OAKLAND ATHLETICS (57-75) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (70-62)

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 31, 2016 — MINUTE MAID PARK — 1:10 P.M. CDT LHP ROSS DETWILER (1-3, 5.74) VS. RHP MIKE FIERS (9-6, 4.40) MLB NETWORK — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four of the last seven games after losing eight of the previous nine...are now 10-20 (.333) over the last 30 games and 57-75 (.432) for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...it is the fifth worst record in Oakland history after 132 games...with a loss today, the A's would have their worst record after 133 games since 1997 (53-80)...are in last place in the AL West and trail first place Texas by a season-high 21½ games...it is the A's largest deficit since finishing the 2011 season 22 games out...have not been farther than 22 games back since finishing the 2008 season 24½ games out...have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 60 days in fourth, 17 days tied for fourth and 31 days in fifth.

IN AUGUST: The A's are 10-17 (.370) in August, which is the second worst record in the American League (Minnesota, 9-19)...it is currently the seventh worst August in Oakland history and the worst since 2008 (10-20, .333)...have clinched a losing record in August for the third consecutive season...it is the A's fourth consecutive month with a losing record (went 13-12 in April)...have 93 runs scored, which is the fewest in the majors (Miami, 95)...are batting .235 (212-for-901), which is second lowest (San Diego, .223)...have the fewest triples in the American League (1), are tied for the fewest home runs (28) and are tied for the second fewest walks (69)...have walked fewer than 74 times in August in a non-strike season just once in Oakland history (62 in 1972)...the pitching staff has issued the second fewest walks in the AL (62) and also has the second fewest strikeouts (176).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.48 ERA (74 er in 191.1 ip) over the last 22 games dating back to August 7...the season ERA stands at 4.50, which is the lowest it has been since May 9 when it was 4.47...have not finished the year with an ERA above 4.28 since 2000 (4.58)...have the second highest ERA in the American League, the third highest opponents batting average (.264) and the third most wild pitches (59).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 8-12 with a 3.63 ERA (54 er in 134.0 ip) over the last 23 games...have issued just 21 walks over that span (1.41 per nine innings), including 11 games with no walks...are 36-58 with a 4.95 ERA (396 er in 719.1 ip) for the season...have the second highest ERA in the American League, the second most losses, the second fewest wins and the fourth fewest innings pitched...have tossed fewer than five innings 39 times, which is the most in the majors and the most by an A's team since 1997 (52)...the A's have used 12 different starting pitchers this year and all 12 have made at least four starts...the 12 players with four or more starts is tied with Atlanta for the most in the majors and is tied for the most in Athletics history (1957 and 1997).

OFFENSE: The A's have been shut out two times in the last seven games and nine times this year, which is tied for second most in the American League (Kansas City, 10)...have scored 521 runs for the season, which is the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors...are now batting .172 (27-for-157) with 12 runs scored over the first five games of the road trip...have the lowest on-base percentage (.302) and slugging percentage (.397) in the AL and the third lowest batting average (.247)...have been hit by the fewest pitches in the AL (31), rank second in fewest walks (334) and fewest strikeouts (922), third in fewest stolen bases (44)...are on pace for 410 walks, which would break the Athletics record for lowest on-base percentage is .302 in 1979.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 26 errors in the last 59 games after making 53 over the first 73 contests...have 79 errors for the season, which is tied for fourth most in the American League, but the errors have led to 33 unearned runs, which is tied for fourth fewest...A's outfielders have 21 assists, which is tied for second fewest in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-3 on this six-game road trip to St. Louis (2-1) and Houston (0-2)...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Texas (0-3) and Chicago-AL (1-2) and have lost 13 of their last 17 road games...are 27-39 (.409) on the road for the season...return home following the game today for a nine-game homestand against Boston (three games), Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Seattle (three games)...went 2-1 on the last homes-

tand against Cleveland and are 30-36 (.455) at home, which is the second worst home record in the American League...have a 5.11 ERA (322 er in 567.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.93 (262 er in 600.0 ip) at home...the road ERA is second highest in the AL (Minnesota, 5.25)...are batting .253 (583-for-2308) on the road compared to .242 (527-for-2178) at home.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 20-20 (.500) in one-run games and rank fourth in the American League in one-run games (40)...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year, which was the second worst record in the majors... have eight walk-off losses, which are third most in the AL...all eight losses have come against AL West competition, including three against Houston.

MARGIN OF VICTORY: The A's are 41-42 (.494) in games decided by three runs or fewer compared to 16-33 (.327) in games decided by four runs or more...the 16 wins by four runs or more is second fewest in the majors (Atlanta, 13) and the winning percentage is the worst in the AL and third worst in the majors...have a run differential of -96, which is second worst in the AL (Minnesota, -125)...the last time the A's were outscored by more than 44 runs in a season was in 1997 (-182).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list an Oaklandrecord 27 times and those players have combined to miss an Oaklandrecord 1423 games (52.7 games per stint)...currently have 15 players on the DL (including 11 on the 60-day DL), which is one short of the season high of 16...prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4, at least nine every day since May 6 and at least six all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 5-9 in this five-series stretch where they will play in five different cities (Texas, Chicago, Oakland vs. Cleveland, St. Louis and Houston)...have made a total of 166 player moves in 150 days dating back to Opening Day, April 4...are averaging 2 hours and 56 minutes per game, which is tied with Kansas City for the fastest in the majors...have lost 16 of the last 21 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 14-21 (.400) in those games for the season, which is the worst record in the American League...pinch hitters are 2 for their last 27 (.074)...rank second in the AL in hits (19), RBI (13) and plate appearances (101) but are tied for last in walks (3).

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's are 6-9 against the Astros...that includes 4-2 in Oakland and 2-7 in Houston...have lost nine of the last 11 games at Minute Maid Park but have won nine of the last 12 games in the Coliseum...lost the season series to the Astros for the first time last year...lead the all-time series 46-32 (.590)...16 of the A's 32 losses to Houston have been by one run...are 25-13 in Oakland and 21-19 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis is batting .308 (20-for-65) with four doubles, one triple, seven home runs (.723 slugging percentage) and 15 RBI over his last 18 games...has 34 home runs for the season, which are tied for third in the American League and are the most by an Athletic since 2006 when Frank Thomas had 39 and Nick Swisher had 35...*Ryan Dull* has allowed 7-of-48 (14.6%) inherited runners to score, which is best percentage by a rookie in Oakland history and the fourth best percentage in the AL...has appeared in 60 games, which leads AL rookies and is tied for sixth among all AL pitchers...the games are also tied for sixth among rookies in Oakland history...*Ryon Healy* has a 16-game reaching base streak, which is an A's season high...is 22-for-59 (.373) with four walks (.413 on-base percentage) during the streak...*Ryan Madson* has not allowed a run in nine games and 10.2 innings in August and is a perfect 5-for-5 in save opportunities.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1996** Willie Adams tosses the A's third consecutive shutout, an 8-0 blanking of the Red Sox...it follows a combined shutout by Dave Telgheder and Buddy Groom against Boston and a Don Wengert blanking of the Orioles...in **1998** Rickey Henderson scores on a Jason Giambi fifth inning sacrifice fly in a game at Cleveland to become the sixth player in Major League history to score 2000 runs in his career.

S STARTING PITCHER: Ross Detwiler (1-3, 5.74 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville Aug. 10 and is 1-3 with a 5.73 ERA (14 er in 22.0 ip) in four starts with Oakland...has allowed 14 runs in his last three starts (14.0 ip), all losses, after tossing 8.0 shutout innings for the win in his first start...was a non-roster invitee with Cleveland this spring and made the Indians Opening Day roster...logged a 5.79 ERA in seven relief appearances before he was designated for assignment April 29...was outrighted to Triple-A Columbus May 1 and traded to the A's organization in a minor league deal for cash considerations on July 17.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 1-3 with a 5.73 ERA (14 er in 22.0 ip) in his four starts compared to 0-0 with a 5.79 ERA (3 er in 4.2 ip) in seven relief appearances...picked up the win in his first start this year on Aug. 10 against Baltimore...it was his first win as a starter since May 10, 2013 against Chicago (NL)...made 69 starts with Washington from 2009-13 but has just 11 since then, including seven with Texas last year and four with the A's this year...has made 184 career appearances with Washington (2007, 09-14), Texas (2015), Atlanta (2015), Cleveland (2016) and Oakland (2016)...is 18-37 with a 4.33 ERA (208 er in 432.1 ip) in his 80 career starts and 4-3 with a 4.04 ERA (56 er in 124.2 ip) in 104 career relief appearances

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .296 (8-for-27) batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .296 (24-for-81) against righthanders...however, has surrendered all four of his home runs and issued nine of his 10 walks to righties...has a .880 OPS against righties, .667 against lefties...three of the four home runs he has allowed have come with runners on base...opponents are batting a .346 (9-for-26) with runners in scoring position

WITH CLEVELAND: Opponents were 3-for-16 (.188) with Cleveland but he issued four walks in 4.2 innings for a .333 on-base percentage...all three of the hits were for extra bases (two doubles, one home run) for a .500 slugging percentage...allowed 1-of-4 (25.0%) inherited runners to score...first batters faced were 2-for-6 (.333) with a walk...tossed fewer than one inning in six of his seven appearances and his season high was 1.0 on April 17 against New York (NL).

FIRST START: Combined with Axford on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win over Baltimore on August 10 in Oakland...tossed a career-high eight innings and allowed six of the hits...matched his career high with 108 pitches...did not walk a batter...is the third pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least 8.0 scoreless innings in his A's debut (Mike Norris, 9.0 on April 10, 1975 and Tommy Milone, 8.0 on April 9, 2012)...allowed four base runners to advance into scoring position but retired each of the final 12 batters that he faced.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-2 loss at Texas on August 15...the A's scored single runs in each of the first two innings and he blanked the Rangers on two hits and two walks over the first three innings...then allowed a RBI single to Andrus in the fourth and a grand slam to Beltre in the fifth for the loss.

THIRD START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-2 loss at Chicago (AL) August 20...allowed a solo home run to Abreu in the first, RBI singles to Sanchez and Anderson in the second, two runs in the third highlighted by a Cabrera RBI double and one more run in the fourth on a Cabrera RBI single...left after four innings trailing 6-0.

LAST START: He lost his third consecutive start in the A's 3-1 loss at St. Louis last Friday...allowed a two-run home run to Gyorko in the bottom of the first but the A's came back with a run in the second inning...that would be the A's only run of the game ... was relieved by Dull with one out and runners on first and third in the sixth inning...Dull allowed one of the runs to score.

MINORS: Went 2-4 with a 4.60 ERA in 12 starts with Triple-A Columbus in the Indians farm system...was assigned to Triple-A Nashville following his July 17 trade and went 4-0 with a 3.86 ERA in four games, including three starts, with the Sounds...combined for a 6-4 record and a 4.40 ERA in 16 games, 15 starts, overall at Triple-A...issued 21 walks in 62.2 innings with the Clippers (3.02 per nine innings) but then walked just four batters in 23.1 innings with the Sounds (1.54 per nine innings)...allowed a .256 opponents batting average, including .252 (58-for-230) against righthanded hitters compared to .265 (26-for-98) against left-handed hitters... surrendered nine of his 10 home runs to righties...nine were solo shots... opponents batted .229 with the bases empty compared to .301 with runners on base...allowed a .357 average with runners in scoring position with Columbus, .118 with Nashville ... went 0-4 with a 5.84 ERA over his first eight starts through June 11...finished the Triple-A portion of his campaign by going 6-0 with a 3.31 ERA over his final eight games, seven starts.

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Andrew Triggs (1-1, 4.39 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville August 5 for his eighth stint with the A's this year...that is believed to be the most stints in one season in Oakland history...is 1-1 with a 3.04 ERA (8 er in 23.2 ip) in six games, including four starts, during his most recent stay and has allowed just one home run and two walks in 23.2 inning...is 1-1 with a 2.92 ERA and .191 opponents batting average in five starts compared to 0-0 with a 5.58 ERA and .302 opponents batting average in 18 relief appearances...has walked just one batter in 24.2 innings as a starter...picked up his first career win in his last start, a 7-4 A's win at St. Louis last Sunday (6.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 8 so)...has faced the Red Sox twice in his career and it came in consecutive relief appearances at Fenway Park earlier this year on May 10 (2.0 ip, 1 h, 2 r, 1 er, 1 so) and May 11 (1.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb).

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

21-17, 3.77 ERA (188 er in 448.1 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 36-for-53 (67.9%)

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 1.86 ERA (6 er in 29.0 ip) and .223 (23for-103) opponents batting average over its last nine games dating back to August 20.
- Has allowed 53-of-211 (25.1%) inherited runners to score, which is the best percentage in the American League and second best in the majors (San Francisco, 21.3%).
- Ranks second in the AL in innings pitched (448.1), fourth in strikeouts (427), fifth in opponents slugging percentage (.383) and tied for fifth in wins (21) and fewest losses (17)...is tied for third in most blown saves (17) and wild pitches (26) and tied for fourth in walks (154).
- First batters faced are 86-for-374 (.230) with 30 walks (.285 on-base percentage)...leads the AL in first batter slugging percentage (.321), ranks third in on-base percentage and fourth in batting average.

- Has not allowed an earned run in 12 of his last 13 games for a 2.25 ERA (3 er in 12.0 ip)...however, has a 6.15 ERA (18 er in 26.1 ip) over his last 31 games (since June 15) after logging a 2.70 ERA over his first 26 contests
- Is tied for third among American League relievers in most blown saves (6) and ranks fourth in walks (26).
- Has allowed nine of his 27 runs in sixth inning (2.2 ip, 30.38 ERA)...has a 3.04 ERA (17 er in 50.1 ip) from the seventh inning on.
- Has a .341 (15-for-44) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position, including .409 (9-for-22) with RISP and two outs.
- Has not allowed a run in six games and 7.1 innings against the Astros this year...is 3-1 with a 2.25 ERA (6 er in 24.0 ip) and has converted 8-of-


