**ABOUT LAST NIGHT:** Boston matched its season high in runs during last night's 16-2 win at OAK (also 8/14 vs. ARI)...11 players recorded at least 1 hit for the Sox, 11 scored at least 1 run, and 12 reached base via hit or BB.

- Travis Shaw (3-for-6, HR, 2 2B, 5 RBI) matched his career highs in XBH (2nd time) and RBI (4th time, all in 2016)...The only other major leaguer with 5+ RBI in at least 4 games this season is Mookie Betts (also 4).
- Friday marked the most runs Boston had ever scored in Oakland and was the club's highest run total in any road game since 6/11/11 at TOR (W, 16-4).

**STATE OF THE SOX:** Boston has won 14 of its last 21 games and owns MLB's 3rd-best record since 7/3 (32-22, .593) behind only the Cubs (36-18) and Blue Jays (32-19).

♣ Boston leads the AL with a +135 run differential.

**ROAD TESTED:** The Sox' .540 win percentage on the road ranks 2nd in the AL and 5th in the majors...Boston has won 8 of its last 12 games away from Fenway Park.

**WELL, FOR STARTERS:** Boston's starters have a 3.48 ERA in the club's last 49 games since 7/9, which ranks 2nd in MLB behind only the Cubs (2.72)...No team has received more innings from its starters than Boston has in that span (308.0).

**RICK'S ROLLIN':** Rick Porcello (18-3) leads the majors in wins...According to Elias, the only other Red Sox to win at least 18 of their first 21 decisions in a season are Cy Young (18-3 in 1902) and Daisuke Matsuzaka (18-3 in 2008)...With a win tonight, Porcello would become the first Red Sox ever to win at least 19 of his first 22 decisions.

- Porcello became the first Red Sox to win 18+ games before September since Derek Lowe in 2002 (18-6).
- The Sox are 20-7 in Porcello's starts, including 12-2 in his last 14...He has recorded 7.0+ IP and allowed 3 ER or fewer in each of his last 7 starts, the longest such streak in MLB this season...The last Red Sox with a longer such streak was Pedro Martinez in 2000 (11).
- Porcello has thrown 5.0+ innings in 35 consecutive starts...The only pitchers with longer active streaks are Jake Arrieta (63) and Madison Bumgarner (58).

**LEADING THE WAY:** Dustin Pedroia is 39-for-85 (.459) since moving into the leadoff spot on 8/10, including 17 for his last 25 (.680)...He had MLB's highest AVG in August (.406) among players with 100+ at-bats, drawing 7 BB against only 6 SO...It marked the 3rd time in his career he batted .400+ in a calendar month (.411 in July 2011; .415 in May 2007).

**HAMMERIN' HANLEY:** Hanley Ramirez has homered in 3 of his last 6 games and has 9 RBI in his last 3 games...In 18 games since 8/11, he is batting .373 with 25 RBI and a 1.128 OPS (25-for-67, 7 2B, 5 HR, 7 BB).

**ONE-TWO PUNCH:** David Ortiz (31 HR, 105 RBI) and Mookie Betts (30 HR, 98 RBI) could become the 11th set of Red Sox teammates with at least 30 HR & 100 RBI each... The most recent duos to accomplish the feat were Ortiz & Manny Ramirez (4 times, 2003-06), Nomar Garciaparra & Mo Vaughn (1998), and Tony Armas & Dwight Evans (1984).

Ortiz and Betts could also become only the 2nd set of Sox teammates with at least 30 HR, 40 doubles, and 100 RBI each (Ortiz & Ramirez in 2004).

**RELEASE THE KIMBREL:** Craig Kimbrel has 249 saves in his career and is only 28 years old...Only 34 players have recorded 250+ saves since the stat became official in 1969... Francisco Rodriguez is the only other pitcher with as many as 200 saves prior to turning 29 years old (268).

Boston is batting .404 and averaging 14.0 runs per game against the A's this season, recording 13+ runs and 15+ hits in all 4 meetings...According to Elias, it had been nearly 115 years since a team scored 12+ runs in 4 consecutive games against a single opponent; on 9/5 and 9/6 in 1901, the Pirates swept the New York Giants in consecutive doubleheaders by scores of 15-1, 15-7, 15-2, and 13-4.

**STRAIGHT A'S:** Dustin Pedroia has hit safely in each of his last 18 games vs. OAK...The only Red Sox with hit streaks as long against the A's since the franchise moved to Oakland in 1968 are Jim Rice (22, 1979-81) & Jerry Remy (20, 1978-81).

**THE NEW GUYS:** Yoan Moncada and Robby Scott yesterday became the 6th and 7th players to make their major league debuts with the Sox this season (also Andrew Benintendi, Marco Hernandez, Mike Miller, William Cuevas, and Pat Light).

**YOUTH BRIGADE:** The Sox have 6 players on their active roster or DL who are 23 years old or younger: Yoan Moncada (21), Andrew Benintendi (22), Mookie Betts (23), Xander Bogaerts (23), Marco Hernandez (23) & Eduardo Rodriguez (23).

**GOING OUT WITH A BANG:** David Ortiz leads the majors in doubles (42), XBH (74), SLG (.623), and OPS (1.026)...He ranks 3rd in RBI (105) and T-12th in HR (31).

**FEATS OF MOOKIE:** Mookie Betts leads MLB in multi-hit games (57) and is the only major leaguer with at least 300 total bases (316)...He also ranks 2nd in hits (180) and XBH (tied, 71), 3rd in runs (104), and T-5th in RBI (98).

- With 30 HR and 98 RBI, Betts could join Ted Williams (1939, 1941) as the only Red Sox players ever with 30+ HR and 100+ RBI in a season before turning 24.
- In 53 games since 7/1, Betts is batting .370 with a 1.061 OPS (81-for-219, 18 2B, 3B, 14 HR)...In that time, he leads the AL in AVG (2nd in MLB), SLG (.653, 2nd in MLB), OPS (4th in MLB), and doubles (T-2nd in MLB).

**SLUGGIN' SOX:** The Sox have scored a major league-best 740 runs, 84 more than the AL's 2nd-highest mark (TOR-656)...Boston scored 634 runs in 2014 and 748 in 2015.

- Boston also leads the majors in doubles (299), AVG (.286), OBP (.351), SLG (.468), and OPS (.819).
- The Sox have recorded 15+ hits in a game 20 times (most in MLB)...No other AL team has more than 11 such games...Boston has recorded 10+ hits in a game a major league-best 70 times.

**EXTRA.** The Sox lead the majors in XBH (493) and have 299 doubles, 33 more than any other team (COL, 266).

- David Ortiz (74) and Mookie Betts (71) could become the 6th set of Red Sox teammates with 75+ XBH each in a season...They would join Jacoby Ellsbury & Adrian Gonzalez (2011), Ortiz & Manny Ramirez (2004-05), Tony Armas & Dwight Evans (1984), Fred Lynn & Jim Rice (1979), and Ted Williams & Jimmie Foxx (1939).
- The Red Sox have hit 77 HR since 7/4, 3rd-most in MLB in that time (BAL-85, STL-83).

**BOSTON'S BACKSTOPS:** Sox catchers have thrown out 11 of 21 (52%) attempted base stealers since 7/9...Only CLE has allowed fewer steals in that span (9)...21 teams have allowed 20+ steals in that time, 11 teams have allowed 30+, and 3 teams have allowed 40+.

- Leads the majors with 18 wins...Is among AL leaders with 5.43 SO.BB (1st), 1.40 BB/9.0 IP (2nd), a 1.04 WHIP (3rd), 179.2 IP (5th), and a 3.26 ERA (10th).
- ♣ Is 1 of 3 Red Sox ever with as many as 18 wins within their first 21 decisions of a season, joining Cy Young (1902, 18-3) and Daisuke Matsuzaka (2008, 18-3).
- Porcello would be the 1st Red Sox ever with as many as 19 wins within their first 22 decisions of a season.
- ♣ The Sox are 20-7 in Porcello's starts this year, winning 12 of his last 14 outings.
- ♣ Has thrown at least 7.0 IP in each of his last 7 starts, going 5-1 with a 2.52 ERA (15 ER/53.2 IP), a .195 opponent AVG (38-for-195), a 0.78 WHIP, and 44 SO/4 BB.
- ♣ Is 10-1 with a 2.40 ERA (24 ER/85.2 IP) in his last 11 starts, tossing 6.0+ IP in each...Has pitched into the 7th inning in each of last 10 outings.
- ♣ Has thrown 7 consecutive quality starts on the road...Is 3-1 with a 2.49 ERA (14 ER/50.2 IP), a .197 opponent AVG (37-for-188), and 46 SO/9 BB in those outings.
- ♣ Has tossed at least 5.0 IP in each of his 35 starts since 8/26/15, recording at least 6.0 IP in 32 of those and at least 7.0 IP in 19...Is tied for the ML lead in wins (22), ranks 3rd in the majors with 237.0 IP, and has a 3.23 ERA, 209 SO, and 39 BB over that span.

Last start: Allowed 3 R on 6 H with 8 SO over 7.0 IP to earn the win on 8/29 vs. TB.

#### **VS. THE ATHLETICS:**

Larned the win on 5/11 vs. OAK, allowing 3 R on 6 H with 2 BB and 5 SO.

#### **CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:**

- Threw at least 8.0 innings in a career-long 3 straight starts from 7/29-8/9.
- Since 2009, his 131 starts with 1 or 0 BB lead the AL and rank 4th in the majors.
- Over the course of his career, has issued 2.08 BB/9.0 IP, the 4th-lowest rate in the AL among active pitchers, and the 5th-lowest in the majors (min. 750.0 IP).


