OAKLAND ATHLETICS (55-73) VS. ST. LOUIS CARDINALS (68-59)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two of the last three games after losing eight of the previous nine...are now 8-18 (.308) over the last 26 games and 55-73 (.430) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...it matches last year for the fifth worst record in Oakland history after 128 games...a loss tonight would also match last year for the fifth worst record after 129 games...are in fourth place in the AL West and trail first place Texas by 19½ games, which is a ½ game short of the season high (20 on Aug. 23)...have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 58 days in fourth, 16 days tied for fourth and 30 days in fifth.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 5-13 (.278) in interleague play, which is the worst record in the majors (Arizona, Cincinnati and San Diego are all 5-12)...will conclude the interleague portion of the schedule with this three-game series at St. Louis...have clinched a losing record against the National League for the first time since 2010 (8-10) and just the sixth time in 20 years of interleague play...have clinched at best the second worst interleague mark in Oakland history...the worst is 5-13 (.278) in 2009...have the fourth lowest interleague batting average (.235) and on-base percentage (.293)...the lowest interleague on-base percentage in Oakland history is .298 in 2006...are 196-166 (.541) all-time in interleague games, which is sixth best in Major League history.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 0-for-17 with 11 strikeouts and three sacrifice hits this year and are 7-for-133 (.053) over the last seven years...have a .079 (29-for-366) average with four doubles, 11 RBI, 10 walks and 173 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .085)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California...the last extra base hit was by Joe Kennedy, a double on June 12, 2007 at Houston.

IN AUGUST: The A's are 8-15 (.348) in August, which is tied for the second worst record in the majors to the Angels (7-16)...have clinched a losing record in August for the third consecutive season...the A's are batting .245 (190-for-774) with 82 runs scored...the runs are the fewest in the majors and the batting average is third lowest in the American League.

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.55 ERA (62 er in 157.1 ip) over the last 18 games...that has lowered the season ERA to 4.54, which is the lowest it has been since May 9 when it was 4.47...rank third in the American League in highest ERA, highest opponents batting average (.265) and most wild pitches (58)...allowed one run in all three games of the last series against Cleveland but won just two of those games...it marked the ninth time in Oakland history the A's allowed exactly one run in three consecutive games and the fourth time they did not win all three games.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 7-10 with a 3.79 ERA (47 er in 111.2 ip) over the last 19 games...have issued just 18 walks over that span (1.45 per nine innings)...are now 35-56 with a 5.02 ERA (389 er in 697.0 ip) for the season...have the second highest ERA in the American League, the second fewest wins, are tied for the second most losses and have the fourth fewest innings pitched.

OFFENSE: The A's have walked 322 times, which is second fewest in the majors (Kansas City, 299)...are on pace for 408 walks, which would break the Athletics record for fewest walks in a 162-game season (421 in 1966)...have a .303 on-base percentage, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...have the second fewest runs scored in the AL (510), the second fewest strikeouts (885), the third lowest slugging percentage (.401), the fourth lowest batting average (.250) and the fourth fewest home runs (139).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed one error in the last six games...have 22 in the last 55 games after making 53 over the first 73 contests...A's outfielders have 20 assists, which is second fewest in the American League.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on this six-game road trip to St. Louis (0-1) and Houston (three games)...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Texas (0-3) and Chicago-AL (1-2) and have lost 11 of their last 13 road games...are 25-37 (.403) on the road for the season...went 2-1 on the last home-stand against Cleveland and are 30-36 (.455) at home, which is the second worst home record in the American League...have a 5.23 ERA (310 er in 533.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.93 (262 er in 600.0 ip) at home...the road ERA is second highest in the majors (Cincinnati, 5.32)...are batting .257 (561-for-2181) on the road compared to .242 (527-for-2178) at home.

MARGIN OF VICTORY: Each of the A's last three wins have been by four runs or more after each of their previous 17 were by three runs or fewer...have outscored their opponents by 21 runs in their last three wins after winning by a combined 27 runs over their previous 17 victories...are 39-41 (.488) in games decided by three runs or fewer compared to 16-32 (.333) in games decided by four runs or more...the record in games decided by four or more is the worst in the American League and third worst in the majors...have a run differential of -92, which is second worst in the AL (Minnesota, -119).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have lost each of their last three one-run decisions...are 19-20 (.487) in one-run games for the season and rank fourth in the American League in one-run games (39)...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year, which was the second worst record in the majors...the A's have six walk-off wins and eight walk-off losses...the eight walk-off losses rank third in the majors and the 14 games are tied for fourth...all eight losses have come against AL West competition.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list an Oakland record 27 times...the previous mark of 25 was set in 2008...the 27 players have combined to miss 1361 games (50.4 games per stint) and the games missed will set an Oakland record on Monday...the current mark is 1397 in 2010...have a season-high 16 players on the DL, including 11 on the 60-day DL...prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4, at least nine every day since May 6 and at least six all year.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 3-7 in this five-series stretch where they will play in five different cities (Texas, Chicago, Oakland vs. Cleveland, St. Louis and Houston)...have made a total of 162 player moves in 146 days dating back to Opening Day, April 4...have lost 16 of the last 20 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 13-21 (.382) in those games for the season, which is the worst record in the American League...are 37-44 (.457) in night games compared to 18-29 (.383) during the day...have the second worst day record in the AL (Minnesota, 18-30)...pinch hitters are 2 for their last 22 (.091)...rank second in the AL in hits (19), RBI (13) and plate appearances (95).

A's vs. CARDINALS: The A's trail in the all-time series, 4-9...are 3-3 in Oakland and 1-6 in St. Louis...including 1-3 in the new Busch Stadium...last met in Oakland in 2013 when the A's won two of three...last played in St. Louis in 2010 when Oakland lost two of three...the two franchises also met in back-to-back World Series with the A's winning in seven games in 1930 and the Cardinals winning in seven games in 1931.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp is batting a Major League leading .431 with runners in scoring position...started the season 0-for-9 with RISP but is 28-for-56 (.500) since then...**Khris Davis** hit his 33rd home run of the season Tuesday night, which ranks third in the AL and is the most by an Athletic since Jack Cust had 33 in 2008...**Ryon Healy** has a 12-game hitting streak (18-for-45, .400), which is the longest active hitting streak in the majors and ties the A's season high (Crisp)...**Jake Smolinski** extended his hitting streak to seven games on Wednesday, which matches his career high...is 9-for-28 (.321) during the streak

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1982** Rickey Henderson steals four bases against the Milwaukee Brewers, breaking Lou Brock's major league single season record of 118...he would finish the season with 130 steals...in **2010** Brett Anderson allowed four runs in 2.0 innings, ending an Athletics record tying streak of 18 games with six or more innings and three earned runs or fewer by A's starting pitchers.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Zach Neal (2-3, 5.49 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 15th appearance and fifth start of the season and his career...was recalled from Nashville July 21 for his fourth stint with the A's this year and is 1-2 with a 3.80 ERA (10 er in 23.2 ip) and .242 (22-for-91) opponents batting average in six games, including three starts, since his return...was first selected from Nashville May 11 and made his Major League debut that night at Boston...was optioned back to the Sounds May 13...returned May 25 and made his first ML start that day at Seattle, a loss...pitched once more in relief before he was optioned to Nashville May 31...joined the A's for a third time June 10 and compiled a 4.70 ERA in five relief appearances while recording his first win and save before he was optioned to Nashville June 30.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 1-3 with a 7.91 ERA (17 er in 19.1 ip) in his four starting assignments compared to 1-0 with a 3.15 ERA in 10 relief appearances...first batters faced are 4-for-10 (.400)...has not inherited any runners...has tossed at least one inning in nine of his 10 relief appearances, including a season-high 3.0 innings on four separate occasions.

LAST NINE, FIRST FIVE: Is 2-2 with a 3.62 ERA (11 er in 27.1 ip), .274 (29-for-106) opponents batting average and three home runs in 27.1 innings over his last nine games dating back to June 18...went 0-1 with a save, a 9.75 ERA, .340 opponents batting average and four home runs in 12.0 innings over his first five contests.

DON'T WALK: Has issued just two walks in 39.1 innings, an average of 0.46 walks per nine innings...that is the lowest mark in the majors among pitchers with 30 or more innings pitched...has struck out just 14, an average of 3.20 per nine innings, which is also the lowest in the majors using the 30.0 innings minimum...issued his first walk with two outs in the sixth inning on July 30 at Cleveland to snap a career-opening nine-game, 18.2-inning, 80-batter faced streak without a walk...the career-opening streak of 18.2 innings without a walk was the longest such streak by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1913...the previous high was 15.1 by Paul Lindblad (Sept. 15, 1965-April 28, 1966).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Has made two interleague appearances, both in relief on consecutive days at San Francisco on June 27 and 28 (1.2 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 0 so).

WITH THE BAT: Has never batted as a professional.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .405 (15-for-37) with runners in scoring position, including .529 (9-for-17) with RISP and two outs...has yielded a .257 (26-for-101) batting average with the bases empty, .362 (21-for-58) with runners on...opponents are 15-for-41 (.366) with five doubles and four home runs (.780 slugging percentage) when leading off an inning...has yielded five of his seven home runs and issued his only two walks to left-handed hitters...five of his seven home runs have been solo shots.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-1 with a 3.92 ERA (9 er in 20.2 ip) and .238 (19-for-80) opponents batting average in seven games at home compared to 1-2 with a 7.23 ERA (15 er in 18.2 ip) and .354 (28-for-79) opponents average in seven games on the road.

2016 IN RELIEF: Made his Major League debut May 11 at Boston, tossing three innings of relief in the A's 13-3 loss...entered the game to start the sixth inning with the A's trailing 10-3...fanned Bradley, Jr. with one out in the sixth inning for his first Major League strikeout...struck out a career-high two batters in his debut...picked up his first Major League save June 13 against Texas when he tossed the final three innings of the A's 14-5 win...was credited with his first Major League win June 28 at San Francisco when he tossed a scoreless seventh inning in the A's 13-11 win...did not allow a run over his final four relief appearances from June 28 to Aug. 4 (9.1 ip).

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 13-3 loss at Seattle May 25...allowed a career high seven runs...retired the first five batters before Lind homered in the second inning...the scored was tied at 1-1 when he allowed six runs in the bottom of the third...Martin, Smith and Seager had RBI singles and Lind capped the scoring with a three-run home run...retired the side in order in the fourth and was relieved by Rzepczynski to start the fifth.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 win over Baltimore last Tuesday in Oakland...tossed a career high 5.1 innings...retired each of the first nine batters he faced and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Jones in the fourth...then retired seven of his final eight batters, yielding a leadoff double to Schoop in the sixth.

THIRD START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-4 loss to Seattle on August 14 in Oakland...tossed a career-high 74 pitches and matched his career highs in innings (5.1) and hits (8)...allowed a lead off home run

to Lind in the second but the A's came back to tie the game with a run in the bottom of the second...then allowed two runs in the third on a Seager RBI double and a Cano RBI single, and another run in the fourth on an O'Malley RBI single...was relieved by Coulombe after allowing a one-out single to Zunino in the sixth and Coulombe allowed that run to score.

LAST START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 4-2 loss at Chicago (AL) last Sunday...matched his career high in strikeouts (2) and hits (8)...allowed three runs in the first inning on a RBI double by Morneau and a two-run single by Frazier...the A's scored twice in the fourth to cut the gap to 3-2 but he allowed a leaoff home run to Abreu in the bottom of the fourth...was relieved by Hendriks with two outs in the fifth.

NASHVILLE: Went 7-2 with a 3.21 ERA in 11 starts with Triple-A Nashville...walked just eight batters in 61.2 innings, an average of 1.17 per nine innings...had five starts with no walks, four with one walk and two with two walks...took the loss in his first start but then went 6-0 with a 2.95 ERA over his next seven starts...went 1-1 with a 4.50 ERA over his final three starts...posted a 3-0 record and a 0.84 ERA in three starts in May...issued just one walk in 21.1 May innings.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .259 opponents batting average, including .233 (24-for-103) against left-handed hitters compared to .279 (38-for-136) against right-handers...surrendered all five of his home runs to right-handed hitters...had a .551 OPS against lefties, .735 against right-handers...opponents were 12-for-63 (.190) with one walk (.203 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...opponents hit .318 with runners in scoring position.

RHP Andrew Triggs (0-1, 4.38 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 23rd appearance and fifth start of the season and his career...was recalled from Triple-A Nashville August 5 for his eighth stint with the A's this year...that is believed to be the most stints in one season in Oakland history...is 0-1 with a 2.55 ERA in five games, including three starts, during his most recent stay...is 0-1 with a 2.41 ERA and .191 opponents batting average in four starts compared to 0-0 with a 5.58 ERA and .302 opponents batting average in 18 relief appearances...has walked just one batter in 18.2 innings as a starter...has not allowed an earned run over innings one through three (15.1 ip) and opponents are batting .167...has a 6.35 ERA and .300 opponents batting average from the fourth inning on...had a no decision in his last start, a 1-0 A's loss to Cleveland last Monday (6.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb, 6 so)...has never faced the Cardinals in his career.

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 2.54 ERA (37 er in 131.0 ip) and .199 (94-for-472) opponents batting average since the All-Star Break after logging a 4.30 ERA and .258 opponents average before the break.
- Has tossed 436.2 innings, which is the third most in the American League.
- Has allowed 50-of-208 (24.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the best percentage in the AL and second best in the majors (San Francisco, 21.5%).
- Ranks fourth in the AL in strikeouts (411), tied for fourth in opponents grounded into double plays (41), fifth in on-base percentage (.307) and tied for fifth in fewest losses (17)...ranks third in most wild pitches (26) and tied for third in blown saves (17) and walks (152).
