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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (59-79) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (62-76)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have lost six of the last eight games and are 12-24 (.333) over the last 36 contests...are 20 games under .500, which is one short of the season high...are 59-79 (.428), which is the third worst record in the American League and tied for fifth worst in Oakland history after 138 games...were also 59-79 last year (won game 139)...with a loss today, the A's will have their worst record after 139 games since 1997 (54-85)... are 23½ games behind first place Texas in the AL West, which is one game short of the season high (24½ on Sept. 3)...have been in fourth place or worse in the AL West every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 60 days in fourth, 17 days tied for fourth and 38 days in fifth.

TRAGIC NUMBER: The A's have a tragic number of one for elimination in the American League West and eight in the Wild Card...can be officially eliminated from the West today in game 139 with a loss or a Texas win... have been eliminated from the West prior to game 140 twice in Oakland history...were eliminated in game 135 in 1979 (Aug. 30) and game 136 in 1977 (Sept. 6).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's recalled Jharel Cotton from Nashville today and now have 31 players on the active roster...Cotton will be the 49th player to appear in game for the A's this year, the 27th pitcher...the pitchers used tie the 1915 Philadelphia A's and 1955 Kansas City A's for second most in Athletics history to the record of 30 set last year...Cotton will be the 12th rookie of the 27 pitchers, tying the Oakland record for rookie pitchers in a season (2009, 2012, 2015)...he will be the ninth of those rookies to make his Major League debut this year...Cotton will bring the A's overall rookie total to 17, including 14 ML debuts...he will be the 14th different pitcher to start a game for the A's, which is the most in the American League and tied for third most in the majors...it is tied for second most in Oakland history (1977 and 2009) and is two short of the record (16 in 1983)...including today's move, the A's have made a total of 174 player moves in 157 days dating back to Opening Day.

OFFENSE: The A's have collected four hits or fewer in each of their last three wins and have seven such wins for the season...that is tied with San Francisco for the most in the majors and it is second most in Oakland history (8 in 1971)...are batting .182 (63-for-346) with 30 runs scored over the last 11 games (2.73 runs per game)...have scored 539 runs for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and third fewest in the majors...are averaging 3.91 runs per game and have not averaged fewer than 3.98 runs per game since 1979 (3.54)...have a .301 on-base percentage, which is the lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors...the Oakland record for lowest on-base percentage is .302 in 1979...have 352 walks, which is second fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors...are on pace for 413 walks, which would break the Athletics record for fewest walks in a 162-game season (421 in 1966)...have gone 18 consecutive games without a stolen base, which is the longest streak by an A's team since a 22-game streak from Sept. 14, 2005-April 6, 2006...have 44 stolen bases for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the AL...have the lowest slugging percentage (.393) and have been hit by the fewest pitches (32) in the AL...rank second in lowest batting average (.245) and fewest strikeouts (964), third in fewest extra base hits (384) and tied for third in fewest home runs (143).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 6.60 ERA (33 er in 45.0 ip) and .316 (59-for-187) opponents batting average over the first five games of the homestand...now have a 4.58 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have not finished the year with an ERA above 4.28 since 2000 (4.58)...have the third highest opponents batting average in the AL (.265).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 0-2 with a 6.63 ERA (14 er in 19.0 ip) over the last five games...are 8-14 with a 3.88 ERA (69 er in 160.0 ip) over the last 29 games and have issued just 29 walks (1.63 per nine innings)...are 36-60 with a 4.96 ERA (411 er in 745.1 ip) for the season...have the fewest innings pitched in the AL (Angels, 746.2) and rank second in highest ERA, most losses and fewest wins...have tossed fewer than five innings 42 times, which is the most in the majors, the most by an American League team since 2008 (Baltimore 44, Texas 42) and the most by an A's team since 1997 (52).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-3 on this nine-game homestand against Boston (1-2), Los Angeles-AL (1-1) and Seattle (three games)...went 2-1 on the last homestand against Cleveland and are 32-39 (.451) at home, which is the second worst home record in the American League...went 2-4 on the last road trip to St. Louis (2-1) and Houston (0-3) and have lost 14 of their last 18 road games...are 27-40 (.403) on the road...are batting .238 (555-for-2332) at home compared to .252 (591-for-2343) on the road.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's won for the ninth time this year last night when trailing after seven innings, which is tied with Kansas City and Texas for the most in the American League...improved to 15-13 in games decided in the last at bat...are now 22-21 (.500) in one-run games and rank fourth in the AL in one-run decisions (43)...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year, which was the second worst record in the majors...the A's 1-0 win over Boston on Sunday was their seventh walk-off win of the season, which is tied for fourth in the AL...have eight walk-off losses (all against AL West competition), which is third most in the AL...are tied for third in walk-off games (15)

SCORING MARGIN: The A's have been outscored by 24 runs over the first five games of the homestand (39-15)...have a season run differential of -121, which is second worst in the American League (Minnesota, -140)... the last time the A's were outscored by more than 44 runs in a season was in 1997 (-182)...are 16-35 (.314) in games decided by four runs or more compared to 43-44 (.494) in games decided by three runs or fewer...the 16 wins by four runs or more are second fewest in the majors (Atlanta, 15) and the winning percentage is the worst in the AL and third worst in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: The A's played their fastest game of the season last night (2:14) and are averaging 2 hours and 56 minutes per game, which is the fastest in the majors...are one of just three teams averaging under three hours per game (Kansas City and Toronto, 2:58)...have committed 11 errors in the last eight games and now have 87 errors for the season, which is tied for second most in the American League...A's pinch hitters are 3 for their last 34 (.088)...rank second in the AL in hits (20), RBI (13) and plate appearances (108) but have the fewest walks (3).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list an Oakland-record 27 times and those players have combined to miss an Oakland-record 1503 games (55.7 games per stint)....currently have 13 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Gray, Ladendorf, Lambo, Lowrie, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard), including 11 on the 60-day DL (all but Gray and Ladendorf)...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4 (including a season-high 16 from Aug. 22-28)...prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once...have had at least six players on the DL all year.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's are 6-9 against the Angels and need to win each of the remaining four games to avoid losing the season series for the third consecutive year...are 4-3 in Anaheim and 2-6 in Oakland...have lost eight of the last 10 games in Oakland...are 23-30 against the Angels over the last three years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 420-351 against the Angels...that includes 217-167 in Oakland and 203-184 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 469-428 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis has hit 22 of his home runs as a left fielder, which are the most by an A's left fielder since Ben Grieve had 27 in 2000... Ryon Healy is batting .358 (29-for-81) over his last 22 games after hitting .222 over his first 26 contests... Ryan Madson has not allowed a run in his last 11 games (12.2 ip) and is a perfect 6-for-6 in save opportunities over that span... Marcus Semien leads American League shortstops and ranks third in the majors with 23 home runs.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1984 the A's tie a club record by using 22 players in a game but lose 13-2 at Cleveland...only Mike Davis, who started the game in right and moved to center, played the entire game...in 2005 the A's scored five times in the bottom of the ninth to defeat Seattle 8-7, marking the first time in Oakland history the A's have come back from a four-run deficit entering the final bat and won...Nick Swisher walks with the bases loaded to force in the winning run.

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TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jharel Cotton (Major League Debut)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville today and will be making his Major League debut...will become the 49th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the fifth this year (Manaea, Mengden, Overton, Alcantara)...is the seventh pitcher to make his first ML start for the A's this year (Neal and Triggs)...this marks the second time in Oakland history the A's had five pitchers start in their ML debut in one season...the other time was in 1978 (Controy, Johnson, Minetto, Morgan, Wirth)...the last complete game was by Mike Morgan June 11, 1978 against Baltimore and the only shutout is by Mike Norris April 10, 1975 against Chicago...the 48 pitchers to start in their debut have combined for a 14-16 record and a 3.88 ERA.

MINORS: Began the season at Triple-A Oklahoma City in the Los Angeles Dodgers organization and went 8-5 with a 4.90 ERA in 22 games, including 16 starts...was one of three players traded to the A's on Aug. 1 in exchange for Rich Hill and Josh Reddick...was assigned to Triple-A Nashville where he went 3-1 with a 2.82 ERA in six starts...combined with both clubs for an 11-6 record and a 4.31 ERA in 28 games, 22 starts...led the Pacific Coast League, ranked second in Triple-A and tied for 12th in all of minor league baseball with a career-high 155 strikeouts...also led the PCL in opponents batting average (.214), tied for the league lead in shutouts (2), tied for second in complete games (2) and tied for 10th in wins (11)...surrendered 20 home runs, which tied for fourth most...was 10-4 with a 3.94 ERA in his 22 starts compared to 1-2 with a 9.00 ERA in his six relief appearances.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .214 opponents batting average, including .192 (38-for-198) against left-handed hitters compared to .229 (70-for-306) against right-handers...yielded 16 of his 20 home runs to righties...13 were solo shots...allowed a .198 batting average and .239 on-base percentage to batters leading off an inning...opponents hit .310 with runners in scoring position with Oklahoma City, .208 with Nashville.

ALMOST PERFECT: Came within one out of a perfect game for Nashville on Aug. 9 in a 3-0 win at Round Rock...retired each of the first 26 batters he faced before allowing a two-out triple to Doug Bernier...then struck out Drew Robinson for his 12th strikeout of the game...it was his second complete game and shutout of the season...was named PCL Pitcher of the Week for the second time (also May 23-29).

LAST MINOR LEAGUE START: He had a no decision in Nashville's 6-5 win over lowa last Thursday...tossed 5.2 innings and did not allow a run... retired each of the first nine batters before John Andreoli singled to start the fourth...also allowed a hit and two walks in the fifth and three more hits in the sixth...was aided by a double play in the sixth and was relieved by Bobby Wahl with two outs in the sixth and the scored tied 0-0...Wahl got the final out of the inning and the Sounds ended up winning on a walk-off RBI triple by Franklin Barreto in the ninth.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Was selected by the Los Angeles Dodgers in the 20th round of the 2012 draft and went 23-24 with a 3.77 ERA in 94 games, 59 starts, over his five seasons in the Los Angeles organization...was traded to the A's with Frankie Montas and Grant Holmes for Rich Hill and Josh Reddick on Aug. 1, 2016...is 26-25 with a 3.68 ERA (183 er in 447.0 ip) in 100 games, 65 starts, overall...has averaged better than a strikeout per inning during the course of his career with 499 strikeouts in 447.0 innings (10.05 per nine innings)...was rated as the Dodgers ninth best prospect by Baseball America prior to the 2016 season...ranked second in the California League with 138 strikeouts in 2014.

VIRGIN ISLANDS: Will become the fourth pitcher in Major League history born in the Virgin Islands...will immediately move into a tie for second place on the games pitched list for natives of the Virgin Islands, joining Ellie Hendriks (1978 Orioles) and Akeel Morris (2015 Mets), who both made one relief appearance...the leader is Al McBean, who went 67-50 with a 3.13 ERA in 409 games, including 76 starts, with Pittsburgh (1961-68, 70), San Diego (1969) and Los Angeles (1969-70)...is the 14th player born in the Virgin Islands in ML history, the third Athletic (Jose Morales, 1973; Jerry Browne, 1992-93).

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Daniel Mengden (1-6, 6.66 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville last Saturday for his second stint with the A's this year and took the loss in a start that day against Boston, an 11-2 decision (2.2 ip, 8 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 2 so)...is now 1-6 with a 6.66 ERA in 10 starts overall...his ERA is fifth highest in the American League among pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, his average of 4.91 walks per nine innings is third highest...is one of eight AL rookies to start 10 or more games...is 0-5 with a 7.53 ERA in six starts at home...his five-game career-opening home losing streak is tied for the longest in Oakland history with Steve Ontiveros (1985-86) and Dallas Braden (2007)...has never faced the Mariners in his career...combined for a 10-2 record, a 1.46 ERA and .197 opponents batting average in 17 games, all starts, with Double-A Midland and Nashville...tied for second in the A's farm system in wins.

- The A's bullpen has allowed 31 runs over its last eight games (26 er in 32.2 ip, 7.16 ERA) after yielding just two runs over its previous eight games (0.77 ERA).
- Has allowed 58-of-219 (26.5%) inherited runners to score, which is the
- second best percentage in the American League (Cleveland, 26.0%). Ranks second in the AL in innings pitched (475.1), fourth in strikeouts (452) and fifth in opponents slugging percentage (.388)...ranks third in most blown saves (18), tied for third in most walks (166), fourth in most wild pitches (29) and fifth in lowest save percentage (67.3%).
