OAKLAND ATHLETICS (66-84) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (79-71)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won six of the last eight games after losing nine of their previous 12 contests...are 66-84 (.440) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...it is two games ahead of last year (64-86, lost game 151)...have clinched a losing record for the second consecutive season (went 68-94 last year)...this is the first time the A's have finished with a losing record in back-to-back seasons since they had three straight from 2007-09...are in fourth place in the AL West and have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent 128 of 165 days this year in fourth or worst (65 days in fourth, 18 days tied for fourth and 45 days in fifth).

OFFENSE: The A's scored two runs on three hits in the first game of the homestand last night after batting .311 and averaging 9.3 runs per game on the last road trip...have five straight multiple homer games (12 home runs total), which is one short of the Oakland record for consecutive games with two or more homers (6, four times, last: Sept. 18-23, 2013)...rank last in the American League in runs (617), on-base percentage (.306) and slugging percentage (.398)...have finished last in the AL in runs four times in Oakland history (1977-79, 2008), last in on-base percentage five times (1977-79, 1994, 2008) and last in slugging percentage six times (1977-79, 1994, 2008-09)...are also last in the AL in hit by pitches (33), second in fewest walks (406), fewest strikeouts (1050) and fewest sacrifice hits (13), third in lowest batting average (.248) and fewest stolen bases (48) and fourth in fewest home runs (161) and fewest extra base hits (424)...the 13 sacrifice hits are currently the fewest in Athletics history...the record is 14 last year...are on pace for 438 walks, which would be second fewest in Oakland history in a non-strike season (433 in 1978, 472 in 1968)...the A's .306 on-base percentage is currently fourth lowest in Oakland history and is the lowest since 1979 (.302).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 30 runs in the last nine games (28 er in 80.2 ip, 3.12 ERA) after yielding 57 runs over the previous eight contests (6.38 ERA)...have a 3.92 ERA (111 er in 254.2 ip) over the last 29 games and a 4.52 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have not finished in the bottom two in the AL in ERA since 1997 when they were last...have not finished the year with an ERA above 4.28 since 2000 (4.58)...have 1100 strikeouts, which is fourth fewest in the AL but eighth most in Athletics history (1117 in 2001 is seventh)...have allowed 169 home runs, which is third fewest in the AL...however, it is eighth most in Oakland history (172 in 1985 and 2015 are tied for sixth)...have 66 wild pitches, which is third most in the AL and fifth most in Oakland history (72 in 1979, 71 in 1989, 68 in 1998, 67 in 1992)...have the third highest opponents batting average in the AL (.264).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-0 with a 2.36 ERA (9 er in 34.1 ip) over the last six games...the four-game winning streak matches the longest of the season...are now 8-7 with a 3.42 ERA (53 er in 139.1 ip) over the last 26 games but are 41-62 with a 4.85 ERA (437 er in 811.1 ip) for the season...the 811.1 innings pitched are second fewest in the American League (Los Angeles, 810.2)...the A's have finished with fewer than 900 innings pitched by their starters in a non-strike season twice in Oakland history (858.2 in 1997, 888.0 in 2009)...the 41 wins are also second fewest in the AL...starters have not won fewer than 47 games since 1997 when they had 29...rank third in the AL in highest ERA (4.85) and most losses (62)...starters have not finished with an ERA above 4.76 since 1999 (4.96).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 92 errors, which is second most in the American League...rank fourth with 145 double plays...A's outfielders have 13 assists over the last 37 games after tallying 14 over the first 113 games.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on their final homestand of the season against Houston (0-1) and Texas (three games)...have lost each of their last four home games and are 33-43 (.434) at home for the season, which is the second worst home record in the American League...need one more win to match their home win total from last year...however, will finish with a losing record at home in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1996-98 when they did it three straight years (went 34-47 last year)...it is just the fourth time it has happened in Oakland history (1977-79 and 1993-94)...are batting .237 (591-for-2494) and are averaging 3.62 (275 r in 76 g) runs per game at home compared to .258 with 4.62 runs per game on the road...have the fewest runs scored at home in the AL and the third lowest batting average...the runs per game at home are currently fourth fewest in Oakland history and the batting average is sixth lowest...have a 4.18 ERA

(316 er in 681.0 ip) at home, which is currently the seventh highest home ERA in Oakland history...went 6-1 on the last road trip to Kansas City (4-0) and Texas (2-1), which tied for the seventh best road trip in Oakland history (min. six games)...it was their best since going 6-0 against Houston and Los Angeles (AL), April 5-11, 2013...are 33-41 (.446) on the road and have clinched a losing record on the road for the third consecutive season (40-41 in 2014, 34-47 in 2015) and eighth time in the last 10 years.

SCORING MARGIN: Four of the A's last six wins have been by eight runs or more...had just four such wins over the first 142 games...are 20-36 (.357) in games decided by four or more runs compared to 46-48 (.489) in games decided by three runs or fewer...the wins and record in games decided by four runs or more are the worst in the American League and third worst in the majors...are 23-24 (.489) in one-run games and rank fourth in the AL in one-run decisions (47)...have a run differential of -91, which is second worst in the AL (Minnesota, -144)...the last time the A's were outscored by more than 62 runs in a season was in 1997 (-182).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have 33 players on the active roster (including Andrew Triggs who is out for the season)...have employed an Oakland record tying 12 rookie pitchers (2009, 2012, 2015) and they have a combined 201 games pitched, which is fourth most in Oakland history (319 in 2012, 232 in 2009, 203 in 2008)...rookie pitchers have made 56 starts, including 10 of the last 14...have used 19 rookies overall and have had at least three rookies in the starting lineup (including the pitcher) in each of the last 18 games...started a season-high six rookies last night...have started five or more rookies seven times this year and four or more 22 times...have made a total of 178 player moves in 169 days dating back to Opening Day.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are averaging 2 hours and 57 minutes per game, which is the fastest in the majors...are one of just three teams averaging under three hours per game (Kansas City and Toronto, 2:58)...are 5-4 in extra inning games and the nine games are currently tied for the fewest in Oakland history in a non-strike season (1974, 1975)...A's pinch hitters are 4 for their last 44 (.091)...rank second in the AL in hits (21), RBI (16) and plate appearances (118) but have the fewest walks (3).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list an Oakland-record 27 times and those players have combined to miss an Oakland-record 1659 games (61.4 games per stint)...currently have 13 players on the DL, including 11 on the 60-day DL...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4 (including a season-high 16 from Aug. 22-28)...prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's have lost the season series for the second consecutive season as they trail 6-11 with two games remaining...went 9-10 last year after winning each of the first four season series...now have a five-game losing streak, which is their longest ever against the Astros...are 4-3 in Oakland this year and went 2-8 in Houston...have won nine of the last 13 games in the Coliseum but have lost 10 of the last 12 at Minute Maid Park...lead the all-time series 46-34...17 of the 34 losses have been by one run...are 25-14 in Oakland and 21-20 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis was named American League Co-Player of the Week yesterday...is the fifth player in Oakland history (Canseco, Giambi, Jackson and McGwire) and seventh in Athletics history (Foxy, Zernial) to hit 40 home runs...is the first since Jason Giambi hit 43 in 2000...**Ryon Healy** hit his 11th home run of the season last night, which is tied for fourth most in Oakland history by a player over the first 60 games of his career...now has a 10-game hitting streak (19-for-42, .452) and is batting .382 (26-for-68) in September...**Marcus Semien** has 26 home runs, which ranks second among ML shortstops (Story, COL 27) and fifth in Athletics history among shortstops...has combined with Davis for 66 home runs, which are the most by an A's duo since Frank Thomas and Nick Swisher had 74 in 2006.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1902** the A's clinch their first American League Pennant...in **1975** Vida Blue wins 20 games for the third time in his career as he pitches eight innings in the A's 16-4 win at Kansas City...he would go on to win each of his final two starts to finish at 22-11...in **1991** Rickey Henderson walks for the 776th time in an A's uniform, breaking Sal Bando's Oakland career record...Henderson would finish his A's career with 1227 walks.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (6-9, 4.23 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Tossed 5.0 shutout innings for the win in his last start after missing 15 days with a strained left rhomboid...is now 4-5 with a 3.07 ERA (26 er in 76.1 ip) in 13 games, including 12 starts, since he was reinstated from the disabled list June 29...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day DL June 14 with a left pronator strain...was selected from Triple-A Nashville April 29 and is making his Major League debut.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Ranks second among American League rookies in strikeouts (109), innings pitched (125.2) and games started (21) and tied for sixth in wins (6)...the strikeouts are tied for 10th most in Oakland history by a rookie.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Left-handed hitters are 2-for-20 (.100) against him over his last seven games and they are batting .170 (15-for-88) with five extra base hits (two doubles, three home runs) overall...right-handers are batting .276 (108-for-391) with 16 of his 19 home runs and 29 of his 33 walks...the batting average against lefties is second lowest in the majors among pitchers with 125 or more innings (Kershaw, LAD .153) and his .511 OPS is third lowest (Kershaw, .345; Duffy, KC .451)...has a .794 OPS against righties.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 1.81 ERA (13 er in 64.2 ip) and .216 (50-for-232) opponents batting average over innings one through three and a 6.79 ERA (46 er in 61.0 ip) and .296 (73-for-247) opponents batting average from the fourth inning on...has allowed three runs in the first inning (21.0 ip, 1.29 ERA), all on May 10 at Boston...his first inning ERA is second lowest in the majors among pitchers with at least 20 innings (Tanaka, NYY 1.20)...using the same minimum, it is third lowest in Oakland history (Catfish Hunter, 0.66 in 1974; Ray Burris, 0.96 in 1984)...has allowed just four runs in innings one through three in 13 games since returning from the DL June 29 (2 er in 38.0 ip, 0.47 ERA) and just four runs over the first four innings of his last nine starts (2 er in 35.1 ip, 0.51 ERA).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-3 with a 3.26 ERA (28 er in 77.1 ip) in 13 games at home compared to 1-6 with a 5.77 ERA (31 er in 48.1 ip) in eight starts on the road...has surrendered 10 home runs in 48.1 innings on the road (1.86 per nine innings), nine in 77.1 innings in Oakland (1.05 per nine innings)...has an .821 OPS on the road, .688 at home.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .205 (18-for-88) with runners in scoring position, including .146 (6-for-41) with RISP and two outs...the marks with RISP is seventh lowest in the American League among pitchers with 125 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, he has the highest opponents batting average in the AL against the opponents number four hitter (22-for-58, .379) and the fourth lowest against the number three hitter (10-for-53, .189)...opponents are 35-for-76 (.461) with eight doubles, six home runs and 21 RBI when putting the first pitch in play...using the 125 inning minimum, the batting average and slugging percentage (.803) are fifth highest in the AL...has a .216 (40-for-185) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .249 (44-for-177) the second time and .333 (39-for-117) with 10 of his 19 home runs after that.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Made his Major League debut on **April 29** and had a no decision in a 7-4 A's win over Houston...had just 42 minor league appearances, all starts, in three professional seasons...became the 45th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the first since Dan Straily on Aug. 3, 2012 against Toronto...left with an 8-4 lead in his second start on **May 4** against Seattle but the bullpen allowed two runs in the sixth inning and three more in the seventh for the blown save (Axford)...yielded a career-high eight runs on 10 hits in a career-low 2.2 innings for the first decision of his career, a loss in a 13-5 decision at Boston **May 10**...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to allow at least four runs in each of his first three Major League appearances...the other is Vida Blue (July 20-Aug. 3, 1969)...picked up his first Major League win in the A's 3-1 victory over Texas **May 16** in Oakland...had a 10-2 lead when he left the game on **June 13** against Texas after 4.1 innings with a left pronator muscle strain...went on the DL the next day...tossed a career-high 106 pitches in 7.0 innings and did not allow a run or walk a batter on **July 10** at Houston...ended up with a no decision in the A's 2-1, 10-inning loss...made his first career relief appearance **July 17** against Toronto...entered the game to start the second inning in relief of Andrew Triggs, who left the game with a left shin contusion...Triggs relieved Rich Hill who left after five pitchers with a blister...Manaea had been scheduled to start two days later...tossed 5.0 innings, which is a season-high for an A's reliever...had a no decision in the A's 1-0, 13-inning win over Tampa Bay **July 22** in Oakland...tossed a career-high 8.0 scoreless innings and allowed just five hits and no walks, but Odorizzi did the same for the Rays...struck out a career-high nine batters in 6.2 innings in a no decision at Texas **July 27**...walked Escobar with two outs in the fifth inning on **August 2** at Los Angeles to

snap a streak of four games, 30.2 innings and 126 batters faced without a walk from July 10 to Aug. 2...the streak of 30.2 innings without a walk was the longest single season streak in Oakland history, topping the previous mark of 29.0 by Lary Sorensen (July 8-31, 1984)...it was fifth longest overall in Oakland history...left his start on **August 29** at Houston after 3.1 innings with a strained left rhomboid.

LAST START: He combined with Axford, Hendriks and Smith on a four-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win at Kansas City last Wednesday...tossed five of the innings and allowed three of the hits...it was his first career win on the road and snapped a career-opening six-game road losing streak, which matched the longest such streak in Oakland history (Mike Morgan, June 17, 1978-July 24, 1979)...allowed just one base runner to advance into scoring position and retired each of the final eight batters he faced.

inning but the A's came back with two in the bottom of the second...allowed a RBI single to Gattis in the sixth to tie the game and was relieved by Doolittle with no outs and runners on first and second...Doolittle allowed both runs to score but the A's tied the game in the eighth and won it on a three-run home run by Alonso in the ninth...also had a no decision in the A's 2-1, 10-inning loss at Houston on July 10...tossed a career-high 106 pitches in 7.0 innings and did not allow a run or walk a batter...left with a 1-0 lead but Madson allowed a run in the ninth for the blown save and Hendriks surrendered a run in the 10th for the loss...took the loss in a 6-0 decision at Houston on August 29...left the game after 3.1 innings with a strained left rhomboid...issued back-to-back bases loaded walks to Marisnick and Springer in the second inning but both of the runs were unearned.
