OAKLAND ATHLETICS (56-73) VS. ST. LOUIS CARDINALS (68-60)

SUNDAY, AUGUST 28, 2016 — BUSCH STADIUM — 1:15 P.M. CDT RHP ANDREW TRIGGS (0-1, 4.38) VS. LHP JAIME GARCIA (10-9, 4.37) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three of the last four games after losing eight of the previous nine...are now 9-18 (.333) over the last 27 games and 56-73 (.434) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...it is the sixth worst record in Oakland history after 129 games...a loss today would match the A's fifth worst record after 130 games...are in fourth place in the AL West and trail first place Texas by 19½ games, which is a ½ game short of the season high (20 on Aug. 23)...have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 59 days in fourth, 16 days tied for fourth and 30 days in fifth.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 6-13 (.316) in interleague play, which is the fourth worst record in the majors...conclude the interleague portion of the schedule today at St. Louis...have clinched a losing record against the National League for the first time since 2010 (8-10) and just the sixth time in 20 years of interleague play...have clinched the second worst interleague mark in Oakland history...the worst is 5-13 (.278)

in 2009...have the second lowest interleague batting average (.230) and fourth lowest on-base percentage (.291)...the lowest interleague on-base percentage in Oakland history currently is .298 in 2006...are 197-166 (.543) all-time in interleague games, which is sixth best in Major League history.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 0-for-19 with 11 strikeouts and three sacrifice hits this year and are 7-for-135 (.052) over the last seven years... have a .079 (29-for-368) average with four doubles, 11 RBI, 10 walks and 173 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .085)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California...the last extra base hit was by Joe Kennedy, a double on June 12, 2007 at Houston.

IN AUGUST: The A's are 9-15 (.375) in August, which is the third worst record in the American League...have clinched a losing record in August for the third consecutive season...the A's are batting .241 (194-for-805) with 85 runs scored...the runs are the fewest in the majors and the batting average is second lowest in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.41 ERA (63 er in 166.1 ip) over the last 19 games...that has lowered the season ERA to 4.51, which is the lowest it has been since May 9 when it was 4.47...rank third in the American League in highest opponents batting average (.264) and most wild pitches (58) and have the fourth highest ERA.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 7-10 with a 3.67 ERA (48 er in 117.2 ip) over the last 20 games...have issued just 18 walks over that span (1.38 per nine innings)...are now 35-56 with a 4.99 ERA (390 er in 703.0 ip) for the season...have the second fewest wins in the American League, are tied for the second most losses, have the third highest ERA and the fourth fewest innings pitched.

OFFENSE: The A's have walked 327 times, which is second fewest in the American League (Kansas City, 299) and third fewest in the majors (Philadelphia, 326)...are on pace for 411 walks, which would break the Athletics record for fewest walks in a 162-game season (421 in 1966)...have a .303 on-base percentage, which is the lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors...have the lowest slugging percentage in the AL (.399), the second fewest runs scored (513) and strikeouts (893), the third lowest batting average (.249) and the fourth fewest home runs (139).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed two errors in the last seven games...have 23 in the last 56 games after making 53 over the first 73 contests...A's outfielders have 20 assists, which is second fewest in the American League.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on this six-game road trip to St. Louis (1-1) and Houston (three games)...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Texas (0-3) and Chicago-AL (1-2) and have lost 11 of their last 14 road games...

are 26-37 (.413) on the road for the season...went 2-1 on the last homestand against Cleveland and are 30-36 (.455) at home, which is the second worst home record in the American League...have a 5.16 ERA (311 er in 542.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.93 (262 er in 600.0 ip) at home...the road ERA is third highest in the majors...are batting .255 (565-for-2212) on the road compared to .242 (527-for-2178) at home.

MARGIN OF VICTORY: Three of the A's last four wins have been by four runs or more after each of their previous 17 were by three runs or fewer... have outscored their opponents by 22 runs in their last four wins after winning by a combined 27 runs over their previous 17 victories...are 40-41 (.494) in games decided by three runs or fewer compared to 16-32 (.333) in games decided by four runs or more...the record in games decided by four or more is the worst in the American League and third worst in the majors...have a run differential of -91, which is second worst in the AL (Minnesota, -120).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have lost three of their last four one-run decisions...are 20-20 (.500) in one-run games for the season and rank fourth in the American League in one-run games (40)...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year, which was the second worst record in the majors... the A's have six walk-off wins and eight walk-off losses...the eight walk-off losses rank third in the majors and the 14 games are tied for fourth...all eight losses have come against AL West competition.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list an Oakland record 27 times...the previous mark of 25 was set in 2008...the 27 players have combined to miss 1377 games (51.0 games per stint) and the games missed will set an Oakland record on Monday...the current mark is 1397 in 2010...have a season-high 16 players on the DL, including 11 on the 60-day DL...prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4, at least nine every day since May 6 and at least six all year.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 4-7 in this five-series stretch where they will play in five different cities (Texas, Chicago, Oakland vs. Cleveland, St. Louis and Houston)...have made a total of 162 player moves in 147 days dating back to Opening Day, April 4...have lost 16 of the last 20 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 13-21 (.382) in those games for the season, which is the worst record in the American League... are 38-44 (.463) in night games compared to 18-29 (.383) during the day... have the second worst day record in the AL (Minnesota, 18-31)...pinch hitters are 2 for their last 25 (.080)...rank second in the AL in hits (19), RBI (13) and plate appearances (99).

A's vs. CARDINALS: The A's trail in the all-time series, 5-9...are 3-3 in Oakland and 2-6 in St. Louis...including 2-3 in the new Busch Stadium... last met in Oakland in 2013 when the A's won two of three...last played in St. Louis in 2010 when Oakland lost two of three...the two franchises also met in back-to-back World Series with the A's winning in seven games in 1930 and the Cardinals winning in seven games in 1931.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp is batting a Major League leading .431 with runners in scoring position...started the season 0-for-9 with RISP but is 28-for-56 (.500) since then...*Khris Davis* has hit 33 home runs, which ranks third in the AL and is the most by an Athletic since Jack Cust had 33 in 2008...*Ryon Healy* has a 13-game hitting streak, which is the longest active hitting streak in the majors and the longest by an Athletic this year...is 19-for-49 (.388) with three doubles, two home runs and five multiple hit games during the streak, which is an on-going career high...*Ryan Madson* has not allowed a run in eight games and 9.2 innings in August and is a perfect 4-for-4 in save opportunities...*Jake Smolinski* had his career-high tying seven-game hitting streak snapped last night (also June 8-17, 2016 and July 17-24, 2016)...went 9-for-28 (.321) during the streak.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1974** the A's win at Milwaukee 3-1 as Catfish Hunter wins his 20th game of the season, his fourth consecutive 20-win season...he would go on to win 25 games, an Oakland record which stood until 1990 when Bob Welch won 27...in **2002** the A's defeat Kansas City 7-1 to extend their winning streak to an Oakland record 15, breaking the mark of 14 set in 1988...the streak would reach an AL record 20 before coming to an end.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Andrew Triggs (0-1, 4.38 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 23rd appearance and fifth start of the season and his career...was recalled from Triple-A Nashville August 5 for his eighth stint with the A's this year...that is believed to be the most stints in one season in Oakland history...is 0-1 with a 2.55 ERA (5 er in 17.2 ip) in five games, including three starts, during his most recent stay.

FIRST FOUR STINTS, LAST FOUR STINTS: Compiled an 8.00 ERA and .312 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over his first four stints through June 3...is 0-1 with a 2.30 ERA (8 er in 31.1 ip) and .231 (27-for-117) opponents batting average in 12 games, including four starts, over his last four stints...allowed three home runs over his first four starts (18.0 ip) and one in his last four (31.1 ip).

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 0-1 with a 2.41 ERA (5 er in 18.2 ip) and .191 (13-for-68) opponents batting average in four starts compared to 0-0 with a 5.58 ERA and .302 opponents batting average in 18 relief appearances...has walked just one batter in 18.2 innings as a starter.

INNING BY INNING: Has not allowed an earned run over innings one through three (15.1 ip) and opponents are batting .167 (9-for-54)...has a 6.35 ERA (24 er in 34.0 ip) and .300 (42-for-140) opponents batting average from the fourth inning on.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Has made four interleague appearances, all in relief (5.2 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 4 bb, 8 so, 1.59 ERA).

WITH THE BAT: Has never batted as a professional.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has issued nine of his 13 walks to left-handed hitters but has surrendered three of his four home runs to right-handers... has yielded a .237 (33-for-139) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .327 (18-for-55) after that...opponents are batting .217 (10-for-46) with two walks and two hit by pitches (.280 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...has a .135 (13-for-96) opponents batting average with two strikes...opponents are 7-for-15 (.467) with two doubles and triple when putting the first pitch in play...the number three hitter is batting .440 (11-for-25) but the four hitter has a .143 (3-for-21) average.

EIGHT STINTS: His stints with the A's this year are from April 26-26, April 29, May 7 (26th man for doubleheader), May 10-June 3, June 18, June 30-July 1, July 4-August 3 (includes stay on the DL from July 18-August 1) and August 5-present...five of his eight stints began less than eight days following his previous option...has three one-day stints and two two-day stints.

IN RELIEF: Tossed at least one inning in 17 of his 18 relief appearances, including two or more 10 times...allowed 4-of-8 (50.0%) inherited runners to score...first batters faced were 3-for-17 (.176) with a walk (.222 on-base percentage)...struck out 33 batters in 30.2 innings of relief (9.68 per nine innings)...pitched just once in a game the A's won (May 18 vs. Texas)... made his Major League debut April 25 at Detroit and retired the side in order in the eighth inning (1.0 ip, 1 so)...struck out the first batter he faced (Tyler Collins)...was sent back to Nashville two days later...did not pitch during his second stint and worked just once during his third...was recalled a fourth time May 10 and allowed at least one run in seven of his eight appearances for a 9.00 ERA and .338 opponents batting average...including June 3 at Houston when he had career highs in hits (7), runs (5) and strikeouts (6)...made just one appearance during his fifth stint and it was his first start on June 18 against Los Angeles-AL...did not allow a run during stint number six from June 30 to July 1 (3.2 ip)...then allowed one run in each of the first three games of his seventh stint (2 er in 4.2 ip, 3.86 ERA) before going on the 15-day disabled list July 19 retroactive to July 18 with a right shin contusion...was reinstated Aug. 2, tossed 2.1 scoreless innings Aug. 3 at Los Angeles (AL), was optioned Aug. 4 and then recalled Aug. 5 when Jesse Hahn went on the DL

FIRST START: Had a no decision in the A's 7-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on June 18 in Oakland...shut out the Angels on two hits over the first three innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Trout in the fourth...was relieved by Dull after tossing 3.0 innings and 50 pitches.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-6 loss to Baltimore on August 11 in Oakland...retired each of the first seven batters before Schoop singled with one out in the third...then allowed three runs in the fourth inning on a RBI single by Trumbo and a two-run double by Alvarez... left after four innings with the A's trailing 3-0.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 10-inning loss at Texas last Tuesday...the A's scored a run in the second inning and he shut out the Rangers on two hits over the first five innings...hit Chrinos with one out to start the sixth and retired the next two batters with Chrinos moving to second...was relieved by Dull who allowed a RBI single to Beltran for the blown save...the A's tied the game in the ninth and scored twice in the

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 1-0 loss to Cleveland last Monday in Oakland...tossed a career-high 6.0 innings and did not allow a run...also had a career-high 89 pitches and matched his high with six strikeouts...faced the minimum over the first four innings as the only base runner, a Naquin leadoff single in the third, was erased on a caught stealing...did not allow a runner past first base until Santana walked with two outs in the sixth and went to third on a Kipnis double...left the game after six innings with the scored tied at 0-0 and Dull allowed a Santana home run in the eighth for the loss.

NASHVILLE: Was 2-1 with two saves and a 2.95 ERA in 16 appearances with Nashville, all in relief...struck out 21 and walked five in 18.1 innings... did not allow a home run...logged a 5.14 ERA in six games before his first promotion to Oakland on April 25...compiled a 1.59 ERA in 10 games after that...did not allow a run in seven games on the road (8.0 ip)

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .225 batting average, including .130 (3-for-23) against left-handed hitters compared to .271 (13-for-48) against right-handers...opponents hit .125 when leading off an inning...yielded a .273 batting average with runners in scoring position

THIS AND THAT: Tossed one or more innings in 15 of his 16 appearances, including a season-high 2.0 innings April 23 against New Orleans and July 28 against Colorado Springs...did not allow a run 12 times...including each of his first three games (3.0 ip) when he picked up his only two runs of the season (April 8 against Oklahoma City and April 13 against Colorado Springs...surrendered a season-high four runs on a season-high four hit in a season-low 0.1 innings for his only loss April 14 against Colorado Springs...his most pitches in a game came on April 20 at Colorado Springs (40)...recorded his first save of the season May 1 at Round Rock... matched his season-high with three strikeouts in the second game of a double header on June 9 at Oklahoma City (also April 11 against Colorado Springs)...was credited with his second save June 12 at Oklahoma City.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Has a 13-10 record, 52 saves and a 2.09 ERA (59 er in 254.1 ip) in 168 games over five professional seasons...has surrendered just seven home runs in 254.1 career innings (0.25 per nine innings) and has issued just 56 walks (1.98 per nine innings)...converted each of his 17 save opportunities at Double-A Bowie in 2015...led the Texas League with 19 saves at Northwest Arkansas in 2014...was a TL All-Star that year...made his only minor league start on May 18, 2014 at Tulsa and had a no decision in a 6-5 loss (4.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...was drafted three times before signing with Kansas City...spent three seasons in the Royals farm system before he was traded to Baltimore prior to the 2015 season...was claimed off waivers by the A's March 13, 2016.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Sean Manaea (5-8, 4.53 ERA): Is 3-4 with a 3.44 ERA (26 er in 68.0 ip) in 11 games, including 10 starts, since he was reinstated from the disabled list June 29...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day DL June 14 with a left pronator strain...ranks second among AL rookies in strikeouts (100), innings pitched (117.1) and games started (19)...is 0-5 with a 6.98 ERA and .320 opponents average in seven starts on the road...his career-opening road losing streak is second longest in Oakland history to Mike Morgan, who lost each of his first six road starts from June 17, 1978-July 24, 1979...has a 1.99 ERA over innings one through three and a 7.06 ERA from the fourth inning on...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 9-1 A's win over Cleveland last Tuesday in Oakland (7.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 8 so)...is 0-0 with a 3.00 ERA (12.0 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 9 so, 1 hr) in two career starts against Houston.

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 2.49 ERA (37 er in 134.0 ip) and .195 (94-for-481) opponents batting average since the All-Star Break after logging a 4.30 ERA and .258 opponents average before the break.
- Has tossed 439.2 innings, which is the third most in the American League.
- Has allowed 50-of-208 (24.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the best percentage in the AL and second best in the majors (San Francisco, 21.4%).
- Ranks fourth in the AL in strikeouts (417) and opponents on-base percentage (.305) and tied for fifth in fewest losses (17) and most grounded into double plays (41)...ranks third in most wild pitches (26), tied for third in blown saves (17) and fourth in walks (152).
- First batters faced are 83-for-368 (.226) with 30 walks (.282 on-base percentage)...leads the AL in first batter slugging percentage (.318), ranks second in on-base percentage and third in batting average.

- Is tied for ninth among American League relievers in games pitched (56)...is tied for third in most blown saves (6) and walks (26).
- Has allowed nine of his 27 runs in sixth inning (2.2 ip, 30.38 ERA)...has a 3.10 ERA (17 er in 49.1 ip) from the seventh inning on.
- Has a .357 (15-for-42) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position, including .429 (9-for-21) with RISP and two outs.
