OAKLAND ATHLETICS (64-82) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (87-60)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won each of their last four games, which is their longest winning streak since a five-game streak from May 28-June 1... have won seven of the last 11 games after going 10-23 (.303) over a 33-game stretch from July 29 to Sept. 3...are 64-82 (.438) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...it is seventh worst in Oakland history after 146 games and is the worst since last year's club was 62-84 (won game 147)...have clinched a losing record for the second consecutive season (went 68-94 last year)...this is the first time the A's have finished with a losing record in back-to-back seasons since they had three straight from 2007-09...are in fourth place in the AL West and have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent 124 of 161 days this year in fourth or worst (61 days in fourth, 18 days tied for fourth and 45 days in fifth).

FOUR-GAME SERIES SWEEP: The A's swept a four-game series from Kansas City to start the road trip...it was just the A's second sweep in 41 four-game series with the Royals (Sept. 26-28, 1977 in Oakland)...it was their first four-game sweep in Kansas City since July 27-30, 1959 when the Kansas City A's swept a four-game series from the original Washington Senators franchise...outscored the Royals 43-12 to set an Athletics record for margin of victory in a four-game series with 31...the previous mark was 28 (May 22-25, 1911 at Cleveland and Aug. 6-9, 1923 vs. Chicago)...the 43 runs were the most in a four-game series in Oakland history and the most since the Philadelphia A's scored 50 runs in a four-game series at Chicago, July 16-19, 1930...according to the Elias Sports Bureau it was the most runs by any team in a series of four or fewer games on the road against the defending World Champions...the four-game sweep was the A's first against any team since July 3-6, 2014 against Toronto and their first on the road since August 27-30, 2012 at Cleveland.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 31-40 (.437) on the road...with one more loss, Oakland will clinch a losing record on the road for the third consecutive season (40-41 in 2014, 34-47 in 2015) and eighth time in the last 10 years...are 4-0 on this seven-game road trip to Kansas City (4-0) and Texas (three games) after going 2-4 on the last road trip to St. Louis (2-1) and Houston (0-3)...return home following the game Sunday for the final homestand of the season, a six-game stand against Houston (three games) and Texas (three games)...went 3-6 on the last homestand against Boston (1-2), Los Angeles-AL (2-1) and Seattle (0-3) and are 33-42 (.440) at home...that is the second worst home record in the American League...will finish with a losing record at home in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1996-98 when they did it three straight years (went 34-47 last year)...it is just the fourth time it has happened in Oakland history (1977-79 and 1993-94)...are batting .257 (643-for-2499) on the road compared to .239 (588-for-2465) at home.

OFFENSE: The A's scored 43 runs in the four-game series at Kansas City after tallying just 26 runs in nine games on the last homestand...hit .333 (52-for-156) with 13 doubles, seven home runs (.551 slugging percentage) and 24 walks (1 hbp, 2 sf, .421 on-base percentage) against the Royals...rank last in the American League in runs scored (593), on-base percentage (.305), slugging percentage (.396) and hit by pitches (33)...are second in fewest walks (380) and fewest strikeouts (1019), third in lowest batting average (.248), tied for third in fewest stolen bases (47) and fourth in fewest home runs (152) and fewest extra base hits (411)...Khris Davis has 37 home runs and Marcus Semien 25 and their 62 home runs are the most by an A's duo since Frank Thomas and Nick Swisher had 74 in 2006.

PITCHING: The A's allowed 14 runs last Saturday against Seattle but have surrendered just 15 runs in five games since then (13 er in 45.0 ip, 2.60 ERA)...have a 3.95 ERA (96 er in 219.0 ip) over the last 25 games and a 4.54 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have not finished the year with an ERA above 4.28 since 2000 (4.58)...have the third highest opponents batting average in the AL (.264) and the third fewest home runs allowed (166).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have not allowed a run in the last two games (12.0 ip), marking the first time they have gone consecutive games without yielding a run in over a year (Aug. 23-24, 2015)...are 2-0 with a 1.98 ERA (6 er in 27.1 ip) over the last five games but are 39-62 with a 4.88 ERA (428 er in 789.0 ip) for the season...rank second in the American League in highest ERA, fewest innings and fewest wins and tied for second in most losses.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 90 errors, which is third most in the American League...A's outfielders have 12 assists over the last 33 games after tallying 14 over the first 113 games.

SCORING MARGIN: Three of the A's last four wins have been by eight runs or more...had just four such wins over the first 142 games...are 19-36 (.345) in games decided by four or more runs compared to 45-46 (.495) in games decided by three runs or fewer...the 19 wins by four runs or more are tied with Miami for second fewest in the majors (Atlanta, 16) and the winning percentage is the worst in the American League and third worst in the majors...are 23-23 (.500) in one-run games and rank fourth in the AL in one-run decisions (46)...have a run differential of -100, which is second worst in the AL (Minnesota, -139)...the last time the A's were outscored by more than 62 runs in a season was in 1997 (-182).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have 33 players on the active roster...have used 51 players for the season, which is tied for third most in Oakland history (used 52 last year and 54 in 2007)...that includes 19 rookies, which ties the 2012 and 2015 A's for second most in Oakland history (21 in 2008)...have employed 27 pitchers, which ties the 1915 Philadelphia A's and 1955 Kansas City A's for second most in Athletics history to the record of 30 set last year...12 of the 27 have been rookies, which ties the Oakland record for most rookie pitchers in a season (2009, 2012, 2015)...the A's have had at least three rookies in the starting lineup (including the pitcher) in each of the last 14 games...have had at least four rookies in the lineup 18 times this year, including a season-high five five times (Aug. 5, 14 and 21; Sept. 13 and 14)...the A's have made a total of 178 player moves in 165 days dating back to Opening Day.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have lost 18 of the last 25 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 16-23 (.410) in those games for the season, which is the worst record in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...are averaging 2 hours and 57 minutes per game, which is the fastest in the majors...are one of just three teams averaging under three hours per game (Kansas City and Toronto)...were officially eliminated from the AL West a week ago tonight in game 140...that matched the third earliest elimination from the division race (by game number) in Oakland history...it was the earliest since 1997 when they were also eliminated in game 140...have a tragic number of one to be eliminated from the Wild Card.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list an Oakland-record 27 times and those players have combined to miss an Oakland-record 1607 games (59.5 games per stint)...currently have 13 players on the DL, including 11 on the 60-day DL...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4 (including a season-high 16 from Aug. 22-28)...prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's trail in the season series, 6-7...are 2-4 in Texas and 4-3 in Oakland...won each of the first four games this year but have lost seven of nine since then...the A's have won three of the previous four season series and are 46-43 against Texas over the last five years...are 338-350 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 177-167 in Oakland and 161-183 in Texas...are 94-95 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 435-432 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis has 37 home runs, which is tied for fourth in the American League and is second most by an Athletic over the last 15 years (Frank Thomas, 39 in 2006)...**Ryon Healy** hit his 10th home run of the season last night, which is third most in the majors among rookies since the All-Star Break...is batting .382 (42-for-110) over his last 29 games after hitting .223 over his first 27 contests...**Marcus Semien** hit his 25th home run of the season last night...among shortstops, that is the most in AL, tied for second in the majors and ranks fifth in Oakland history.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1934** Sugar Cain and Johnny Marcus toss complete games as the A's sweep a doubleheader at St. Louis 2-1 and 2-0...in **1947** the A's score all seven of their runs with two outs in the bottom of the seventh inning to defeat Cleveland 7-3 in the second game of a doubleheader...in **1980** Mike Norris goes the distance in the A's 4-2, 11 inning win at Texas...Oakland scores two in the ninth and two in the 11th as Norris wins his 20th game of the season.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (10-10, 4.13 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 9-4 with a 3.64 ERA (49 er in 121.0 ip) over his last 19 starts after going 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts...has eight wins dating back to June 23, which is tied for eighth most in the American League over that span.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for second in the American League in shutouts (1), tied for fourth in complete games (2), tied for fifth in opponents reaching on an error (8) and ranks seventh in fewest pitches per game (91.6).

STRIKEOUTS AND WALKS: Struck out just one batter in his last start, the sixth time this year he has struck out just one batter (has zero games with no strikeouts)...has 96 strikeouts in 168.0 innings, an average of 5.14 per nine innings...that is the third lowest mark in the American League and the lowest mark by an A's pitcher since Trevor Cahill in 2009 (4.53)...has walked one batter or fewer in 15 of his 28 starts and has issued 45 free passes for the season, an average of 2.41 per nine innings...has issued 35 of his 45 walks to left-handed hitters.

THE FIRST INNING: Allowed two runs in the first inning of his last start, snapping a streak of 18 consecutive starts without allowing a run in the first inning...prior to that, had not allowed a run in the first since May 24...now has a 1.93 ERA (6 er in 28.0 ip) in the first inning, 4.56 (71 er in 140.0 ip) after that...has the fourth lowest ERA in the first inning in the American League (min. 25.0 ip).

SUPPORT: Has received one run of support in his last three starts (18.1 ip), including none in his last two starts (11.1 ip)...is 0-7 with two runs of support or fewer, 10-3 with three runs of support or more...is now 1-16 in 23 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 15-3 in 26 starts with three runs of support or more...has left with the lead in four of his starts this year only to have the bullpen blow the save (April 12 vs. Los Angeles-AL, June 17 vs. Los Angeles, June 28 vs. San Francisco, July 29 at Cleveland).

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: Is 5-4 with a 3.80 ERA (31 er in 73.1 ip) in 11 starts since the All-Star Break after going 5-6 with a 4.37 ERA in 17 starts before the break...his five post-break wins surpass Sonny Gray's and Fernando Rodriguez' team leading total of four from last year.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-5 with a 3.35 ERA (31 er in 83.1 ip) in 13 starts at home compared to 5-5 with a 4.89 ERA (46 er in 84.2 ip) in 15 starts on the road...has surrendered six home runs in 83.1 innings at home compared to 15 in 84.2 innings on the road.

THIS AND THAT: Is scheduled to make his 29th start of the season today, which is an on-going career high...is in his second full season and has surpassed his total from last year in all categories...went 1-2 with a 7.29 ERA over the first nine games (four starts) of his career through April 25, 2015, 5-2 with a 1.78 ERA over a nine-start stretch from May 23-July 4, 2015, 1-11 with a 5.57 ERA over a 17-start stretch from July 10, 2015-May 24, 2016 and is 9-4 with a 3.64 ERA (49 er in 121.0 ip) over his last 19 starts.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Allowed four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts, joining John Odom (1969) and Mike Norris (1980) as the only pitchers in Oakland history on an Opening Day roster to allow four hits or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of their first three starts...picked up his first win of the season and struck out a career-high eight batters April 20 at New York (AL)...it snapped a career-high six-game losing streak dating back to July 10, 2015...compiled a 5.52 ERA and .276 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned nine starts...then lost each of his next five starts from April 25 to May 19...logged a 7.92 ERA and .361 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which fell one short of his career high of six...snapped his five-game losing streak in a 3-2 win over Minnesota May 30...finished May with a 1-4 record and a 5.87 EA in six starts...tied for second in the American League in May losses...tossed 8.0 innings July 9 at Houston, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer dating back to June 18 of last year...that was the fifth longest such streak in Oakland history...fired his second career complete game in the A's 4-3 win over Tampa Bay on July 23 in Oakland...allowed nine hits, which were the most by an A's pitcher in a complete game since Mark Redman allowed 12 on May 13, 2004 against Detroit...had his career high six-game winning streak come to an end in the A's 5-3 loss at Cleveland July 29...compiled a 3.25 ERA and .264 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 10 starts from May 30 to July 23...went 4-1 with a 2.68 ERA in five starts in July...the wins tied for third in the AL and were his most ever in a month...fired his third career complete game and his first shutout, a two-hitter in the A's 9-0 win at Chicago (AL) Aug. 19...became the ninth Oakland pitcher since 1987 to toss fewer than 100 pitches in a shutout, the first since Rich Harden on July 14, 2005 against Texas (80)...faced just one batter over the minimum to become the 13th pitcher in Oakland history to face 28 batters or fewer in a nine inning complete game (last: Dallas Braden, May 9, 2010 vs. Tampa

Bay)...had a no decision in the A's 1-0 win over Boston Sept. 4 in Oakland...tossed 6.1 scoreless innings and a career-high tying 112 pitches.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 14-3 loss to Seattle last Saturday in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying eight runs on a career-high 12 hits...the hits were the most by an A's pitcher since Tyson Ross allowed 12 on May 25, 2012 against New York (AL)...yielded two runs in the first inning on a double play and an RBI single by Seager, and four more runs in the third, including a two-run double by Cruz...then allowed three straight hits to start the sixth inning and was relieved by Wendelken after allowing a two-run double to Aoki.

three runs in the first, a two-run home run to Moreland in the third and a three-run home run to Choo in the fourth...yielded eight runs in 3.1 innings to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to allow eight or more runs in his A's debut...then picked up the win in an 8-2 victory at Texas June 24...the A's scored five times in the first inning and three in the second and he blanked the Rangers on two hits over the first four innings...allowed his only runs in the fifth inning on a two-run double by Corporan...was relieved by Mujica after putting runners on first and second to start the eighth innings.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Raul Alcantara (0-1, 7.27 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville September 5 and is scheduled to make his third start of the season and his career...had a no decision in his last start, a 3-2 A's loss to Seattle last Sunday in Oakland (5.2 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...had not pitched above Double-A prior to this year...started the season at Double-A Midland where he went 5-6 with a 4.80 ERA in 17 starts...was moved up to Nashville July 21 and was a perfect 4-0 with a 1.18 ERA in eight starts...his ERA with the Sounds was the lowest in the Pacific Coast League from July 21 through the end of the season...combined to go 9-6 with a 3.58 ERA in 25 minor league starts overall...walked 30 batters in 135.2 innings (1.99 per nine innings), including just three in 45.2 innings with Nashville (0.59 per nine innings)...was acquired from Boston with Josh Reddick and Miles Head for Andrew Bailey and Ryan Sweeney, Dec. 28, 2011.

- The A's bullpen has allowed one run or less in 17 of its last 24 games... however, has allowed three runs or more in the seven other games for a 4.48 ERA (42 er in 84.1 ip) over that span (since Aug. 20).
- Has allowed 61-of-227 (26.9%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the American League (Cleveland, 25.8%) and fifth best in the majors.
- Ranks second in the AL in innings pitched (503.2), fourth in strikeouts (482) and fifth in opponents on-base percentage (.309) and slugging percentage (.385)...is tied for third in most blown saves (18), ranks fourth in most wild pitches (30) and fifth in most walks (173).
- First batters faced are 93-for-410 (.227) with 31 walks (.279 on-base percentage)...leads the AL in first batter slugging percentage (.315) and fewest home runs (5), ranks third in on-base percentage, fourth in batting average and fifth in strikeouts (111).
