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### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (57-74) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (69-62)

TUESDAY, AUGUST 30, 2016 — MINUTE MAID PARK — 7:10 P.M. CDT RHP KENDALL GRAVEMAN (10-8, 3.97) VS. RHP COLLIN MCHUGH (8-10, 5.01) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four of the last six games after losing eight of the previous nine...are now 10-19 (.345) over the last 29 games and 57-74 (.435) for the season, which is tied for the third worst record in the American League...it is tied with the 2015 A's for the fifth worst record in Oakland history after 131 games (won game 132 in 2015)...with a loss today, the A's would have their worst record after 132 games since 1997 (52-80)...are tied for fourth in the AL West and trail first place Texas by a season-high 20½ games...the A's largest deficit last year was 21 games (Oct. 1) and they have not been farther than 21 games back since finishing the 2011 season 22 games out...have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 60 days in fourth, 17 days tied for fourth and 30 days in fifth.

IN AUGUST: The A's are 10-16 (.385) in August, which is tied with Los Angeles for the second worst record in the American League (Minnesota, 9-18)...it is currently the seventh worst August in Oakland history and the worst since 2008 (10-20, .333)...have clinched a losing record in August for the third consecutive season...it is the A's fourth consecutive month with a losing record (went 13-12 in April)...are batting .238 (207-for-869), which is second lowest in the majors (San Diego, .223)...have 92 runs scored, which is also second fewest (Miami, 91)...have the fewest triples in the AL (1), the second fewest home runs (28) and are tied for the fourth fewest walks (68)...have walked fewer than 74 times in August in a non-strike season just once in Oakland history (62 in 1972)...the pitching staff has issued the second fewest walks in the AL (61) and also has the second fewest strikeouts (174).

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 3.49 ERA (71 er in 183.1 ip) over the last 21 games dating back to August 7...the season ERA stands at 4.51 for the third consecutive day, which is the lowest it has been since May 9 when it was 4.47...have not finished the year with an ERA above 4.28 since 2000 (4.58)...have the second highest ERA in the American League, the third highest opponents batting average (.264) and the third most wild pitches (59).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 8-11 with a 3.61 ERA (51 er in 127.0 ip) over the last 22 games...have issued just 20 walks over that span (1.42 per nine innings), including 11 games with no walks...are 36-57 with a 4.97 ERA (393 er in 712.1 ip) for the season...have the second highest ERA in the American League, the second most losses, the second fewest wins and the third fewest innings pitched...have tossed fewer than five innings 39 times, which is the most in the majors and the most by an A's team since 1997 (52)...the A's have used 12 different starting pitchers this year and all 12 have made at least four starts...the 12 players with four or more starts is tied with Atlanta for the most in the majors and is tied for the most in Athletics history (1957 and 1997).

OFFENSE: The A's were shutout for the second time in the last seven games last night and the ninth time this year, which is tied for second most in the American League (Kansas City, 10)...have scored 520 runs for the season, which is the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors... are now batting .176 (22-for-125) with 11 runs scored over the first four games of the road trip...have the lowest on-base percentage (.303) and slugging percentage (.398) in the AL and the third lowest batting average (.248)...have been hit by the fewest pitches in the AL (31), rank second in fewest walks (333) and fewest strikeouts (912) and fourth in fewest home runs (141), fewest extra base hits (369) and fewest stolen bases (44)...are on pace for 412 walks, which would break the Athletics record for fewest walks in a 162-game season (421 in 1966)...the Oakland record for lowest on-base percentage is .302 in 1979.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 25 errors in the last 58 games after making 53 over the first 73 contests...have 78 errors for the season, which is fifth most in the American League, but the errors have led to 33 unearned runs, which is tied for fourth fewest...A's outfielders have 21 assists, which is tied for second fewest in the AL.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 2-2 on this six-game road trip to St. Louis (2-1) and Houston (0-1)...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Texas (0-3) and Chicago-AL (1-2) and have lost 12 of their last 16 road games...are 27-

38 (.415) on the road for the season...return home following the game tomorrow for a nine-game homestand against Boston (three games), Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Seattle (three games)...went 2-1 on the last homestand against Cleveland and are 30-36 (.455) at home, which is the second worst home record in the American League...have a 5.13 ERA (319 er in 559.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.93 (262 er in 600.0 ip) at home...the road ERA is second highest in the AL (Minnesota, 5.24)...are batting .254 (578-for-2276) on the road compared to .242 (527-for-2178) at home.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 20-20 (.500) in one-run games and rank fourth in the American League in one-run games (40)...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year, which was the second worst record in the majors... have eight walk-off losses, which are third most in the AL...all eight losses have come against AL West competition, including three against Houston.

MARGIN OF VICTORY: The A's are 41-41 (.500) in games decided by three runs or fewer compared to 16-33 (.327) in games decided by four runs or more...the 16 wins by four runs or more is second fewest in the majors (Atlanta, 12) and the winning percentage is the worst in the AL and third worst in the majors...have a run differential of -94, which is second worst in the AL (Minnesota, -124)...the last time the A's were outscored by more than 44 runs in a season was in 1997 (-182).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list an Oakland-record 27 times and those players have combined to miss an Oakland-record 1408 games (52.1 games per stint)....currently have 15 players on the DL (including 11 on the 60-day DL), which is one short of the season high of 16...prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4, at least nine every day since May 6 and at least six all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 5-8 in this five-series stretch where they will play in five different cities (Texas, Chicago, Oakland vs. Cleveland, St. Louis and Houston)...have made a total of 164 player moves in 149 days dating back to Opening Day, April 4...are averaging 2 hours and 56 minutes per game, which is tied with Kansas City for the fastest in the majors...have lost 16 of the last 21 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 14-21 (.400) in those games for the season, which is the worst record in the American League...pinch hitters are 2 for their last 27 (.074)...rank second in the AL in hits (19), RBI (13) and plate appearances (101) but are tied for last in walks (3).

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's are 6-8 against the Astros...that includes 4-2 in Oakland and 2-6 in Houston...have lost eight of the last 10 games at Minute Maid Park but have won nine of the last 12 games in the Coliseum... lost the season series to the Astros for the first time last year...lead the all-time series 46-31 (.597)...16 of the A's 31 losses to Houston have been by one run...are 25-13 in Oakland and 21-18 in Houston.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp is batting a Major League leading .424 with runners in scoring position...started the season 0-for-9 with RISP but is 28-for-57 (.491) since then...Khris Davis has seven home runs in his last 17 games and 34 for the season, which are the most by an Athletic since 2006 when Frank Thomas had 39 and Nick Swisher had 35...Ryon Healy had his 14-game hitting streak snapped yesterday, but now has a 15-game reaching base streak, which matches the A's season high...Ryan Madson has not allowed a run in nine games and 10.2 innings in August and is a perfect 5-for-5 in save opportunities.

### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1974** Claudell Washington has five hits in five at bats, collecting three singles, a double and a triple in the A's 10-5 win at Detroit...in **1995** the A's tie a club record with three triples in a 7-2 win at Baltimore...Brent Gates has one of those triples, and adds a single and a double to fall a home run short of the cycle...in **2001** Eric Chavez homers twice and has eight RBI in the A's 15-0 win at Baltimore.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (10-8, 3.97 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is 3-1 with a 1.88 ERA (6 er in 28.2 ip) over his last four starts...is now 9-2 with a 3.33 ERA (38 er in 102.2 ip) over his last 16 starts after going 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts...has eight wins dating back to June 23, which is tied for third most in the American League over that span.

**DON'T WALK:** Has walked two batters or fewer in 14 of his last 15 starts and has 16 walks in 96.2 innings over that span for an average of 1.49 per nine innings...walked 22 batters over his first 10 starts and 53.0 innings (3.74 per nine innings)...has walked just five batters to lead off an inning, which is tied for fourth fewest in the American League among pitchers with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title...has walked one batter or fewer in 15 of his 25 starts.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Is tied for second in the American League in shutouts (1), ranks third in fewest strikeouts per nine innings (5.23), tied for fourth in complete games (2), fifth in fewest pitches per game (90.6) and tied for fifth in opponents reaching on an error (8).

**SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK:** Is 5-2 with a 3.27 ERA (20 er in 55.0 ip) in eight starts since the All-Star Break after going 5-6 with a 4.37 ERA in 17 starts before the break...is tied for fifth in the American League in wins since the break...his five post-break wins surpass Sonny Gray's and Fernando Rodriguez' team leading total of four from last year.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 3-1 with a 3.31 ERA (12 er in 32.2 ip) in five starts in August...has won more than three games in a month once in his career and that came this July when he went 4-1 with a 2.68 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in five starts...the July wins tied for third in the American League...went 1-0 with a 4.33 ERA in five starts in June...was 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in six starts in May...his May loss total tied for second in the AL...it was the first time he has lost four games in a month in his career...went 1-2 with a 4.03 ERA in four starts in April.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 4-3 with a 4.40 ERA (38 er in 77.2 ip) in 13 starts on four days rest compared to 6-5 with a 3.50 ERA (28 er in 72.0 ip) in 12 starts on five days rest or more.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 5-4 with a 2.88 ERA (23 er in 72.0 ip) in 11 starts at home compared to 5-4 with a 4.98 ERA (43 er in 77.2 ip) in 14 starts on the road...has the fifth lowest home ERA in the American League...has surrendered six home runs in 72.0 innings at home compared to 13 in 77.2 innings on the road.

**SUPPORT:** Has left with the lead in four of his starts only to have the bullpen blow the save (April 12 vs. Los Angeles-AL, June 17 vs. Los Angeles, June 28 vs. San Francisco, July 29 at Cleveland)...is averaging 5.79 (66 rs in 102.2 ip) runs of support over his last 16 starts after receiving an average of 2.30 runs of support over his first nine starts...is 0-5 with two runs of support or fewer, 10-2 with three runs of support or more...is now 1-14 in 20 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 15-3 in 26 starts with three runs of support or more.

THIS AND THAT: Is scheduled to make his 26th start of the season today, which is an on-going career high...is in his second full season and has career highs in every category except losses...has a 1.44 ERA (4 er in 25.0 ip) in the first inning, 4.48 (62 er in 124.2 ip) after that...has the third lowest ERA in the first inning in the American League...went 1-2 with a 7.29 ERA over the first nine games (four starts) of his career through April 25, 2015, 5-2 with a 1.78 ERA over a nine-start stretch from May 23-July 4, 2015, 1-11 with a 5.57 ERA over a 17-start stretch from July 10, 2015-May 24, 2016 and is 8-2 with a 3.65 ERA (38 er in 93.2 ip) over his last 13 starts.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Allowed four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts, joining John Odom (1969) and Mike Norris (1980) as the only pitchers in Oakland history on an Opening Day roster to allow four hits or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of their first three starts...picked up his first win of the season and struck out a career-high eight batters April 20 at New York (AL)...it snapped a career-high six-game losing streak dating back to July 10, 2015...compiled a 5.52 ERA and .276 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned nine starts...then lost each of his next five starts from April 25 to May 19...logged a 7.92 ERA and .361 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which fell one short of his career high of six...snapped his five-game losing streak in a 3-2 win over Minnesota May 30...tossed 8.0 innings July 9 at Houston, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer dating back to June 18 of last year...that was the fifth longest such streak in Oakland history...fired his second career complete game in the A's 4-3 win over Tampa Bay on July 23 in Oakland...allowed nine hits, which were the most by an A's pitcher in a complete game since Mark Redman allowed 12 on May 13, 2004 against Detroit...had his career high six-game winning streak come to an end in the A's 5-3 loss at Cleveland July 29...compiled

GRAVEMAN'S CAREER HIGHS

a 3.25 ERA and .264 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 10 starts from May 30 to July 23...fired his third career complete game and his first shutout, a two-hitter in the A's 9-0 win at Chicago (AL) Aug. 19...became the ninth Oakland pitcher since 1987 to toss fewer than 100 pitches in a shutout, the first since Rich Harden on July 14, 2005 against Texas (80)...faced just one batter over the minimum to become the 13th pitcher in Oakland history to face 28 batters or fewer in a nine inning complete game (last: Dallas Braden, May 9, 2010 vs. Tampa Bay).

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-1 win over Cleveland last Wednesday in Oakland...the A's scored five times in the second inning and he shut out the Indians on four hits, a walk and a hit batter over the first six innings...allowed his only run on a two-out home run by Perez in the seventh inning...that snapped a 16.0-inning scoreless streak.

19 h, 10 r, 9 er, 2 bb, 9 so, 2 hr) in three starts this year...the no decision came in a 6-5 A's loss at Houston in 12 innings on June 4...the A's scored three times in the second but he allowed three in the bottom of the second on a two-run home run by Gattis and a Marisnick sacrifice fly...also allowed a Rasmus RBI double in the third and a Correa RBI single in the fifth and left after 4.1 innings trailing 5-3...then picked up the win in a 3-2 A's win at Houston July 9...retired each of the first 14 batters before Reed singled with two outs in the fifth...had a 3-0 lead when he allowed back-to-back singles to Marisnick and Gonzalez to start the ninth...was relieved by Dull who allowed both inherited runners to score...also won in a 7-4 A's victory in Oakland on July 18...allowed a Rasmus sacrifice fly in the second and an unearned run in the fourth, but the A's scored five times in the bottom of the fourth to take a 5-2 lead...also yielded a solo home run to Gonzalez in the fifth.

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Ross Detwiler (1-3, 5.74 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville Aug. 10 and is 1-3 with a 5.73 ERA in four starts with Oakland...has allowed 14 runs in his last three starts (14.0 ip), all losses, after tossing 8.0 shutout innings for the win in his first start...was a non-roster invitee with Cleveland this spring and made the Indians Opening Day roster...logged a 5.79 ERA in seven relief appearances before he was designated for assignment April 29...was traded to the A's in a minor league deal for cash considerations on July 17...lost his third consecutive start in his last start, a 3-1 A's loss at St. Louis last Friday (5.1 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...is 1-0 with a 2.38 ERA (22.2 ip, 17 h, 6 r, 6 er, 8 bb, 12 so, 1 hr) in five career appearances, including three starts, against Houston...combined for a 6-4 record and a 4.40 ERA in 16 games, 15 starts, Triple-A Columbus and Nashville.

### ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

21-17, 3.78 ERA (188 er in 447.1 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 36-for-53 (67.9%)

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 1.93 ERA (6 er in 28.0 ip) and .220 (22-for-100) opponents batting average over its last nine games (since August 20).
- Has allowed 53-of-211 (25.1%) inherited runners to score, which is the best percentage in the AL and second best in the majors (San Francisco. 21.4%).
- Is tied for the AL lead in innings pitched (447.1), ranks fourth in strikeouts (426) and opponents on-base percentage (.307), fifth in slugging percentage (.383) and tied for fifth in wins (21) and fewest losses (17) ranks third in most wild pitches (26) and tied for third in blown saves (17) and walks (154).
- First batters faced are 85-for-373 (.228) with 30 walks (.283 on-base percentage)...leads the AL in first batter slugging percentage (.319), ranks second in on-base percentage and third in batting average.
