OAKLAND ATHLETICS (66-85) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (80-71)

WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 21, 2016 — OAKLAND ALAMEDA COLISEUM — 12:35 P.M. PDT RHP DANIEL MENGDEN (2-7, 5.68) VS. RHP COLLIN MCHUGH (11-10, 4.66) MLB NETWORK — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost the first two games of the homestand after going 6-1 on the last road trip...are 66-85 (.437) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...it is two games ahead of last year (64-87, lost game 152)...have clinched a losing record for the second consecutive season (went 68-94 last year)...this is the first time the A's have finished with a losing record in back-to-back seasons since they had three straight from 2007-09...are in fourth place in the AL West and trail first place Texas by 23½ games, which is one game short of the season high of 24½ on Sept. 3...have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent 129 of 166 days this year in fourth or worst (66 days in fourth, 18 days tied for fourth and 45 days in fifth).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's fell to 15-17 in games decided in the last at bat with the loss last night...it was the eighth time in 18 games against Houston the game has been decided in the last at bat and the A's are 2-6 in those games...fell to 5-5 (.500) in extra inning games and last night was just the A's 10th extra inning game of the season...the Oakland record for fewest extra inning games in a non-strike season will remain at nine (1974 and 1975)...are now 23-25 (.479) in one-run games and rank fourth in the American League in one-run decisions (48) and losses.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored three runs on six hits over the first two games of the homestand...scored at least three runs in an inning 15 times on the last road trip when they batted .311 and averaged 9.3 runs per game in seven games...rank last in the AL in runs (618), on-base percentage (.305) and slugging percentage (.396)...have finished last in the AL in runs four times in Oakland history (1977-79, 2008), last in on-base percentage five times (1977-79, 1994, 2008) and last in slugging percentage six times (1977-79, 1994, 2008-09)...are also last in the AL in hit by pitches (33), second in fewest walks (411), fewest strikeouts (1060), fewest stolen bases (48) and fewest sacrifice hits (13), third in lowest batting average (.247) and fourth in fewest home runs (161) and fewest extra base hits (424)...the 13 sacrifice hits are currently the fewest in Athletics history...the record is 14 last year...are on pace for 440 walks, which would be second fewest in Oakland history in a non-strike season (433 in 1978, 472 in 1968)...the A's .305 on-base percentage is currently fourth lowest in Oakland history (.302 in 1979, .303 in 1978, .304 in 1968, .306 in 1972).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 32 runs in the last 10 games (30 er in 90.2 ip, 2.98 ERA) after yielding 57 runs over the previous eight contests (6.38 ERA)...have a 3.84 ERA (113 er in 264.2 ip) over the last 30 games and a 4.50 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have not finished in the bottom two in the AL in ERA since 1997 when they were last...have not finished the year with an ERA above 4.28 since 2000 (4.58)...have 1110 strikeouts, which is fourth fewest in the AL but eighth most in Athletics history (1117 in 2001 is seventh)...have allowed 169 home runs, which is third fewest in the AL...however, it is eighth most in Oakland history (172 in 1985 and 2015 are tied for sixth)...have 66 wild pitches, which is tied for third most in the AL and is fifth most in Oakland history (72 in 1979, 71 in 1989, 68 in 1998, 67 in 1992)...have the third highest opponents batting average in the AL (.264).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-0 with a 2.01 ERA (9 er in 40.1 ip) over the last seven games...the four-game winning streak matches the longest of the season...are now 8-7 with a 3.28 ERA (53 er in 145.1 ip) over the last 27 games but are 41-62 with a 4.81 ERA (437 er in 817.1 ip) for the season...the 817.1 innings pitched are tied with Minnesota for second fewest in the American League (Los Angeles, 815.1)...the A's have finished with fewer than 900 innings pitched by their starters in a non-strike season twice in Oakland history (858.2 in 1997, 888.0 in 2009)...the 41 wins are second fewest in the AL...starters have not won fewer than 47 games since 1997 when they had 29...rank third in the AL in highest ERA (4.81) and most losses (62)...starters have not finished with an ERA above 4.76 since 1999 (4.96).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 92 errors, which is second most in the American League...rank fourth with 147 double plays...A's outfielders have 13 assists over the last 38 games after tallying 14 over the first 113 contests.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-2 on their final homestand of the season against Houston (0-2) and Texas (three games)...have a season-high tying five-game home losing streak (April 7-15 and May 19-27)...are 33-44 (.429) at home for the season, which is the second worst home record in

the American League...it is currently tied for third worst in Oakland history (.383 in 1979, .420 in 2015, .429 in 1994)...will finish with a losing record at home in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1996-98 when they did it three straight years (went 34-47 last year)...it is just the fourth time it has happened in Oakland history (1977-79 and 1993-94)...are batting .235 (594-for-2526) and are averaging 3.58 (276 r in 77 g) runs per game at home compared to .258 with 4.62 runs per game on the road...have the fewest runs scored at home in the AL and the third lowest batting average...the runs per game and batting average at home are currently fourth worst in Oakland history...went 6-1 on the last road trip to Kansas City (4-0) and Texas (2-1), which tied for the seventh best road trip in Oakland history (min. six games)...it was their best since going 6-0 against Houston and Los Angeles (AL), April 5-11, 2013...are 33-41 (.446) on the road and have clinched a losing record on the road for the third consecutive season (40-41 in 2014, 34-47 in 2015) and eighth time in the last 10 years.

SCORING MARGIN: Four of the A's last six wins have been by eight runs or more...had just four such wins over the first 142 games...are 20-36 (.357) in games decided by four or more runs compared to 46-49 (.484) in games decided by three runs or fewer...the wins and record in games decided by four runs or more are the worst in the American League and third worst in the majors...have a run differential of -92, which is second worst in the AL (Minnesota, -151)...the last time the A's were outscored by more than 62 runs in a season was in 1997 (-182).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have 33 players on the active roster (including Andrew Triggs who is out for the season)...have employed an Oakland record tying 12 rookie pitchers (2009, 2012, 2015) and they have a combined 202 games pitched, which is fourth most in Oakland history (319 in 2012, 232 in 2009, 203 in 2008)...rookie pitchers have made 57 starts, including 11 of the last 15...have used 19 rookies overall and have had at least three rookies in the starting lineup (including the pitcher) in each of the last 19 games...started a season-high six rookies Monday night...have started five or more rookies eight times this year and four or more 23 times...have made a total of 178 player moves in 170 days dating back to Opening Day.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list an Oaklandrecord 27 times and those players have combined to miss an Oaklandrecord 1672 games (61.9 games per stint)...currently have 13 players on the DL, including 11 on the 60-day DL...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4 (including a season-high 16 from Aug. 22-28)... prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's have lost the season series for the second consecutive season as they trail 6-12 entering the final game today...went 9-10 last year after winning each of the first four season series...now have a six-game losing streak, which is their longest ever against the Astros... are 4-4 in Oakland this year and went 2-8 in Houston...have won nine of the last 14 games in the Coliseum but have lost 10 of the last 12 at Minute Maid Park...lead the all-time series 46-35...18 of the 35 losses have been by one run...are 25-15 in Oakland and 21-20 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis was named American League Co-Player of the Week Monday...is the fifth player in Oakland history (Canseco, Giambi, Jackson and McGwire) and seventh in Athletics history (Foxx, Zernial) to hit 40 home runs...is the first since Jason Giambi hit 43 in 2000...*Ryon Healy* leads AL rookies in hits (69) since the All-Star Break, is tied for the lead in runs (31), ranks second in doubles (16) and home runs (11) and third in RBI (30)...*Marcus Semien* has 26 home runs, which ranks second among ML shortstops (Story, COL 27) and fifth in Athletics history among shortstops...has combined with Davis for 66 home runs, which are the most by an A's duo since Thomas and Swisher had 74 in 2006.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1970** Vida Blue no hits the Minnesota Twins in the A's 5-0 win at the Coliseum...only a fourth inning, two out walk to Harmon Killebrew prevented Blue from tossing a perfect game...in **1992** Dennis Eckersley becomes the second pitcher in baseball history to record 50 saves when he preserves Ron Darling's 6-5 win at Chicago...he would go on to save a franchise record 51 games and win both the AL MVP and Cy Young awards.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Mengden (2-7, 5.68 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville September 3 for his second stint with the A's this year and is 1-2 with a 5.52 ERA (9 er in 14.2 ip) in three starts since his return...was selected from Nashville June 11 and made his Major League debut that day at Cincinnati after just 43 minor league appearances, including 34 starts, in three professional seasons...went 1-5 with a 5.73 ERA in nine starts before he was optioned to Nashville July 26...had not pitched above Single-A prior to this year.

FIRST FOUR, NEXT SIX, LAST TWO: Went 1-3 with a 2.81 ERA and .221 opponents batting average in his four starts in June...then went 0-3 with a 10.52 ERA and .342 opponents batting average over his next six starts from July 3 to Sept. 3...is 1-1 with a 1.50 ERA (2 er in 12.0 ip) and .182 (8-for-44) opponents batting average in two starts since then.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 0-6 with a 6.95 ERA (26 er in 33.2 ip) in seven starts at home compared to 2-1 with a 4.25 ERA (14 er in 29.2 ip) in five starts on the road...the last A's pitcher to go winless with six or more decisions at home is Rip Coleman, who went 0-7 for the Kansas City A's in 1959... his six-game career-opening home losing streak is the longest in Oakland history, surpassing the previous mark of five by Steve Ontiveros (1985-86) and Dallas Braden (2007)...since 1913, it is the third longest by an Athletic and the longest since Wally Burnette had a seven-game streak (July 24-Sept. 9, 1956)...the longest is 11 by Bobby Hasty (Sept. 11, 1919-Aug. 11, 1921).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 0-5 with a 4.13 ERA (13 er in 28.1 ip) in five starts during the day compared to 2-2 with a 6.94 ERA (27 er in 35.0 ip) in seven starts at night...the five day losses are tied for sixth in the American League...his 0-5 record during the day is the worst in Oakland history among pitchers with at least five decisions during the day...the last A's pitcher to go 0-5 or worse during the day is Diego Segui, who went 0-9 in 1965.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for sixth among American League rookies in games started (12) and ranks 10th in strikeouts (63)...is 2-7 and his .222 winning percentage is tied for third lowest among all AL pitchers with at least 10 games started.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 2.63 ERA (7 er in 24.0 ip) and .225 (20-for-89) opponents batting average in innings one and two and an 7.55 ERA (33 er in 39.1 ip) and .293 (48-for-164) opponents average from the third inning on.

STRIKEOUTS: Has 63 strikeouts in 63.1 innings over the first 12 starts of his career (8.95 per nine innings)...since 1913, his 63 strikeouts are fourth most by an A's pitcher over the first 12 games of his career.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received 22 runs of support in his two wins (14.2 ip, 13.50 RSA) and just 17 runs of support in his other 10 starts (48.2 ip, 3.14 RSA).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .220 (22-for-100) opponents batting average and has surrendered one home run the first time through

the lineup...has a .301 (46-for-153) average and six home runs allowed after that...the opponents number five hitter is 3-for-30 (.100)...however, the seven through nine hitters are batting a combined .351 (26-for-74).

AL AND NL: Has made four of his 12 career starts against National League teams...is 1-3 with a 4.01 ERA (11 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts in interleague play compared to 1-4 with a 6.75 ERA (29 er in 38.2 ip) in eight starts against American League teams.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: He was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, a 2-1 A's loss at Cincinnati June 11...became the 46th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut and the first of those to take the loss since Brett Anderson on April 10, 2009 against Seattle...at the age of 23 years, 113 days, he became the youngest A's pitcher to start a game since Trevor Cahill on June 19, 2011 (23 years, 110 days)...struck out the first batter he faced (Cozart)...struck out a career high nine batters and tossed a careerhigh 108 pitches but fell to 0-3 in a 4-2 loss to Milwaukee June 22...joined Brad Rigby (1997) and Mike Morgan (1978) as the only three pitchers in Oakland history to lose each of the first three games of their career...is just the fourth Major League pitcher since 1913 to lose each of his first three career games while allowing three runs or fewer in each game...the others are Duane Pillette (1949 Yankees), Jim McAndrew (1968 Mets) and Kyle Drabek (2010 Blue Jays)...tossed a career-high 7.2 innings and picked up his first Major League win in his fourth start, an 8-3 victory at San Francisco June 27 ... retired each of the first 13 batters and shutout the Giants on two hits and a walk over the first seven innings...had an 8-0 lead when he

allowed his only two runs in the eighth inning...became the eighth pitcher in Oakland history to allow to allow three runs or fewer in each of his first four starts, the first since A.J. Griffin in 2012...fell to 1-4 with a loss in his fifth start on *July 3* against Pittsburgh...allowed four runs or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of his first five career starts...since 1913, the only other Major League pitcher to do that and lose at least four of those games is Tony Armas, who went 0-4 with a 2.97 ERA over his first five career starts with Montreal from Aug. 16, 1999-May 30, 2000...yielded a career-high seven runs in just 3.1 innings *July 15* against Toronto but had a no decision in a game the A's would come back to win 8-7...walked a career-high five batters in a 7-0 loss to Houston *July 20*...finished July 0-2 with a 9.00 ERA in five starts...that was the second highest July ERA in Oakland history among pitchers with 20 or more innings (Steve Karsay, 9.36 in 1997)...allowed a career-high tying seven runs on a career-high eight hits in a career-low 2.2 innings in an 11-2 loss to Boston on *Sept. 3*.

LAST START: He snapped his career-high four-game losing streak in the A's 14-5 win at Kansas City last Thursday...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and allowed just three hits without walking a batter...allowed just two base runners to advance into scoring position, both with two outs.

MINORS: Combined for a 10-2 record, a 1.46 ERA and .197 opponents batting average in 17 games, all starts, with Double-A Midland and Triple-A Nashville...tied for second in the A's farm system in wins...allowed just four home runs in 98.1 innings, an average of 0.37 per nine innings...struck out 95 and walked 29 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.28...began the season at Midland and went 2-0 with a 0.78 ERA in four starts before he was promoted to Nashville May 1...went 3-1 with a 1.39 ERA in seven starts with the Sounds before his promotion to Oakland on June 11...then went 5-1 with a 2.10 ERA in 3 starts overall at Nashville...his opponents batting average included a .190 (28-for-147) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .202 (41-for-203) against right-handers...yielded a .134 batting average with runners in scoring position...had a 1.19 ERA in the minors at the time of his first promotion to Oakland on June 11, which was sixth lowest in all of the minor leagues.

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Kendall Graveman (10-10, 4.21 ERA): Is 3-4 with a 4.31 ERA over his last 10 starts...however, is 9-4 with a 3.78 ERA over his last 20 starts after going 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts...has struck out just 99 batters in 173.1 innings, an average of 5.14 per nine innings...that is the third lowest mark in the American League and the lowest mark by an A's pitcher since Trevor Cahill in 2009 (4.53)...has a 1.86 ERA in the first inning, which is second lowest in the AL (min. 25.0 ip)...had a no decision in his last start, a 7-6 A's loss at Texas last Friday (5.1 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...left with a 6-3 lead but the bullpen blew the save for the fifth time this year in a Graveman start...is 1-1 with a 7.47 ERA (15.2 ip, 22 h, 14 r, 13 er, 4 bb, 8 so, 2 hr) in three career starts against Texas...is 3-4 with a 5.14 ERA in 13 starts against AL West competition this year compared to 7-6 with a 3.46 ERA in 16 starts against everyone else.
