**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won four of the last five games after losing eight of the previous nine...are now 10-18 (.357) over the last 28 games and 57-73 (.438) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...it is tied for the sixth worst record in Oakland history after 130 games...were 56-74 after 130 games last year (won game 131)...are in fourth place in the AL West and trail first place Texas by 19½ games, which is ½ game short of the season high (20 on Aug. 23)...have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 60 days in fourth, 16 days tied for fourth and 30 days in fifth.

**IN AUGUST:** The A's are 10-15 (.400) in August, which is the third worst record in the American League...have clinched a losing record in August for the third consecutive season...it is the A's fourth consecutive month with a losing record (went 13-12 in April)...have the fewest triples in the American League (1), the second lowest batting average (.243) and second fewest runs scored (92), are tied for the second fewest home runs (28) and tied for the third fewest walks (64)...have walked fewer than 74 times in August in a non-strike season just once in Oakland history (62 in 1972)...the pitching staff has issued the second fewest walks in the AL (57) and also has the second fewest strikeouts (163).

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 3.44 ERA (67 er in 175.1 ip) over the last 20 games dating back to August 7...the season ERA stands at 4.51 for the second consecutive day, which is the lowest it has been since May 9 when it was 4.47...have not finished the year with an ERA above 4.28 since 2000 (4.58)...have the second highest ERA in the American League, the third highest opponents batting average (.264) and the third most wild pitches (58).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 8-10 with a 3.71 ERA (51 er in 123.2 ip) over the last 21 games...have issued just 18 walks over that span (1.31 per nine innings), including 11 games with no walks...are 36-56 with a 4.99 ERA (393 er in 709.0 ip) for the season...have the second highest ERA in the American League, the second fewest wins, are tied for the second most losses and have the fourth fewest innings pitched...have tossed fewer than five innings 38 times, which is the most in the majors and the most by an A's team since 1997 (52)...the A's have used 12 different starting pitchers this year and all 12 have made at least four starts...the 12 players with four or more starts is tied with Atlanta for the most in the majors and is tied for the most in Athletics history (1957 and 1997).

**OFFENSE:** The A's have walked 329 times, which is second fewest in the American League (Kansas City, 306)...are on pace for 410 walks, which would break the Athletics record for fewest walks in a 162-game season (421 in 1966)...have a .303 on-base percentage, which is the lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors...the Oakland record for lowest on-base percentage is .302 in 1979...have been hit by a pitch 29 times, which is second fewest in the majors (Milwaukee, 28)...are tied with Kansas City for the fewest runs scored in the AL (520), have the second fewest strikeouts (902), the second lowest slugging percentage (.400), the third lowest batting average (.249) and the fourth fewest home runs (141) and stolen bases (44).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed two errors in the last eight games...have 23 in the last 57 games after making 53 over the first 73 contests...A's outfielders have 21 assists, which is tied for second fewest in the American League.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 2-1 on this six-game road trip to St. Louis (2-1) and Houston (three games)...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Texas (0-3) and Chicago-AL (1-2) and have lost 11 of their last 15 road games...are 27-37 (.422) on the road for the season...return home following the game Wednesday for a nine-game homestand against Boston (three games), Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Seattle (three games)...went 2-1 on the last homestand against Cleveland and are 30-36 (.455) at home, which is the second worst home record in the American League...have a 5.14 ERA (315 er in 551.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.93 (262 er in 600.0 ip) at home...the road ERA is second highest in the AL (Minnesota, 5.32)...are batting .255 (574-for-2247) on the road compared to .242 (527-for-2178) at home.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 20-20 (.500) in one-run games and rank fourth in the American League in one-run games (40)...went 19-35 (.352)

in one-run games last year, which was the second worst record in the majors...have six walk-off wins and eight walk-off losses...the 14 walk-off games are tied for third most in the AL and the eight losses ranks third...all eight losses have come against AL West competition, including three against Houston.

**MARGIN OF VICTORY:** The A's are 41-41 (.500) in games decided by three runs or fewer compared to 16-32 (.333) in games decided by four runs or more...the 16 wins by four runs or more is second fewest in the majors (Atlanta, 12) and the winning percentage is the worst in the AL and third worst in the majors...have a run differential of -88, which is second worst in the AL (Minnesota, -123)...the last time the A's were outscored by more than 44 runs in a season was in 1997 (-182).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list 27 times and those players have combined to miss 1393 games (51.6 games per stint)...the 27 DL placements is an Oakland record, breaking the previous mark of 25 set in 2008...the games missed will set an Oakland today, breaking the mark of 1397 set in 2010...with Billy Butler being reinstated from the seven-day concussion DL today, the A's now have 15 players on the DL (including 11 on the 60-day DL), which is one short of the season high of 16...prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4, at least nine every day since May 6 and at least six all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 5-7 in this five-series stretch where they will play in five different cities (Texas, Chicago, Oakland vs. Cleveland, St. Louis and Houston)...have made a total of 164 player moves in 148 days dating back to Opening Day, April 4...are averaging 2 hours and 57 minutes per game, which is second fastest in the majors (Kansas City, 2:56)...have lost 16 of the last 21 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 14-21 (.400) in those games for the season, which is the worst record in the American League...pinch hitters are 2 for their last 26 (.077)...rank second in the AL in hits (19), RBI (13) and plate appearances (100) but are tied for last in walks (3).

**A's vs. ASTROS:** The A's are 6-7 against the Astros...that includes 4-2 in Oakland and 2-5 in Houston...have lost seven of the last nine games at Minute Maid Park but have won nine of the last 12 games in the Coliseum...lost the season series to the Astros for the first time last year...lead the all-time series 46-30 (.605), which is the fifth best record by a Major League club against another club among teams that have played each other 60 or more times...16 of the A's 30 losses to Houston have been by one run...are 25-13 in Oakland and 21-17 in Houston.

**TODAY'S TIDBITS**  
**Coco Crisp** is batting a Major League leading .431 with runners in scoring position...started the season 0-for-9 with RISP but is 28-for-56 (.500) since then...**Khris Davis** hit his 34 home run of the season yesterday, which are the most by an Athletic since 2006 when Frank Thomas had 39 and Nick Swisher had 35...**Ryon Healy** extended his hitting streak to 14 games yesterday, which is the longest active hitting streak in the majors, the longest by an American League rookie and the longest by an Athletic this year (21-for-52, .404)...**Ryan Madson** has not allowed a run in nine games and 10.2 innings in August and is a perfect 5-for-5 in save opportunities

**THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY**  
In 1937 the A's score 12 runs in the first inning of the first game of a doubleheader against Chicago...Bob Johnson drives in six runs in the first inning...in 1989 the A's score 10 times in the fifth inning of a 19-5 win at New York...Jose Canseco has two hits in the inning, including a three run homer, and is 4 for 5 with four runs, a pair of homers and five RBI in the game...in 1998 the A's set an Oakland record with eight doubles in an 11-6 win at Cleveland...Ben Grieve ties the Oakland individual record with three doubles and Scott Spiezio adds two.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (5-8, 4.53 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is 3-4 with a 3.44 ERA (26 er in 68.0 ip) in 12 games, including 10 starts, since he was reinstated from the disabled list June 29...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day DL June 14 with a left pronator strain...was selected from Triple-A Nashville April 29 and is making his Major League debut.

**ROOKIE LEADERS:** Ranks second among American League rookies in strikeouts (100), innings pitched (117.1) and games started (19) and tied for sixth in wins (5).

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** Left-handed hitters are 1-for-16 (.063) against him in August and are batting .167 (14-for-84) with five extra base hits (two doubles, three home runs) overall...right-handers are batting .288 (105-for-365) with 16 of his 19 home runs and 26 of his 30 walks...the batting average against lefties is second lowest in the majors among pitchers with 100 or more innings (Kershaw, LAD .152) and his .511 OPS is third lowest...has an .828 OPS against righties.

**INNING BY INNING:** Has a 1.99 ERA (13 er in 58.2 ip) and .220 (46-for-209) opponents batting average over innings one through three and a 7.06 ERA (46 er in 58.2 ip) and .304 (73-for-240) opponents batting average from the fourth inning on...has allowed three runs in the first inning (19.0 ip, 1.42 ERA), all on May 10 at Boston...has allowed just two runs in innings one through three in 11 games since returning from the DL June 29 (32.0 ip, 0.56 ERA) and just two runs over the first four innings of his last seven starts (28.0 ip, 0.64 ERA).

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 0-5 with a 6.98 ERA (31 er in 40.0 ip) and .320 (54-for-169) opponents average in seven starts on the road compared to 5-3 with a 3.26 ERA (28 er in 77.1 ip) and .232 (65-for-280) opponents batting average in 13 games at home...his career-opening road losing streak is second longest in Oakland history to Mike Morgan, who lost each of his first six road starts from June 17, 1978-July 24, 1979...has surrendered 10 home runs in 40.0 innings on the road (2.25 per nine innings), nine in 77.1 innings in Oakland (1.05 per nine innings)...has a .906 OPS on the road, .688 at home.

**DON'T WALK:** Has not walked a batter in five of his last nine games and has walked just 14 batters in 68.0 innings (1.85 per nine innings) since he was reinstated from the DL June 29...is averaging 2.30 walks per nine innings for the season (30 bb in 117.1 ip)...walked Yunel Escobar with two outs in the fifth inning on Aug. 2 at Los Angeles (AL) to snap a streak of four games, 30.2 innings and 126 batters faced without a walk...the streak of 30.2 innings without a walk was the longest single season streak in Oakland history, topping the previous mark of 29.0 by Lary Sorensen (July 8-31, 1984)...it was fifth longest overall in Oakland history.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Opponents are batting .212 (18-for-85) with runners in scoring position, including .158 (6-for-38) with RISP and two outs...based on a minimum of 100 innings pitched, he has the highest opponents batting average in the majors against the opponents number four hitter (21-for-54, .389) and the fifth lowest in the AL against the number three hitter (9-for-49, .184)...opponents are 34-for-72 (.472) with eight doubles, six home runs and 21 RBI when putting the first pitch in play...the batting average is the highest in the AL and his slugging percentage (.833) is fourth highest...has a .219 (37-for-169) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .264 (43-for-163) the second time and .333 (39-for-117) with 10 of his 19 home runs after that...has allowed at least one home run in each of his last six starts (eight home runs total).

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 2-3 with a 3.61 ERA (23 er in 57.1 ip) in nine starts on four days rest, 3-5 with a 5.56 ERA (34 er in 55.0 ip) in 10 starts on five days rest or more.

**2016 HIGHLIGHTS:** Made his Major League debut on **April 29** and had a no decision in a 7-4 A's win over Houston...had just 42 minor league appearances, all starts, in three professional seasons...became the 45th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the first since Dan Straily on Aug. 3, 2012 against Toronto...issued a career-high four walks...left with an 8-4 lead in his second start on **May 4** against Seattle but the bullpen allowed two runs in the sixth inning and three more in the seventh for the blown save (Axford)...yielded a career-high eight runs on 10 hits in a career-low 2.2 innings for the first decision of his career, a loss in a 13-5 decision at Boston **May 10**...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to allow at least four runs in each of his first three Major League appearances...the other is Vida Blue (July 20-Aug. 3, 1969)...picked up his first Major League win in the A's 3-1 victory over Texas **May 16** in Oakland...had a no decision in the A's 14-5 win over Texas on **June 13** in Oakland...had a 10-2 lead when he left the game after 4.1 innings with a left pronator muscle strain...went on the DL the next day...made one start on a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton on **June 24** against San Jose and had a no decision (3.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 3 so, 1 hr, 64

itches)...tossed a career-high 106 pitches in 7.0 innings and did not allow a run or walk a batter on **July 10** at Houston...ended up with a no decision in the A's 2-1, 10-inning loss...made his first career relief appearance **July 17** against Toronto...entered the game to start the second inning in relief of Andrew Triggs, who left the game with a left shin contusion...Triggs relieved Rich Hill who left after five pitchers with a blister...Manaea had been scheduled to start two days later...tossed 5.0 innings, which is a season-high for an A's reliever...had a no decision in the A's 1-0, 13-inning win over Tampa Bay **July 22** in Oakland...tossed a career-high 8.0 scoreless innings and allowed just five hits and no walks, but Odorizzi did the same for the Rays...struck out a career-high nine batters but allowed a career-high 11 hits in 6.2 innings in a no decision at Texas **July 27**...picked up his fourth win of the season in a 6-3 victory over Seattle **August 12** to snap a career-high three-game losing streak.

**LAST START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-1 win over Cleveland last Tuesday in Oakland...did not allow a hit until Napoli singled with two outs in the fourth and shutout the Indians on two hits and two walks over the first five innings...had a 6-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Gimenez in the sixth...that was the only run he would allowed in seven innings.

**MANAEA vs. HOUSTON:** Is 0-0 with a 3.00 ERA (12.0 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 9 so, 1 hr) in two career starts, both this year...had a no decision in his Major League debut, a 7-4 A's win in Oakland on April 29...allowed a leadoff home run to Gattis in the second inning but the A's came back with two in the bottom of the second...allowed a RBI single to Gattis in the sixth to tie the game and was relieved by Doolittle with no outs and runners on first and second...Doolittle allowed both runs to score but the A's tied the game in the eighth and won it on a three-run home run by Alonso in the ninth...also had a no decision in the A's 2-1, 10-inning loss at Houston on July 10...tossed a career-high 106 pitches in 7.0 innings and did not allow a run or walk a batter...allowed a runner to advance into scoring position in five of his seven innings...the A's scored a run in the sixth to take a 1-0 lead but Madson allowed a run in the ninth for the blown save and Hendriks surrendered a run in the 10th for the loss.

**TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER**  
**RHP Kendall Graveman (10-8, 3.97 ERA):** Is 3-1 with a 1.88 ERA (6 er in 28.2 ip) over his last four starts...is now 9-2 with a 3.33 ERA (38 er in 102.2 ip) over his last 16 starts after going 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts...has eight wins dating back to June 23, which is tied for third most in the American League over that span...Has walked two batters or fewer in 14 of his last 15 starts and has 16 walks in 96.2 innings over that span for an average of 1.49 per nine innings...is 5-2 with a 3.27 ERA in eight starts since the All-Star Break...is tied for fifth in the AL in wins since the break...is 3-1 with a 3.31 ERA in five starts in August...won four games in July, which were his most wins in a month...picked up his 10th win of the season in his last start, a 5-1 A's win over Cleveland last Wednesday in Oakland (6.2 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 2 so)...is 3-1 with a 4.60 ERA (29.1 ip, 32 h, 16 r, 15 er, 7 bb, 13 so) in five career starts against Houston.

**Saves/Opportunities:** 36-for-53 (67.9%)

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 0.77 ERA (2 er in 23.1 ip) and .185 (15-for-81) opponents batting average over its last eight games.
- Has allowed 50-of-208 (24.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the best percentage in the AL and second best in the majors (San Francisco, 21.4%).
- Ranks third in the AL in innings pitched (442.2), fourth in strikeouts (419), opponents on-base percentage (.305) and slugging percentage (.381) and tied for fifth in wins (21) and fewest losses (17)...ranks third in most wild pitches (26), tied for third in blown saves (17) and fourth in walks (152).
- First batters faced are 84-for-371 (.226) with 30 walks (.282 on-base percentage)...leads the AL in first batter slugging percentage (.318), ranks second in on-base percentage and third in batting average.
