OAKLAND ATHLETICS (60-81) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (74-68)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's fell to 60-81 (.426) with the loss yesterday and are a season-high tying 21 games under .500 for the third time...with one more loss, the A's will clinch a losing record for the second consecutive season (went 68-94 last year)...have not finished with a losing record in back-to-back seasons since they had three straight from 2007-09...are 7-9 over the last 16 games and 13-26 (.333) over the last 39 contests...the A's 60-81 record is the third worst record in the American League and tied for sixth worst in Oakland history after 141 games...were also 60-81 last year (won game 142)...with a loss today, the A's would have their worst record after 142 games since 1997 (56-86)...are 24 games behind first place Texas in the AL West, which is ½-game short of the season high of 24½ (Sept. 3)...have not been more than 24½ games out of first since finishing the 1997 season 25 games back...remain in fifth place in the West for the 12th consecutive day and have been in fourth place or worse every day since June 3...have spent 119 of 156 days this year in fourth or worst (60 days in fourth, 17 days tied for fourth and 42 days in fifth).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's fell to 33-41 (.446) at home with the loss yesterday and have clinched a losing record at home for the second consecutive season (went 34-47 last year)...this marks the first time the A's have posted a losing record at home in back-to-back seasons since 1996-98 when they did it three straight years...it is just the fourth time it has happened in Oakland history (1977-79 and 1993-94)...have the second worst home record in the American League...are 3-5 on this nine-game homestand against Boston (1-2), Los Angeles-AL (2-1) and Seattle (0-2)...leave following the game today for a seven-game road trip to Kansas City (four games) and Texas (three games)...went 2-4 on the last road trip to St. Louis (2-1) and Houston (0-3) and have lost 14 of their last 18 road games...are 27-40 (.403) on the road.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .198 (89-for-450) with 39 runs scored over the last 14 games (2.79 runs per game)...rank last in the American League in runs scored (548), on-base percentage (.301), slugging percentage (.392) and hit by pitches (32)...are second in the AL in lowest batting average (.245), fewest walks (362), fewest extra base hits (390) and fewest strikeouts (985) and fourth in fewest home runs (145) and fewest stolen bases (45).

PITCHING: In eight games on the homestand, the A's have allowed three runs or fewer four times and 10 runs or more four times...have a 6.38 ERA (51 er in 72.0 ip) and .292 (84-for-288) opponents batting average on the homestand...now have a 4.61 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have not finished the year with an ERA above 4.58 since 1999 (4.69)...have the third highest opponents batting average in the AL (.265) and are tied for the third fewest home runs allowed (164).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-4 with a 6.37 ERA (25 er in 35.1 ip) in eight games on the homestand...are 37-62 with a 4.99 ERA (422 er in 761.2 ip) for the season...rank second in the American League in highest ERA, fewest innings pitched, most losses and fewest wins.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 12 errors in the last 13 games and now have 87 for the season, which is third most in the American League...A's outfielders have five assists in the last five games...now 12 assists over the last 28 contests after tallying 14 assists over the first 113 games.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's lost 14-3 yesterday, their American League leading fifth loss by 10 or more runs this year...are 16-36 (.308) in games decided by four runs or more compared to 44-45 (.494) in games decided by three runs or fewer...the 16 wins by four runs or more are second fewest in the majors (Atlanta, 15) and the winning percentage is the worst in the AL and third worst in the majors...have a season run differential of -130, which is second worst in the AL (Minnesota, -139)...the last time the A's were outscored by more than 62 runs in a season was in 1997 (-182)...are 22-22 (.500) in one-run games and are tied for fourth in the AL in one-run decisions (44).

AGAINST LEFT-HANDERS: The A's have lost 17 of the last 23 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 15-22 (.405) in those games for the season, which is the worst record in the American League behind Seattle (23-32, .418)...it is third worst in the majors.

ROOKIES: The A's have employed a total of 17 rookies this year, including 12 pitchers...have tied the Oakland record for most rookie pitchers in a season (2009, 2012, 2015)...the rookies have a combined 182 games pitched, which is fourth most in Oakland history (319 in 2012, 232 in 2009, 203 in 2008)...have 379 strikeouts, which is third most (688 in 2012, 618 in 2009)...a rookie pitcher has started 50 of the A's 141 games (35.5%), including four of the last five...the A's have had at least three rookies in the starting lineup (including the pitcher) in each of the last nine games...have had at least four rookies in the lineup 13 times, including a season-high five three times (Aug. 5, 14 and 21).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have 30 players on the active roster...have employed 49 players this year, including 27 pitchers...the pitchers used tie the 1915 Philadelphia A's and 1955 Kansas City A's for second most in Athletics history to the record of 30 set last year...have used 14 different starting pitchers, which is second most in the American League (Los Angeles, 15)...it is tied for second most in Oakland history (1977 and 2009) and is two short of the record (16 in 1983)...the A's have made a total of 175 player moves in 160 days dating back to Opening Day.

ELIMINATED: The A's were officially eliminated in the American League West Friday night in game 140...that matched the third earliest elimination from the division race (by game number) in Oakland history...it was the earliest since 1997 when they were also eliminated in game 140...have a tragic number of five to be eliminated from the Wild Card.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list an Oakland-record 27 times and those players have combined to miss an Oakland-record 1542 games (57.1 games per stint)...currently have 13 players on the DL, including 11 on the 60-day DL...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4 (including a season-high 16 from Aug. 22-28)...prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once...have had at least six players on the DL all year.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's trail in the season series, 5-9...have lost each of the previous three season series and with one more loss, will have four straight season series losses to the Mariners for the first time in Oakland history...are 4-2 in Seattle but are 1-7 in Oakland...the A's worst mark against the Mariners in Oakland is 1-8 in 2007...have lost 11 of the last 12 games in Oakland but have won six of the last nine in Seattle...seven of the A's 14 games this year have been decided by one run...did not homer Friday night, snapping a streak of 22 consecutive games with a home run against the Mariners...that was the longest streak against one team in Oakland history and tied for second longest by any team against another team since 1913...have lost the season series in four of the previous five years and are 49-60 (.450) against the Mariners dating back to 2011...the only American League team with a worse record against Seattle over that stretch is Kansas City (19-24, .442)...all-time, the A's are 332-267 against the Mariners...that includes 180-121 in Oakland, 151-145 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 75-81 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis has seven home runs against Seattle, which match the most in Oakland history against the Mariners (Canseco, 1988; Chavez, 2001; Moss, 2013)...**Ryon Healy** is batting .360 (32-for-89) over his last 24 games after hitting .223 over his first 27 contests...**Ryan Madson** has not allowed a run in his last 12 games (13.2 ip) and is a perfect 7-for-7 in save opportunities over that span.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1912** Eddie Collins steals six bases in the A's 9-7 win over Detroit, an American League record that he would match 11 days later...in **1936** Hod Lisenbee ties a major league record by allowing 26 hits in a 17-2 loss to Chicago...in **1970** Vida Blue tosses his first career complete game, a 3-0, one-hit shutout at Kansas City...he would go on to compile 105 complete games and 28 shutouts in an A's uniform, both Oakland career records...in **1976** Mike Torrez tosses his club record third consecutive shutout, a six-hit, 1-0 win at Texas...the streak is part of a string of 38 1/3 consecutive scoreless innings...in **1999** Doug Jones becomes the 11th pitcher in major league history to record 300 saves in the A's 5-4 victory at Tampa Bay...in **2006** Frank Thomas homers in his sixth consecutive game to set an Athletics record for consecutive games with a home run.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Raul Alcantara (0-1, 15.00)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Monday and made his Major League debut that day against Los Angeles...had not pitched above Double-A prior to this year and is the third A's pitcher to make his debut this year without any Triple-A experience entering the season (Mengden, Overton)...became the 48th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut (Cotton became the 49th two days later) and is one of five to do it this year (Manaea, Mengden, Overton, Cotton)...this marks the second time in Oakland history the A's had five pitchers start in their ML debut in one season...the other time was in 1978 (Conroy, Johnson, Minetto, Morgan, Wirth)...is one of seven pitchers to make his first ML start for the A's this year (Neal and Triggs).

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, a 10-7 A's loss to Boston last Monday in Oakland...hit three batters, all in the first inning, to tie the ML record for most hit batters in an inning (30th time, last: Kirby Yates NYY vs. TEX, June 27, 2016)...is the first Athletic to do it...tied the Oakland record for hit batters in a game (10th time, last: Jesse Hahn vs. TEX, June 10, 2015)...the last Athletic to hit three batters in his debut was Bill Knowlton on Sept. 3, 1920...lasted 3.0 innings, which matched the second shortest outing by an Oakland starter in his ML debut...it was the shortest since Marcus Jones pitched 2.1 innings in the day game of a day/night doubleheader at Colorado July 17, 2000...allowed three runs in the first inning on a hit by pitch, walk and sacrifice fly...also surrendered a leadoff home run to Calhoun in the second and a sacrifice fly to Buss in the third.

MINORS: Started the season at Double-A Midland, where he went 5-6 with a 4.80 ERA in 17 starts...was moved up to Triple-A Nashville July 21 and was a perfect 4-0 with a 1.18 ERA in eight starts...his ERA with the Sounds was the lowest in the Pacific Coast League from July 21 through the end of the season...combined to go 9-6 with a 3.58 ERA in 25 minor league starts overall...walked 30 batters in 135.2 innings (1.99 per nine innings), including just three in 45.2 innings with Nashville (0.59 per nine innings)...struck out 105 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.5...surrendered just one home run at Nashville after yielding 11 with Midland.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .266 opponents batting average, including .256 (51-for-199) against left-handed hitters compared to .273 (87-for-319) against right-handed hitters...surrendered 11 of his 12 home runs to right-handed hitters...opponents hit .230 with runners in scoring position, including .176 with Nashville...however, they were 17-for-55 (.309) with RISP and two outs.

THIS AND THAT: Allowed two runs or fewer in 17 of his 25 starts, including all eight with Nashville...had four starts with no runs and four with one run...walked two batters or fewer 21 times, including all eight with Nashville...his teams were 17-8 (.680) in his starting assignments, including 7-1 (.875) with Nashville...surrendered 20 of his 52 runs with Midland in the first inning (10.59 ERA)...did not allow a first inning run with Nashville (8.0 ip).

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Struck out a season-high nine batters in his first start of the season April 8 at Arkansas but took the loss after allowing two runs in 5.0 innings in a 2-0 decision...issued a season-high four walks April 19 against Northwest Arkansas...surrendered a season-high seven runs in a season-low 2.0 innings April 25 at Corpus Christi but ended up with a no decision in a game the RockHounds would win 8-7 in 14 innings...picked up his first win of the season in his next start April 30 against San Antonio to start a three-game winning streak (1.02 ERA)...finished April 1-1 with a 7.06 ERA in five starts...then went 3-2 with a 2.35 ERA in the month of May...tossed 6.0 no-hit innings May 5 against Corpus Christi and issued just one walk...was relieved by Bracewell to start the seventh inning after throwing 88 pitches...Bracewell allowed two hits in the RockHounds 13-0 win...yielded a season-high 11 hits in 6.0 innings in a 9-1 loss at Springfield May 26...then allowed eight hits in his next start, also against Springfield, on June 2 but allowed just one run in a season-high 7.2 innings for the win...allowed 10 runs in 8.2 innings over two losses on June 13 and 18 and was placed on the disabled list June 19 with a strained right shoulder...was reinstated July 4 and went 0-1 with a 5.17 ERA over his final three starts

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Was originally signed by the Boston organization July 2, 2009 out of the Dominican Republic and spent two years in the Red Sox farm system before he was dealt to the A's with Josh Reddick and Miles Head for Andrew Bailey and Ryan Sweeney, Dec. 28, 2011...is 35-32 with a 3.52 ERA (230 er in 588.2 ip) in 123 games, including 113 starts, in seven seasons as a professional...has issued just 125 walks in 588.2 innings, an average of 1.91 per nine innings...had "Tommy John" surgery on May 14, 2014.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Ross Detwiler (1-3, 5.15 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville Aug. 10 and is 1-3 with a 5.06 ERA in six games, including five starts, with Oakland...tossed 8.0 shutout innings for the win in his first start, went 0-3 with a 9.00 ERA over his next three starts, and is 0-0 with a 3.60 ERA over his last two games...is 1-3 with a 4.66 ERA in five starts compared to 0-0 with a 7.04 ERA in eight relief appearances...pitched in relief in his last appearance last Monday against Los Angeles (3.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 2 so)...his last start came on Aug. 31 at Houston, a no decision in a 4-3 A's loss (7.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 7 so)...was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance against Kansas City, a start at Texas last year on May 14 in a 6-3 loss (5.0 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...combined for a 6-4 record and a 4.40 ERA in 16 games, including 15 starts, with Triple-A Columbus in the Indians organization and Triple-A Nashville with the A's.

- The A's bullpen has allowed 38 runs over its last 11 games (33 er in 43.1 ip, 6.85 ERA) after yielding just two runs over its previous eight games (0.77 ERA)...has a 4.02 ERA (217 er in 486.0 ip) for the season, which ranks fifth highest in the American League.
- Has allowed 61-of-223 (27.4%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the AL (Cleveland, 25.5%) and fourth best in the majors.
- Ranks second in the AL in innings pitched (486.0), fourth in strikeouts (467) and fifth in opponents slugging percentage (.387)...is tied for third in most blown saves (18), fourth in most wild pitches (29) and fifth in lowest save percentage (67.9%).
- First batters faced are 90-for-395 (.228) with 31 walks (.281 on-base percentage)...leads the AL in first batter slugging percentage (.316), ranks third in on-base percentage and fourth in batting average.
