STATE OF THE SOX: With Toronto's 7-5 loss to the Rays last night, Boston moved into a tie for 1st place in the AL East...The Sox have not been in sole possession of 1st place since the conclusion of play on 7/21 (+0.5 GA).

- ☛ The Sox have won 15 of their last 22 games and own MLB's 3rd-best record since 7/3 (33-22, .600) behind only the Cubs (36-19) and Blue Jays (32-20).
- ☛ Boston leads the AL with a +144 run differential.

ROAD TESTED: The Sox' .547 win percentage on the road ranks 1st in the AL and 4th in the majors...Boston has won 9 of its last 13 games away from Fenway Park.

BAY AREA VS. BAY STATE: The Sox have won their last 9 games against the A's, marking their longest winning streak vs. OAK since 7/6/04-5/11/05 (also 9 games)...Boston has had only 2 win streaks of 10+ games against the A's since they moved to Oakland in 1968: 7/10/93-4/28/94 (11 games) and 8/22/82-7/15/83 (10 games).

- ☛ Boston is batting .398 and averaging 13.4 runs per game against the A's this season, recording 11+ runs and 15+ hits in all 5 meetings...According to Elias, the Red Sox are the first team in AL history to score more than 10 runs in 5 consecutive games versus a single opponent...The last major league team to do that was the Brooklyn Dodgers vs. Pittsburgh in 1950.

STRAIGHT A'S: Dustin Pedroia has hit safely in each of his last 19 games vs. OAK...The only Red Sox with hit streaks as long against the A's since the franchise moved to Oakland in 1968 are Jim Rice (22, 1979-81) & Jerry Remy (20, 1978-81).

LEADING THE WAY: Dustin Pedroia increased his hitting streak to 10 games last night, marking his 6th streak of 10+ games this season...According to Elias, he is the first Red Sox player ever with as many as 6 hitting streaks of 10+ games in a single season...The last major leaguer to do that was Derek Jeter in 1999 (also 6).

- ☛ Pedroia is 41-for-89 (.461) since moving into the leadoff spot on 8/10, including 19 for his last 29 (.655)...He has scored a run in each of his last 6 games and reached base in each of his last 22.

WELL, FOR STARTERS: Boston's starters have a 3.46 ERA in the club's last 50 games since 7/9, which ranks 2nd in MLB behind only the Cubs (2.73)...No team has received more innings from its starters than Boston has in that span (315.0).

RICK'S ROLLIN': Rick Porcello (19-3) leads the majors in wins...According to Elias, Porcello is the first Red Sox ever to win at least 19 of his first 22 decisions.

HAMMERIN' HANLEY: Hanley Ramirez has 3 HR and 10 RBI in his last 4 games...He has at least 1 XBH in each of his last 5 games, 1 shy of his career-best streak (7/20-31/07 with FLA)...He has scored a run in each of his last 5 games.

- ☛ In 19 games since 8/11, Ramirez is batting .366 with 26 RBI and a 1.143 OPS (26-for-71, 7 2B, 6 HR, 7 BB).

RELEASE THE KIMBREL: Craig Kimbrel has 249 saves in his career and is only 28 years old...Only 34 players have recorded 250+ saves since the stat became official in 1969...Francisco Rodriguez is the only other pitcher with as many as 200 saves prior to turning 29 years old (268).

YOUTH BRIGADE: The Sox have 6 players on their active roster or DL who are 23 years old or younger: Yoan Moncada (21), Andrew Benintendi (22), Mookie Betts (23), Xander Bogaerts (23), Marco Hernandez (23) & Eduardo Rodriguez (23).

THE 4TH IS STRONG WITH HIM: David Ortiz has hit 8 HR in his career on today's date, 9/4: 2000 vs. BAL, 2001 at TEX, 2002 at SEA, 2004 vs. TEX, 2013 vs. DET (2), and 2014 at NYY (2)...The only other dates on which he has homered as many as 8 times are 8/12 (10) and 9/12 (8).

GOING OUT WITH A BANG: David Ortiz leads the majors in doubles (44), XBH (76), SLG (.629), and OPS (1.035)...He ranks 3rd in RBI (107) and 6th in AVG (.320).

- ☛ Ortiz enters today's game with 9,990 career plate appearances...According to Elias, only 84 players in MLB history have recorded at least 10,000 career PA.
- ☛ Elias notes that only 3 players have had 100+ RBI in their final MLB season: Shoeless Joe Jackson (123 in 1920), Happy Felsch (116 in 1920) & Albert Belle (103 in 2000)...The record for HR in a final season is 35 (Dave Kingman in 1986).
- ☛ With 107 RBI, Ortiz is only 1 shy of tying Dave Winfield for the single-season record for a player age 40 or older...Winfield had 108 RBI in 1992 with TOR.

GETTING DEFENSIVE: Mookie Betts and Jackie Bradley Jr. rank T-5th in the majors with 12 OF assists each...The Red Sox last had 2 outfielders with 12+ assists apiece in a season in 1987 (Ellis Burks-15, Jim Rice-12).

- ☛ Boston outfielders have combined for 7 double plays (T-3rd in MLB), 32 assists (T-4th in MLB), and a .992 fielding percentage (1st in MLB).
- ☛ Sox catchers have thrown out 11 of 21 (52%) attempted base stealers in 50 games since 7/9...Only CLE has allowed fewer steals in that span (9).

30 & 100: With 30 HR and 100 RBI, Mookie Betts joins Ted Williams (1939, 1941) as the only Red Sox players ever with 30+ HR and 100+ RBI in a season before turning 24.

- ☛ David Ortiz (31 HR, 107 RBI) and Betts became the 11th set of Red Sox teammates with 30+ HR & 100+ RBI each...The only other players with those totals this season are Nolan Arenado and Edwin Encarnacion.

FEATS OF MOOKIE: Mookie Betts leads MLB in multi-hit games (57) and total bases (318)...He ranks 2nd in hits (181) and XBH (tied, 72), 4th in runs (104), and 5th in RBI (100).

- ☛ Betts has reached base in each of his last 21 games...In 54 games since 7/1, he is batting .368 with a 1.058 OPS (82-for-223, 19 2B, 3B, 14 HR)...In that time, he leads the AL in AVG, SLG (.650), OPS, and doubles (tied).

SLUGGIN' SOX: The Sox have scored a major league-best 751 runs, 90 more than the AL's 2nd-highest mark (TOR-661)...Boston scored 634 runs in 2014 and 748 in 2015.

- ☛ Boston also leads the majors in doubles (304), AVG (.287), OBP (.352), SLG (.469), and OPS (.821).
- ☛ The Sox have recorded 15+ hits in a game 21 times (most in MLB)...No other AL team has more than 11 such games...Boston has recorded 10+ hits in a game a major league-best 71 times.

EXTRA, EXTRA: The Sox lead the majors in XBH (499) and have 304 doubles, 36 more than any other team (COL, 268).

- ☛ David Ortiz (76) and Mookie Betts (72) could become the 6th set of Red Sox teammates with 75+ XBH each in a season...Ortiz and Betts could also become only the 2nd set of Sox teammates with at least 30 HR, 40 doubles, and 100 RBI each (Ortiz & Ramirez in 2004).
- ☛ The Sox rank 3rd in the majors with 78 HR since 7/4.

- 🔥 Has a 3.22 ERA (16 ER/44.2) with 40 SO/16 BB in 8 starts after the All-Star break, with 39 strikeouts over 37.2 innings in his last 7 starts.
- 🔥 In his last 4 road starts, has a 2.08 ERA (5 ER/21.2 IP), a 1.02 WHIP, a .192 opponent AVG (15-for-78) and 19 SO/7 BB (1-1 record).
- 🔥 Has allowed 3 or fewer earned runs in 16 of his last 21 ML starts dating back to 8/18/15...Has a 4.14 ERA (54 ER/117.1 IP) and 96 SO/38 BB in that time (6-7 record).
- 🔥 Trails only Babe Ruth (21, 1914-15) for the most quality starts by a Red Sox LHP within their first 35 career games since 1913 (18).
- 🔥 Both his 16 career starts with 1 or fewer ER allowed and 25 starts of 2 or fewer BB are the most by a Red Sox pitcher within their first 35 career games since 1913.
- 🔥 Over his career, is limiting opponents to a .153 AVG (11-for-72) with 2 outs & RISP.

Last start: Allowed 5 R on 4 H and 2 BB with 1 SO over 5.1 IP on 8/28 vs. KC.

VS. THE ATHLETICS:

- 🔥 Is making his 1st career appearance vs. Oakland.

2016 WITH PAWTUCKET:

- 🔥 Has a 3.08 ERA (13 ER/38.0 IP), a 1.05 WHIP, and 24 SO/7 BB in 7 starts for the PawSox this season (0-4 record).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:

- 🔥 Is in his 2nd full season in the Red Sox organization after making his ML debut with 21 starts last season...Went 10-6 with a 4.07 ERA (52 ER/121.2 IP) and 98 strikeouts in 2015, earning Boston BBWAA's 2015 Red Sox Pitcher of the Year and 2015 Red Sox Rookie of the Year honors.
- 🔥 His 11 wins within his first 25 career games are the most by a Red Sox pitcher since Daisuke Matsuzaka won 13 games in 2007...Are tied for the most by a Red Sox LHP (also Jon Lester, 2006-07) since Babe Ruth won 13 games in 1914-15.
- 🔥 Last season, led AL rookies in wins and finished 2nd among left-handed AL rookies with both 98 SO and 13 quality starts...Was the Red Sox' 1st left-handed rookie to reach double digits in wins since John Curtis in 1972 (11-8)...His 13 quality starts were most by a lefty rookie with BOS since Hal Wiltse in 1926 (15).
- 🔥 Was the 1st Red Sox pitcher to win at least 10 games and post a sub-4.00 ERA before turning 23 since Mike Nagy in 1969...Was the 1st Red Sox left-hander to do that since Babe Ruth in 3 straight years, 1915-17 (Source: Elias).
