OAKLAND ATHLETICS (66-86) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (90-63)

ABOUT THE A'S: Were swept by Houston in a three-game series to start the homestand after going 6-1 on the last road trip...are 66-86 (.434) for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...it is two games ahead of last year (64-88, lost game 153)...have clinched a losing record for the second consecutive season (went 68-94 last year)...this is the first time the A's have finished with a losing record in back-to-back seasons since they had three straight from 2007-09...are in fifth place in the AL West and trail first place Texas by 23½ games, which is one game short of the season high of 24½ on Sept. 3...have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent 131 of 168 days this year in fourth or worst (66 days in fourth, 19 days tied for fourth and 46 days in fifth).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .137 (13-for-95) with eight runs scored over the first three games of the homestand after batting .311 and averaging 9.3 runs per game in seven games on the last road trip...rank last in the American League in runs (623), on-base percentage (.305) and slugging percentage (.396)...have finished last in the AL in runs four times in Oakland history (1977-79, 2008), last in on-base percentage five times (1977-79, 1994, 2008) and last in slugging percentage six times (1977-79, 1994, 2008-09)...the .305 on-base percentage is currently fourth lowest in Oakland history (.302 in 1979, .303 in 1978, .304 in 1968, .306 in 1972)...are also last in the AL in hit by pitches (33), second in fewest walks (415), fewest strikeouts (1068), fewest stolen bases (48) and fewest sacrifice hits (13), third in lowest batting average (.247) and fourth in fewest home runs (161) and fewest extra base hits (428)...the 13 sacrifice hits are currently the fewest in Athletics history...the record is 14 last year...are on pace for 442 walks, which would be second fewest in Oakland history in a non-strike season (433 in 1978, 472 in 1968).

PITCHING: The A's compiled a 3.55 ERA over the first 27 games through May 2, a 5.09 ERA over an 82-game stretch from May 3 to Aug. 5 and a 4.00 ERA (169 er in 380.0 ip) over the last 43 contests...have a 4.51 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have not finished in the bottom two in the AL in ERA since 1997 when they were last...have not finished the year with an ERA above 4.28 since 2000 (4.58)...have 1120 strikeouts, which is third fewest in the AL but seventh most in Athletics history (1124 in 2009 is sixth, 1136 in 2012 is fifth)...have allowed 171 home runs, which is third fewest in the AL...however, it is eighth most in Oakland history (172 in 1985 and 2015 are tied for sixth)...have 68 wild pitches, which is third most in the AL and tied for third most in Oakland history (72 in 1979, 71 in 1989, 68 in 1998)...have the third highest opponents batting average in the AL (.261).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-1 with a 2.54 ERA (13 er in 46.0 ip) over the last eight games and 8-8 with a 3.40 ERA (57 er in 151.0 ip) over the last 28 games...are 41-63 with a 4.82 ERA (441 er in 823.0 ip) for the season...the 823.0 innings pitched are the fewest in the American League...the A's have finished with fewer than 900 innings pitched by their starters in a non-strike season twice in Oakland history (858.2 in 1997, 888.0 in 2009)...the 41 wins are second fewest in the AL...starters have not won fewer than 47 games since 1997 when they had 29...rank third in the AL in highest ERA (4.82) and most losses (63)...starters have not finished with an ERA above 4.76 since 1999 (4.96).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 92 errors, which is tied for second most in the American League...rank fourth with 147 double plays...A's outfielders have 13 assists over the last 39 games after tallying 14 over the first 113 contests.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have lost each of their last six home games, which matches their longest home losing streak over the last 15 years...have not lost more than six straight in the Coliseum since losing eight in a row from April 8-May 1, 2001...are 0-3 on the final homestand of the season against Houston (0-3) and Texas (three games)...are 33-45 (.423) at home for the season, which is the second worst home record in the American League...will finish with a losing record at home in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1996-98 when they did it three straight years (went 34-47 last year)...it is just the fourth time it has happened in Oakland history (1977-79 and 1993-94)...are batting .235 (601-for-2560) and are averaging 3.60 (281 r in 78 g) runs per game at home compared to .258 with 4.62 runs per game on the road...have the fewest runs scored and lowest

batting average at home in the AL...the batting average is currently tied for third lowest in Oakland history (.225 in 1979, .229 in 1989, .235 in 2012, .236 in 1977, .236 in 1972, .239 in 1971) and the runs per game are fourth lowest (3.23 in 1979, 3.51 in 1978, 3.57 in 1968, 3.73 in 1972)...went 6-1 on the last road trip to Kansas City (4-0) and Texas (2-1), which tied for the seventh best road trip in Oakland history (min. six games)...it was their best since going 6-0 against Houston and Los Angeles (AL), April 5-11, 2013...leave following the game Sunday for the final road trip of the season, a seven-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Seattle (four games)...are 33-41 (.446) on the road and have clinched a losing record on the road for the third consecutive season (40-41 in 2014, 34-47 in 2015) and eighth time in the last 10 years.

LEFT-HANDED STARTERS: The A's have lost 19 of the last 26 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 16-24 (.400) in those games for the season, which is the worst record in the American League and third worst in the majors.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's have lost each of the last two games by one run and five of their last seven losses have been by one run...are 23-26 (.469) in one-run games and rank fourth in the American League in one-run decisions (49) and losses...are 46-50 (.479) in games decided by three runs or fewer compared to 20-36 (.357) in games decided by four or more runs...the wins and record in games decided by four runs or more are the worst in the AL and third worst in the majors...have a run differential of -93, which is second worst in the AL (Minnesota, -160)...the last time the A's were outscored by more than 62 runs in a season was in 1997 (-182).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have 33 players on the active roster (including A. Alcantara, Triggs and Wendelken who are out for the season)...have employed an Oakland record tying 12 rookie pitchers (2009, 2012, 2015) and they have a combined 205 games pitched, which is third most in Oakland history (319 in 2012, 232 in 2009)...rookie pitchers have made 58 starts, including 12 of the last 16...have used 19 rookies overall and have had at least three rookies in the starting lineup (including the pitcher) in each of the last 20 games...started a season-high six rookies Monday night...have started five or more rookies nine times this year and four or more 24 times...have used the disabled list an Oakland-record 27 times and those players have combined to miss an Oakland-record 1685 games (62.4 games per stint)...currently have 13 players on the DL, including 11 on the 60-day DL.

A's vs. RANGERS: The season series is even at eight games each...the A's went 4-5 in Texas and are 4-3 in Oakland...have won three of the previous four season series and are 48-44 against Texas over the last five years...are 340-351 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 177-167 in Oakland and 163-184 in Texas...are 96-96 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 437-433 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis was named American League Co-Player of the Week Monday...is the fifth player in Oakland history (Canseco, Giambi, Jackson and McGwire) and seventh in Athletics history (Foxy, Zernial) to hit 40 home runs...is the first since Jason Giambi hit 43 in 2000...**Ryon Healy** leads AL rookies in hits (69) since the All-Star Break, is tied for the lead in runs (31), ranks second in doubles (16) and home runs (11) and third in RBI (31)...**Marcus Semien** has 26 home runs, which ranks second among ML shortstops (Story, COL 27) and fifth in Athletics history among shortstops...has combined with Davis for 66 home runs, which are the most by an A's duo since Thomas and Swisher had 74 in 2006.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1950** the A's score 12 runs in the sixth inning of a 16-5 win over Washington...Joe Astroth has a grand slam and six RBI in the inning...in **1973** Vida Blue wins his 20th as the A's win at Chicago 10-5 to clinch their third consecutive AL Western Division title...in **1988** Jose Canseco steals his 40th base of the season in the A's 9-8, 14-inning win at Milwaukee...he becomes the charter member of baseball's 40/40 club, hitting 42 home runs and stealing 40 bases...in **2001** Mark Mulder wins his 20th game and the A's clinch their first ever AL Wild Card with a 7-4 win at Seattle...in **2003** the A's clinch their third AL West title in four years and the 13th in Oakland history as they defeat Texas, 4-3 in 10 innings.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (10-10, 4.21 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 3-4 with a 4.31 ERA (30 er in 62.2 ip) over his last 10 starts...however, is 9-4 with a 3.78 ERA (53 er in 126.1 ip) over his last 20 starts after going 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts...has eight wins dating back to June 23, which is tied for ninth most in the American League over that span.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for second in the American League in shutouts (1), tied for fifth in complete games (2) and opponents reaching on an error (8) and ranks sixth in fewest pitches per game (91.3).

STRIKEOUTS AND WALKS: Has struck out just 99 batters in 173.1 innings, an average of 5.14 per nine innings...that is the second lowest mark in the American League (Perez, TEX 4.67) and is the lowest mark by an A's pitcher since Trevor Cahill in 2009 (4.53)...has walked one batter or fewer in 16 of his 29 starts and has issued 46 free passes for the season, an average of 2.42 per nine innings...has issued 35 of his 46 walks to left-handed hitters.

SUPPORT: Left his last start after 5.1 innings with a 6-3 lead but the bullpen blew the save...it was the fifth time this year he left with a lead only to have the bullpen blow the save (April 12 vs. Los Angeles-AL, June 17 vs. Los Angeles, June 28 vs. San Francisco, July 29 at Cleveland)...has received two runs of support or fewer in 10 of his starts this year and is 0-7 in those games...is 10-3 in 19 starts with support of three or more...is now 1-16 in 23 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 15-3 in 27 starts with three runs of support or more.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-5 with a 3.35 ERA (31 er in 83.1 ip) in 13 starts at home compared to 5-5 with a 5.00 ERA (50 er in 90.0 ip) in 16 starts on the road...has surrendered six home runs in 83.1 innings at home compared to 15 in 90.0 innings on the road.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 3-4 with a 5.14 ERA (44 er in 77.0 ip) in 13 starts against American League West competition compared to 7-6 with a 3.46 ERA in 16 starts against everyone else.

THE FIRST INNING: Has a 1.86 ERA (6 er in 29.0 ip) in the first inning compared to a 4.68 ERA (75 er in 144.1 ip) after that...has the second lowest ERA in the first inning in the American League (min. 25.0 ip)...had a streak of 18 consecutive starts without allowing a run in the first innings from May 30 to September 4

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Allowed four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts, joining John Odom (1969) and Mike Norris (1980) as the only pitchers in Oakland history on an Opening Day roster to allow four hits or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of their first three starts...picked up his first win of the season and struck out a career-high eight batters April 20 at New York (AL)...it snapped a career-high six-game losing streak dating back to July 10, 2015...compiled a 5.52 ERA and .276 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned nine starts...struck out in the fifth inning in his first professional at bat that day...then lost each of his next five starts from April 25 to May 19...logged a 7.92 ERA and .361 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which fell one short of his career high of six...allowed 10 hits in back-to-back starts on April 25 at Detroit and May 2 against Seattle...is the first A's pitcher with at least 10 hits in back-to-back starts since Brandon McCarthy (April 16-21, 2012)...yielded a career-high four home runs in an 11-3 loss at Baltimore May 8...snapped his five-game losing streak in a 3-2 win over Minnesota May 30...issued a career-high tying four walks but allowed just one run in 6.2 innings of work in a 3-1 win at Minnesota July 4...tossed 8.0 innings July 9 at Houston, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer dating back to June 18 of last year...that was the fifth longest such streak in Oakland history...tossed a career-high 112 pitches in 7.0 innings in a 7-4 win over Houston July 18...fired his second career complete game in the A's 4-3 win over Tampa Bay on July 23 in Oakland...it was his first complete game win...allowed nine hits, which were the most by an A's pitcher in a complete game since Mark Redman allowed 12 on May 13, 2004 against Detroit...had his career high six-game winning streak come to an end in the A's 5-3 loss at Cleveland July 29...the streak doubled his previous best (3, June 24-July 4, 2015) and matched the longest by an A's pitcher this year (Hill)...compiled a 3.25 ERA and .264 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 10 starts from May 30 to July 23 the A's 9-0 win at Chicago (AL) Aug. 19...tossed just 98 pitches, which were the fewest by an Athletic in a nine-inning complete game since Dana Eveland on May 21, 2008 against Tampa Bay (95)...became the ninth Oakland pitcher since 1987 to toss fewer than 100 pitches in a shutout, the first since Rich Harden on July 14, 2005 against Texas (80)...faced just one batter over the minimum to become the 13th pitcher in Oakland history to face 28 batters or fewer in a nine inning complete game (last: Dallas Braden, May 9, 2010 vs. Tampa Bay)...had a no decision in the A's 1-0 win over Boston Sept. 4 in Oakland...tossed 6.1 scoreless innings and

a career-high tying 112 pitches... allowed a career-high tying eight runs on a career-high 12 hits in a 14-3 loss to Seattle on Sept. 10... the hits were the most by an A's pitcher since Tyson Ross allowed 12 on May 25, 2012 against New York (AL).

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss at Texas a week ago today...shut out the Rangers on two hits over the first four innings... then allowed two runs in the fifth on an Andrus RBI double and a Gomez RBI ground out...also yielded a RBI double to Beltre in the sixth and was relieved by Doolittle with a 6-3 lead and one out with runners on first and third...Doolittle allowed one run of those runs to score and Madson allowed two runs in the ninth for the blown save.

the loss came in a 10-1 decision in Oakland on April 9 in his first Major League start...allowed three runs in the first, a two-run home run to Moreland in the third and a three-run home run to Choo in the fourth...yielded eight runs in 3.1 innings to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to allow eight or more runs in his A's debut...then picked up the win in an 8-2 victory at Texas June 24...the A's scored five times in the first inning and three in the second and he blanked the Rangers on two hits over the first four innings...allowed his only runs in the fifth inning on a two-run double by Corporan...was relieved by Mujica after putting runners on first and second to start the eighth innings.

RHP Raul Alcantara (1-1, 5.65 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville September 5 and is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season and his career...has allowed four runs in his last two starts (3.18 ERA) after allowing five runs in 3.0 innings in his first start...picked up his first Major League win in his last start, an 11-2 A's win at Texas last Saturday (5.2 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 so)...started the season at Double-A Midland where he went 5-6 with a 4.80 ERA in 17 starts...was moved up to Nashville July 21 and was a perfect 4-0 with a 1.18 ERA in eight starts...his ERA with the Sounds was the lowest in the Pacific Coast League from July 21 through the end of the season...combined to go 9-6 with a 3.58 ERA in 25 minor league starts overall...walked 30 batters in 135.2 innings (1.99 per nine innings)...was acquired from Boston with Josh Reddick and Miles Head for Andrew Bailey and Ryan Sweeney, Dec. 28, 2011.
