## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (63-82) VS. KANSAS CITY (74-71)

THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 15, 2016 — KAUFFMAN STADIUM — 6:15 P.M. CDT RHP DANIEL MENGDEN (1-7, 6.39) VS. RHP EDINSON VOLQUEZ (10-10, 5.09) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight games for the first time since August 8-10...have not won more than three in a row since a five-game winning streak from May 28-June 1...have won five of the last eight games but are 16-27 (.372) over the last 43 contests...are 63-82 (.434) for the season, which is tied for the third worst record in the American League...it is seventh worst in Oakland history after 145 games and is the worst since last year's club was 62-83 (lost game 146)...have clinched a losing record for the second consecutive season (went 68-94 last year)...this is the first time the A's have finished with a losing record in back-to-back seasons since they had three straight from 2007-09...are in a tie for fourth place in the AL West and have been in fourth place or worse every day since June 3...have spent 123 of 160 days this year in fourth or worst (60 days in fourth, 18 days tied for fourth and 45 days in fifth).

FOUR GAME SERIES: This is the 41st four-game series between the A's and Royals and the A's have swept just one of those (Sept. 26-28, 1977 in Oakland)...the last time the A's swept a four-game series in Kansas City was July 27-30, 1959 when the Kansas City A's swept a four-game series from the original Washington Senators franchise...have outscored Kansas City by 22 runs in the first three games of this series (29-7)...the best run differential in a four-game series in Oakland history is 27 against Seattle from April 17-19, 1981 (32-5)...have not swept a four-game series from any team since July 3-6, 2014 against Toronto...have not swept a four-game series on the road since August 27-30, 2012 at Cleveland.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 30-40 (.429) on the road...with one more loss, Oakland will clinch a losing record on the road for the third consecutive season (40-41 in 2014, 34-47 in 2015) and eighth time in the last 10 years...are 3-0 on this seven-game road trip to Kansas City (3-0) and Texas (three games) after going 2-4 on the last road trip to St. Louis (2-1) and Houston (0-3)...went 3-6 on the last homestand against Boston (1-2), Los Angeles-AL (2-1) and Seattle (0-3) and are 33-42 (.440) at home...that is the second worst home record in the American League...will finish with a losing record at home in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1996-98 when they did it three straight years (went 34-47 last year)...it is just the fourth time it has happened in Oakland history (1977-79 and 1993-94).

**SCORING MARGIN:** The A's are 18-36 (.333) in games decided by four or more runs compared to 45-46 (.495) in games decided by three runs or fewer...the 18 wins by four runs or more are second fewest in the majors (Atlanta, 16) and the winning percentage is the worst in the AL and third worst in the majors...are 23-23 (.500) in one-run games and rank fourth in the AL in one-run decisions (46)...have a run differential of -109, which is second worst in the AL (Minnesota, -143)...the last time the A's were outscored by more than 62 runs in a season was in 1997 (-182).

OFFENSE: The A's have scored 29 runs in the first three games of the road trip after tallying 26 runs in nine games on the last homestand...have 579 runs scored for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and fourth fewest in the majors...have 384 walks, which is second fewest in the AL to Kansas City (353)...are on pace for 429 walks, which would be the fewest in Oakland history in a non-strike season (433 in 1978)...have a .304 on-base percentage, which is the lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors...the Oakland record for lowest on-base percentage is .302 in 1979...have 149 home runs, which surpasses the season total of 146 from each of the previous two years but is fourth fewest in the AL...Khris Davis has 37 home runs and Marcus Semien 24 and their 61 home runs are the most by an A's duo since Frank Thomas and Nick Swisher had 74 in 2006...have the lowest slugging percentage (.394) and fewest hit by pitches (33) in the AL, rank second in fewest strikeouts (1012), third in lowest batting average (.247), tied for third in fewest stolen bases (47) and fourth in fewest extra base hits (404).

**PITCHING:** The A's tossed their seventh shutout of the season last night and have not finished with fewer than 10 shutouts in a season since 2008 (also 7)...allowed 14 runs last Saturday against Seattle but have surrendered just 10 runs in four games since then (8 er in 36.0 ip, 2.00 ERA)... have a 3.90 ERA (91 er in 210.0 ip) over the last 24 games and a 4.54 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have not finished the year with an ERA above 4.28 since 2000 (4.58)...have the third highest opponents batting average in the AL (.264) and the third fewest home runs allowed (165).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 5-7 with a 3.60 ERA (44 er in 110.0 ip) over the last 21 games and are 38-62 with a 4.93 ERA (428 er in 782.0 ip) for the season...have the fewest innings pitched in the American League and rank second in highest ERA, most losses and fewest wins...starters have tossed fewer than five innings 43 times, which is the most in the majors, the most by an American League team since 2008 (Baltimore, 44) and the most by an A's team since 1997 (52).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed two errors in the last seven games and have 89 for the season, which is third most in the American League...A's outfielders have five assists in the last nine games...now 12 assists over the last 32 contests after tallying 14 over the first 113 games.

ROOKIES: The A's have used 19 rookies, which is tied with the 2012 and 2015 A's for second most in Oakland history (21 in 2008)...12 of the 19 rookies have been pitchers, which ties the Oakland record for most rookie pitchers in a season (2009, 2012, 2015)...16 of the 19 rookies have made their Major League debuts this year, including nine of the 12 pitchers... a rookie pitcher has started 53 of the A's 145 games (36.5%), including seven of the last nine...the A's have had at least three rookies in the starting lineup (including the pitcher) in each of the last 13 games...have had at least four rookies in the lineup 17 times, including a season-high five five times (Aug. 5, 14 and 21; Sept. 13 and 14).

ROSTER NOTES: With the addition of Dillon Overton today, the A's now have 33 players on the active roster...have used 51 players for the season, which is tied for third most in Oakland history (used 52 last year and 54 in 2007)...have employed 27 pitchers, which ties the 1915 Philadelphia A's and 1955 Kansas City A's for second most in Athletics history to the record of 30 set last year...the A's have made a total of 178 player moves in 164 days dating back to Opening Day.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are averaging 2 hours and 57 minutes per game, which is the fastest in the majors...are one of just three teams averaging under three hours per game (Kansas City and Toronto, 2:58)...were officially eliminated in the American League West last Friday night in game 140...that matched the third earliest elimination from the division race (by game number) in Oakland history...it was the earliest since 1997 when they were also eliminated in game 140...have a tragic number of two to be eliminated from the Wild Card.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list an Oakland-record 27 times and those players have combined to miss an Oakland-record 1594 games (59.0 games per stint)...currently have 13 players on the DL, including 11 on the 60-day DL...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4 (including a season-high 16 from Aug. 22-28)... prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once.

A's vs. ROYALS: The A's have won the season series for the first time since 2013 as they lead 5-1 entering the final game today...a win today would give the A's their best record ever against a defending World Series Champion (current: 5-1 vs. Toronto in 1994)...a win would give the A's their second best record ever against the Royals (8-1 in 2002)...lost the first game this year but have won five straight since then...are 3-0 in Kansas City and 2-1 in Oakland...are 17-17 against Kansas City over the last five years...all-time, the A's are 313-260 against the Royals...that breaks down to 171-115 in Oakland and 142-145 in Kansas City.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

*Khris Davis* has 37 home runs, which is tied for fourth in the AL and is second most by an Athletic over the last 15 years (Frank Thomas, 39 in 2006)... *Ryon Healy* is batting .371 (39-for-105) over his last 28 games after hitting .223 over his first 27 contests... *Marcus Semien* has 24 home runs, which leads AL shortstops and ranks third in the majors.

### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1931 the A's clinch their third consecutive American League pennant as Eddie Rommell defeats Cleveland, 14-3...it is the ninth and final pennant for manager Connie Mack...in 1971 the A's score twice in the eighth inning to defeat Chicago 3-2 in the first game of a doubleheader, clinching their first AL West title...in 1990 Dennis Eckersley becomes Oakland's all-time saves leader when he saves his 137<sup>th</sup> game as an Athletic, breaking Rollie Fingers record of 136.

## <u> TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Mengden (1-7, 6.39 ERA)</u>

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville September 3 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 0-2 with a 10.57 ERA (9 er in 7.2 ip) in two starts since his return...is now 1-7 with a 6.39 ERA in 11 starts overall...his ERA is fourth highest in the American League among pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, he is tied for the second lowest winning percentage (.125) and has the third highest walks per nine innings (4.79)...his 11 starts are tied for seventh among AL rookies...was selected from Nashville June 11 and made his Major League debut that day at Cincinnati after just 43 minor league appearances, including 34 starts, in three professional seasons...went 1-5 with a 5.73 ERA in nine starts before he was optioned to Nashville July 26...had not pitched above Single-A prior to this year.

FIRST FOUR, LAST SEVEN: Went 1-3 with a 2.81 ERA and .221 opponents batting average in his four starts in June...is 0-4 with a 9.39 ERA (32 er in 30.2 ip) and .328 (44-for-134) opponents batting average in seven starts since then...the four-game losing streak is a career high...logged a 9.00 ERA in five starts in July, which was second highest in Oakland history in July among pitchers with 20 or more innings (Karsay, 9.36 in 1997).

INNING BY INNING: Has a 2.86 ERA (7 er in 22.0 ip) and .229 (19-for-83) opponents batting average in innings one and two and an 8.65 ERA (33 er in 34.1 ip) and .315 (46-for-146) opponents average from the third inning on.

AL AND NL: Has made four of his 11 career starts against National League teams...is 1-3 with a 4.01 ERA (11 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts in interleague play compared to 0-4 with an 8.24 ERA (29 er in 31.2 ip) in seven starts against American League teams.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 1-2 with a 5.08 ERA (16 er in 28.1 ip) in five starts on four days rest compared to 0-5 with a 7.71 ERA (24 er in 28.0 ip) in six starts on five days rest or more.

STRIKEOUTS: Has 57 strikeouts in 56.1 innings over the first 11 starts of his career (9.10 per nine innings)...since 1913, his 57 strikeouts are tied for fifth most by an A's pitcher over the first 11 games of his career

RUN SUPPORT: Received eight runs of support in his lone win on June 27 at San Francisco...has a total of 17 runs of support in his other 10 starts (48.2 ip, 3.14 RSA).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has a .231 (21-for-91) opponents batting average and has surrendered one home run the first time through the lineup... has a .319 (44-for-138) average and seven home runs allowed after that... the opponents number five hitter is 3-for-27 (.111)...however, the seven through nine hitters are batting a combined .368 (25-for-68)...opponents are batting .304 (17-for-56) when leading off an inning.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 0-6 with a 6.95 ERA (26 er in 33.2 ip) in seven starts at home compared to 1-1 with a 5.56 ERA (14 er in 22.2 ip) in four starts on the road...his six-game career-opening home losing streak is the longest in Oakland history, surpassing the previous mark of five by Steve Ontiveros (1985-86) and Dallas Braden (2007)...since 1913, it is the third longest by an Athletic and the longest since Wally Burnette had a seven-game streak (July 24-Sept. 9, 1956)...the longest is 11 by Boby Hasty (Sept. 11, 1919-Aug. 11, 1921).

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: He was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, a 2-1 A's loss at Cincinnati June 11... became the 46th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut and the first of those to take the loss since Brett Anderson on April 10, 2009 against Seattle...at the age of 23 years, 113 days, he became the youngest A's pitcher to start a game since Trevor Cahill on June 19, 2011 (23 years, 110 days)...struck out the first batter he faced (Cozart)...struck out a career high nine batters and tossed a careerhigh 108 pitches but fell to 0-3 in a 4-2 loss to Milwaukee June 22...joined Brad Rigby (1997) and Mike Morgan (1978) as the only three pitchers in Oakland history to lose each of the first three games of their career...is just the fourth Major League pitcher since 1913 to lose each of his first three career games while allowing three runs or fewer in each game...the others are Duane Pillette (1949 Yankees), Jim McAndrew (1968 Mets) and Kyle Drabek (2010 Blue Jays)...tossed a career-high 7.2 innings and picked up his first Major League win in his fourth start, an 8-3 victory at San Francisco June 27...retired each of the first 13 batters and shutout the Giants on two hits and a walk over the first seven innings...had an 8-0 lead when he allowed his only two runs in the eighth inning...became the eighth pitcher in Oakland history to allow to allow three runs or fewer in each of his first four starts, the first since A.J. Griffin in 2012...fell to 1-4 with a loss in his fifth start on July 3 against Pittsburgh...allowed four runs or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of his first five career starts...since 1913, the only other Major League pitcher to do that and lose at least four of those games is Tony Armas, who went 0-4 with a 2.97 ERA over his first

five career starts with Montreal from Aug. 16, 1999-May 30, 2000...yielded a career-high seven runs in just 3.1 innings July 15 against Toronto but had a no decision in a game the A's would come back to win 8-7...walked a career-high five batters in a 7-0 loss to Houston July 20...allowed a career-high tying seven runs on a career-high eight hits in a career-low 2.2 innings in an 11-2 loss to Boston on Sept. 3.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-2 loss to Seattle last Friday in Oakland...allowed a RBI double to Cruz in the first and a solo home run to Aoki in the third...those were the only runs he would allow in five innings and he retired each of the final seven batters he faced...left trailing 2-1.

MINORS: Combined for a 10-2 record, a 1.46 ERA and .197 opponents batting average in 17 games, all starts, with Double-A Midland and Triple-A Nashville...tied for second in the A's farm system in wins...allowed just four home runs in 98.1 innings, an average of 0.37 per nine innings...struck out 95 and walked 29 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.28...began the season at Midland and went 2-0 with a 0.78 ERA in four starts before he was promoted to Nashville May 1...went 3-1 with a 1.39 ERA in seven starts with the Sounds before his promotion to Oakland on June 11...then went 5-1 with a 2.10 ERA in six starts following his July 26 option...was 8-2 with a 1.67 ERA in 13 starts overall at Nashville...his opponents batting average included a .190 (28-for-147) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .202 (41-for-203) against right-handers...yielded a .134 batting average with runners in scoring position...had a 1.19 ERA in the minors at the time of his first promotion to Oakland on June 11, which was sixth lowest in all of the minor leagues.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Was originally drafted by Houston in the fourth round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft...was traded to Oakland with catcher Jacob Nottingham for left-handed pitcher Scott Kazmir on July 23, 2015...has compiled a 20-6 record and a 2.87 ERA (74 er in 240.0 ip) in 49 games, including 40 starts, in three seasons in the minors...has 237 strikeouts in 240.0 innings.

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Kendall Graveman (10-10, 4.13 ERA): Is 9-4 with a 3.64 ERA over his last 19 starts after going 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts... has eight wins dating back to June 23, which is tied for eighth most in the American League over that span...struck out just one batter in his last start and has 96 strikeouts in 168.0 innings, an average of 5.14 per nine innings...that is the third lowest mark in the AL...allowed two runs in the first inning of his last start, snapping a streak of 18 consecutive starts without allowing a run in the first inning...has a 1.93 ERA in the first inning, which is fourth lowest ERA in the AL (min. 25 ip)...has received one run of support in his last three starts (18.1 ip)...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 14-3 A's loss to Seattle last Saturday in Oakland (5.0 ip, 12 h, 8 r, 8 er, 3 bb, 1 so)...is 1-1 with a 7.84 ERA (10.1 ip, 15 h, 10 r, 9 er, 3 bb, 5 so, 2 hr) in two career starts against Texas, both last year.

- The A's bullpen has a 2.84 ERA (12 er in 38.0 ip) and .193 (26-for-135) opponents batting average over the last 10 games (since Sept. 4).
- Has allowed 61-of-227 (26.9%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the American League (Cleveland, 26.0%) and fifth best in the majors
- Ranks second in the AL in innings pitched (501.2), fourth in strikeouts (481) and opponents on-base percentage (.307) and fifth in slugging percentage (.382)...is tied for third in most blown saves (18) and ranks fourth in most walks (172) and most wild pitches (30).
- First batters faced are 92-for-408 (.225) with 31 walks (.278 on-base percentage)...leads the AL in first batter slugging percentage (.314) and fewest home runs (5), ranks third in on-base percentage, fourth in batting average and fifth in strikeouts (111).

- Has not allowed an earned run in 16 of his last 18 games for a 2.45 ERA (5 er in 18.1 ip)...however, has a 5.51 ERA (20 er in 32.2 ip) over his last 36 games (since June 15) after logging a 2.70 ERA over his first 26 contests.
- Is tied for sixth among American League relievers in wins (6) and tied for 10th in games pitched (62)...ranks third in most walks (29) and tied for fifth in most blown saves (6).
- Has allowed 11 of his 29 runs (5.0 ip, 19.80 ERA) over innings three through six...has a 2.87 ERA (17 er in 53.1 ip) from the seventh inning on.
- Has a .327 (17-for-52) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position, including .423 (11-for-26) with RISP and two outs.
