OAKLAND ATHLETICS (60-80) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (73-68)

SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 10, 2016 — OAKLAND ALAMEDA COLISEUM — 1:05 P.M. PDT RHP KENDALL GRAVEMAN (10-9, 3.81) VS. RHP FELIX HERNANDEZ (10-5, 3.75) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three of the last five games and are 7-8 over the last 15 contests...however, are 13-25 (.342) over the last 38 games and 60-80 (.429) for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...it is tied for the sixth worst record in Oakland history after 140 games...were also 60-80 last year (lost game 141)...are 20 games under .500, which is one short of the season high of 21 (twice, last: 58-79 on Sept. 5)...remain in fifth place in the AL West for the 11th consecutive day and have been in fourth place or worse in the West every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 60 days in fourth, 17 days tied for fourth and 41 days in fifth.

ELIMINATED: The A's were officially eliminated in the American League West last night in game 140...that matched the third earliest elimination from the division race (by game number) in Oakland history...it was the earliest since 1997 when they were also eliminated in game 140...have a tragic number of seven to be eliminated from the Wild Card.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's fell to 33-40 (.452) at home with the loss last night, which is the second worst home record in the American League... with one more loss, the A's will clinch a losing record at home for the second consecutive season (34-47 in 2015)...have not finished with a losing record at home in consecutive seasons since 1996-98 when they did it three straight years...have done it just three times in Oakland history (1977-79 and 1993-94)...are 3-4 on this nine-game homestand against Boston (1-2), Los Angeles-AL (2-1) and Seattle (0-1)...leave following the game tomorrow for a seven-game road trip to Kansas City (four games) and Texas (three games)...went 2-4 on the last road trip to St. Louis (2-1) and Houston (0-3) and have lost 14 of their last 18 road games...are 27-40 (.403) on the road...are batting .238 (572-for-2400) at home compared to .252 (591-for-2343) on the road...have a 4.06 ERA (299 er in 663.0 ip) at home compared to 5.10 (326 er in 575.2 ip) on the road.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .193 (80-for-414) with 36 runs scored over the last 13 games (2.77 runs per game)...have scored 545 runs for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and third fewest in the majors...are averaging 3.89 runs per game and have not averaged fewer than 3.98 runs per game since 1979 (3.54)...have a .301 on-base percentage, which is the lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors...the Oakland record for lowest on-base percentage is .302 in 1979...have 360 walks, which is second fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors... are on pace for 417 walks, which would break the Athletics record for fewest walks in a 162-game season (421 in 1966)...have the lowest slugging percentage (.392) and have been hit by the fewest pitches (32) in the AL, rank second in lowest batting average (.245) and fewest strikeouts (982), third in fewest stolen bases (45).

PITCHING: In seven games on the homestand, the A's have allowed three runs or fewer four times and 10 runs or more three times...have a 5.29 ERA (37 er in 63.0 ip) and .270 (67-for-248) opponents batting average on the homestand...now have a 4.54 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have not finished the year with an ERA above 4.28 since 2000 (4.58)...have the third highest opponents batting average in the AL (.264) and are tied for the third fewest home runs allowed (163).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 9-15 with a 3.78 ERA (72 er in 171.1 ip) over the last 31 games and have issued just 33 walks (1.73 per nine innings)...are 37-61 with a 4.92 ERA (414 er in 756.2 ip) for the season...rank second in the American League in highest ERA, fewest innings pitched, most losses and fewest wins...have tossed fewer than five innings 42 times, which is the most in the majors, the most by an American League team since 2008 (Baltimore 44, Texas 42) and the most by an A's team since 1997 (52).

SCORING MARGIN: The A's fell to 22-22 (.500) in one-run games with the loss last night...rank fourth in the American League in one-run decisions (44)...are now 44-45 (.494) in games decided by three runs or fewer compared to 16-35 (.314) in games decided by four runs or more...the 16 wins

by four runs or more are second fewest in the majors (Atlanta, 15) and the winning percentage is the worst in the AL and third worst in the majors... have a season run differential of -119, which is second worst in the AL (Minnesota, -140)...the last time the A's were outscored by more than 62 runs in a season was in 1997 (-182).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have 31 players on the active roster...have employed 49 players this year, including 27 pitchers...the pitchers used tie the 1915 Philadelphia A's and 1955 Kansas City A's for second most in Athletics history to the record of 30 set last year...have used 14 different starting pitchers, which is tied with Los Angeles for the most in the American League...it is tied for second most in Oakland history (1977 and 2009) and is two short of the record (16 in 1983)...the A's have made a total of 174 player moves in 159 days dating back to Opening Day.

ROOKIES: The A's have employed a total of 17 rookies this year, including 12 pitchers...have tied the Oakland record for most rookie pitchers in a season (2009, 2012, 2015)...the rookies have a combined 181 games pitched, which is fourth most in Oakland history (319 in 2012, 232 in 2009, 203 in 2008)...have 376 strikeouts, which is third most (688 in 2012, 618 in 2009)...a rookie pitcher has started 50 of the A's 140 games (35.7%), including each of the previous four and six of the previous seven...the A's have had at least three rookies in the starting lineup (including the pitcher) in each of the last eight games...have had at least four rookies in the lineup 13 times, including a season-high five three times (Aug. 5, 14 and 21)...14 of the 17 rookies have made their Major League debuts this year, including nine of the 12 pitchers.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list an Oaklandrecord 27 times and those players have combined to miss an Oaklandrecord 1529 games (56.6 games per stint)...currently have 13 players on the DL, including 11 on the 60-day DL...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4 (including a season-high 16 from Aug. 22-28)... prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once... have had at least six players on the DL all year.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's trail in the season series, 5-8...are 1-6 in Oakland and 4-2 in Seattle...have lost 10 of the last 11 games in Oakland but have won six of the last nine in Seattle...did not homer last night, snapping a streak of 22 consecutive games with a home run against the Mariners... that was the longest streak against one team in Oakland history and tied for second longest by any team against another team since 1913...15 of the A's last 24 losses to Seattle have been by one run and 23 of the last 33 have been by two runs or fewer...the A's lost the season series last year for the third consecutive season and fourth time in the last five years...are now 49-59 against the Mariners over the last six years...all-time, the A's are 332-266 against Seattle...that includes 180-120 in Oakland, 151-145 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 75-81 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's are averaging 2 hours and 56 minutes per game, which is the fastest in the majors by two minutes...are one of just three teams averaging under three hours per game (Kansas City and Toronto, 2:58)... *Khris Davis* has seven home runs against Seattle, which match the most in Oakland history against the Mariners (Canseco, 1988; Chavez, 2001; Moss, 2013)...*Ryon Healy* is batting .337 (30-for-89) over his last 23 games after hitting .222 over his first 26 contests...*Ryan Madson* has not allowed a run in his last 12 games (13.2 ip) and is a perfect 7-for-7 in save opportunities over that span...*Marcus Semien* leads American League shortstops and ranks third in the majors with 23 home runs.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1948** Barney McCosky collects seven hits in a doubleheader sweep at Washington...he goes 4-for-4 in a 9-6 win in game one and collects three hits in four at bats in a 3-0 win in the night cap...in **1961** Dick Howser is a perfect 5-for-5 in the A's 13-1 win over Minnesota in the first game of a doubleheader...In **1976** Vida Blue strikes out Danny Thompson of Texas for his 1140th as an Athletic, breaking Catfish Hunter's Oakland record... he would go on to strike out 1315 batters in his A's career which is still an Oakland record.

<u>TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (10-9, 3.81 ERA)</u>

FOR STARTERS: Is 2-1 with a 1.24 ERA (4 er in 29.0 ip) and .176 (18-for-102) opponents batting average over his last three starts...is now 9-3 with a 3.18 ERA (41 er in 116.0 ip) over his last 18 starts after going 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts...has eight wins dating back to June 23, which is tied for fifth most in the American League over that span.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-4 with a 2.64 ERA (23 er in 78.1 ip) in 12 starts at home compared to 5-5 with a 4.89 ERA (46 er in 84.2 ip) in 15 starts on the road...has the third lowest home ERA in the American League...has surrendered six home runs in 78.1 innings at home compared to 15 in 84.2 innings on the road.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for second in the American League in shutouts (1), tied for fourth in complete games (2), tied for fifth in opponents reaching on an error (8) and ranks seventh in fewest pitches per game (91.6).

WALKS AND STRIKEOUTS: Has walked two batters or fewer in 16 of his last 17 starts and has 20 walks in 110.0 innings over that span for an average of 1.64 per nine innings...struck out seven batters in his last start to snap a 21-start streak with five strikeouts or fewer...for the season, is averaging 5.25 strikeouts per nine innings, which is third lowest in the American League...has walked one batter or fewer in 16 of his 27 starts... has issued 32 of his 42 walks to left-handed hitters.

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: Is 5-3 with a 3.03 ERA (23 er in 68.1 ip) in 10 starts since the All-Star Break after going 5-6 with a 4.37 ERA in 17 starts before the break...his five post-break wins surpass Sonny Gray's and Fernando Rodriguez' team leading total of four from last year.

THE FIRST INNING: Has not allowed a run in the first inning since May 24 for a streak of 18 consecutive games without a first inning run...has a 1.33 ERA (4 er in 27.0 ip) in the first inning, 4.30 (65 er in 136.0 ip) after that...has the third lowest ERA in the first inning in the American League (min. 20 ip)

SUPPORT: Has left with the lead in four of his starts only to have the bullpen blow the save (April 12 vs. Los Angeles-AL, June 17 vs. Los Angeles, June 28 vs. San Francisco, July 29 at Cleveland)...is averaging 5.20 (67 rs in 116.0 ip) runs of support over his last 18 starts after receiving an average of 2.30 runs of support over his first nine starts... is 0-6 with two runs of support or fewer, 10-2 with three runs of support or more...is now 1-15 in 22 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 15-3 in 26 starts with three runs of support or more.

THIS AND THAT: Is scheduled to make his 28th start of the season today, which is an on-going career high ... is in his second full season and has career highs in every category except losses (has matched his high in losses)...has walked just six batters to lead off an inning, which is tied for seventh fewest in the American League among pitchers with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title ... went 1-2 with a 7.29 ERA over the first nine games (four starts) of his career through April 25, 2015, 5-2 with a 1.78 ERA over a nine-start stretch from May 23-July 4, 2015, 1-11 with a 5.57 ERA over a 17-start stretch from July 10, 2015-May 24, 2016 and is 9-3 with a 3.18 ERA (41 er in 116.0 ip) over his last 18 starts.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Allowed four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts, joining John Odom (1969) and Mike Norris (1980) as the only pitchers in Oakland history on an Opening Day roster to allow four hits or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of their first three starts...picked up his first win of the season and struck out a career-high eight batters April 20 at New York (AL)...it snapped a career-high six-game losing streak dating back to July 10, 2015...compiled a 5.52 ERA and .276 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned nine starts...then lost each of his next five starts from April 25 to May 19...logged a 7.92 ERA and .361 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which fell one short of his career high of six...snapped his five-game losing streak in a 3-2 win over Minnesota May 30...finished May with a 1-4 record and a 5.87 EA in six starts...tied for second in the American League in May losses...tossed 8.0 innings July 9 at Houston, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer dating back to June 18 of last year...that was the fifth longest such streak in Oakland history...fired his second career complete game in the A's 4-3 win over Tampa Bay on July 23 in Oakland...allowed nine hits, which were the most by an A's pitcher in a complete game since Mark Redman allowed 12 on May 13, 2004 against Detroit...had his career high six-game winning streak come to an end in the A's 5-3 loss at Cleveland July 29...compiled a 3.25 ERA and .264 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 10 starts from May 30 to July 23...went 4-1 with a 2.68 ERA in five starts in July... the wins tied for third in the AL and were his most ever in a month...fired his third career complete game and his first shutout, a two-hitter in the A's 9-0 win at Chicago (AL) Aug. 19...became the ninth Oakland pitcher

since 1987 to toss fewer than 100 pitches in a shutout, the first since Rich Harden on July 14, 2005 against Texas (80)...faced just one batter over the minimum to become the 13th pitcher in Oakland history to face 28 batters or fewer in a nine inning complete game (last: Dallas Braden, May 9, 2010 vs. Tampa Bav).

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 1-0 win over Boston last Sunday in Oakland...tossed 6.1 scoreless innings and a career-high tying 112 pitches...retired the side in order twice and allowed runners into scoring position in three of the innings...Rodriguez shutout the A's on one hit in 8.0 innings but Oakland won the game in the bottom of the ninth off Kimbrel when Valencia walked and scored on a Davis double and a Holt error (E7).

five games, three starts, in his home ballparks...is 1-2 with a 3.80 ERA (10 er in 23.2 ip) in his four starting assignments... is 0-2 with a 5.40 ERA (16.2 ip, 24 h, 10 r, 10 er, 4 bb, 11 so, 2 hr) in three starts this year...the first loss came in a 4-3 decision in Oakland on May 2... yielded a career-high tying 10 hits ... allowed a RBI single to Lind in the fourth and two more runs in the sixth on a Seager RBI double and an Ianetta RBI single...then had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Seattle May 24...tossed just 4.2 innings and allowed two runs...yielded a RBI double to Cano in the first and a RBI single to Cruz in the third...took the loss in a 4-3 decision in Oakland on Aug. 13...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Cruz in the fourth...allowed three more runs in the fifth on a Smith RBI single and a Cano two-run homer.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Raul Alcantara (0-1, 15.00 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville last Monday and took the loss in his Major League debut that day against Los Angeles, a 10-7 decision (3.0 ip, 5 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 0 so)...hit three batters, all in the first inning, to tie the ML record for most hit batters in an inning (30th time, last: Kirby Yates NYY vs. TEX, June 27, 2016)...is the first Athletic to do it...tied the Oakland record for hit batters in a game (10th time, last: Jesse Hahn vs. TEX, June 10, 2015)...the last Athletic to hit three batters in his debut was Bill Knowlton on Sept. 3, 1920...had not pitched above Double-A prior to this year...started the season at Double-A Midland where he went 5-6 with a 4.80 ERA in 17 starts...was moved up to Triple-A Nashville July 21 and was a perfect 4-0 with a 1.18 ERA in eight starts...combined to go 9-6 with a 3.58 ERA in 25 minor league starts overall...walked 30 batters in 135.2 innings (1.99 per nine innings)

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

23-19, 3.94 ERA (211 er in 482.0 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 38-for-56 (67.9%)

- The A's bullpen has allowed 32 runs over its last 10 games (27 er in 39.1 ip, 6.62 ERA) after yielding just two runs over its previous eight games (0.77 ERA).
- Has allowed 58-of-219 (26.5%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the American League (Cleveland, 26.2%) and fourth best in the majors.
- Ranks second in the AL in innings pitched (482.0), fourth in strikeouts (462) and fifth in opponents slugging percentage (.386)...is tied for third in most blown saves (18), fourth in most wild pitches (29) and fifth in lowest save percentage (67.9%).
- First batters faced are 90-for-394 (.228) with 30 walks (.280 on-base percentage)...leads the AL in first batter slugging percentage (.317), ranks third in on-base percentage and fourth in batting average.
