The Mariners have 4 players with 20+ home runs this season (Nelson Cruz -35 HR, Robinson Canó - 32 HR, Kyle Seager - 27 HR and Adam Lind - 20 HR)...marks the 9th season in franchise history to have 4 or more players with 20+ home runs (last: 2013: Raul Ibañez - 29 HR, Kendrys Morales - 23 HR, Kyle Seager - 22 HR & Justin Smoak - 20 HR).

**TODAY'S TILT**...the Mariners continue a 2-city, 6-game road trip with the second of three games vs. Oakland (1-0)...will also play Los Angeles-AL (3 G) on the next leg of the trip...just concluded a 2-team, 7-game homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Texas (3-1)...today's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

**ODDS AND ENDS**...the Mariners are 5-3 in their last 8 games and 5-8 in their last 13 games...are 6-10 in their last 16 games...overall have won 19 of their last 34 games and 21 of their last 38...are 27-22 in their last 49 games, 28-24 in the last 52 games and 37-31 in their last 68 games since snapping a 6-game losing streak...are 45-50 over their last 95 games since May 27 following a 26-12 stretch from April 13-May 25.

- Buenos Diaz since Aug. 1, Edwin Diaz leads the Majors (ahead of Los Angeles NL's Kenley Jansen) in saves with 14...during that time span, Diaz has converted 14 of 15 save opportunities (93.3%) while posting a 13.24 strikeout/9.0 innings ratio (25 K, 17.0 IP).
- Streaking Robinson Canó has reached base safely in 13 straight games (8/27–c), batting .375 (18x48) with 9 runs, 1 double, 3 home runs and 6 RBI during this span.
- Seager Surge Since Aug. 6, Kyle Seager is batting .355 (39x110) with 23 runs, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 7 home runs, 23 RBI, a .438 on-base percentage, a .600 slugging mark and a 1.038 OPS in 30 games.
   Guti, Guti, Guti Franklin Gutierrez is 12-for-his-last-30 (.400) with 5 runs, 2 double, 3 home runs
- and 10 RBI in his last 10 games since Aug. 26.
  Divisional Data Seattle is 28-33 vs. the AL West, 14-17 vs. the AL Central and 18-11 vs. AL East this season... is 13-7 vs. Interleague opponents.

<u>THE .500 CLUB</u>...Nelson Cruz (.583/7x12, HR, 2 RBI), Robinson Canó (.545/6x11, 3 2B, HR, 3 RBI), Seth Smith (.500/6x12, RBI) and Norichika Aoki (.500/4x8, 2B, BB) are all hitting at least .500 against today's Oakland starter Kendall Graveman...Chris lannetta is 3x7 in his career against the right-hander.

**BACKSTOP POP**...**Mike Zunino** hit his 10th home run of the season last night...he hit 22 homers in 2014 and 11 in 2015...he joins **Dan Wilson** (18 in 1996, 15 in 1997 & 10 in 2001) and **Dave Valle** (12 in 1987, 10 in 1988 & 13 in 1993) as the only Mariners catchers to hit double-digit home runs in 3 seasons for the Mariners.

<u>10x9</u>...Mike Zunino hit his 10th home run of the season last night, giving Seattle a club-record tying 9 players with 10+ home runs: Nelson Cruz (35), Robinson Canó (32), Kyle Seager (27), Adam Lind (20), Franklin Gutierrez (14), Dae-Ho Lee (14), Leonys Martin (14), Seth Smith (13) & Zunino (10)...it is the 5th time that Seattle has had 9 players with 10+ home runs (also: 2015, 2013, 1997 & 1988)...no other team this season has as many as 9 players with 10+ homers (5 teams have 8 players).

**BULLPEN BACK ON TRACK**...Seattle's bullpen has not allowed a run in the last 9.1 innings (3 games)... in the last 5 games, the pen has posted a 2.08 ERA (4 ER, 17.1 IP) with 16 strikeouts...in the previous 19 games, the pen posted a 6.16 ERA (42 ER, 61.1 IP) with 59 strikeouts.

KEEP CLIMBING...Kyle Seager has improved his home run output in each of his first 6 seasons (3 in 2011, 20 in 2012, 22 in 2013, 25 in 2014, 26 in 2015 and now 27 in 2016)...he's the first player in the Majors to do so since Matt Kemp (2006-11)...the only other Mariners player to accomplish the feat is **Tino Martinez** (0 in 1990, 4 in 1991, 16 in 1992, 17 in 1993, 20 in 1994 & 31 in 1995).

**FEELS LIKE HOME**...Seattle is 6-1 against the Athletics at the Oakland Coliseum this season...Seattle has won 9 of the last 10 games in Oakland and are 18-6 in the last 24 games here (since May 5, 2014)...if Seattle wins 2 out of 3 this series, the 7-2 (.778) mark will be the 2nd-best single-season winning percentage in Oakland behind the 2007 club (8-1/.889) and ahead of the 2015 club (7-3/.700).

**S(OAK)ING THE A'S...Nelson Cruz** is hitting .392 (20x51) with 6 runs, 2 doubles, 3 home runs, 7 RBI, a .436 on-base mark and a .608 slugging percentage against Oakland...he's reached base safely in 12 of the 13 games this season, including the last 12 straight...in his last 27 games against the A's, he's hitting .374 (40x107) with 18 runs, 4 doubles, 8 home runs and 19 RBI.

**<u>GREEN WITH ENVY</u></u>...Norichika Aoki** is hitting .337 (29x86) with 13 runs, 5 doubles, 1 triple, 1 home run, 9 RBI and a .376 on-base mark in 22 career games against Oakland, including .342 (13x38) in 9 games at the Coliseum...overall, he's hit safely in 20 of 21 games (with an at-bat) against Oakland.

**SIMPLY SILVER SLUGGER**...**Kyle Seager** is among the American League leaders in several offensive categories as a 3rd baseman...among AL 3rd basemen, Seager ranks 2nd in on-base percentage (.373), 5th in hits (151), 3rd in OPS (.900), 3rd in runs (82), T3rd in RBI (90), 3rd in slugging (.526), 4th in extra-base hits (63), 4th in total bases (271), 4th in doubles (33), 5th in batting (.293) and T5th in home runs (27).

**DAE-HO HEATING UP**...**Dae-Ho Lee** is hitting .448 (13x29) with 6 runs, 1 double, 1 home run, 8 RBI & a .500 on-base mark in 8 games since Aug. 30...has 5 multi-hit games in that span and has RBI in 5 of 8 G.

**LEFTY LANDING**...Seattle has 73 home runs against left-handers this season, a club record (previous: 70 in 1997)...the 73 home runs vs. lefties is the T7th-most in the Majors since 2000...during that time span, the White Sox (78 HR in 2004) and Yankees (78 HR in 2012) share the team record.

**INFIELD POP**...**Robinson Canó** (32 HR), **Kyle Seager** (27 HR) and **Adam Lind** (20 HR) have each hit at least 20 home runs this season...the trio of Canó, Seager and Lind are just the third infield trio in club history to post at least 20 home runs in a season...Canó, Seager and Lind join the 1999 trio of Alex Rodriguez (42 HR), David Bell (21 HR) and Russ Davis (21 HR) and the 1997 trio of Paul Sorrento (31 HR), Rodriguez (23 HR) and Davis (20 HR)...(min. 60% of total starts in the infield).

<u>AS YOU KNOW</u>...Felix Hernandez is 11-3 in Oakland...<u>BUT DID YOU KNOW?</u>...that his 11 career wins at Oakland Coliseum rank T2nd all-time by a visiting pitcher?...he's tied with Baltimore's Mike Flanagan... with his next win at Oakland, Felix will tie Tommy John (CWS, NYY & LAA) for most career wins by a visiting player in Oakland...Jamie Moyer ranks T4th with 10 wins (8 with SEA & 2 with BAL)...Randy Johnson ranks T7th with 9 wins as a visitor in Oakland (5 with SEA, 2 with NYY, 1 with ARI & 1 with SFG).

- 21st start of the season today vs. the Athletics. Is the second pitcher in franchise history to record 300 games start-ed as a Mariner (also: Jamie Moyer, 323 GS w/Seattle 1996-2006).
- Signed a 7-year deal through the 2019 season on Feb. 13, 2013. In 2010 won the **AL Cy Young**, garnering 21 of 28 first-place votes.
- joined Randy Johnson (1995) as only Mariners pitcher to win the Cy Young...named Sporting News AL Pitcher of the Year...was 2nd in
- Young...named Sporting News AL Pitcher of the Year...was 2nd in Cy Young voting in 2014. ML debut Aug. 4, 2005 at Detroit...Safeco debut vs. MIN Aug. 9, 2005. At 19 years, 118 days old at debut, was the 3rd-youngest player to de-but in Mariners history & 2nd-youngest pitcher...youngest pitcher since Jose Rijo worked as reliever in '84 (19 years, 54 days (7/6/84 at MIN). Born in Valencia, VZ...signed as 16-year-old non-drafted FA 7/4/02. A.L. All-Star: 2009, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014 (starter) & 2015, most by any Mariner pitcher and 4th most overall behind Ken Griffey Jr. (10), Ichiro Suzuki (10) and Edgar Martinez (7). Threw the first Perfect Game in Mariners history, and 23rd in ML
- Threw the first Perfect Game in Mariners history, and 23rd in ML history, Aug. 15, 2012 in a 1-0 victory over Tampa Bay at Safeco Field (9.0,0,0,0,0,12)...7th PG in MLB history to be decided in a 1-0 game, and 1st in the AL since 1984. Tossed 6.0+ IP in 287 of 354 GS (81.1%)...6.0+ innings in 94 of 116
- starts side 2013 (81.0%), including 80 quality starts (238 career quality starts, Seattle record). Is 22-19 with a 3.32 ERA (137 ER, 371.20 IP) in 56 career GS in September...was 3-1 with a 2.86 ERA (11 ER, 34.2 IP) in 5 GS in September, 2015.
- LAST START ... W#10 in the Mariners 14-1 win vs. TEX, Sept. 5 at Safeco Field ... allowed 5 runs in the 3rd inning and 1 run in the 6th inning, before being lifted with 2 outs in the 6th and the Mariners leading 8-6...overall, allowed 6 runs on 6 hits (2 home runs), while walking 4 and striking out 3...marked the 33rd time in his career to allow 6 ER or more in a start, 3rd this season (last: 6 ER, 8/31 at TEX).
- AN EVEN 10 ... Felix recorded his 10th win of the season on Sept. 5 vs. TEX... has recorded at least 10 wins in 10 of his last 11 seasons, including each of his last 8 seasons...the streak of 8 consecutive seasons with at least 10 wins is currently tied for the 5th-longest active streak in the majors...trails only John Lackey (12), Zack Greinke (9), James Shields (9), and David Price (8), while tied with Clayton Kershaw and Max Scherzer.
- LET THERE BE LIGHT ... dating back to the start of 2014, Felix is 15-6 with a 3.09 ERA (67 ER, 195.1 IP) over his last 30 day game starts...his 15 wins in day games since 2014 are T4thnost in the AL (also: Phil Hughes, Corey Kluber & Collin McHugh).
- WORKING HIS WAY BACK...over last 10 starts since returning from DL on July 20, Felix is 6-1 with a 4.62 ERA (33 ER, 64.1 IP) with 54 strikeouts and 30 walks... has gone at least 6.0 innings in 7 of those 10 starts...has struck out at least 8 batters in 4 of those 10 starts...has held opponents to 2 or fewer runs in 5 of those 10 starts.
- FIRST OFF ... since his return from DL on July 20 (10 GS), Hernandez has a 8.10 ERA in the 1st inning (9 ER, 10.0 IP) compared to 3.92 ERA in innings 2-8 (24 ER, 55.1 IP)...he has allowed exactly 3 runs in the first inning of 3 of his 10 GS since his return 7/20...in his first 11 starts this season prior to his DL stint, he did not allow a 1st inning run.
- SIX UP, SIX DOWN ... Felix struck out 6 consecutive batters Aug. 15 at LAA, beginning with the final out of the 3rd inning through the 2nd out of the 5th inning...6 consecutive strikeouts are T2nd-most in club history (also: Taijuan Walker, Charlie Furbush & Rafael Soriano), trailing Mark Langston (7)...Felix is the first pitcher in club history to accomplish this feat twice...first time in club history that two different pitchers have struck out 6 consecutive batters in the same season (also: Walker, April 25 vs. HOU).
- DON'T WALK ... Felix recorded his 2,200 career strikeout July 26 at PIT ... at that point, Felix had recorded 2,200 strikeouts to just 659 walks... Felix's 659 walks are the 7th-fewest all-time before reaching 2,200 career strikeouts, trailing only Pedro Martinez (501 BB), Curt Schilling (550 BB), Fergie Jenkins (586 BB), Mike Mussina (620 BB), Javier Vazquez (638 BB) and Juan Marichal (657 BB).
- WELCOME BACK ... activated July 20 from 15-day disabled list ... placed on DL on 6/1 (retro to 5/28) with a strained right calf...DL stint included rehab starts with short-A Everett and AAA Tacoma...missed total of 43 games, and Mariners were 17-26.
- MINORS REHAB....starter for short-A Everett on July 10 (vs. Spokane), working 3.2 innings and allowing 3 earned runs on 6 hits (2 BB, 6 SO)...was winning pitcher July 15 with AAA Tacoma (vs. Colorado Springs), tossing 5.2 IP and allowing just a solo HR (5 H, 1 ER, 1 BB, 7 SO) in 4-1 win.
- JUST GET HIM 3...since 2013 when receiving at least 3 runs of support, Felix is 47-2 with a 2.42 ERA (107 ER, 397.1 IP) in 58 starts...by contrast, is 8-28 with a 3.63 ERA (150 ER, 372.0 IP) in 58 starts since 2013 where he received 2 or fewer runs of support...is 129-13 with a 2.81 ERA (383 ER, 1226.2 IP) in 177 career starts with 3 or more runs of support.

HE'S OUR LEADER ... win on May 9 vs. TB was #146 of his career, setting a new club record in wins (Jamie Moyer has 145)...Felix is one of two active pitchers that hold their respective club records for career wins and career strike-

outs, joining Colorado's Jorge De La Rosa STRIKEOUT KING ... struck out the Angels Rafael Ortega in the 1st inning on April 23 for career strikeout #2,163, passing Randy Johnson for the all-time strikeout lead in club history.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER: LHP JAMES PAXTON (4-6, 4.03)

27-year-old left-hander will be making his 17th start of the season tomorrow at Oakland, his 4th start since being activated from the DL on 8/25...L#6 in his last start, a 10-7 Mariners loss vs. Texas on Sept. 6 (4.1,9,6,4,0,8,HR); was just his 2nd start this season of fewer than 5.0 IP....W#4 Aug. 7 vs. LAA (8.1,5,1,0,1,6); left game in 9th inning after being hit on the elbow; placed on the 15-day DL with a left elbow contusion on Aug. 16 (retro. 8/8) and activated on Aug. 24...made 1 rehab start w/AAA Tacoma on Aug. 20 vs. Las Vegas (3.0,2,0,0,1,3)...has tossed 6.0+ innings in 8 of last 15 GS...AAA TACOMA: held opponents to 1 earned run or less in 7 of 10 starts w/Tacoma...overall went 4-3 with a 3.97 ERA (21 ER, 47.2 IP) with 50 strikeouts and 14 walks in 10 AAA starts...won 4 consecutive starts, April 20-May 6, going 4-0 with a 0.74 ERA (2 ER, 24.1 IP)...CAREER: 16-14 with a 3.43 ERA (101 ER, 261.0 IP) in 46 starts in parts of 2013-16 seasons... vs. OAK: is 2-0 with a 2.63 ERA (4 ER, 13.2 IP) with 10 strikeouts and 6 walks in 2 career starts vs. Oakland...will be making 1st start against the Athletics since Sept. 12, 2014 at Safeco Field when he earned the win after allowing 2 runs on 4 hits while striking out 8 and walking 3 over 6.0 innings pitched.
