THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY: SEPT. 20

2007 - Rookie catcher **J.R. Towles** sets a franchise record by tallying 8 RBI in an 18-1 Astros win in St. Louis.

<u>1986</u> - Mike Scott begins a club-record run of 16.0 straight hitless innings by retiring the final 6 hitters he faces in 10-6 win over SD... he then no-hits the Giants in his next start.

TODAY'S MEDIA AVAILABILITY The Astros clubhouse will be open from 4:00-4:50 p.m...manager A.J. Hinch will be available in the Astros dugout at approx. 4:50 p.m. **TONIGHT'S GAME:** The Astros, winners of 4 of their last 5 games, continue the final leg of their 6-game road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Oakland (1-0) tonight with the 2nd of 3 games against the A's...rookie **RHP Joe Musgrove** (3-4) will try to pitch Houston to a series victory opposite fellow rookie starter **LHP Sean Manaea** (6-9) and the A's.

MIGHTY JDE YDUNG: RHP Joe Musgrove enters tonight's game coming off consecutive quality starts against 1st place opponents...he held the Cubs to 2 runs on 3 hits in 6.0 innings on Sept. 9, before leading the Astros to an 8-4 win over the Rangers on Wednesday (3ER/6.1IP).

STRAIGHT A'S: The Astros have won their last 5 games vs. the A's, which includes a 3-game sweep in Houston from Aug. 29-31...this marks Houston's longest winning streak against the A's in club history.

DIVISION FOES: The Astros are facing AL West opponents in their final 19 games of the season, a stretch that began on Monday against the Rangers (1-2) and has continued this road trip with Seattle (2-1) and Oakland (1-0)...the Astros will face the A's (2g), Angels (7g) and Mariners (3g) to finish their campaign, a trio that the Astros have combined to go 32-13 (.711) against this season.

VS. DAKLAND: The Astros have gone 29-21 against the A's since April 26, 2014, which includes season series victories over Oakland in 2015 (10-9) and 2016 (11-6 thus far with 2 to play)...Houston's 29-21 record in its last 50 games opposite Oakland represents a stark difference from the 1st 30 matchups, with the Astros going just 5-25 in those contests.

LAST NIGHT'S WIN: The Astros completed a thrilling, 4-2, come-from-behind victory over the A's last night in the series opener...PH Tyler White (1x1) tied the game in the 8th with a pinch-hit, RBI-double, his 3rd pinch hit double of the season...in the 9th inning, **1B** Marwin Gonzalez hit a 2-run single with the bases loaded to put Houston ahead...RHP Brad Peacock (2ER/5.1IP) had a solid outing while the bullpen held Oakland scoreless over 3.2 innings.

CLUTCH CITY: With last night's pinch-hit double, **Tyler White** has gone 4x11 (.364) with 3 doubles and 3 RBI as a pinch-hitter...that gives him the most pinch-hit doubles in the AL and ties a rookie franchise record set by **Russ Johnson** in 1999.

PEACOCK SOARING: Last night was **Brad Peacock's** 10th consecutive Major League start in which he allowed 3 earned runs or less (dating back to 2014)...in his 3 starts this year, he owns a 2.40 ERA (4ER/15IP).

TALE OF TWO SEASONS: The Astros are 62-43 (.590) since May 23, which has come after the club bottomed out with a 17-28 record after a loss on May 22...it's been an uphill battle for the Astros all season, as the club started 7-17 in April and has since recovered to go 72-54 (.571) in 126 games since.

IN THE STANDINGS: There are 5 teams within 3.0 games of the 2 AL Wild Card Spots, with the Astros entering tonight 3.0 games back of both Toronto and Baltimore.

BRINGIN' THE HITS: With a Major League leading 199 hits, **2B Jose Altuve** needs 1 more to reach 200 for the 3rd consecutive season...last player with 3 consecutive 200-hit seasons: **Ichiro Suzuki**, 10 straight from 2001-10...last right-handed hitter with 3 straight: **Michael Young**, 5 straight 200-hit seasons (2003-07).

MVP CALIBER: Jose Altuve leads the AL in average (.337) and in hits (199), ranks T-2nd in doubles (40), T-3rd in steals (27), 3rd in WAR (7.7), 4th in OBP (.396), 4th in total bases (321) and 4th in OPS (.940).

DUT WEST: Houston has fared well on the road over the last 3 months, posting a 25-17 road record dating back to June 14 (tops in MLB in that span)...on the season, Houston ranks 2nd in the AL in runs per game on the road (4.96) behind Boston (5.10).

FLYING HIGH: Jose Altuve has hit .376 (112x298) with a 1.005 OPS (.441 OBP/.564 SLG) on the road this year...the last Major League players with road batting averages this high in a single season: Ichiro Suzuki (.405 in 2004) and Barry Bonds (.386 in 2002).

MR. SEPTEMBER: Tomorrow's starter, **RHP Collin McHugh**, is 2-0 with a 3.31 ERA this month, and has gone undefeated in 12 September starts as an Astro (since 2014), posting a 10-0 record and a 3.08 ERA... his 10 September wins in that span rank 2nd in the AL behind **LHP David Price** (11-2).

THE PRODIGY: On Sunday, **Carlos Correa** joined **Alex Rodriguez** as the only shortstops in Major League history to hit 20 homers twice through their age-21 seasons (ESPN Stats & Info).

YEAR OF THE WHIFF: The Astros pitching staff has set a club record for strikeouts in a season (1,288)... the Astros rank 3rd in the AL in strikeouts, while the bullpen leads the AL with 564, also a club record.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY!: The Astros would like to send happy birthday wishes to closer **Ken Giles** (26) and TV broadcaster **Bill Brown** (69)...they share their birthday with Game of Thrones author **George R. R. Martin** and actor **Jon Bernthal**, who starred in the popular TV shows The Walking Dead and Daredevil.

- **LAST START 9/14 VS. TEX:** gave the Astros a much-needed quality start in the club's 8-4 win over the Rangers last Wednesday in Houston... tossed 6.1 innings, allowing 3 runs on 5 hits, while fanning 7 and allowing 2 walks...earned his 3rd career victory.
- threw 106 pitches in the contest, 79 of which were strikes...were his most pitches thrown in a game since 8/12/15 at Arkansas while with the Double A Corpus Christi Hooks
- **WHAT TO KNOW ABOUT JDE:** 23-year-old rookie is set to make his 10th career Major League appearance, and 9th career start.
- was recalled from Triple A on 8/1 for his 1st career stint in the Major Leagues...was added to the Astros 40-man roster this offseason.
- at the time of his promotion, was ranked by *Baseball America* as the No. 3 prospect in Houston's system, and the No. 32 overall prospect in baseball.
- was acquired by Houston from Toronto as part of a 10-player trade on 7/20/12...the Astros acquired 7 players in the deal (5 prospects) in exchange for Major League players LHP J.A. Happ, RHP Brandon Lyon and RHP David Carpenter.
- originally drafted by Toronto in the supplemental 1st round (46th overall) of the 2011 draft out of Grossmont High School in El Cajon, Calif.
- **HOMEBOY:** has had most of his success at home thus far in his short Major League career...has given up just 6 runs in 29 innings (1.86 ERA) at the venue between 5 appearances (4 starts)...owns an 8.71 ERA (20ER/20.2IP) on the road.
- is the 2nd Astros pitcher over the last 10 seasons to allow 3 runs or less in each of his first 4 career starts at home...RHP Lance McCullers is currently in the midst of a franchise-record, 20-game streak to start his career.
- **VS. DAK:** faced the A's once since his recall, earning the win on 8/29 in Houston after tossing 5.1 scoreless innings, while allowing just 3 hits and 3 walks with 7 strikeouts.

MIGHTY JDE YDUNG: has struck out 47 batters and walked 13 across his first 9 games in the Major Leagues.

- showcased impeccable command in the minors, as he never walked more than 2 batters in any game during his minor league career...he continued that trend through his 1st 5 Major League outings before walking 3 hitters for the 1st time in his professional career on 8/29 vs. OAK.
- walked just 10 batters in 85.1 minor league innings (1.05 walks per 9.0 innings) in 2016 between Triple A (10g) and Double A (6g)...put up a 1.09 walks per 9.0 innings ratio (41BB/337.1IP) in 76 career games in the minors.
- **BUSY YEAR:** has compiled 135.0 innings pitched this season between the Majors (49.2) and minor leagues (85.1), by far a career high...has increased his innings total in each of the last 5 seasons: 2012 (17.0 IP), 2013 (32.2 IP), 2014 (77.0 IP), 2015 (100.2 IP).
- **SHOWTIME:** had an incredible Major League debut on 8/2 vs. TOR against his former organization...tossed 4.1 scoreless innings of relief, allowing just 1 hit and 1 walk while striking out 8 in Houston's 2-1 loss.
- set a Major League record for strikeouts by a reliever in a Major League debut...also set a franchise record for most scoreless relief innings in a Major League debut, which was previously held by RHP Jose Cisnero (3.2 IP on 4/22/13).
