or-0 hits allowed.
- ▶ Was placed on the 15-day D.L. from 6/11 (retro. to 6/10)/7-8 with a left flexor forearm muscle strain (missed 25 games)...in one rehab relief appearance w/ Triple-A Scranton/WB on 7/6, tossed 1.0 scoreless inning (2H, 1K).
- ▶ Earned the save despite allowing a solo HR to Chris Davis in 7/22 win vs. Baltimore (1.0IP, 1H, 1ER, 2K, 1HR), just his second HR surrendered to a lefty batter over his last 96 batters faced since 5/15/14 (also on 9/23/14 w/ Baltimore to Brian McCann at Yankee Stadium)...was his second outing in as many days and third in as many games.
- ▶ Suffered his first blown save of the season in 8/11 loss at Cleveland, allowing 2ER in the 10th inning (1.0IP, 3H, 2ER, 2K) in an eventual 16-inning Yankees loss.
- ▶ Did not allow a run over a 10-game stretch from 8/14-9/6, recording six saves and striking out 18 of his 37 batters faced (48.6%) over the span (10.0IP, 6H, 2BB, 1HP)...earned his first Yankees win on 8/17 vs. Minnesota (1.0IP, 2K).
- ▶ Tossed 2.0 perfect innings (4K) in 9/12 Game 1 loss vs. Toronto...tossed 2.0 innings in three of his final nine appearances of the season (beginning 9/12 vs. Toronto-Game 1)...had just one appearance of 2.0 innings over his first 51 games of the season from 4/8-9/7.
- ▶ Struck out eight consecutive batters faced spanning three games from 9/12 (Game 1) vs. Toronto through 9/16 at Tampa Bay, marking the longest such streak by a Yankee since David Robertson had eight straight strikeouts in 2012 (credit: *Elias*).
- ▶ Tossed a perfect ninth (1.0IP, 3K) in both 9/14 and 9/16 wins at Tampa Bay, earning the save in both games...according to *Elias*, became the 10th pitcher in Baseball history—and the first Yankee—to earn the save while tossing at least 1.0 inning and striking out every batter faced in consecutive games.
- ▶ Allowed 3H and 2ER in 2.0IP (2BB/1BB, 4K, 2HR) while earning his third win on 9/22 at Toronto...allowed a game-tying HR in the bottom of the ninth for his second blown save...threw 42 pitches, his most in a relief appearance since 8/4/11 vs. Cleveland (71 pitches).
- ▶ Tossed a perfect ninth inning (1.0IP, 2K) in the Yankees' AL Wild Card Game loss vs. Houston on 10/6.



2014

- ▶ Combined with Boston and Baltimore to go 5-5 with one save and a 2.02 ERA (62.1IP, 14ER, 17BB, 103K) in 73 relief appearances...produced career bests in strikeouts, ERA and games...stranded 35-of-42 inherited runners (83.3%).
- ▶ Led the AL and finished second in the Majors with a career-high 14.87 K/9.0IP (Chapman-17.67)...ranked eighth among Major League relievers with a 6.06 K/BB ratio...finished third among AL relievers in opponents' batting average (.153), fourth in strikeouts and tied for fifth in appearances.
- ▶ Held opponents to a .153 batting average (33-for-216); LH .163 (15-for-92, 2HR), RH .145 (18-for-124, 1HR)...also held opponents to a career-low .229 on-base percentage.
- ▶ Began the season by making 50 appearances for Boston, going 3-5 with a 2.34 ERA (42.1IP, 11ER)...stranded 24-of-26 inherited runners (92.3%)...surrendered only one run in 26 games while pitching for the Red Sox at Fenway Park (23.0IP, 0.39 ERA), limiting opponents to a .105 batting average (8-for-76) in those games.
- ▶ Acquired by Baltimore on 7/31 in exchange for LHP Eduardo Rodriguez...went 2-0 with a 1.35 ERA (20.0IP, 8H, 3ER) in 23 appearances for the Orioles, striking out 34 batters with just 4BB.
- ▶ Did not allow a hit in eight consecutive appearances from 7/25-8/7 (7.0IP, 4BB, 12K), setting a new career-long stretch (later matched on 4/29-5/16/15)...allowed 0H in seven straight outings from 9/6-19 (5.2IP, 0BB, 14K).
- ▶ Earned his first Major League save on 9/7 at Tampa Bay (1.0IP, 1HP).
- ▶ In five scoreless playoff appearances in the ALDS vs. Detroit and ALCS vs. Kansas City, allowed only 3-of-24 batters to reach safely (7.1IP, 1H, 1BB, 1HP, 8K, .045 opp BA).

2013

- ▶ Appeared in only 37 games with Boston due to a season-ending left foot injury suffered in July...went 1-2 with a 2.64 ERA (30.2IP, 25H, 9ER, 17BB, 48K).
- ▶ Averaged 14.10 K/9.0IP, the second-highest mark among pitchers with at least 30.0IP (Chapman-15.83).
- ▶ Surrendered more than 1ER only once (3ER in 0.1IP, 5/12 vs. TOR)...allowed multiple runs only twice.
- ▶ Suffered a left foot injury while attempting to back up home plate on 7/6 at Los Angeles-AL...placed on the 15-day disabled list on 7/7 and underwent Lis-Franc ligament repair surgery on 7/15 (performed by Dr. George Theodore in Boston)...transferred to the 60-day D.L. on 7/12.



2012

- ▶ Made 53 relief appearances for the Red Sox, going 3-2 with a 3.35 ERA (40.1IP, 15ER, 20BB, 51K)...opponents batted .194 (28-for-144, 3HR); LH .149 (13-for-87, 1HR), RH .263 (15-for-57, 2HR)...was named Red Sox "Fireman of the Year" by the Boston BBWAA in his first full season as a reliever.
- ▶ Stranded 39-of-46 inherited runners (84.8%), the fifth-best rate in the American League...retired the first batter faced in 45-of-53 outings (84.9%), the best percentage on the Red Sox (min. five games).
- ▶ Held lefties to a .149 BA, the second-lowest mark in the AL (min. 100BF) and the second-lowest average by a Red Sox LHP since at least 1974...allowed only 1XBH to a LHB all season (Nick Johnson HR on 5/23 at BAL).
- ▶ Averaged 11.38 K/9.0IP, the third-best mark by a Boston left-handed reliever since at least 1914 (Ken Brett-12.04 in 1970 and Alan Embree-11.76 in 2002).
- ▶ Among qualifying AL lefty relievers, finished fourth in opponents' BA (.149) and third in opponent slugging percentage (.292)...since at least 1921, the only Red Sox LHPs with a better opponents' BA were Mickey McDermott in 1950 (.183) and Ken Brett in 1970 (.187)...also marked the third-best opponents' slugging pct. by a Red Sox LHP in that time, trailing only Bill Landis in 1968 (.260) and Chet Nichols in 1961 (.286).
- ▶ Began the season on the 15-day disabled list with a left hamstring strain...made 12 rehab appearances between Single-A Greenville (2G) and Triple-A Pawtucket (10G), combining to go 0-0 with a 4.85 ERA (13.0IP, 7ER).

2011

- ▶ Was selected to the Major League roster on 6/19 and spent the remainder of the season with the Red Sox, going 6-3 with a 5.54 ERA (65.0IP, 40ER) in 17 appearances (12 starts)...the Red Sox went 9-3 in his starts.
- ▶ Did not lose any of his first four starts (3-0) from 6/20-7/7...recorded at least 5.0IP and allowed 3R or fewer in each of those outings, the longest such stretch to begin a Red Sox career since Matt Clement in 2005 (first 6GS).
- ▶ Made his Red Sox debut on 6/20 vs. San Diego, earning a no-decision in a 14-5 Boston win (5.2IP, 3ER, 3BB, 6K)...became only the fifth LHP since 1919 to strike out six-or-more batters in his Red Sox debut, and the first since Kevin Morton on 7/5/91 vs. Detroit (CG, 9K)...became the first pitcher overall to record at least 6K in his Red Sox debut since Daisuke Matsuzaka on 4/5/07 at Kansas City (10K).
- ▶ Issued 6BB but only 2H in 5.2 scoreless innings in a 4-0 win at Baltimore on 7/20...since 1994, the only other Red Sox pitcher to hold a team scoreless while issuing at least 6BB in an outing was Matt Clement on 9/24/05 at Baltimore (6BB in 6.0IP)...became the first pitcher to accomplish the feat while earning a win for the Red Sox since Joe Hesketh on 4/17/93 vs. Chicago-AL (6BB in 8.0IP).
- ▶ Began the season with Triple-A Pawtucket, going 3-3 with a 2.47 ERA (65.2IP, 18ER) in 13G/12GS...at the time of his selection to Boston on 6/19, led Triple-A pitchers in opponents' batting average (.181, 42-for-232).

2010

- ▶ Spent most of his season with Double-A Jacksonville, going 1-8 with a 6.01 ERA (85.1IP, 57ER) in 18 starts.
- ▶ Began the season on the minor league disabled list with a right ankle sprain...reinstated on 4/30 and made three starts for Single-A Jupiter, going 1-1 with a 1.72 ERA (15.2IP, 3ER)...promoted to Jacksonville on 5/13.
- ▶ Recalled by Florida on 8/19 and finished the season with the Marlins, going 1-5 with an 8.54 ERA (32.2IP, 31ER) in nine appearances (seven starts).
- ▶ Was traded to the Boston Red Sox in exchange for LHP Dustin Richardson on 11/12/10.

2009

- ▶ Went 3-5 with a 4.84 ERA (80.0IP, 43ER) in 20 appearances (14 starts) over two stints with the Marlins.
- ▶ Made four appearances (two starts) with Florida before being placed on the 15-day disabled list from 4/21-5/15 with a right oblique strain...made one rehab start with Single-A Jupiter and one with Double-A Jacksonville.
- ▶ Optioned to Triple-A New Orleans on 7/20 and made three starts with the club...placed on the minor league disabled list with an ankle injury from 7/30-9/1...made two rehab starts for the GCL Marlins.
- ▶ Recalled by the Marlins on 9/6 and made four relief appearances (3.1IP, 4H, 3R/2ER, 5BB, 4K).

2008

- ▶ In his first season with the Marlins, went 6-10 with a 5.87 ERA (107.1IP, 70ER) in 29 appearances (20 starts)...ranked third on the club in strikeouts (89) and fourth in innings pitched.
- ▶ Made his first 20 appearances as a starter, going 5-9 with a 5.63 ERA (100.2IP, 63ER)...placed on the 15-day disabled list from 7/14-8/31 with patella tendinitis in his right knee...made rehab starts with the GCL Marlins, Single-A Jupiter and Double-A Carolina before returning to the Marlins on 9/1.
- ▶ Made his final nine appearances as a reliever, going 1-1 with a 9.45 ERA (6.2IP, 7ER).

2007

- ▶ Pitched for four teams in the Tigers organization (at the Major League level and with three minor league teams)...made 13 starts over two stints with Detroit, going 5-5 with a 5.63 ERA (64.0IP, 40ER)...also combined to go 3-4 with a 2.77 ERA (78.0IP, 24ER) in 13 minor league starts.
- ▶ Began the season by making three starts for Single-A Lakeland...was promoted to Double-A Erie on 5/9.
- ▶ Was recalled by Detroit on 5/18 and made his first Major League start that night at St. Louis...pitched 6.0 scoreless innings and earned the win, becoming the first Tigers pitcher to earn his first Major League victory in his first start since LHP Andy Van Hekken did so on 9/2/02 vs. Cleveland...optioned back to Erie on 5/22.
- ▶ Recalled by the Tigers on 6/10...placed on the 15-day D.L. from 8/4-23 with a left hamstring strain, making two rehab starts with Triple-A Toledo in his final appearances of the season...optioned back to Lakeland on 8/30.
- ▶ Was traded to the Florida Marlins along with RHP Dallas Trahern, RHP Burke Badenhop, RHP Frankie De La Cruz, OF Cameron Maybin and C Mike Rabelo in exchange for INF Miguel Cabrera and LHP Dontrelle Willis on 12/5/07.



2006

- ▶ Made only three minor league appearances prior to making his Major League debut for the Tigers on 8/30 at Yankee Stadium, tossing a scoreless eighth inning (1HP) in the first game of a doubleheader.
- ▶ Went 0-1 with a 6.10 ERA (10.1IP, 7ER) in eight relief appearances for the Tigers.
- ▶ Did not allow a run in his three relief appearances for Single-A Lakeland (5.0IP, 2H, 1HP, 1BB, 9K).

PERSONAL

- ▶ Is married to Katie...the couple has one son, Max.
- ▶ Was named Florida's "Gatorade Player of the Year" as a senior at Buchholz High School in Gainesville in 2003, also earning preseason and postseason All-America honors that year.
- ▶ Played three seasons at University of North Carolina, going 27-9 with a 2.77 ERA (309.0IP, 95ER)...set the school's career strikeout record (325) and single-season strikeout record (133K in 2006)...as a junior in 2006, was named the *Baseball America* "National Player of the Year" and won the "Roger Clemens Award" as college baseball's top pitcher, going 13-2 with a 2.48 ERA (123.1IP, 34ER) in 20 games (18 starts)...was also the ACC's "Pitcher of the Year" and an All-America first-team selection in 2006.
- ▶ Received a 2016 Thurman Munson award for success on the field and in the philanthropic community.
- ▶ With several Yankees teammates, participated in a program with the MLBPA Players Trust to promote baseball to children on 5/8/15...as part of the event, coached children from the NYC Autism Charter School in a game at Harlem RBI's Field of Dreams.

X-RAY REPORT

- + Around the time he joined the Rays, Brandon began adopting a healthier diet and he now eats "as clean as possible," avoiding artificial ingredients...among his more exotic snacks are cricket protein bars and dried crickets, which he says taste like chips.
- + A devoted fan of ultimate fighting, he attended a UFC bout in Orlando in December along with former teammate Cole Figueroa.
- + Brandon and his wife, Lindsay Murphy Goyer, are expecting a baby boy in mid-March...they also have a one-year-old daughter, Riley.
- + Lindsay is a sports reporter/anchor who worked for Fox 5 in Washington, D.C. for several years...a year ago they decided she and Riley would join Brandon in St. Pete for the season, rather than continue working in D.C. year-round...the couple met when Lindsay came to interview Brandon when he played at the University of Virginia.
- + During the offseason, Brandon and Lindsay enjoy helping Gaithersburg (Md.) homeless shelters...they have also volunteered with Special Love, a nonprofit organization that supports families dealing with cancer.
- + His father, Ray, is a former semi-pro tennis player who recently retired from Exxon Mobil and now runs a consulting company.

2015 SEASON

- + Established career highs across the board as he enjoyed his first fully healthy season in the majors, playing in 128 games, 79 starts

(39-LF, 17-CF, 20-RF, 3-DH)...started all 53 games against lefties, 52 of those at leadoff.

- + His 24 HBP led the American League and were most by any AL player since ANA David Eckstein in 2002 (27)...ranked 2nd in the majors to CHC Anthony Rizzo (30) and had 9 more than any other AL player (CWS Jose Abreu and TEX Shin-Soo Choo)...shattered the club record previously held by Sean Rodriguez (18 in 2011), passing him on Sep 19 vs. BAL...became the first Ray to lead the AL in HBP.
- + Nineteen of his 24 HBP came against left-handed pitchers, most by any major league player since splits are first available (1914)...PHI Chase Utley held the previous record of 16 in 2007...his last 13 HBP in a row (and 18 of his last 19) came against lefties.
- + With only 385 PA, averaged 1 HBP every 16.04 PA, the highest mark in American League history (min. 20 HBP) and a mark topped by only one player in the modern era (since 1900)...in 1971, MTL Ron Hunt averaged 12.76 PA/HBP when he absorbed a modern-era-record 50 HBP in 638 PA...became the first player in 125 years with 24 HBP in 400 PA or less, since Chief Roseman (29 in 369 PA) in 1890 for the St. Louis Browns and Louisville Colonels.
- + Hit .271/.387/.457 (51-for-188) vs. LHP, and .257/.318/.354 (37-for-144) vs. RHP...has a career .362 OBP vs. LHP, compared to .311 vs. RHP...seven of his 8 HR in 2015 (and 11 of 14 in his career) came against LHP...only homer vs. a righty was July 10 vs. HOU (Collin McHugh).
- + Led the team with 52 starts at leadoff, and the Rays went 29-23 in those games...his .379 OBP

from the leadoff spot ranked 3rd in the AL (min. 150 PA), behind teammate John Jaso (.404) and CLE Jason Kipnis (.385).

- + Was one of three AL players to start at least 15 games at all three OF positions, along with HOU Colby Rasmus and KC Jarrod Dyson...his .994 fielding pct. ranked 4th among AL outfielders, behind NYY Jacoby Ellsbury (1.000), LAA Mike Trout (1.000) and TOR Kevin Pillar (.996).
- + According to Stats LLC, led all major league outfielders with a .960 zone rating, which measures a player's efficiency in fielding balls hit into his typical defensive zone...it was the 2nd-highest zone rating recorded by an outfielder since they began measuring it in 1987, behind CAL Devon White in 1989 (.961).
- + Became the first player in club history with multiple pinch-hit (2) and leadoff HR (3) in the same season...was the first Ray with 3 leadoff homers since Matt Joyce (3) in 2013.
- + Two of his 3 leadoff homers came in back-to-back games at Fenway Park (Aug 2 off Wade Miley, Sep 21 off Eduardo Rodriguez), making him the third visiting player since data is available (1974) to hit 2 leadoff homers in a season at Fenway Park, joining NYY Chuck Knoblauch (1999) and MIL Paul Molitor (1983).
- + His first career pinch-hit homer came May 8 vs. TEX...his 9th-inning homer on Sep 20 vs. BAL (off Zach Britton) was the first pinch-hit, game-tying homer by a Ray since Dan Johnson's celebrated homer in "Game 162" (Sep 28, 2011 vs. NYY)...the Rays won on a walk-off single by Kevin Kiermaier later in the frame.
- + His 43 PA as a pinch-hitter were the most in the AL in one season since TOR Tony Fernandez had 45 in 2001...his 10 pinch-hits tied the club record (Travis Lee in 2005) and were 2nd in the AL to CLE/LAA David Murphy (11)...his 9 RBI tied Murphy for the AL lead.
- + Tied his career high with 2 SB twice: May 21 vs. OAK and June 27 vs. BOS...on both occasions, stole 2B and 3B in the 7th inning.
- + Was hit by a pitch in a club-record 4 straight games Aug 4-8, the first AL player to do so since CWS Carlos Quentin (6, Aug 7-14, 2008).
- + Had 2 outfield assists on Sep 22 at BOS, the first two of his career.
- + Tied a major league record when he drew 3 HBP in a game, Oct 2 vs. TOR, all by Mark Buehrle...was the first player with 3 HBP in a game since STL Matt Carpenter (June 4, 2013 vs. ARI, 14 innings), and the first in a 9-inning game since CLE Austin Kearns (July 5, 2010 at TEX)...was the second in Rays history to do so, joining Jonny Gomes (Aug 15, 2005 vs. NYY)... incidentally, the last time a player was plunked

3 times by the same pitcher was another Rays-Blue Jays game, on April 7, 2006 in Toronto (TOR Reed Johnson facing TB Casey Fossum).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- + Made the Rays **2014** Opening Day roster and spent his first full season in the majors...appeared in 97 games, including 60 starts (51-LF, 5-CF, 4-DH)...missed 22 games due to a left thumb fracture suffered on May 25 vs. BOS while diving for a double hit by Grady Sizemore in shallow CF.
- + Guyer and teammate Logan Forsythe were the only two players in the majors to start a game in all nine slots of the batting order...Melvin Upton Jr. in 2007 was the only other Ray to do this...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, they became the first teammates to do it since Pete Mackanin and John Castino for the 1980 Twins.
- + Sustained a club-high 11 HBP, tied with CWS Jose Abreu for most among major league rookies and tied for 4th in the AL, in only 294 PA.
- + Ranked 2nd on the club with a .297 (33-for-111) batting avg. against lefties, after Ben Zobrist (.340)...led the team (min. 50 AB) with a .323 (20-for-62) avg. with RISP.
- + Ranked among AL rookies (min. 250 AB) in avg. (.266, 4th) and OBP (.334, 5th)...was batting only .196/.212/.275 (10-for-51) through May 23, but after that hit .284/.362/.389 (59-for-208) through the end of the season.
- + Had 4 hits on May 24 vs. BOS, tying the Rays rookie record at the time...Mikie Mahtook had a 5-hit game on Sep 18, 2015 vs. BAL.
- + Set a Rays rookie record with 3 doubles on June 27 vs. BAL (61)...his first career triple was Aug 21 vs. DET against former Ray David Price...it was the Rays only hit of the game, scoring Ben Zobrist (reached on E6) in a 1-0 win.
- + Selected as the Al Lopez Award winner for most outstanding Rays rookie during spring training...batted .302 (13-for-43) with 1 HR, 3 RBI, 3 2B and 5 runs.
- + Played the **2013** season at Triple-A Durham, his third straight season spent primarily there...his .301 avg. led the Bulls and ranked 5th in the International League.
- + On April 9, became the first Durham player to hit 2 HR in an inning since the team joined Triple-A in 1998, pacing the Bulls to a 12-8 win over the Gwinnett Braves...the Bulls scored 10 runs in the 1st inning, with Guyer plating half of those runs on two blasts...also became the 12th IL player in 70 years to hit 2 HR in an inning, and the first since Kelly Shoppach of Pawtucket in 2005.

- + Missed 27 games after he fractured his right middle finger when he was struck by a pitch from Gwinnett's Cody Martin on July 25.
- + Missed the last four months of the **2012** season after undergoing surgery to repair a torn labrum in his left shoulder on May 31...the surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews in Birmingham, Ala.
- + Opened the season with Durham and played in 22 games, primarily in RF and CF...recalled by the Rays on May 9 and played in 3 games (2 starts, both in LF) before going on the DL on May 16.

- + His lone hit with the Rays was a home run in his last game, May 12 at BAL, a solo shot off LH Brian Matusz in a 5-3 loss.
- + In **2011** saw three stints in the majors, his first big league experience, and spent the remainder of the season in Durham...his first two stints lasted one day each, May 6 at BAL and July 10 at NYY...recalled Sep 1 and remained with the Rays for the rest of the regular season but was left off the postseason roster.
- + Made his major league debut on May 6 at BAL before he was optioned to Durham the next day...in his first major league plate app hit a 2-run homer off LH Zach Britton, joining pitcher Esteban Yan (June 4, 2000 at NYM) as the only Rays to homer in their first plate app... Jake Elmore became the third on April 22, 2015 vs. BOS.
- + Was the 108th player in major league history to homer in his first at-bat...became the first ever to homer at Camden Yards in his major league debut (visitor or Oriole)...since then, BAL Jonathan Schoop (Sep 25, 2013 vs. TOR) and NYY Mason Williams (June 12, 2015 at BAL) have also both done it.

- + Named an IL midseason All-Star...ranked 5th in the IL and 3rd in the Rays org. with a .312 avg. ...tied teammate Russ Canzler for 2nd in the IL with 78 runs scored.
- + Named the Cubs **2010** Minor League Player of the Year after spending the entire season at Double-A Tennessee...hit .344 (127-for-369) with 13 HR and 30 SB...led the Southern League with a .588 SLG and ranked 2nd in avg., 3rd with 39 doubles, 4th with 58 extra-base hits and 5th with a .398 OBP.
- + After the All-Star break led the SL with a .424 avg. (.72-for-170), 26 2B and a .724 SLG.
- + Had two stints on the 7-day DL with a left shoulder subluxation: April 29-May 10 and May 15-29.
- + In **2009** hit .282 (128-for-454) with 62 R, 28 2B, 46 RBI and 30 SB in 130 games between Tennessee and Class-A Daytona...in **2008** with Class-A Peoria was limited to 88 games after missing the first month and a half due to a right elbow injury...began his professional career in **2007** with the Rookie-level AZL Cubs...was shelved July 2-21 with a dislocated left shoulder...promoted to Short-A Boise on Aug 17.
