## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (60-79) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (72-68)

FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 9, 2016 — OAKLAND ALAMEDA COLISEUM — 7:05 P.M. PDT RHP DANIEL MENGDEN (1-6, 6.66) VS. RHP HISASHI IWAKUMA (14-11, 4.01) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have won two straight and three of the last four games after losing five in a row...are now 13-24 (.351) over the last 37 games and 60-79 (.432) for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...it is tied for the sixth worst record in Oakland history after 139 games...were also 60-79 last year (lost game 140)...remain in fifth place in the AL West for the 10th consecutive day and have been in fourth place or worse in the AL West every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 60 days in fourth, 17 days tied for fourth and 40 days in fifth.

TRAGIC NUMBER: The A's have a tragic number of one for elimination in the American League West and eight in the Wild Card...can be officially eliminated from the West today in game 140 with a loss or a Texas win... should the A's be eliminated today, it would match the third earliest elimination (by game number) in Oakland history...it would be the earliest since 1997 when they were also eliminated in game 140.

ROOKIES: The A's are scheduled to start a rookie pitcher tonight for the fourth consecutive game, which is their longest such streak since starting a rookie in each of the final 14 games of the 2012 season...entering tonight, rookies have started 49 of the A's 139 games this year...the A's have employed a total of 17 rookies this year, including 12 pitchers...have tied the Oakland record for most rookie pitchers in a season (2009, 2012, 2015)... the rookies have a combined 179 games pitched, which is fourth most in Oakland history (319 in 2012, 232 in 2009, 203 in 2008)...have 366 strikeouts, which is also fourth most (688 in 2012, 618 in 2009, 367 in 1983)... the A's have had at least three rookies in the starting lineup (including the pitcher) in each of the last seven games...have had at least four rookies in the lineup 12 times, including a season-high five three times (Aug. 5, 14 and 21)...14 of the 17 rookies have made their Major League debuts this year, including nine of the 12 pitchers

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .192 (73-for-381) with 34 runs scored over the last 12 games (2.83 runs per game)...have scored 543 runs for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and third fewest in the majors...are averaging 3.91 runs per game and have not averaged fewer than 3.98 runs per game since 1979 (3.54)...have a .302 on-base percentage, which is the lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors... the Oakland record for lowest on-base percentage is .302 in 1979...have 359 walks, which is second fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors...are on pace for 418 walks, which would break the Athletics record for fewest walks in a 162-game season (421 in 1966)...stole their first base on Wednesday since Aug. 16, snapping an 18-game streak without a stole base...that was the longest streak by an A's team since a 22-game streak from Sept. 14, 2005-April 6, 2006...have 45 stolen bases for the season, which is fourth fewest in the AL...have the lowest slugging percentage (.393) and have been hit by the fewest pitches (32) in the AL...rank second in lowest batting average (.245) and fewest strikeouts (974), third in fewest extra base hits (387) and fourth in fewest home runs (144)

PITCHING: In six games on the homestand, the A's have allowed two runs or fewer three times and 10 runs or more three times...have a 5.67 ERA (34 er in 54.0 ip) and .284 (61-for-215) opponents batting average on the homestand...now have a 4.55 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have not finished the year with an ERA above 4.28 since 2000 (4.58)...have the third highest opponents batting average in the AL (.264) and are tied for the third fewest home runs allowed (161).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 9-14 with a 3.79 ERA (70 er in 166.1 ip) over the last 30 games and have issued just 31 walks (1.68 per nine innings)...are 37-60 with a 4.93 ERA (412 er in 751.2 ip) for the season...rank second in the American League in highest ERA, fewest innings pitched, most losses and fewest wins...have tossed fewer than five innings 42 times, which is the most in the majors, the most by an American League team since 2008 (Baltimore 44, Texas 42) and the most by an A's team since 1997 (52).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-3 on this nine-game homestand against Boston (1-2), Los Angeles-AL (2-1) and Seattle (three games)...went 2-1 on the last homestand against Cleveland and are 33-39 (.458) at home, which is the second worst home record in the American League...went 2-4 on the last road trip to St. Louis (2-1) and Houston (0-3) and have lost 14 of their last 18 road games...are 27-40 (.403) on the road...are batting .239 (565-for-2367) at home compared to .252 (591-for-2343) on the road... have a 4.07 ERA (296 er in 654.0 ip) at home compared to 5.10 (326 er in 575.2 ip) on the road.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 22-21 (.500) in one-run games and rank fourth in the American League in one-run decisions (43)...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year, which was the second worst record in the majors...the A's 1-0 win over Boston on Sunday was their seventh walk-off win of the season, which is tied for fourth in the AL...have eight walk-off losses (all against AL West competition), which is third most in the AL...are tied for third in walk-off games (15)...Tuesday's win was the A's ninth this year when trailing after seven innings, which is tied for the most in the AL...are 15-13 in games decided in the last at bat.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 16-35 (.314) in games decided by four runs or more compared to 44-44 (.500) in games decided by three runs or fewer...the 16 wins by four runs or more are second fewest in the majors (Atlanta, 15) and the winning percentage is the worst in the American League and third worst in the majors...have a season run differential of -118, which is second worst in the AL (Minnesota, -139)...the last time the A's were outscored by more than 44 runs in a season was in 1997 (-182).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have 31 players on the active roster...have employed 49 players this year, including 27 pitchers...the pitchers used tie the 1915 Philadelphia A's and 1955 Kansas City A's for second most in Athletics history to the record of 30 set last year...have used 14 different starting pitchers, which is tied with Los Angeles for the most in the American League...it is tied for second most in Oakland history (1977 and 2009) and is two short of the record (16 in 1983)...the A's have made a total of 174 player moves in 158 days dating back to Opening Day.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list an Oaklandrecord 27 times and those players have combined to miss an Oaklandrecord 1516 games (56.1 games per stint)...currently have 13 players on the DL, including 11 on the 60-day DL...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4 (including a season-high 16 from Aug. 22-28)... prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once... have had at least six players on the DL all year.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's trail in the season series, 5-7...are 1-5 in Oakland and 4-2 in Seattle...have lost nine of the last 10 games in Oakland but have won six of the last nine in Seattle...14 of the A's last 23 losses to Seattle have been by one run and 22 of the last 32 have been by two runs or fewer...the A's lost the season series last year for the third consecutive season and fourth time in the last five

years...are now 49-58 against the Mariners over the last six years...alltime, the A's are 332-265 against Seattle...that includes 180-119 in Oakland, 151-145 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 75-81 at Safeco Field.

#### **TODAY'S TIDBITS**

The A's are averaging 2 hours and 56 minutes per game, which is the fastest in the majors by two minutes...are one of just three teams averaging under three hours per game (Kansas City and Toronto, 2:58)... Khris Davis has seven home runs against Seattle, which match the most in Oakland history against the Mariners (Canseco, 1988; Chavez, 2001; Moss, 2013)... Ryon Healy is batting .353 (30-for-85) over his last 22 games after hitting .222 over his first 26 contests... Ryan Madson has not allowed a run in his last 12 games (13.2 ip) and is a perfect 7-for-7 in save opportunities over that span... *Marcus Semien* leads American League shortstops and ranks third in the majors with 23 home runs.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1945 Dick Fowler no-hits the St. Louis Browns, 1-0...in 1958 Preston Ward hits three consecutive home runs in Kansas City's 8-6 win against Baltimore...in 1985 Jose Canseco hits his first major league home run off the Rangers Jeff Russell in the A's 3-1 loss to Texas...in 1988 Luis Polonia becomes the third player in Oakland history to score five runs in a game in the A's 14-6 win at Kansas City...he is a perfect 5 for 5 on the day and also drives in three runs...in 1990 the A's defeat the New York Yankees 7-3 to complete a sweep of the season series, 12-0.

### TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Mengden (1-6, 6.66 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville last Saturday for his second stint with the A's this year and took the loss in a start that day against Boston (7 er in 2.2 ip, 23.63 ERA)...is now 1-6 with a 6.66 ERA in 10 starts overall...his ERA is fourth highest in the American League among pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, his average of 4.91 walks per nine innings is third highest...is one of eight AL rookies to start 10 or more games...was selected from Nashville June 11 and made his Major League debut that day at Cincinnati after just 43 minor league appearances, including 34 starts, in three professional seasons... went 1-5 with a 5.73 ERA in nine starts before he was optioned to Nashville July 26...had not pitched above Single-A prior to this year.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 0-5 with a 7.53 ERA (24 er in 28.2 ip) in six starts at home compared to 1-1 with a 5.56 ERA (14 er in 22.2 ip) in four starts on the road...his five-game career-opening home losing streak is tied for the longest in Oakland history with Steve Ontiveros (1985-86) and Dallas Braden (2007)...since 1913, only two A's pitchers have a longer such streak: Bob Hasty (11, Sept. 11, 1919-Aug. 11, 1921) and Wally Burnette (7, July 24-Sept. 9, 1956).

**FIRST FOUR, LAST SIX:** Went 1-3 with a 2.81 ERA and .221 opponents batting average in his four starts in June...is 0-3 with a 10.52 ERA (30 er in 25.2 ip) and .342 (39-for-114) opponents batting average in six starts since then...logged a 9.00 ERA in five starts in July, which was second highest in Oakland history in July among pitchers with 20 or more innings (Karsay, 9.36 in 1997).

**INNING BY INNING:** Has a 2.70 ERA (6 er in 20.0 ip) and .227 (17-for-75) opponents batting average in innings one and two and a 9.19 ERA (32 er in 31.1 ip) and .321 (43-for-134) opponents average from the third inning on.

**AL AND NL:** Has made four of his 10 career starts against National League teams...is 1-3 with a 4.01 ERA (11 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts in interleague play compared to 0-3 with a 9.11 ERA (27 er in 26.2 ip) in six starts against American League teams.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 1-2 with a 5.08 ERA (16 er in 28.1 ip) in five starts on four days rest compared to 0-4 with a 8.61 ERA (22 er in 23.0 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more.

**STRIKEOUTS:** Has 51 strikeouts in 51.1 innings over the first 10 starts of his career (8.94 per nine innings)...since 1913, his 51 strikeouts are tied for seventh most by an A's pitcher over the first 10 games of his career.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has a .229 (19-for-83) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .303 (23-for-76) the second time and .360 (18-for-50) after that...the opponents number five hitter is 3-for-25 (.120)...however, the seven through nine hitters are batting a combined .403 (25-for-62).

**RUN SUPPORT:** Received eight runs of support in his lone win on June 27 at San Francisco...has a total of 16 runs of support in his other nine starts (43.2 ip, 3.30 RSA).

THIS AND THAT: Is the eighth starting pitcher in Oakland history to allow to allow three runs or fewer in each of his first four starts, the first since A.J. Griffin in 2012...was charged with the loss in each of his first three starts to join Brad Rigby (1997) and Mike Morgan (1978) as the only three pitchers in Oakland history to lose each of the first three games of their career... is just the fourth Major League pitcher since 1913 to lose each of his first three career games while allowing three runs or fewer in each game...the others are Duane Pillette (1949 Yankees), Jim McAndrew (1968 Mets) and Kyle Drabek (2010 Blue Jays)...allowed four runs or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of his first five career starts...since 1913, the only other Major League pitcher to do that and lose at least four of those games is Tony Armas, who went 0-4 with a 2.97 ERA over his first five career starts with Montreal from Aug. 16, 1999-May 30, 2000.

2016 START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, a 2-1 A's loss at Cincinnati *June 11*...became the 46th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut and the first of those to take the loss since Brett Anderson on April 10, 2009 against Seattle...at the age of 23 years, 113 days, he became the youngest A's pitcher to start a game since Trevor Cahill on June 19, 2011 (23 years, 110 days)...struck out the first batter he faced (Cozart)...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to Texas *June 16* in Oakland...shutout the Rangers on a hit and a walk over the first six innings and had retired 15 straight when he allowed a leadoff home run to Desmond in the seventh...lost his third consecutive start in the A's 4-2 loss to Milwaukee *June 22* in Oakland...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the fifth inning...picked up his first Major League win in the A's 8-3 victory at San Francisco *June 27*...retired each of the first 13 batters and shutout the Giants on two hits and a walk over the first seven innings...had an 8-0 lead when he allowed his only two runs in the

eighth inning...was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss to Pittsburgh *July* 3 in Oakland...had a 3-2 lead when he allowed a RBI triple to Frazier and a RBI single to Kratz in the sixth inning for the loss...had his first career no decision in the A's 10-9 loss at Houston *July* 8...had a 3-2 lead when he allowed four runs in the fifth inning...had a no decision in the A's 8-7 win over Toronto *July* 15 in Oakland...left after 3.1 innings trailing 7-3 but the A's came back to score five unanswered runs...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-0 loss to Houston *July* 20 in Oakland...allowed a run in the first and two more in the second on a Springer RBI double and a Correa bases loaded walk...Fister and Devenski combined to shutout the A's on four hits and two walks...had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss at Texas on *July* 25... allowed four runs on seven hits in three walks in 4.2 innings but left the game with a 5-4 lead...did not qualify for the decision but the A's would lose the game on a Beltre two-run walk-off home run off Madson.

LAST START: He extended his losing streak to three games in the A's 11-2 loss to Boston last Saturday in Oakland...allowed a two-run double to Betts in the first inning...was then charged with five of the Red Sox seven runs in the third inning, all with two outs...allowed a solo home run to Ramirez and a RBI double to Moncado which plated a third run on a Davis error...was relieved by Axford, who allowed two inherited runners to score plus two of his own.

MINORS: Combined for a 10-2 record, a 1.46 ERA and .197 opponents batting average in 17 games, all starts, with Double-A Midland and Triple-A Nashville...tied for second in the A's farm system in wins...allowed just four home runs in 98.1 innings, an average of 0.37 per nine innings...struck out 95 and walked 29 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.28...began the season at Midland and went 2-0 with a 0.78 ERA in four starts before he was promoted to Nashville May 1...went 3-1 with a 1.39 ERA in seven starts with the Sounds before his promotion to Oakland on June 11...then went 5-1 with a 2.10 ERA in six starts following his July 26 option...was 8-2 with a 1.67 ERA in 13 starts overall at Nashville...his opponents batting average included a .190 (28-for-147) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .202 (41-for-203) against right-handers...yielded a .134 batting average with runners in scoring position...had a 1.19 ERA in the minors at the time of his first promotion to Oakland on June 11, which was sixth lowest in all of the minor leagues.

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Kendall Graveman (10-9, 3.81 ERA): Is 2-1 with a 1.24 ERA and .176 opponents batting average over his last three starts...is now 9-3 with a 3.18 ERA over his last 18 starts after going 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts...has eight wins dating back to June 23, which is tied for fourth most in the American League over that span...is 5-4 with a 2.64 ERA in 12 starts at home compared to 5-5 with a 4.89 ERA in 15 starts on the road...has the third lowest home ERA in the AL...has surrendered six home runs in 78.1 innings at home compared to 15 in 84.2 innings on the road...had a no decision in his last start, a 1-0 A's win over Boston last Sunday here in Oakland (6.1 ip, 6 h, 2 bb, 7 so)...is 1-2 with a 3.71 ERA (26.2 ip, 31 h, 11 r, 11 er, 5 bb, 15 so, 2 hr) in six career appearances, including four starts, against Seattle...is 0-2 with a 5.40 ERA in two starts this year.

### ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

23-19, 3.95 ERA (210 er in 478.0 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 38-for-56 (67.9%)

- The A's bullpen has allowed 31 runs over its last nine games (26 er in 35.1 ip, 6.62 ERA) after yielding just two runs over its previous eight games (0.77 ERA).
- Has allowed 58-of-219 (26.5%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the American League (Cleveland, 26.4%) and fourth best in the majors.
- Ranks second in the AL in innings pitched (478.0), fourth in strikeouts (456) and fifth in opponents slugging percentage (.386)...ranks third in most blown saves (18), fourth in most wild pitches (29) and fifth in most walks (166) and lowest save percentage (67.9%).
- First batters faced are 90-for-391 (.232) with 30 walks (.282 on-base percentage)...leads the AL in first batter slugging percentage (.320), ranks third in on-base percentage and fourth in batting average.
