- Went to spring training with NYY as a non-roster invitee
- Began the season with Tampa (A)
- Was on the 7-day DL with a right shoulder strain, 4/28-6/25
- Made 1 rehab appearance with the GCL Yankees (R)
- Transferred to Trenton (AA) on 6/28
- Went 1-0, 2 SV, 0.63 ERA (1 ER, 14.1 IP, 17 SO) in 11 appearances before being promoted to Scranton/Wilkes-Barre (AAA) on 7/29
- Had his contract selected by NYY on 9/1
- Made his Yankees debut, 9/2 at BOS; was his 1st ML appearance since 7/12/13 at OAK
- Went 0-1, 5.19 ERA (5 ER, 8.2 IP) in 10 relief appearances with NYY from 9/1-10/4
- Held LHH to a .167 AVG (2-12) with the Yankees, as opposed to .318 vs RHH (7-22)

### 2014

- Missed the entire season recovering from right shoulder surgery

### 2013

- Appeared in only 30 games with BOS due to injury
- 21 of his 30 appearances were scoreless
- Averaged 12.24 SO/9.0 IP (39 SO, 28.2 IP)
- Had a 1.46 ERA (2 ER, 12.1 IP) over 13 April games
- Named Co-AL Player of the Week with teammate Mike Napoli, 4/15-21
- Placed on the 15-day DL on 5/6 (retro to 4/29) with a right biceps strain; activated on 5/20
- His final 4 appearances of the season were scoreless (5.1 IP), 7/4-12
- Placed back on the 15-day DL on 7/19 (retro to 7/13) with a right shoulder strain
- Underwent right shoulder capsular repair surgery on 7/24 (Dr. David Altchek) and missed the remainder of the season

### 2012

- Began the season on the 60-day DL; missed the first 116 games
- Underwent surgery to reconstruct the ulnar collateral ligament in his right thumb on 4/4 (Dr. Thomas Graham)

- Posted a 1.42 ERA (1 ER, 6.1 IP) over 6 rehab games between the GCL Red Sox (R), Portland (AA) and Pawtucket (AAA), 8/1-13
- Activated on 8/14
- Compiled a 1.35 ERA (1 ER, 6.2 IP) in his first 9 appearances (8/14-9/4) before posting a 11.42 ERA (11 ER, 8.2 IP) over his final 10 games (9/8-10/2)
- Was limited to a career-low 19 games and posted a career-worst 7.04 ERA (12 ER, 15.1 IP)

### 2011

- Led OAK in saves for the 3rd straight season (24)
- Ranked 2nd in the AL in save % (92.3)
- Began the season on the 15-day DL (strained right forearm); activated on 5/29
- Went a perfect 16-for-16 in save opportunities after the All-Star break; his 16 saves were 3rd-most in the AL in the 2nd half
- T-3rd in the AL with a .125 AVG (5-40) against 1st batters faced
- Traded to BOS on 12/28

### 2010

- Finished 2nd among all AL relievers in ERA (1.47), 5th in save % (89.3), and 7th in opponent's OBP (.251) & opponent's SLG % (.292)
- Selected as an AL All-Star for the 2nd consecutive season
- Held opponents to a .199 AVG (34-171)
- Allowed 1 ER or none in all 47 of his appearances
- Each of his first 12 appearances of the season were scoreless (4/5-5/8)
- Blew the save on 5/11 at TEX, snapping his career-long streak of successfully converted saves at 27 (6/16/09-5/8/10); was the 2nd-longest streak in OAK history (Dennis Eckersley, 40)
- Recorded 9 saves in May, tied for most in the AL
- Went 1-0, 7 SV, 0.75 ERA (1 ER, 12.0 IP) after the All-Star break
- Was on the DL with a right intercostal strain, 7/21-8/21
- Converted his final 13 save opportunities of the season
- Underwent season-ending right elbow surgery on 9/24 (Dr. James Andrews)

## 2009

- Named AL Rookie of the Year
- Ranked 2nd among all AL relievers in SO (91) and opponent's OBP (.228) and 3rd in ERA (1.84) and innings (83.1)
- His 1.84 ERA was the 3rd-lowest by an OAK pitcher with at least 80.0 IP since ERA became an official stat in 1912
- Set an OAK rookie record with 26 SV; led all ML rookies in saves and ranked 9th in the AL overall
- Selected as an AL All-Star; was the only rookie named to either team
- Threw at least 1.0 inning in 67 of his 68 appearances
- Struck out at least 2 batters in an outing 31 times, tied for most in the AL and 2nd-most in the majors
- Held opponents to a .152 AVG (10-66) with RISP
- Made his ML debut on Opening Night, 4/6 at LAA (1.0 IP, 1 SO)
- Earned his 1st career win, 4/8 at LAA
- Picked up his 1st career save, 5/8 vs TOR
- Had a career-best 15.1-inning scoreless streak, 6/14-7/19
- Named the AL Rookie of the Month for August (2-0, 7 SV, 11.0 IP, 4 H, 0 R)
- Did not allow an ER in 22 of his final 23 appearances (0.77 ERA, 2 ER, 23.1 IP)
- Converted each of his final 21 save opportunities of the season, tied for the 2nd-longest save streak in the AL

- Spent the entire season with Midland (AA)
- Went 1-8, 6.18 ERA (49 ER, 71.1 IP) in 15 starts before being converted into a reliever in the 2nd half; went 4-1, 0.92 ERA (4 ER, 39.0 IP) in 22 relief appearances
- Did not allow an ER in his first 8 relief appearances (12.0 IP), 6/28-7/22
- Went 4-0, 1.29 ERA (3 ER, 21.0 IP) in August
- Threw at least 1.0 inning in each of his 22 relief appearances

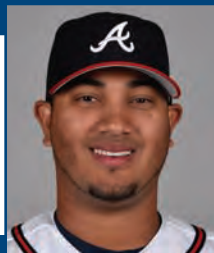

## Chacin's 2015 Season Recap

- In his 11th professional campaign, went 9-7 with a 3.24 ERA with three teams: Arizona Diamondbacks, Reno Aces and Columbus Clippers.
- Attended Major League spring training with the Colorado Rockies and was given his unconditional release on 3/25. Signed by the Cleveland Indians to a minor-league contract on 5/15.
- Made his first appearance of the season with Triple-A Columbus on 5/14
- Was released by Cleveland on 6/18 and signed as a minor-league free agent by the Arizona Diamondbacks on 6/20.
- Had his contract purchased and made his Arizona debut on 8/24. Went 2-1 with a 3.38 ERA in five appearances (four starts) for the Diamondbacks.
- Made two starts for ARI, 8/24 vs. STL and 8/29 at OAK prior to being optioned back to Reno on 8/29. Was recalled by ARI for the final time on 9/8 and made three appearances (two starts) the remainder of the season.
- Posted a 3.22 ERA while going 7-6 in 20 minor league starts between Columbus and Reno.
- Lasted at least 6.0 innings in 14 of his 20 minor league starts, 11 of which were 7.0-plus inning efforts.
- On 9/27 at SD, made his first appearance out of the bullpen since 7/23/10 at PHI.

## Chacin's Career Highlights

**2014:** Had an injury plagued season that resulted in him making just 11 starts at the Major League level... Began 2014 on the DL (right shoulder strain) before being reinstated on 5/4...Placed on DL again on 6/30 (right shoulder inflammation) and would spend the remainder of the season on the DL...His 11 starts and 63.1 innings pitched were his lowest in any of his five full Major League seasons (since 2010)...Made his season-debut on 5/4 vs. NYM, and went 5.0 innings and allowed four runs as the Rockies lost 5-1...His first quality start of the season came in his next time out on 5/9 at CIN as he allowed two runs on four hits over 6.0 innings (ND)...Did not allow more than four runs in each of his first seven starts but the Rockies scored 10 combined runs of support in those starts (2.33 RSA)...His first and only win of 2014 came on 6/12 vs. ATL as the Rockies won 10-3 and he went 7.0 innings of shutout, two-hit baseball...Took the loss in his next three starts before being placed on the disabled list on 6/30...He was later transferred to the 60-day DL on 7/4 through the end of the season...On 6/12 vs. ATL, he became the seventh pitcher in franchise history to hit the 500 strikeout mark in a Rockies uniform, joining Ubaldo Jimenez, Pedro Astacio, Jeff Francis, Jorge De La Rosa, Jason Jennings and Aaron Cook...He was the 141st active pitcher to join the 500 strikeout society...With his start on 5/9 at CIN, he made his 100th career start, all with the Rockies...He became the ninth Rockie to have ever started at least 100 games and 95th active pitcher with at least 100 starts.

**2013:** Set career highs in wins (14) and innings pitched (197.1) while starting a career-high-tying 31 games for the Rockies...Compiled a 14-10 record with a 3.47 ERA (76ER/197.1 IP) and 19 quality starts...Placed on the disabled list on 4/20 with a left lower back strain and was reinstated on 5/5...His 31 starts were tied with teammate Juan Nicasio for most starts while his 126 strikeouts led the team...Became the third-youngest Rockie pitcher to open the season as the team's Opening Day starter at the age of 25 years and 84 days old and went 6.2 innings and allowed one run on three hits with six strikeouts in the no-decision at MIL on 4/1...David Nied in 1993 (24 years, 104 days) and Jason Jennings in 2003 (24 years, 258 days) were the only other younger Opening Day starters over the franchise's 21 Opening Days...Forced opponents to ground into 30 double plays, the second-most by an NL pitcher, trailing only Adam Wainwright (32)...Twenty of those came at Coors Field, which led all pitchers for GDPs at home...In the first "half" of the season, established a career-best five-game winning streak (6/11-7/4)...During the streak that spanned five games, he tossed 34.1 combined innings and allowed just eight runs (2.10 ERA) and 30 hits...Became the second Rockies pitcher that season to have a five-game winning streak (De La Rosa, 5/7-6/2)...Set a new record for the longest a pitcher has taken a no-hitter in a game at Coors Field on 8/28 vs. SF (previous 6.1 no-hit innings by John Thomson 5/2/02 vs. PIT)...Took a no-hitter into the seventh inning before Brandon Crawford broke up the bid with a two-out single...He also matched Jorge De La Rosa (5/12 at STL) for the longest a Rockies pitcher took a no-hitter on the season.

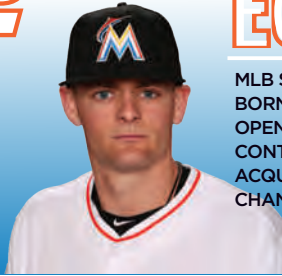

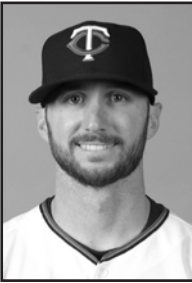
