OAKLAND ATHLETICS (53-72) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (72-51)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three straight, eight of the last nine and 17 of the last 23 games to fall a season-high 19 games under .500 at 53-72 (.424)...that is the fourth worst record in the American League and fifth worst in Oakland history after 125 games...it is the worst since the 1997 club was 50-75 (lost game 126)...are in fourth place in the AL West and trail first place Texas by a season-high 20 games...have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 54 days in fourth, 16 days tied for fourth and 30 days in fifth.

IN AUGUST: The A's are 6-14 (.300) in August, which is the second worst record in the majors to the Angels (5-14)...with one more loss, will clinch a losing record in August for the third consecutive season...the A's are batting .240 (162-for-676) with 67 runs scored...the runs are second fewest in the majors to the Angels (65) and the batting average is third lowest in the American League...are one of three AL teams with no triples and have not gone a full month without a triple since July, 2008.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 5-13 with a 5.90 ERA (76 er in 116.0 ip) and .295 (138-for-467) opponents batting average over the last 22 games...have a 5.10 ERA (384 er in 678.0 ip) for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have finished the season with an ERA of 5.00 or more four times in Oakland history, all over a five-year span from 1993-97 (5.94 in 1997, 5.57 in 1996, 5.31 in 1995, 5.19 in 1993)...are tied for the AL lead in losses (55) and have the second fewest wins (33)...have tossed fewer than five innings 38 times, which is the most in the majors and the most by an A's team since 1997 (52)...have 678.0 innings pitched for the season, which is third fewest in the AL...have not walked a batter in 10 of the last 17 games and have the same amount of walks (13) as home runs (13) over that span.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.91 ERA (57 er in 131.1 ip) over the last 15 games and now have a 4.61 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have not finished the year with an ERA above 4.58 since 1999 (4.69)...have the third highest opponents batting average (.266) and the third most wild pitches (58)

OFFENSE: The A's were shutout for the eighth time last night, matching the season total from last year...have scored 49 runs over the last 17 games, an average of 2.9 per game...are tied for the second fewest runs scored in the American League for the season (495)...have the lowest on-base percentage in the AL and third lowest in the majors (.302)...have walked just 312 times, which is second fewest in the majors (Kansas City, 286)...are on pace for 404 walks, which would break the Athletics record for fewest walks in a 162-game season (421 in 1966)...the Oakland record for lowest on-base percentage is .302 in 1979...have the second lowest slugging percentage in the AL (.400), the second fewest strikeouts (866), the fourth lowest batting average (.249) and fourth fewest home runs (137).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 22 errors in the last 52 games after making 53 over the first 73 contests...have 75 errors for the season, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...A's outfielders have 18 assists, which is second fewest in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on this three-game homestand against Cleveland...went 4-6 on the last homestand against Chicago-NL (0-3), Baltimore (3-1) and Seattle (1-2) and are 28-36 (.438) at home, which is the second worst home record in the American League...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Texas (0-3) and Chicago-AL (1-2) and have lost 10 of their last 12 road games...are 25-36 (.410) on the road for the season...leave on Thursday for a six-game road trip to St. Louis (three games) and Houston (three games)...are batting .239 (504-for-2110) at home compared to .258 (556-for-2151) on the road...have the third lowest home batting average in the AL...have a 4.02 (260 er in 582.0 ip) at home compared to 5.26 ERA (307 er in 525.2 ip) on the road.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their first 1-0 loss of the season last night and have now dropped each of their last three one-run decisions...are 19-20 (.487) in one-run games for the season and rank fourth in the American League in one-run games (39)...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year, which was the second worst record in the majors...the A's have six walk-off wins and eight walk-off losses...the 14 walk-off games are tied for

the most in the majors...the eight losses are third most in the AL and all have come against AL West competition.

MARGIN OF VICTORY: The A's are 39-40 (.494) in games decided by three runs or fewer compared to 14-32 (.295) in games decided by four runs or more...the record in games decided by four or more is second worst in the majors (Atlanta, 12-34)...have a run differential of -102, which is the worst in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...the last time the A's were outscored by more than 44 runs in a season was in 1997 (-182)...won 9-0 win at Chicago (AL) last Friday to snap a streak of 17 consecutive wins by three runs or fewer...it was the A's first win by more than three runs since a 7-1 win over San Francisco on June 29.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Billy Butler on the seven-day concussion disabled list yesterday and have used the DL an Oakland record 27 times...the previous mark of 25 was set in 2008...the 27 players have combined to miss 1313 games (48.6 games per stint) and the games missed will set an Oakland record...the current mark is 1397 in 2010...have a season-high 16 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Butler, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Gray, Hahn, Ladendorf, Lambo, Lowrie, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard), including 11 on the 60-day DL (all but Butler, Doolittle, Gray, Hahn and Ladendorf)...prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4, at least nine every day since May 6 and at least six all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

THIS AND THAT: Today's game marks the 17th time in the A's last 27 games that their opponent has been in first place in their division at the time of the game...are 5-11 in those games...are 1-6 in this five-series stretch where they will play in five different cities (Texas, Chicago, Oakland vs. Cleveland, St. Louis and Houston)...have made a total of 158 player moves in 142 days dating back to Opening Day, April 4...have the third shortest average time of game in the majors (2:57)...are 17-29 (.370) in day games, which is the second worst record in the majors (San Diego, 11-29)...have lost 16 of the last 20 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 13-21 (.382) in those games for the season, which is the worst record in the American League...pinch hitters are 2 for their last 22 (.091)...rank second in the AL in hits (19), RBI (13) and plate appearances (94)...designated hitters have the third fewest RBI in the AL (52) and the fourth lowest batting average (.235).

A's vs. INDIANS: The A's have lost the season series as they are 0-4 with two games remaining...lost the first game in Oakland last night after getting swept in a three-game series at Cleveland at the end of July...over the last six years, the A's have lost three season series (2011, 13, 16) and won three (2012, 14, 15)...are 20-21 against the Indians over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 268-236 against the Indians...that breaks down to 141-104 in Oakland and 127-132 in Cleveland...including 42-63 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 903-1029 against the Indians.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp is batting a Major League leading .429 with runners in scoring position...started the season 0-for-9 with RISP but is 27-for-54 (.500) since then...**Khris Davis** hit his 32nd home run of the season Sunday, which matches the most by an Athletic over the last eight years (Reddick, 2012)...**Liam Hendriks** has a 1.93 ERA (7 er in 32.2 ip) in 27 games since he was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list on June 19...**Marcus Semien** had his consecutive games played streak end at 126 last night...it was the longest by an Athletic since Miguel Tejada's Athletics record streak of 594 (June 2, 2000-Sept. 28, 2003).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1946** Jesse Flores tosses a three-hit shutout and Gene Desautels has a RBI single in the bottom of the ninth in a 1-0 win over Cleveland...in **1975** Billy Williams homers twice in the second game of a doubleheader at Milwaukee and combines for six hits in the A's sweep of the Brewers...in **1983** Rickey Henderson has three hits and steals four bases in the A's 9-3 win at New York.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (4-8, 4.73 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 2-4 with a 3.69 ERA (25 er in 61.0 ip) in 10 games, including nine starts, since he was reinstated from the disabled list June 29...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day DL June 14 with a left pronator strain...was selected from Triple-A Nashville April 29 and is making his Major League debut.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Ranks second among American League rookies in strikeouts (92), innings pitched (110.1) and games started (18) and tied for eighth in wins (4).

MONTH-BY-MONTH: Is 1-3 with a 5.32 ERA (14 er in 23.2 ip) in four starts in August...is tied for third in the American League in losses this month...combined for a 2-2 record and a 3.13 ERA in nine games in June and July...was 1-3 with a 7.03 ERA in six starts in April and May.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-3 with a 3.45 ERA (27 er in 70.1 ip) and .240 (62-for-258) opponents batting average in 12 games at home compared to 0-5 with a 6.98 ERA (31 er in 40.0 ip) and .320 (54-for-169) opponents average in seven starts on the road...is the second pitcher in Oakland history to start his career with a losing streak of five or more games on the road...the other is Mike Morgan, who lost each of his first six road starts from June 17, 1978-July 24, 1979...has surrendered 10 home runs in 40.0 innings on the road (2.25 per nine innings), eight in 70.1 innings in Oakland (1.02 per nine innings)...has a .906 OPS on the road, .701 at home.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has held left-handed hitters to a .173 (14-for-81) batting average and five extra base hits (two doubles, three home runs)...right-handers are batting .295 (102-for-346) with 15 of his 18 home runs and 24 of his 28 walks...the batting average against lefties is third lowest in the American League among pitchers with 100 or more innings as is his .530 OPS...has an .840 OPS against righties.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 2.10 ERA (13 er in 55.2 ip) and .229 (46-for-201) opponents batting average over innings one through three and a 7.41 ERA (45 er in 54.2 ip) and .310 (70-for-226) opponents batting average from the fourth inning on...has allowed three runs in the first inning (18.0 ip, 1.50 ERA), all on May 10 at Boston...has allowed just two runs in innings one through three in 10 games since returning from the DL June 29 (29.0 ip, 0.62 ERA) and just two runs over the first four innings of his last six starts (24.0 ip, 0.75 ERA).

DON'T WALK: Has not walked a batter in five of his last eight games and has walked just 12 batters in 61.0 innings (1.77 per nine innings) since he was reinstated from the DL June 29...is averaging 2.28 walks per nine innings for the season (28 bb in 110.1 ip)...walked Yunel Escobar with two outs in the fifth inning on Aug. 2 at Los Angeles (AL) to snap a streak of four games, 30.2 innings and 126 batters faced without a walk...the streak of 30.2 innings without a walk was the longest single season streak in Oakland history, topping the previous mark of 29.0 by Lary Sorensen (July 8-31, 1984)...it was fifth longest overall in Oakland history.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .214 (18-for-84) with runners in scoring position, including .162 (6-for-37) with RISP and two outs...the mark with RISP is 10th lowest among American League pitchers with 100 or more innings...using the same minimum, he has the highest opponents batting average in the majors against the opponents number four hitter (20-for-51, .392) and the sixth lowest in the AL against the number three hitter (9-for-46, .196)...opponents are 33-for-71 (.465) with seven doubles, six home runs and 21 RBI when putting the first pitch in play...the batting average is second highest in the AL and his slugging percentage (.817) is fourth highest...has a .228 (37-for-162) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .260 (40-for-154) the second time and .351 (39-for-111) with 10 of his 18 home runs after that.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received just 14 runs of support over his last eight starts (50.1 ip, 2.50 RSA)...has two runs of support or fewer in seven of those eight starts and 13 of 18 for the season...has support of five runs or more in his other five starts.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 2-3 with a 3.61 ERA (23 er in 57.1 ip) in nine starts on four days rest, 2-5 with a 6.19 ERA (33 er in 48.0 ip) in nine starts on five days rest or more.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Made his Major League debut on **April 29** and had a no decision in a 7-4 A's win over Houston...had just 42 minor league appearances, all starts, in three professional seasons...became the 45th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the first since Dan Straily on Aug. 3, 2012 against Toronto...issued a career-high four walks...left with an 8-4 lead in his second start on **May 4** against Seattle but the bullpen allowed two runs in the sixth inning and three more in the seventh for the blown save (Axford)...yielded a career-high eight runs on 10 hits in a career-low 2.2 innings for the first decision of his career, a loss in a 13-5

decision at Boston **May 10**...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to allow at least four runs in each of his first three Major League appearances...the other is Vida Blue (July 20-Aug. 3, 1969)...picked up his first Major League win in the A's 3-1 victory over Texas **May 16** in Oakland...had a no decision in the A's 14-5 win over Texas on **June 13** in Oakland...had a 10-2 lead when he left the game after 4.1 innings with a left pronator muscle strain...went on the DL the next day...made one start on a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton on **June 24** against San Jose and had a no decision (3.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 3 so, 1 hr, 64 pitches)...tossed a career-high 106 pitches in 7.0 innings and did not allow a run or walk a batter on **July 10** at Houston...ended up with a no decision in the A's 2-1, 10-inning loss...made his first career relief appearance **July 17** against Toronto...entered the game to start the second inning in relief of Andrew Triggs, who left the game with a left shin contusion...Triggs relieved Rich Hill who left after five pitchers with a blister...Manaea had been scheduled to start two days later...tossed 5.0 innings, which is a season-high for an A's reliever...had a no decision in the A's 1-0, 13-inning win over Tampa Bay **July 22** in Oakland...tossed a career-high 8.0 scoreless innings and allowed just five hits and no walks, but Odorizzi did the same for the Rays...struck out a career-high nine batters but allowed a career-high 11 hits in 6.2 innings in a no decision at Texas **July 27**...picked up his fourth win of the season in a 6-3 victory over Seattle **August 12** to snap a career-high three-game losing streak.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-2 loss at Texas last Wednesday...the A's scored a run in the first inning and he blanked the Rangers on three hits over the first three innings before allowing a one-out home run to Lucroy in the fourth...Oakland scored once in the fifth to take a 2-1 lead but he allowed a two-run single to Desmond in the bottom of the fifth for the loss.

RHP Kendall Graveman (9-8, 4.09 ERA): Is 8-2 with a 3.47 ERA (37 er in 96.0 ip) over his last 15 starts after going 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts...seven of those wins have come since June 23, which is tied for fifth most in the American League over that span...has walked two batters or fewer in 13 of his last 14 starts and has 15 walks in 90.0 innings over that span for an average of 1.50 per nine innings...is 4-4 with a 3.03 ERA in 10 starts at home compared and has the eighth lowest home ERA in the American League...tossed his third career complete game and his first shutout in his last start, a two-hitter in the A's 9-0 win at Chicago (AL) last Friday (0 bb, 5 so)...tossed just 98 pitches, which were the fewest by an Athletic in a nine-inning complete game since Dana Eveland on May 21, 2008 (95)...is 0-2 with a 3.38 ERA (18.2 ip, 18 h, 9 r, 7 er, 7 bb, 13 so, 1 hr) in three career starts against Cleveland.

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 2.69 ERA (37 er in 124.0 ip) and .200 (90-for-450) opponents batting average since the All-Star Break after logging a 4.30 ERA and .258 opponents average before the break.
- Has tossed 429.2 innings, which is the most in the American League and fifth most in the majors.
- Has allowed 49-of-204 (24.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the best percentage in the AL and second best in the majors (San Francisco, 21.5%).
- Is tied for third in the AL in opponents grounded into double plays (40), ranks fourth in strikeouts (405), fifth in on-base percentage (.308) and tied for fifth in wins (20) and fewest losses (17)...ranks third in most walks (150), blown saves (17) and wild pitches (26).

- Has not allowed an earned run in nine of his last 10 games for a 3.00 ERA (3 er in 9.0 ip)...however, has a 6.94 ERA (18 er in 23.1 ip) over his last 28 games (since June 15) after logging a 2.70 ERA over his first 26 contests.
- Is tied for the second most blown saves in the majors (6)...is tied for fourth among American League relievers in most walks (25) and has the ninth highest ERA (4.68).
- Has allowed nine of his 27 runs in sixth inning (2.2 ip, 30.38 ERA)...has a 3.23 ERA (17 er in 47.1 ip) from the seventh inning on.
