OAKLAND ATHLETICS (65-83) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (88-61)

SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 18, 2016 — GLOBE LIFE PARK — 2:05 P.M. CDT LHP ROSS DETWILER (1-3, 5.25) VS. RHP COLBY LEWIS (6-2, 3.31) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won five out of six games after losing nine of their previous 12 contests...have won eight of the last 13 games after going 10-23 (.303) over a 33-game stretch from July 29 to Sept. 3...are 65-83 (.439) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League... it is seventh worst in Oakland history after 148 games and is the worst since last year's club was 64-84 (lost game 149)...have clinched a losing record for the second consecutive season (went 68-94 last year)...this is the first time the A's have finished with a losing record in back-to-back seasons since they had three straight from 2007-09...are in fourth place in the AL West and have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3... have spent 126 of 163 days this year in fourth or worst (63 days in fourth, 18 days tied for fourth and 45 days in fifth).

FOUR-GAME SERIES SWEEP: The A's swept a four-game series from Kansas City to start the road trip...it was just the A's second sweep in 41 four-game series with the Royals (Sept. 26-28, 1977 in Oakland)...it was their first four-game sweep in Kansas City since July 27-30, 1959 when the Kansas City A's swept a four-game series from the original Washington Senators franchise...outscored the Royals 43-12 to set an Athletics record for margin of victory in a four-game series with 31...the previous mark was 28 (May 22-25, 1911 at Cleveland and Aug. 6-9, 1923 vs. Chicago)...the 43 runs were the most in a four-game series in Oakland history and the most since the Philadelphia A's scored 50 runs in a four-game series at Chicago, July 16-19, 1930.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 32-41 (.438) on the road...with Friday's loss, Oakland clinched a losing record on the road for the third consecutive season (40-41 in 2014, 34-47 in 2015) and eighth time in the last 10 years...are 5-1 on this seven-game road trip to Kansas City (4-0) and Texas (1-1) after going 2-4 on the last road trip to St. Louis (2-1) and Houston (0-3)...the five wins this road trip match the A's season high for wins on a trip of any length...return home following today's game for the final homestand of the season, a six-game stand against Houston (three games) and Texas (three games)...went 3-6 on the last homestand against Boston (1-2), Los Angeles-AL (2-1) and Seattle (0-3) and are 33-42 (.440) at home...that is the second worst home record in the American League... will finish with a losing record at home in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1996-98 when they did it three straight years (went 34-47 last year)...it is just the fourth time it has happened in Oakland history (1977-79 and 1993-94)...are batting .258 (665-for-2573) on the road compared to .239 (588-for-2465) at home.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored 60 runs in their last six games (10 runs/game) after tallying just 41 runs over their previous 15 games (2.7 runs/game)...this marks the most runs scored over a six-game stretch on the road since May 3-9, 2000 (at KC-1, at TEX-3, at ANA-1), when they also scored 60...the A's record is 68...over the current six-game stretch, they have hit .322 (74-for-230) with 16 doubles, 12 home runs (.548 slugging percentage) and 32 walks (1 hbp, 2 sf, .402 on-base percentage)... had hit 10 home runs as a team over their last 20 games overall before this stretch...rank second to last in the American League in runs scored (610), slugging percentage (.397), fewest walks (397), and fewest strikeouts (1040)...are last in on-base percentage (.306) and hit by pitches (33)...are third in lowest batting average (.249), tied for third in fewest stolen bases (47) and fourth in fewest home runs (157) and fewest extra base hits (419) ...Khris Davis has 38 home runs and Marcus Semien 26 and their 64 home runs are the most by an A's duo since Frank Thomas and Nick Swisher had 74 in 2006.

PITCHING: The A's allowed 14 runs last Saturday against Seattle but have surrendered just 24 runs in seven games since then (22 er in 62.2 ip, 3.16 ERA)...have a 3.99 ERA (105 er in 236.2 ip) over the last 27 games and a 4.54 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have not finished the year with an ERA above 4.28 since 2000 (4.58)...have the third highest opponents batting average in the AL (.264) and the third fewest home runs allowed (168).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers did not allow a run on Wednesday and Thursday (12.0 ip), marking the first time they went consecutive games without yielding a run in over a year (Aug. 23-24, 2015)...are 3-0 with a 2.82 ERA (12 er in 38.1 ip) over the last seven games but are 40-62 with a 4.88 ERA (434 er in 800.0 ip) for the season...have thrown the

fewest innings in the AL, rank second in highest ERA and fewest wins, and have the third most losses.

SCORING MARGIN: Four of the A's last five wins have been by eight runs or more...had just four such wins over the first 142 games...are 20-36 (.357) in games decided by four or more runs compared to 45-47 (.489) in games decided by three runs or fewer...the 20 wins by four runs or more are the third fewest in the majors (Atlanta, 16; Miami, 19) and the winning percentage is the worst in the American League and third worst in the majors...are 23-24 (.489) in one-run games and rank fourth in the AL in one-run decisions (47)...have a run differential of -92, which is second worst in the AL (Minnesota, -143)...the last time the A's were outscored by more than 62 runs in a season was in 1997 (-182).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have 33 players on the active roster...have used 51 players for the season, which is tied for third most in Oakland history (used 52 last year and 54 in 2007)...that includes 19 rookies, which ties the 2012 and 2015 A's for second most in Oakland history (21 in 2008)...have employed 27 pitchers, which ties the 1915 Philadelphia A's and 1955 Kansas City A's for second most in Athletics history to the record of 30 set last year...12 of the 27 have been rookies, which ties the Oakland record for most rookie pitchers in a season (2009, 2012, 2015)...the A's have had at least three rookies in the starting lineup (including the pitcher) in each of the last 16 games...have had at least four rookies in the lineup 19 times this year, including a season-high five six times (Aug. 5, 14 and 21; Sept. 13, 14, and 17)...the A's have made a total of 178 player moves in 167 days dating back to Opening Day.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have lost 19 of the last 26 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 16-24 (.400) in those games for the season, which is the worst record in the American League and third worst in the majors...are averaging 2 hours and 57 minutes per game, which is the fastest in the majors...are one of just three teams averaging under three hours per game (Kansas City and Toronto)...the A's were officially eliminated from the AL West race in Game 140 and from the Wild Card race with Friday's loss.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list an Oakland-record 27 times and those players have combined to miss an Oakland-record 1633 games (60.5 games per stint)...currently have 13 players on the DL, including 11 on the 60-day DL...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4 (including a season-high 16 from Aug. 22-28)... prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's trail in the season series, 7-8...are 3-5 in Texas and 4-3 in Oakland...won each of the first four games this year but have lost eight of 11 since then...the A's have won three of the previous four season series and are 47-44 against Texas over the last five years...are 339-351 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 177-167 in Oakland and 162-184 in Texas...are 95-96 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 436-433 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's have scored 60 runs over their last six road games, which is the most since May 3-9, 2000 (also 60)...the club record is 68...the five wins on their current trip matches their season high for a road trip of any length... *Ryon Healy* has hit safely in each of his last eight games and is 16-for-33 (.485) with four doubles, three home runs, nine RBI, and six multiple hit games over that span...his OPS over his current eight-game hitting streak is 1.419...he is second in the AL in September batting average (.390) and on-base percentage (.438).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1930 the A's clinch their second consecutive AL Championship with a 14-10 win over Chicago...in 1982 the A's strand a club record 17 baserunners in a nine inning game but come back to defeat Chicago 5-4 in the second game of a doubleheader...in 2000 Jason Giambi breaks Jose Canseco's single season RBI record as he drives in two runs in the A's 12-3 win at Baltimore...Giambi would go on to finish the season with 137 RBI...in 2002 Billy Koch saves his 40th game in the A's 7-4 win over Anaheim to become the first pitcher in major league history with 40 saves and 10 wins in the same season.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Ross Detwiler (1-3, 5.31 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville Aug. 10 and is 1-3 with a 5.25 ERA (21 er in 36.0 ip) in seven games, including six starts, with Oakland...tossed 8.0 shutout innings for the win in his first start but is 0-3 with a 6.75 ERA (21 er in 28.0 ip) in six games, including five starts, since then...has tossed fewer than five innings in three of those starts... was a non-roster invitee with Cleveland this spring and made the Indians Opening Day roster...logged a 5.79 ERA in seven relief appearances before he was designated for assignment April 29...was outrighted to Triple-A Columbus May 1 and traded to the A's organization in a minor league deal for cash considerations on July 17.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 1-3 with a 4.91 ERA (18 er in 33.0 ip) in his six starts compared to 0-0 with a 7.04 ERA (6 er in 7.2 ip) in eight relief appearances...has allowed 1-of-4 (25.0%) inherited runners to score and first batters faced are 2-for-7 (.286) with a walk...made 69 starts with Washington from 2009-13 but has just 13 since then, including seven with Texas last year and six with the A's this year...has made 187 career appearances with Washington (2007, 09-14), Texas (2015), Atlanta (2015), Cleveland (2016) and Oakland (2016)...is 18-37 with a 4.30 ERA (212 er in 443.1 ip) in his 82 career starts and 4-3 with a 4.16 ERA (59 er in 127.2 ip) in 105 career relief appearances.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 0-3 with a 6.31 ERA (18 er in 25.2 ip) in six games on the road compared to 1-0 with a 3.60 ERA (6 er in 15.0 ip) in eight games in his home ballparks...now has a six-game losing streak on the road dating back to his last road win on July 12, 2014 at Philadelphia while pitching for Washington...has a 6.94 ERA (54 er in 70.0 ip) and .326 (94-for-288) opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spans 38 games, including nine starts.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 1-3 with a 6.35 ERA (20 er in 28.1 ip) and .319 (38-for-119) opponents batting average in nine games at night compared to 0-0 with a 2.92 ERA (4 er in 12.1 ip) and .186 (8-for-43) opponents batting average in five games during the day...has allowed all four of his home runs at night.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has surrendered all four of his home runs and issued 13 of his 16 walks to right-handed hitters...has allowed just one extra base hit to a left-handed hitter (double) for a .273 slugging percentage... has a .457 slugging percentage against right-handers...three of his four home runs have come over his first 15 pitches in a game...has allowed a .233 (21-for-90) batting average with the bases empty compared to .347 (25-for-72) with three of his four home runs with runners on base...opponents are batting .349 (15-for-43) with runners in scoring position.

2016 START-BY-START: Combined with Axford on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win over Baltimore on Aug. 10 in Oakland...tossed a careerhigh eight innings and allowed six of the hits...matched his career high with 108 pitches...did not walk a batter...is the third pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least 8.0 scoreless innings in his A's debut (Mike Norris, 9.0 on April 10, 1975 and Tommy Milone, 8.0 on April 9, 2012)...allowed four base runners to advance into scoring position but retired each of the final 12 batters that he faced...it was his first win as a starter since May 10, 2013 against Chicago (NL)...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-2 loss at Texas on Aug. 15...the A's scored single runs in each of the first two innings and he blanked the Rangers on two hits and two walks over the first three innings...then allowed a RBI single to Andrus in the fourth and a grand slam to Beltre in the fifth for the loss...was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-2 loss at Chicago (AL) Aug. 20...allowed a solo home run to Abreu in the first, RBI singles to Sanchez and Anderson in the second, two runs in the third highlighted by a Cabrera RBI double and one more run in the fourth on a Cabrera RBI single...left after four innings trailing 6-0... lost his third consecutive start in the A's 3-1 loss at St. Louis Aug. 26... allowed a two-run home run to Gyorko in the bottom of the first but the A's came back with a run in the second inning...that would be the A's only run of the game...was relieved by Dull with one out and runners on first and third in the sixth inning...Dull allowed one of the runs to score...had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss at Houston Aug. 31...struck out a career-high tying seven batters...retired nine of the 10 batters he faced over the first three innings...had a 3-0 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Correa in the fourth...then retired nine of the batters he faced over his final three innings, including each of the last seven...was relieved by Hendriks to start the eighth with the A's leading 3-1 and Hendriks allowed three runs for the blown save and loss.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 16-3 win at Kansas City on Monday...the A's scored three times in the third inning but he allowed three in the bottom of the third on a two-run double by Orlando and a RBI single by Morales...Oakland added three more runs in the fourth and one in the fifth to take a 7-3 lead but he was relieved by Coulombe to start the bottom of the fifth after tossing 81 pitches in 4.0 innings.

MINORS: Went 2-4 with a 4.60 ERA in 12 starts with Triple-A Columbus in the Indians farm system...was assigned to Triple-A Nashville following his July 17 trade and went 4-0 with a 3.86 ERA in four games, including three starts, with the Sounds...combined for a 6-4 record and a 4.40 ERA in 16 games, 15 starts, overall at Triple-A...issued 21 walks in 62.2 innings with the Clippers (3.02 per nine innings) but then walked just four batters in 23.1 innings with the Sounds (1.54 per nine innings)...allowed a .256 opponents batting average, including .252 (58-for-230) against right-handed hitters compared to .265 (26-for-98) against left-handed hitters... opponents batted .229 with the bases empty compared to .301 with runners on base...allowed a .357 average with runners in scoring position with Columbus, .118 with Nashville...went 0-4 with a 5.84 ERA over his first eight starts through June 11...finished the Triple-A portion of his campaign by going 6-0 with a 3.31 ERA over his final eight games, seven starts.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jharel Cotton (1-0, 1.50 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville September 7 and is scheduled to make his third start of the season and his career...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-4 A's win at Kansas City on Tuesday (5.2 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 1 r, 1 bb, 2 so)...is the seventh starting pitcher in Oakland history to allow one earned run or fewer in each of his first two Major League games (last: Vin Mazzaro in 2009)...began the season at Triple-A Oklahoma City in the Dodgers organization and went 8-5 with a 4.90 ERA in 22 games, including 16 starts...was traded to the A's with Frankie Montas and Grant Holmes for Rich Hill and Josh Reddick on August 1...was assigned to Nashville where he went 3-1 with a 2.82 ERA in six starts...combined for an 11-6 record and a 4.31 ERA in 28 games, 22 starts...led the PCL and tied for 12th in all of minor league baseball with a career-high 155 strikeouts.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

25-21, 4.00 ERA (227 er in 510.1 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 40-for-59 (67.8%)

- The A's bullpen has allowed one run or less in 18 of its last 26 games... however, has allowed three runs or more in the eight other games for a 4.45 ERA (45 er in 91.0 ip) over that span (since Aug. 20).
- Has allowed 62-of-230 (27.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the American League (Cleveland, 25.7%) and fifth best in the majors.
- Ranks second in the AL in innings pitched (510.1), fourth in strikeouts (488) and fifth in opponents on-base percentage (.309) and slugging percentage (.385)...is fourth in most blown saves (19) and most wild pitches (31), and tied for fifth in most walks (176).
