OAKLAND ATHLETICS (58-78) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (61-75)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's snapped their five-game losing streak yesterday with a 1-0 walk-off win over Boston...are now 11-23 (.324) over the last 34 games and 58-78 (.426) for the season...that is the second worst record in the American League and tied for fifth worst in Oakland history after 136 games...were also 58-78 last year (lost game 137)...the 20 games under .500 is one short of the season high (57-78 on Sept. 3)...are 23½ games behind first place Texas in the AL West, which is also one game short of the season high (24½ on Sept. 3)...have a tragic number of three for elimination in the West and 11 in the Wild Card...have been in fourth place or worse in the AL West every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 60 days in fourth, 17 days tied for fourth and 36 days in fifth.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's recalled Raul Alcantara from Nashville today and now have 29 players on the active roster...Alcantara will be the 48th player to appear in a game for the A's this year, the 26th pitcher...Jharel Cotton will become pitcher number 27 on Wednesday and that will tie the 1915 Philadelphia A's and 1955 Kansas City A's for the second most pitchers in Athletics history to the record of 30 set last year...Alcantara will be the 13th pitcher to start a game, which ties Los Angeles and Seattle for the most in the American League...Alcantara and Cotton will be the 11th and 12th rookies to pitch for the A's, which ties the Oakland record (2009, 2012, 2015)...they will be the eighth and ninth to make their Major League debut...overall, they will bring the A's rookie total to 17, including 14 ML debuts...including the Alcantara move, the A's have made a total of 172 player moves in 155 days dating back to Opening Day.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .171 (48-for-281) with 20 runs scored over the last nine games (2.22 runs per game)...have scored 529 runs for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and third fewest in the majors...are averaging 3.89 runs per game and have not averaged fewer than 3.98 runs per game since 1979 (3.54)...have a .300 on-base percentage, which is the lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors...the Oakland record for lowest on-base percentage is .302 in 1979...have 342 walks, which is second fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors...are on pace for 407 walks, which would break the Athletics record for fewest walks in a 162-game season (421 in 1966)...have gone six consecutive games without a home run, which is their longest streak since a six-game streak from May 16-21, 2011...have 141 home runs for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the AL...have the lowest slugging percentage (.392) and have been hit by the fewest pitches (32) in the AL...rank second in lowest batting average (.245) and fewest strikeouts (951), third in fewest extra base hits (377) and fourth in fewest stolen bases (44).

PITCHING: The A's tossed their sixth shutout of the season yesterday, their third 1-0 shutout...had just one 1-0 shutout over the previous two seasons combined...are tied for fourth in the American League in fewest shutouts and have not finished the season with fewer than seven since 1999 (5)...the shutout came after allowing 16 runs on Friday and 11 on Saturday...it marks the second time in Oakland history the A's tossed a shutout after allowing at least 10 runs in each of the previous two games... the other time was Sept. 18 (10), 19 (13) and 20 (0) in 1980...have a 3.84 ERA (55 er in 129.0 ip) over the last 15 games but have a 4.57 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL...have the third highest opponents batting average (.265).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 8-13 with a 3.70 ERA (62 er in 151.0 ip) over the last 27 games...have issued just 27 walks over that span (1.61 per nine innings), including 12 games with no walks...are 36-59 with a 4.94 ERA (404 er in 736.1 ip) for the season...rank second in the American League in fewest innings pitched, highest ERA, most losses and fewest wins...A's starters have tossed fewer than five innings 41 times, which is the most in the majors and the most by an A's team since 1997 (52).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed eight errors in the last six games and now have 84 errors for the season, which is third most in the American League...A's outfielders have 21 assists, which is tied for second fewest in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on this nine-game homestand against Boston (1-2), Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Seattle (three games)... went 2-1 on the last homestand against Cleveland and are 31-38 (.449) at

home, which is the second worst home record in the American League... went 2-4 on the last road trip to St. Louis (2-1) and Houston (0-3) and have lost 14 of their last 18 road games...are 27-40 (.403) on the road... are batting .238 (540-for-2267) at home compared to .252 (591-for-2343) on the road.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's improved to 21-21 (.500) in one-run games with the win yesterday...rank fourth in the American League in one-run games (42)...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year, which was the second worst record in the majors...the win yesterday was the A's seventh walk-off win of the season, which is tied for fourth in the AL...have eight walk-off losses (all against AL West competition), which is third most in the AL... are tied for third in walk-off games (15)...have a 14-13 record in games decided in the last at bat

SCORING MARGIN: The A's have a run differential of -119, which is second worst in the American League (Minnesota, -127)...that includes -47 in six games against Boston compared -72 in 130 games against everyone else...the last time the A's were outscored by more than 44 runs in a season was in 1997 (-182)...are 16-35 (.314) in games decided by four runs or more compared to 42-43 (.494) in games decided by three runs or fewer... the 16 wins by four runs or more are second fewest in the majors (Atlanta, 15) and the winning percentage is the worst in the AL and third worst in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are averaging 2 hours and 56 minutes per game, which is the fastest in the majors by two minutes...are one of four teams averaging under three hours per game...A's pinch hitters are 3 for their last 32 (.094)...rank second in the American League in hits (20), RBI (13) and plate appearances (106) but have the fewest walks (3)...the A's have lost 17 of the last 23 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 15-22 (.405) in those games for the season, which is the second worst record in the American League (Seattle 21-31, .404).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list an Oakland-record 27 times and those players have combined to miss an Oakland-record 1477 games (54.7 games per stint)...currently have 13 players on the DL, including 11 on the 60-day DL...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4 (including a season-high 16 from Aug. 22-28)... prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once... have had at least six players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's are 5-8 against the Angels...that includes 4-3 in Anaheim and 1-5 in Oakland...have lost seven of the last eight games in Oakland...have lost the season series in each of the previous two years after winning three straight prior to that...are 54-54 against the Angels since the start of the 2011 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 419-350 against the Angels...that includes 216-166 in Oakland and 203-184 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 468-427 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's are 21-23 on Labor Day since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 13-16 in Oakland and 8-7 on the road...have won each of the last three Labor Day games, all in Oakland...are 4-6 against the Angels and last met in 2012, an 8-3 A's loss in Oakland...*Khris Davis* has 34 home runs, which are the most by an Athletic since 2006 when Frank Thomas had 39 and Nick Swisher had 35...*Ryan Madson* has not allowed a run in his last 10 games (11.2 ip) and is a perfect 5-for-5 in save opportunities over that span...*Marcus Semien* leads American League shortstops and is tied for second in the majors with 23 home runs (Story, COL 27).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1931** George Earnshaw tosses a one-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win the first game of a doubleheader at Boston...in **1951** Ferris Fain goes 5 for 5 in the second game of a doubleheader against Washington...in **1973** Catfish Hunter improves his record to 18-3 as the A's defeat the California Angels 11-6...it is Hunter's club record 13th consecutive win... he finishes the season 21-5, an .808 winning percentage.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Raul Alcantara (Major League Debut)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville today and will be making his Major League debut...had not pitched above Double-A prior to this year and is the third A's pitcher to make his debut this year without any Triple-A experience entering the season (Mengden, Overton)...will become the 48th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the fourth this year (Manaea, Mengden, Overton)...is the sixth pitcher to make his first ML start for the A's this year (Neal and Triggs)...this marks the second time in Oakland history the A's had at least four pitchers start in their ML debut...had five in 1978 (Controy, Johnson, Minetto, Morgan, Wirth)...the last complete game was by Mike Morgan June 11, 1978 against Baltimore and the only shutout is by Mike Norris April 10, 1975 against Chicago...the 47 pitchers to start in their debut have combined for a 14-15 record and a 3.75 ERA.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Was originally signed by the Boston organization July 2, 2009 out of the Dominican Republic and spent two years in the Red Sox farm system before he was dealt to the A's with Josh Reddick and Miles Head for Andrew Bailey and Ryan Sweeney, Dec. 28, 2011...is 35-32 with a 3.52 ERA (230 er in 588.2 ip) in 123 games, including 113 starts, in seven seasons as a professional...has issued just 125 walks in 588.2 innings, an average of 1.91 per nine innings...had "Tommy John" surgery on May 14, 2014.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Ross Detwiler (1-3, 4.81 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville Aug. 10 and is 1-3 with a 4.66 ERA in five starts with Oakland...tossed 8.0 shutout innings for the win in his first start, went 0-3 with a 9.00 ERA over his next three starts, and allowed one run in 7.0 innings in a no decision in his last start, a 4-3 A's loss at Houston last Wednesday (3 h, 2 bb, 7 so)... was a non-roster invitee with Cleveland this spring and made the Indians Opening Day roster...logged a 5.79 ERA in seven relief appearances before he was designated for assignment April 29...was outrighted to Triple-A Columbus May 1 and traded to the A's organization in a minor league deal for cash considerations on July 17...is 0-1 with a 5.91 ERA (10.2 ip, 13 h, 8 r, 7 er, 9 bb, 6 so, 2 hr) in four career appearances against Los Angeles, including one start...combined for a 6-4 record and a 4.40 ERA in 16 games, 15 starts, with Triple-A Columbus and Nashville.

- land record 16 runs Aug. 25, 2011 at New York (AL).
 Has allowed 58-of-219 (26.5%) inherited runners to score, which is the best percentage in the American League and third best in the majors.
- Ranks second in the AL in innings pitched (466.1), fourth in strikeouts (445) and fifth in opponents slugging percentage (.389)...ranks third in most blown saves (18) and most walks (164), tied for third in most wild pitches (28) and fifth in highest ERA (3.99) and lowest save percentage (66.7%)
- First batters faced are 89-for-383 (.232) with 30 walks (.285 on-base percentage)...leads the AL in first batter slugging percentage (.324), ranks third in on-base percentage and fourth in batting average.
