OAKLAND ATHLETICS (60-82) VS. KANSAS CITY (74-68)

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 12, 2016 — KAUFFMAN STADIUM — 6:15 P.M. CDT LHP ROSS DETWILER (1-3, 5.15) VS. RHP DILLON GEE (6-7, 4.34) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's lost their 82nd game of the season yesterday to clinch a losing record for the second consecutive season (went 68-94) last year...it marks the first time the A's have finished with a losing record in back-to-back seasons since they had three straight from 2007-09...have lost three straight and nine of the last 12 games and are 13-27 (.325) over the last 40 contests...are a season-high 22 games under .500 at 60-82 (.423)...that is tied for the second worst record in the American League and is sixth worst in Oakland history after 142 games...it is the worst since the 1997 club started the year 56-86 (won game 143)...are 24 games behind first place Texas in the AL West, which is ½-game short of the season high of 24½ (Sept. 3)...have not been more than 24½ games out of first since finishing the 1997 season 25 games back...remain in fifth place in the West for the 13th consecutive day and have been in fourth place or worse every day since June 3...have spent 120 of 157 days this year in fourth or worst (60 days in fourth, 17 days tied for fourth and 43 days in fifth)

ROOKIES: The A's have employed a total of 17 rookies this year, including 12 pitchers...the addition of Nuñez and Olson today will bring the total to 19, which will tie the 2012 and 2015 A's for second most in Oakland history (21 in 2008)...have already tied the Oakland record for most rookie pitchers in a season (2009, 2012, 2015)...Nuñez and Olson will be the 15th and 16th players to make their Major League debuts this year...that includes nine of the 12 pitchers...the rookies have a combined 184 games pitched, which is fourth most in Oakland history (319 in 2012, 232 in 2009, 203 in 2008)...have 383 strikeouts, which is third most (688 in 2012, 618 in 2009)...a rookie pitcher has started 51 of the A's 142 games (35.9%), including five of the last six...the A's have had at least three rookies in the starting lineup (including the pitcher) in each of the last 10 games...have had at least four rookies in the lineup 14 times, including a season-high five three times (Aug. 5, 14 and 21).

ROSTER NOTES: With the addition of Nuñez and Olson today, the A's now have 32 players on the active roster...they will become the 50th and 51st players to appear in a game for the A's, which will tie for third most in Oakland history (used 52 last year and 54 in 2007)...have employed 27 pitchers, which ties the 1915 Philadelphia A's and 1955 Kansas City A's for second most in Athletics history to the record of 30 set last year...the 32 active players were born in eight different countries...that includes 24 in the United States, two in the Dominican Republic and one each from Australia, Canada, Cuba, Germany, Venezuela and the Virgin Islands... the A's have made a total of 177 player moves in 161 days dating back to Opening Day.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 27-40 (.403) on the road...with one more loss, Oakland will clinch a losing record on the road for the third consecutive season (40-41 in 2014, 34-47 in 2015) and eighth time in the last 10 years...begin a seven-game road trip to Kansas City (four games) and Texas (three games) tonight...went 2-4 on the last road trip to St. Louis (2-1) and Houston (0-3) and have lost 14 of their last 18 road games...went 3-6 on the last homestand against Boston (1-2), Los Angeles-AL (2-1) and Seattle (0-3) and are 33-42 (.440) at home...that is the second worst home record in the American League...will finish with a losing record at home in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1996-98 when they did it three straight years (went 34-47 last year)...it is just the fourth time it has happened in Oakland history (1977-79 and 1993-94).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .200 (96-for-479) with 41 runs scored over the last 15 games (2.73 runs per game)...have scored 550 runs for the season, which is second fewest in the majors (Philadelphia, 520)...are averaging 3.87 runs per game and have not averaged fewer than 3.98 runs per game since 1979 (3.54)...have a .301 on-base percentage, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...the Oakland record for lowest on-base percentage is .302 in 1979...have 365 walks, which is second fewest in the AL to Kansas City (346)...are on pace for 416 walks, which would break the Athletics record for fewest walks in a 162-game season (421 in 1966)...have the lowest slugging percentage (.391) and fewest hit by pitches (32) in the AL, rank second in lowest batting average (.245), fewest extra base hits (391) and fewest strikeouts (991), third in fewest home runs (145) and tied for third in fewest stolen bases (45).

PITCHING: In nine games on the last homestand, the A's allowed three runs or fewer five times and 10 runs or more four times...posted a 6.00

ERA (54 er in 81.0 ip) and .296 (96-for-324) opponents batting average on the homestand...now have a 4.60 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have not finished the year with an ERA above 4.58 since 1999 (4.69)...have the third highest opponents batting average in the AL (.265) and the fourth fewest home runs allowed (165).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers went 1-4 with a 5.93 ERA (27 er in 41.0 ip) in nine games on the homestand...are 37-62 with a 4.97 ERA (424 er in 767.1 ip) for the season...have the fewest innings pitched in the American League and rank second in highest ERA, most losses and fewest wins.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 13 errors in the last 14 games and now have 88 for the season, which is tied for second most in the American League...A's outfielders have five assists in the last six games...now 12 assists over the last 29 contests after tallying 14 over the first 113 games.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's fell to 22-23 (.489) in one-run games with the loss yesterday...ranks fourth in the American League in one-run losses and one-run games (45)...are 44-46 (.489) in games decided by three runs or fewer compared to 16-36 (.308) in games decided by four runs or more... the 16 wins by four runs or more are second fewest in the majors (Atlanta, 15) and the winning percentage is the worst in the AL and third worst in the majors...have a season run differential of -131, which is second worst in the AL (Minnesota, -145)...the last time the A's were outscored by more than 62 runs in a season was in 1997 (-182).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are averaging 2 hours and 56 minutes per game, which is the fastest in the majors by two minutes...are one of just three teams averaging under three hours per game (Kansas City and Toronto, 2:58)...have lost 18 of the last 24 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 15-23 (.395) in those games for the season, which is the worst record in the American League...were officially eliminated in the AL West Friday night in game 140...that matched the third earliest elimination from the division race (by game number) in Oakland history...it was the earliest since 1997 when they were also eliminated in game 140... have a tragic number of three to be eliminated from the Wild Card.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list an Oakland-record 27 times and those players have combined to miss an Oakland-record 1555 games (57.6 games per stint)...currently have 13 players on the DL, including 11 on the 60-day DL...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4 (including a season-high 16 from Aug. 22-28)... prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once... have had at least six players on the DL all year.

A's vs. ROYALS: The A's lead the season series 2-1 after taking two of three in Oakland in April...that marked the first time the A's won a series from the Royals since July 5-7, 2013, when they won two of three at Kansas City...lost the season series last year, 1-5...that was the A's worst mark ever against the Royals...have lost each of the previous two season series and three of the previous four...are 14-17 against Kansas City over the last five years...all-time, the A's are 310-260 against the Royals...that breaks down to 171-115 in Oakland and 139-145 in Kansas City.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis is tied for fifth in the American League with 35 home runs, which are the most by an Athletic since 2006 when Frank Thomas had 39 and Nick Swisher had 35...Ryon Healy is batting .355 (33-for-93) over his last 25 games after hitting .223 over his first 27 contests...is tied for second among AL rookie in home runs since the All-Star Break (8) and ranks fourth in RBI (22)...Marcus Semien leads AL shortstops and ranks third in the majors with 23 home runs.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1964 Bob Meyer tosses a one-hitter but the A's lose to Baltimore 1-0 as the Orioles Frank Bertaina also tosses a one-hitter...in 1980 Rick Langford pitches his club record 22nd consecutive complete game in the A's 9-5 win against Kansas City...he would go on to pitch an Oakland record 28 complete games...in 1986 Terry Steinbach homers in his first major league at bat off the Indians Greg Swindell at Cleveland Stadium...he would also homer in his last at bat as an Oakland Athletic.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Ross Detwiler (1-3, 5.15 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville Aug. 10 and is 1-3 with a 5.06 ERA (18 er in 32.0 ip) in six games, including five starts, with Oakland...tossed 8.0 shutout innings for the win in his first start, went 0-3 with a 9.00 ERA over his next three starts, and is 0-0 with a 3.60 ERA (4 er in 10.0 ip) over his last two games...was a non-roster invitee with Cleveland this spring and made the Indians Opening Day roster...logged a 5.79 ERA in seven relief appearances before he was designated for assignment April 29...was outrighted to Triple-A Columbus May 1 and traded to the A's organization in a minor league deal for cash considerations on July 17.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 1-3 with a 4.66 ERA (15 er in 29.0 ip) in his five starts compared to 0-0 with a 7.04 ERA (6 er in 7.2 ip) in eight relief appearances...made 69 starts with Washington from 2009-13 but has just 12 since then, including seven with Texas last year and five with the A's this year...has made 186 career appearances with Washington (2007, 09-14), Texas (2015), Atlanta (2015), Cleveland (2016) and Oakland (2016)...is 18-37 with a 4.29 ERA (209 er in 439.1 ip) in his 81 career starts and 4-3 with a 4.16 ERA (59 er in 127.2 ip) in 105 career relief appearances.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 1-3 with a 6.29 ERA (17 er in 24.1 ip) and .314 (32-for-102) opponents batting average in eight games at night compared to 0-0 with a 2.92 ERA (4 er in 12.1 ip) and .186 (8-for-43) opponents batting average in five games during the day...has allowed all four of his home runs at night.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has surrendered all four of his home runs and issued 12 of his 14 walks to right-handed hitters...three of his home runs have come over his first 15 pitches in a game...has allowed a .232 (19-for-82) batting average with the bases empty compared to .333 (21-for-63) with three of his four home runs with runners on base...opponents are batting .351 (13-for-37) with runners in scoring position.

WITH CLEVELAND: Opponents were 3-for-16 (.188) with Cleveland but he issued four walks in 4.2 innings for a .333 on-base percentage...all three of the hits were for extra bases (two doubles, one home run) for a .500 slugging percentage...allowed 1-of-4 (25.0%) inherited runners to score...first batters faced were 2-for-6 (.333) with a walk...tossed fewer than one inning in six of his seven appearances and his season high was 1.0 on April 17 against New York (NL).

FIRST START: Combined with Axford on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win over Baltimore on August 10 in Oakland...tossed a career-high eight innings and allowed six of the hits...matched his career high with 108 pitches...did not walk a batter...is the third pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least 8.0 scoreless innings in his A's debut (Mike Norris, 9.0 on April 10, 1975 and Tommy Milone, 8.0 on April 9, 2012)...allowed four base runners to advance into scoring position but retired each of the final 12 batters that he faced...it was his first win as a starter since May 10, 2013 against Chicago (NL)

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-2 loss at Texas on August 15...the A's scored single runs in each of the first two innings and he blanked the Rangers on two hits and two walks over the first three innings...then allowed a RBI single to Andrus in the fourth and a grand slam to Beltre in the fifth for the loss.

THIRD START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-2 loss at Chicago (AL) August 20...allowed a solo home run to Abreu in the first, RBI singles to Sanchez and Anderson in the second, two runs in the third highlighted by a Cabrera RBI double and one more run in the fourth on a Cabrera RBI single...left after four innings trailing 6-0.

FOURTH START: He lost his third consecutive start in the A's 3-1 loss at St. Louis August 26...allowed a two-run home run to Gyorko in the bottom of the first but the A's came back with a run in the second inning...that would be the A's only run of the game...was relieved by Dull with one out and runners on first and third in the sixth inning...Dull allowed one of the runs to score.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss at Houston Aug. 31...struck out a career-high tying seven batters...retired nine of the 10 batters he faced over the first three innings...had a 3-0 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Correa in the fourth...then retired nine of the batters he faced over his final three innings, including each of the last seven... was relieved by Hendriks to start the eighth with the A's leading 3-1 and Hendriks allowed three runs for the blown save and loss.

LAST APPEARANCE: He relieved Raul Alcantara in the A's 10-7 loss to Los Angeles (AL) a week ago today in Oakland...entered the game at the start of the fourth inning with the A's trailing 4-2...allowed three runs in the fourth on a two-run double by Pujols and a RBI single by Marte...then re-

tired eight of the final 10 batters he faced...his 3.0 innings pitched were his most as a reliever since June 28, 2014 (3.0 at Chicago-NL).

MINORS: Went 2-4 with a 4.60 ERA in 12 starts with Triple-A Columbus in the Indians farm system...was assigned to Triple-A Nashville following his July 17 trade and went 4-0 with a 3.86 ERA in four games, including three starts, with the Sounds...combined for a 6-4 record and a 4.40 ERA in 16 games, 15 starts, overall at Triple-A...issued 21 walks in 62.2 innings with the Clippers (3.02 per nine innings) but then walked just four batters in 23.1 innings with the Sounds (1.54 per nine innings)...allowed a .256 opponents batting average, including .252 (58-for-230) against right-handed hitters compared to .265 (26-for-98) against left-handed hitters... surrendered nine of his 10 home runs to righties...nine were solo shots... opponents batted .229 with the bases empty compared to .301 with runers on base...allowed a .357 average with runners in scoring position with Columbus, .118 with Nashville...went 0-4 with a 5.84 ERA over his first eight starts through June 11...finished the Triple-A portion of his campaign by going 6-0 with a 3.31 ERA over his final eight games, seven starts.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jharel Cotton (1-0, 1.42 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville last Wednesday and made his Major League debut that day with a win in the A's 4-1 victory over Los Angeles-AL (6.1 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 3 so)... became the 16th pitcher in Oakland history to win his ML debut, the second this year (Overton)...became the first Athletics pitcher with more than six innings and two hits or fewer in his debut since Porter Vaughan on June 16, 1940 (7.0 ip, 2 h)...began the season at Triple-A Oklahoma City in the Dodgers organization and went 8-5 with a 4.90 ERA in 22 games, including 16 starts...was one of three players traded to the A's on Aug. 1 in exchange for Rich Hill and Josh Reddick...was assigned to Nashville where he went 3-1 with a 2.82 ERA in six starts...combined for an 11-6 record and a 4.31 ERA in 28 games, 22 starts...led the PCL and tied for 12th in all of minor league baseball with a career-high 155 strikeouts.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

23-20, 4.01 ERA (218 er in 489.1 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 38-for-56 (67.9%)

- The A's bullpen has allowed 39 runs over its last 12 games (34 er in 46.2 ip, 6.56 ERA) after yielding just two runs over its previous eight games (0.77 ERA).
- Has allowed 61-of-226 (27.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the American League (Cleveland, 25.5%) and fourth best in the majors.
- Ranks second in the AL in innings pitched (489.1), fourth in strikeouts (468) and fifth in opponents slugging percentage (.387)...is tied for third in most blown saves (18), fourth in most wild pitches (29) and fifth in lowest save percentage (67.9%).
- First batters faced are 91-for-399 (.228) with 31 walks (.281 on-base percentage)...leads the AL in first batter slugging percentage (.318), ranks third in on-base percentage and fourth in batting average.

- Has not allowed an earned run in 14 of his last 16 games for a 2.76 ERA (5 er in 16.1 ip)...however, has a 5.87 ERA (20 er in 30.2 ip) over his last 34 games (since June 15) after logging a 2.70 ERA over his first
