LEADING OFF Today the Angels play the final contest of a six-game (3-2) road trip to Seattle (2-1) & Oakland (1-1)...Club is off tomorrow...Angels have won eight of 10 and 10 of 13 games...Halos have won seven of last 10 road affairs...Angels are 25-24 since All-Star break...Active roster at 31 players... On Friday, Club opens a 10-game homestand vs. Texas (Sept. 9-11), Seattle (Sept. 12-14) and Toronto (Sept. 15-18).

SHOEMAKER UPDATE Matt Shoemaker was struck by a line drive on the right side of his head Sunday at Seattle (off the bat of Kyle Seager)...Readings of a CT scan showed a small skull fracture and small hematoma. Matt stayed the night at the hospital for observation and then underwent successful surgery (Dr. Manuel Ferreira) to stop the bleeding. Matt has been released from the hospital and can return home today. He continues to rest well.

KNOW THIS Alex Meyer becomes the 14th different starting pitcher for Angels in 2016 and 52nd player to appear. Club records are 17 starters in 1967 & 54 players in 2014.

DOUBLE VISION Albert Pujols is one double shy from becoming 16th player all-time with 600 career doubles...He is two shy from matching Barry Bonds (601) for 15th...Would become third player ever with 575 HRs and 600 doubles: Barry Bonds & Hank Aaron.

A.L. MVP? Mike Trout ranks among the AL's top five in batting (.323), runs (109), stolen bases (24) and OBP (.442)... His 1.015 OPS ranks second to David Ortiz (1.030), while Trout has the AL's best WAR at 9.3.

MR. MASH Pujols sits on 29 HRs and is seeking 30+ home runs for 4th time in career...Would be fourth player all-time with 14, 30+ homer campaigns: Alex Rodriguez (15), Hank Aaron (15) and Barry Bonds (14)...Would be first to accomplish the feat in 14 of first 16 seasons.

GAME OF CRON C.J. Cron had his career-long 12-game hit streak (.392; 20/51) snapped last night...Since his return from DL (8/20), Cron is hitting .318 (21/66) with two doubles, a triple, four HRs, 11 RBI and nine runs scored...Has 28 RBI over last 24 games.

TROUT RECENTLY Mike Trout has scored a run in each of last eight games (12 R total)...He is batting .429 (24/56) with four doubles, a triple, four home runs and 11 RBI over his last 16 games...Has logged six, three-hit games in last 12 affairs...Since Aug. 1, Trout is hitting .360 with a .500 on-base percentage, a .690 slugging percentage and OPS of 1.190.

TEAM PITCHING Since August 21st, Angels lead A.L. with a 3.16 ERA (131 IP – 46 ER)...Halo pitching staff has held opponents to three runs or less in 11 of last 15 games.

ONLY ME With 27 HRs & 109 R, Trout is the only player to turn the 25 HR/100 run trick 5 times before age-25 campaign.

TWO PLAYERS EVER Trout's 109 runs are T1st in the A.L...Trout has now reached the 100-run plateau for the fifth consecutive season - just second player all-time to log 100 runs five times prior to their age-25 season (Alex Rodriguez).

RBI MACHINE Pujols has 110 RBI (2nd in A.L.) reaching the century mark for 13th time (has done so three times as an Angel; 2012, 2014 & 2016)...He leads A.L. with 50 RBI since All-Star Break and has 63 RBI his last 62 G...On pace for 7th season of 120+ RBI...He is one of five players to amass 100 RBI in 13 different seasons: Alex Rodriguez (14 times), Jimmie Foxx (13), Lou Gehrig (13) and Babe Ruth (13).

Vs. ATHLETICS LAA leads 2016 series 8-6...Angels had HR streak end at 11 consecutive games vs. A's last night...Angels have won 25 of last 38 overall meetings...Halos have won eight of last 10 at the Coliseum.

HI, MY NAME IS... Angels have used 51 players this season (55 on active roster)...Halos have used 13 starting pitchers this season...Club records in each category are 54 players used (2014) and 17 different starting pitchers (1967)...LAA has 19 different starting left fielders since 2015.

THIS N' THAT LAA has scored at least eight runs five times in last 13 games...With Andrew Bailey's debut Friday, LAA has matched the A.L. record for most former Rookie of the Year winners to play for one team in a season with five (Pujols, Street, Soto, Trout) - 2000 Yankees also had five (Canseco, Gooden, Jeter, Justice, Knoblauch)...LAA has grounded into 133 double plays, most in MLB...21 pickoffs by Halo pitching leads MLB...LAA batters have fewest strikeouts in MLB (832)...LAA's 87 errors are 2nd-most in A.L...Halos & Indians pitchers lead A.L. with 10 SHO in 2016...Pujols' now has 134 first-inning HRs, breaking an all-time record he shared with Babe Ruth and Barry Bonds

THE MANAGER In his 17th season, Mike Scioscia is the longest tenured manager in MLB and only active manager to collect over 1,000 victories with a single club...His 17 years with the Angels matches Sparky Anderson (Detroit, 1979-95) for second longest tenure with an A.L. team (trailing only Connie Mack's 50 seasons with Philadelphia).

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

September 7

(2007) Garret Anderson collects an RBI in his 12th consecutive game (Aug. 26 – Sept. 7) to extend his club record...The streak ends the next night as he falls two games shy of matching the AL record for consecutive games with an RBI of 14 set by Tris Speaker of Philadelphia A's in 1928.

September 8

(1996) The Angels turned the fifth triple play in club history in a 4-2 victory at Minnesota.

Making Angels debut today

- Making third Major League appearance and second start of the season...Today marks Angels debut.
- **BACK IN THE BIGS:** Recalled by Angels on Saturday for first Major League appearance since start for Twins on May 3 at Houston...Made Major League debut on June 26, 2015 for Minnesota vs. Milwaukee.
- **DEADLINE DEAL:** Acquired from Minnesota on August 1 along with RHP **Ricky Nolasco** in exchange for LHP **Hector Santiago** and minor league RHP **Alan Busenitz**.
- **COUNTING HALOS:** Becomes 14th different starting pitcher for Angels this season (tied with Oakland for most in A.L.)...Franchise record is 17 starting pitchers in 1967.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Tossed four scoreless innings vs. Albuquerque in last outing on Sept. 1 with Triple-A Salt Lake...Allowed just two hits with no walks and six strikeouts.
- **IN THE TWINS SYSTEM:** Opened the season with Triple-A Rochester and went 1-1 with a 1.04 ERA (17.1 IP – 2 ER) in three games (two starts) for the Red Wings before being recalled by Minnesota on April 25...In two games (one start) for the Twins, went 0-1 with a 12.27 ERA (3.2 IP – 5 ER).
- **D.L. STINT:** After being optioned back to Rochester on May 4, was placed on disabled list with right shoulder inflammation...Was sidelined until making first rehab appearance with AZL Angels on Aug. 12.
- **MINOR TOTALS:** In eight total minor league games (seven starts) this season, went 1-1 with one save and a 1.86 ERA (29 IP – 6 ER)...Recorded 40 strikeouts with just six walks.
- **PROSPECT RANKINGS:** At time of promotion to Angels, was ranked by *MLB.com* as #12 prospect in Angels system...Entered the year ranked by *Baseball America* as #12 prospect in Twins system...Was ranked among top five prospects in Twins organization each season from 2013-15.
- **VS. OAKLAND:** Today marks first career appearance vs. Athletics.
- **AT OAKLAND COLISEUM:** Today marks first career appearance at the Coliseum.
- **FIRST ROUNDER:** Originally drafted by Washington in first round (23rd overall) of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of University of Kentucky...Was ranked as Nationals #6 prospect by *Baseball America* entering 2012...Traded by Nationals to Minnesota on Nov. 29, 2012 for OF **Denard Span**.
- **CAREER NOTES:** In four career Major League games (one start), is 0-1 with a 14.21 ERA (6.1 IP – 10 ER)...Made first Major League start on May 3, 2016 for Minnesota at Houston.
