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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (62-82) VS. KANSAS CITY (74-70)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight after losing three in a row and are now 5-4 over the last nine games...however, are 15-27 (.357) over the last 42 contests and 62-82 (.431) overall, which is the third worst record in the American League...it is seventh worst in Oakland history after 144 games and is the worst since last year's club was 61-83 (won game 145)...have clinched a losing record for the second consecutive season (went 68-94 last year)...this is the first time the A's have finished with a losing record in back-to-back seasons since they had three straight from 2007-09...are 24 games behind first place Texas in the AL West, which is ½-game short of the season high of 24½ (Sept. 3)...have not been more than 24½ games out of first since finishing the 1997 season 25 games back...remain in fifth place in the West for the 15th consecutive day and have been in fourth place or worse every day since June 3...have spent 122 of 159 days this year in fourth or worst (60 days in fourth, 17 days tied for fourth and 45 days in fifth).

CLOSE CALLS AND SCORING MARGIN: Last night, the A's won for the 10th time when trailing after seven innings...that is second most in the American League (Texas, 11) and tied for third most in Oakland history (13 in 2014, 12 in 1969)...improved to 23-23 (.500) in one-run games and rank fourth in the AL in one-run games (46)...are 45-46 (.495) in games decided by three runs or fewer compared to 17-36 (.321) in games decided by four or more runs...the 17 wins by four runs or more are second fewest in the majors (Atlanta, 16) and the winning percentage is the worst in the American League and third worst in the majors...have a run differential of -117, which is second worst in the AL (Minnesota, -140)...the last time the A's were outscored by more than 62 runs in a season was in 1997 (-182).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 29-40 (.421) on the road...with one more loss, Oakland will clinch a losing record on the road for the third consecutive season (40-41 in 2014, 34-47 in 2015) and eighth time in the last 10 years...are 2-0 on this seven-game road trip to Kansas City (2-0) and Texas (three games)...went 2-4 on the last road trip to St. Louis (2-1) and Houston (0-3) and have lost 14 of their last 20 road games...went 3-6 on the last homestand against Boston (1-2), Los Angeles-AL (2-1) and Seattle (0-3) and are 33-42 (.440) at home...that is the second worst home record in the American League...will finish with a losing record at home in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1996-98 when they did it three straight years (went 34-47 last year)...it is just the fourth time it has happened in Oakland history (1977-79 and 1993-94).

OFFENSE: The A's have scored 21 runs in the first two games of the road trip after tallying 26 runs in nine games on the last homestand...rank last in the American League and third to last in the majors with 571 runs scored...are averaging 3.97 runs per game and have not averaged fewer than 3.98 runs per game since 1979 (3.54)...have 377 walks, which is second fewest in the AL to Kansas City (350)...are on pace for 424 walks, which would be the fewest in Oakland history in a non-strike season (433 in 1978)...have a .303 on-base percentage, which is the lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors...the Oakland record for lowest on-base percentage is .302 in 1979...have 149 home runs, which surpasses the season total of 146 from each of the previous two years...however, the home runs are fourth fewest in the AL...Chris Davis has 37 home runs and Marcus Semien 24 and their 61 home runs are the most by an A's duo since Frank Thomas and Nick Swisher had 74 in 2006...have the lowest slugging percentage (.393) and fewest hit by pitches (32) in the AL, rank second in fewest strikeouts (1003), third in lowest batting average (.246) and fewest extra base hits (400) and fourth in fewest stolen bases (47).

PITCHING: Over the last 11 games, the A's have allowed four runs or fewer seven times and 10 runs or more four times...have a 5.36 ERA (59 er in 99.0 ip) and .287 (113-for-394) opponents batting average over that span...now have a 4.57 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have not finished the year with an ERA above 4.28 since 2000 (4.58)...have the third highest opponents batting average in the AL (.265) and the third fewest home runs allowed (165).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-4 with a 5.62 ERA (31 er in 49.2 ip) over the last 10 games and 37-62 with a 4.96 ERA (428 er in 777.0 ip) for the season...have the fewest innings pitched in the American League and rank second in highest ERA, most losses and fewest wins...starters have tossed fewer than five innings 43 times, which is the most in

the majors, the most by an American League team since 2008 (Baltimore, 44) and the most by an A's team since 1997 (52).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 13 errors in the last 14 games and have 89 for the season, which is third most in the American League...A's outfielders have five assists in the last eight games...now 12 assists over the last 31 contests after tallying 14 over the first 113 games.

ROOKIES: The A's have used 19 rookies this year, which is tied with the 2012 and 2015 A's for second most in Oakland history (21 in 2008)...12 of the 19 rookies have been pitchers, which ties the Oakland record for most rookie pitchers in a season (2009, 2012, 2015)...16 of the 19 rookies have made their Major League debuts this year, including nine of the 12 pitchers...the rookies have a combined 188 games pitched, which is fourth most in Oakland history (319 in 2012, 232 in 2009, 203 in 2008)...have 391 strikeouts, which is third most (688 in 2012, 618 in 2009)...a rookie pitcher has started 52 of the A's 144 games (36.1%), including six of the last eight...the A's have had at least three rookies in the starting lineup (including the pitcher) in each of the last 12 games...have had at least four rookies in the lineup 16 times, including a season-high five four times (Aug. 5, 14 and 21; Sept. 13).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have 32 players on the active roster...have used 51 players for the season, which is tied for third most in Oakland history (used 52 last year and 54 in 2007)...have employed 27 pitchers, which ties the 1915 Philadelphia A's and 1955 Kansas City A's for second most in Athletics history to the record of 30 set last year...the A's have made a total of 177 player moves in 163 days dating back to Opening Day.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are averaging 2 hours and 57 minutes per game, which is the fastest in the majors...are one of just three teams averaging under three hours per game (Kansas City and Toronto, 2:58)...were officially eliminated in the American League West last Friday night in game 140...that matched the third earliest elimination from the division race (by game number) in Oakland history...it was the earliest since 1997 when they were also eliminated in game 140...have a tragic number of two to be eliminated from the Wild Card.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list an Oakland-record 27 times and those players have combined to miss an Oakland-record 1581 games (58.6 games per stint)...currently have 13 players on the DL, including 11 on the 60-day DL...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4 (including a season-high 16 from Aug. 22-28)...prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once...have had at least six players on the DL all year.

A's vs. ROYALS: The A's have won the season series for the first time since 2013 as they lead 4-1 with two games remaining...lost the first game this year but have won four straight since then...are 2-0 in Kansas City and 2-1 in Oakland...are 16-17 against Kansas City over the last five years...all-time, the A's are 312-260 against the Royals...that breaks down to 171-115 in Oakland and 141-145 in Kansas City.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khrist Davis has homered in back-to-back games for the seventh time this year and now has 37 home runs for the season...that is tied for fourth in the American League and is second most by an Athletic over the last 15 years (Frank Thomas, 39 in 2006)...**Ryon Healy** hit his ninth home run of the season last night, which ranks second among AL rookies since the break (Sanchez, NYY 14)...**Marcus Semien** hit his 24th home run Monday night, which leads AL shortstops and ranks third in the majors.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1929** the A's clinch the American League pennant with a 5-0 win over the Chicago White Sox...in **1990** Dave Stewart tosses a five-hitter in the A's 9-1 victory over Minnesota to win his 20th for the fourth consecutive season...in **1995** Mark McGwire hits his 269th career home run off Kansas City's Mark Gubicza, breaking Reggie Jackson's Oakland career record for home runs...in **1996** Mark McGwire homers in the first inning of both games of a double header at Cleveland, his 49th and 50th of the season, breaking the Oakland record of 49 which he previously held.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (5-9, 4.40 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his first start since Aug. 29 at Houston, when he left the game after 3.1 innings with a strained left rhomboid...is 3-5 with a 3.28 ERA (26 er in 71.1 ip) in 12 games, including 11 starts, since he was reinstated from the disabled list June 29...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day DL June 14 with a left pronator strain...was selected from Triple-A Nashville April 29 and is making his Major League debut.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Ranks second among American League rookies in strikeouts (104), innings pitched (120.2) and games started (20) and tied for seventh in wins (5).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 0-6 with a 6.44 ERA (31 er in 43.1 ip) and .302 (55-for-182) opponents average in eight starts on the road compared to 5-3 with a 3.26 ERA (28 er in 77.1 ip) and .232 (65-for-280) opponents batting average in 13 games at home...his career-opening road losing streak matches the longest in Oakland history (also Mike Morgan, June 17, 1978-July 24, 1979)...the last longer streak by an Athletic is seven by Troy Herriage of the 1956 Kansas City A's (May 12-Aug. 31)...has surrendered 10 home runs in 43.1 innings on the road (2.08 per nine innings), nine in 77.1 innings in Oakland (1.05 per nine innings)...has an .861 OPS on the road, .688 at home.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Left-handed hitters are 1-for-16 (.063) against him over his last six games and are batting .167 (14-for-84) with five extra base hits (two doubles, three home runs) overall...right-handers are batting .280 (106-for-378) with 16 of his 19 home runs and 28 of his 32 walks...the batting average against lefties is second lowest in the majors among pitchers with 100 or more innings (Kershaw, LAD .156) and his .511 OPS is third lowest (Kershaw, .355; Duffy, KC .434)...has an .809 OPS against righties.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 1.90 ERA (13 er in 61.2 ip) and .213 (47-for-221) opponents batting average over innings one through three and a 7.02 ERA (46 er in 59.0 ip) and .303 (73-for-241) opponents batting average from the fourth inning on...has allowed three runs in the first inning (20.0 ip, 1.35 ERA), all on May 10 at Boston...his first inning ERA is second lowest in the majors among pitchers with at least 20 innings (Tanaka, NYY 1.24)...using the same minimum, it is fifth lowest in Oakland history...has allowed just four runs in innings one through three in 12 games since returning from the DL June 29 (2 er in 35.0 ip, 0.51 ERA) and just four runs over the first four innings of his last eight starts (2 er in 31.1 ip, 0.57 ERA).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .207 (18-for-87) with runners in scoring position, including .150 (6-for-40) with RISP and two outs...the marks with RISP is eighth lowest in the American League among pitchers with 100 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, he has the second highest opponents batting average in the AL against the opponents number four hitter (21-for-56, .375) and the fifth lowest against the number three hitter (9-for-51, .176)...opponents are 35-for-74 (.473) with eight doubles, six home runs and 21 RBI when putting the first pitch in play...using the 100 inning minimum, the batting average is third highest in the AL and his slugging percentage (.824) is seventh highest...has a .215 (38-for-177) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .256 (43-for-168) the second time and .333 (39-for-117) with 10 of his 19 home runs after that.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on 19 days rest today...is 2-3 with a 3.61 ERA (23 er in 57.1 ip) in nine starts on four days rest, 3-6 with a 5.25 ERA (34 er in 58.1 ip) in 11 starts on five days rest or more.

BASES ON BALLS: Has walked 12 batters in his last six starts and 34.0 innings (3.18 walks per nine innings) to snap a streak of four games, 30.2 innings and 126 batters faced without a walk from July 10 to Aug. 2...the streak of 30.2 innings without a walk was the longest single season streak in Oakland history, topping the previous mark of 29.0 by Lary Sorensen (July 8-31, 1984)...it was fifth longest overall in Oakland history...is averaging 2.39 walks per nine innings for the season (32 bb in 120.2 ip).

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Made his Major League debut on **April 29** and had a no decision in a 7-4 A's win over Houston...had just 42 minor league appearances, all starts, in three professional seasons...became the 45th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the first since Dan Straily on Aug. 3, 2012 against Toronto...issued a career-high four walks...left with an 8-4 lead in his second start on **May 4** against Seattle but the bullpen allowed two runs in the sixth inning and three more in the seventh for the blown save (Axford)...yielded a career-high eight runs on 10 hits in a career-low 2.2 innings for the first decision of his career, a loss in a 13-5 decision at Boston **May 10**...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to allow at least four runs in each of his first three Major League appearances...the other is Vida Blue (July 20-Aug. 3, 1969)...picked up his first Major League win in the A's 3-1 victory over Texas **May 16** in Oakland...had a no decision in the A's 14-5 win over Texas on **June 13** in

Oakland...had a 10-2 lead when he left the game after 4.1 innings with a left pronator muscle strain...went on the DL the next day...made one start on a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton on **June 24** against San Jose and had a no decision (3.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 bb, 3 so, 1 hr, 64 pitches)...tossed a career-high 106 pitches in 7.0 innings and did not allow a run or walk a batter on **July 10** at Houston...ended up with a no decision in the A's 2-1, 10-inning loss...made his first career relief appearance **July 17** against Toronto...entered the game to start the second inning in relief of Andrew Triggs, who left the game with a left shin contusion...Triggs relieved Rich Hill who left after five pitchers with a blister...Manaea had been scheduled to start two days later...tossed 5.0 innings, which is a season-high for an A's reliever...had a no decision in the A's 1-0, 13-inning win over Tampa Bay **July 22** in Oakland...tossed a career-high 8.0 scoreless innings and allowed just five hits and no walks, but Odorizzi did the same for the Rays...struck out a career-high nine batters but allowed a career-high 11 hits in 6.2 innings in a no decision at Texas **July 27**...picked up his fourth win of the season in a 6-3 victory over Seattle **August 12** to snap a career-high three-game losing streak.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-0 loss at Houston on August 29...left the game after 3.1 innings with a strained left rhomboid...allowed two unearned runs in the second inning after back-to-back two-out errors by Ryon Healy loaded the bases...then issued back-to-back walks to Marisnick and Springer...retired each of the final five batters he faced.

NASHVILLE: Was 2-0 with a 1.50 ERA (18.0 ip, 16 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 21 so) in three starts with Triple-A Nashville...ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in ERA, fifth in strikeouts per nine innings (10.50) and tied for fifth in wins at the time of his April 29 promotion...allowed just one run in each of his starts...surrendered just one home run in 18.0 innings...allowed a .232 opponents batting average, including .077 (1-for-13) against left-handed hitters compared to .268 (15-for-56) against right-handers.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Daniel Mengden (1-7, 6.39 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville September 3 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 0-2 with a 10.57 ERA in two starts since his return...is now 1-7 with a 6.39 ERA in 11 starts overall...his ERA is fourth highest in the American League among pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, he is tied for the second lowest winning percentage (.125)...his 11 starts are tied for seventh among AL rookies...went 1-3 with a 2.81 ERA and .221 opponents batting average in his four starts in June...is 0-4 with a 9.39 ERA and .328 opponents batting average in seven starts since then...has a 2.86 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in innings one and two and an 8.65 ERA and .315 opponents average from the third inning on...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 3-2 A's loss to Seattle last Friday in Oakland (5.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...has never faced the Royals in his career.

- Has allowed 61-of-227 (26.9%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the American League (Cleveland, 26.1%) and fifth best in the majors.
- Ranks second in the AL in innings pitched (497.2), fourth in strikeouts (475) and opponents on-base percentage (.308) and fifth in slugging percentage (.384)...is tied for third in most blown saves (18), fourth in most wild pitches (30) and tied for fifth in most walks (170).
- First batters faced are 92-for-405 (.227) with 31 walks (.280 on-base percentage)...leads the AL in first batter slugging percentage (.316) and fewest home runs (5), ranks third in on-base percentage, fourth in batting average and fifth in strikeouts (111).
