Norichika Aoki is hitting .352 (32x91) with 16 runs, 7 doubles, 1 triple, 1 home run, 11 RBI and a .394 on-base mark in 23 career games against Oakland, including .372 (16x43) in 10 games at the Coliseum...overall, he's hit safely in 21 of 22 games (with at-bat) against Oakland.

Mike Zunino has posted an .869 OPS (5 2B, 10 HR) in 39 games this season.

TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 2-city, 6-game road trip with the final of three games vs. Oakland (2-0)...will also play Los Angeles-AL (3 G) on the next leg of the trip...just concluded a 2-team, 7-game homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Texas (3-1)...today's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **770 KTTH** and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners are 6-3 in their last 9 games and 6-8 in their last 14 games...are 7-10 in their last 17 games...overall have won 20 of their last 35 games and 22 of their last 39...are 28-22 in their last 50 games, 29-24 in the last 53 games and 38-31 in their last 69 games since snapping a 6-game losing streak...are 46-50 over their last 96 games since May 27 following a 26-12 stretch from April 13-May 25.

- **Buenos Diaz** - since Aug. 1, **Edwin Diaz** leads the Majors (ahead of Los Angeles - NL's Kenley Jansen) in saves with 14...during that time span, Diaz has converted 14 of 15 save opportunities (93.3%) while posting a 13.24 strikeout/9.0 innings ratio (25 K, 17.0 IP).
- **Streaking** - **Robinson Canó** has reached base safely in 14 straight games (8/27-c), batting .353 (18x51) with 10 runs, 1 double, 3 home runs and 6 RBI during this span.
- **Seager Surge** - Since Aug. 6, **Kyle Seager** is batting .357 (41x115) with 24 runs, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 8 home runs, 25 RBI, a .436 on-base percentage, a .617 slugging mark and a 1.053 OPS in 31 games.
- **Guti, Guti, Guti** - **Franklin Gutierrez** is 12-for-his-last-30 (.400) with 5 runs, 2 double, 3 home runs and 10 RBI in his last 10 games since Aug. 26.
- **Divisional Data** - Seattle is 29-33 vs. the AL West, 14-17 vs. the AL Central and 18-11 vs. AL East this season...is 13-7 vs. Interleague opponents.

HOW SWEEP IT IS...Seattle is looking to sweep the A's on the road for the 2nd time this year (also: May 2-4)...if completed, it would be the first time in club history to sweep the A's on the road twice in a single year...the last time the Mariners swept two road series against a single opponent was 1984 against Texas...it would be 7th sweep of season of 3+ games: May 2-4 vs. Oakland, May 5-11 vs. Tampa Bay, May 20-22 vs. Cincinnati, June 30-July 3 vs. Baltimore (4), Aug. 5-7 vs. Los Angeles-AL & Aug. 8-10 vs. Detroit.

MINI STREAKING...Seattle has won 4 straight games and is looking to win at least 5 in a row for the second time this season...won a season-best 6 straight from Aug. 5-10.

A-OKAY...**Norichika Aoki** is hitting .352 (32x91) with 16 runs, 7 doubles, 1 triple, 1 home run and 11 RBI in his career against the A's...his .352 batting average against Oakland is the 2nd-best (min. 100 PA) among active players behind Detroit's Victor Martinez (.356/101x284).

A.L. WEST TURNAROUND...Seattle has won 4 straight games against the American League West and are 13-9 against the division since the start of August...began the season 16-24 in the first 40 games against the A.L. West, including a 4-15 stretch from May 8-July 17...overall, Seattle is 29-33 against the West.

SAVE IT...**Edwin Diaz** has 14 saves on this season...with one more save this year, he'll be the 5th rookie in club history with 15+ saves in a season...he joins **Kazuhiro Sasaki** (37 in 2000), **Danny Farquhar** (16 in 2013), **Enrique Romo** (16 in 1977) and **Mike Schooler** (15 in 1988).

FEELS LIKE HOME...Seattle is 7-1 against the Athletics at the Oakland Coliseum this season...Seattle has won 10 of the last 11 games in Oakland and are 19-6 in the last 25 games here (since May 5, 2014)...if Seattle wins 2 out of 3 this series, the 7-2 (.778) mark will be the 2nd-best single-season winning percentage in Oakland behind the 2007 club (8-1/.889) and ahead of the 2015 club (7-3/.700).

SOAKING THE A'S...**Nelson Cruz** is hitting .418 (23x55) with 8 runs, 4 doubles, 3 home runs, 10 RBI, a .450 on-base mark and a .655 slugging percentage against Oakland this season...he's reached base safely in 13 of the 14 games this season, including the last 13 straight...in his last 28 games against the A's, he's hitting .384 (43x112) with 20 runs, 6 doubles, 8 home runs and 20 RBI.

BACKSTOP POP...**Mike Zunino** hit his 10th home run of the season on Friday...he hit 22 homers in 2014 and 11 in 2015...he joins **Dan Wilson** (18 in 1996, 15 in 1997 & 10 in 2001) and **Dave Valle** (12 in 1987, 10 in 1988 & 13 in 1993) as the only Mariners catchers to hit double-digit home runs in 3 seasons for the Mariners.

10x9...**Mike Zunino** hit his 10th home run of the season last night, giving Seattle a club-record tying 9 players with 10+ home runs: **Nelson Cruz** (35), **Robinson Canó** (32), **Kyle Seager** (28), **Adam Lind** (20), **Franklin Gutierrez** (14), **Dae-Ho Lee** (14), **Leonys Martin** (14), **Seth Smith** (13) & Zunino (10)...it is the 5th time that Seattle has had 9 players with 10+ home runs (also: 2015, 2013, 1997 & 1988)...no other team this season has as many as 9 players with 10+ homers (5 teams have 8 players).

KEEP CLIMBING...**Kyle Seager** has improved his home run output in each of his first 6 seasons (3 in 2011, 20 in 2012, 22 in 2013, 25 in 2014, 26 in 2015 and now 28 in 2016)...he's the first player in the Majors to do so since Matt Kemp (2006-11)...the only other Mariners player to accomplish the feat is **Tino Martinez** (0 in 1990, 4 in 1991, 16 in 1992, 17 in 1993, 20 in 1994 & 31 in 1995).

SIMPLY SILVER SLUGGER...**Kyle Seager** is among the American League leaders in several offensive categories as a 3rd baseman...among AL 3rd basemen, Seager ranks 2nd in on-base percentage (.374), T3rd in hits (153), 3rd in OPS (.904), 3rd in runs (83), T2nd in RBI (92), 3rd in slugging (.531), 4th in extra-base hits (64), 4th in total bases (276), 4th in doubles (33), 5th in batting (.294) and 5th in home runs (28).

DAE-HO HEATING UP...**Dae-Ho Lee** is hitting .448 (13x29) with 6 runs, 1 double, 1 home run, 8 RBI & a .500 on-base mark in 8 games since Aug. 30...has 5 multi-hit games in that span and has RBI in 5 of 8 G.

LEFTY LANDING...Seattle has 73 home runs against left-handers this season, a club record (previous: 70 in 1997)...the 73 home runs vs. lefties is the T7th-most in the Majors since 2000...during that time span, the White Sox (78 HR in 2004) and Yankees (78 HR in 2012) share the team record.

YOU MAY KNOW...that yesterday, for the 4th time this season, both **Kyle Seager** (28) and brother **Corey Seager** (25) homered on the same day...**BUT DID YOU KNOW**...that Kyle and Corey are the first set of brothers to each hit 25+ home runs in the same season?...the Seager's have combined for 53 homers...the last set of brothers to combine for 50+ homers were Melvin Upton Jr. (23) & Justin Upton (31) in 2011.

ABOUT PAXTON...

- 27-year-old left-hander is making his 17th start of the season, his 47th career MLB start, and his 3rd career start vs. OAK today.
- Selected by Seattle in the 4th round of the 2010 MLB June Draft.
- Native of Ladner, BC...attended Delta Secondary School.
- Pitched for the University of Kentucky, 2007-09...was 11-5, 4.91 ERA (81 ER, 148.1 IP) and 168 K's in 55 G/24 GS.
- Originally selected by Toronto in the Supplemental 1st round (39th overall) in the 2009 MLB June Draft, but did not sign.
- Went 1-2 with a 4.08 ERA (8 ER, 17.2 IP) in 4 starts with Grand Prairie in the Independent League in 2010.
- Holds a career record of 27-24 with a 3.60 ERA (167 ER, 417.1 IP) in 84 career MiLB games/82 starts from 2011-16.
- Pitched for the World squad in the 2011 MLB Futures game... named to Midwest League All-Star team in 2011.
- Is 5-5 with a 3.77 ERA (30 ER, 71.2 IP) in 14 career starts in Sept.

LAST OUTING...L#6 vs. TEX at Safeco Field Sept. 6...allowed 6 R (4 ER) on 6 hits, while striking out 8 and not issuing a walk over 4.1 IP...lifted in 5th inning with 1 out after allowing a 2-run home run to Jonathan Lucroy, with the Mariners trailing 4-6.

SUCCESS VS. THE WEST...in 18 career starts vs. the American League Western Division, Paxton is 6-5 with a 3.38 ERA (40 ER, 106.2 IP) with 91 strikeouts and 32 walks...dating back to April 30, 2015, Paxton is 1-2 with a 3.61 ERA (19 ER, 47.1 IP) in 87 starts against the West during that time span...in 18 career starts vs. the West, has posted 11 quality starts.

4 K'S IN ONE INNING...struck out four Rangers batters in the first inning on Sept. 6 vs. Texas, becoming the 4th pitcher in club history to record 4 strikeouts in 1 inning (also: Felix Hernandez - 2010, Kazuhiro Sasaki - 2003 & Matt Young - 1990).

THROWIN' STRIKES...has walked 2 or less in 15 of 16 GS this season, while striking out 5 or more in 12 of 16 GS...overall, has a 4.50 SO/BB ratio (90 K, 20 BB) and an 8.44 K/9.0 IP ratio (90 K, 96.0 IP).

LIMITING DAMAGE...has allowed 3 earned runs or less in 11 of his 16 starts this season...has left the game with the lead in 5 of his last 10 games.

'K' ZONE...since being recalled from AAA Tacoma on June 1, Paxton leads all Mariners pitchers with 90 strikeouts, ranking ahead of Hisashi Iwakuma (77 K), Edwin Diaz (74 K), Felix Hernandez (56 K) and Nathan Karns (44 K)...has struck out at least 5 batters in 12 starts this season...equaled a career-high with 10 strikeouts on June 6 vs. Cleveland (also: 9/24/13 vs. KC).

STRIKEOUT RATES INCREASING...is striking out 8.44 batters per 9.0 innings (90 K, 96.0 IP), the highest rate of his career (7.88 in 2013, 7.18 in 2014 & 7.52 in 2015)...his 4.50 K/BB rate (90 K, 20 BB) is also the best of his career (3.00 in 2013, 2.03 in 2014 & 1.93 in 2015).

INJURY & REHAB...placed on 15-day disabled list Aug. 16 (retro Aug. 8) with a left elbow contusion...made 1 rehabilitation start on Aug. 20 with AAA Tacoma vs. Las Vegas...left after 3.0 IP with a 2-0 lead for a no-decision: 3.0 IP, 2 H, 0 R, 0 ER, 1 BB, 3 SO...53 pitches, 37 strikes.

RACKING 'EM UP...struck out 41 batters in the month of June, most on the Mariners club (Karns-33) and 7th-most in the American League (also: David Price-BOS).

NO HITS FOR YOU...over his last 25 Major League starts, dating back to April 30, 2015, Paxton has limited opponents to a .243 average (34x140) with RISP, including not allowing a hit with RISP in 11 of 25 starts during this span...in his career Paxton has limited opponents to a .229 (53x231) average with RISP, but has allowed a .311 (33x106) opponent average with RISP in 2016.

REVERSE SPLITS...in his career has limited right-handed batters to a .244 (201x824, 18 HR), while lefties are batting .296 (55x186, 3 HR)...since 2015, right-handed batters are hitting .265 (140x528, 13 HR) while lefties are hitting .325 (41x126, 3 HR)...despite high batting average against by lefties, has allowed just 3 career HRs vs. LH batters (211 BF)...allowed first career home run to a left-handed batter on May 28, 2015 as Brandon Moss (CLE) took him deep.

WINNING STREAK...became the first Mariners pitcher to open MLB career with 6-game winning streak (all games being starts)...previous: 3-0, by Freddy Garcia in 1999...only relief pitcher Eric O'Flaherty (7-game win streak) recorded a longer streak to begin his Mariners career.

A WIN TO REMEMBER...became the 12th Mariners pitcher to record a win in first ML start as a Mariner...the other 11 Mariners to start and win in their ML debut include: Bob Stoddard (9/4/81 at BOS), Matt Young (4/6/83 vs. NYY), Mark Langston (4/7/84 vs. MIL), Pat Rice (5/18/91 at NYY), Bob Wolcott (8/18/95 vs. BOS), Freddy Garcia (4/7/99 vs. CWS), Joel Pineiro (8/8/2000-G1 at CWS), Travis Blackley (7/1/04 vs. TEX), Blake Beavan (7/3/11 vs. SD), Anthony Vasquez (8/23/11 vs. CLE-G2) and Taijuan Walker (8/30/13 at HOU).
