ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost the first four games of the homestand after going 6-1 on the last road trip...are 66-87 (.431) for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...it is two games ahead of last year (64-89, won game 154)...have clinched a losing record for the second consecutive season (went 68-94 last year)...this is the first time the A's have finished with a losing record in back-to-back seasons since they had three straight from 2007-09...are in fifth place in the AL West and trail first place Texas by a season-high tying 24½ games (also Sept. 3)...have not been more than 25 games out of first place in the West since Sept. 27, 1997 when they were 26 games behind Seattle...also finished fifth last year...have finished in last place in consecutive seasons just once in Oakland history (1997-98)...have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent 132 of 169 days this year in fourth or worst (66 days in fourth, 19 days tied for fourth and 47 days in fifth).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have lost each of their last seven home games, which is tied for the seventh longest home losing streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since losing eight in a row from April 8-May 1, 2001...are 0-4 on the final homestand of the season against Houston (0-3) and Texas (0-1)...are 33-46 (.418) at home for the season, which is the second worst home record in the American League...will finish with a losing record at home in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1996-98 when they did it three straight years (went 34-47 last year)...it is just the fourth time it has happened in Oakland history (1977-79 and 1993-94)...are batting .235 (608-for-2591) and are averaging 3.56 (281 r in 79 g) runs per game at home compared to .258 with 4.62 runs per game on the road...have the fewest runs scored at home in the AL and the second lowest batting average...the runs per game are currently third fewest in Oakland history (3.23 in 1979, 3.51 in 1978, 3.57 in 1968, 3.73 in 1972) and the batting average is tied for third lowest (.225 in 1979, .229 in 1989, .235 in 2012, .236 in 1977, .236 in 1972, .239 in 1971)...went 6-1 on the last road trip to Kansas City (4-0) and Texas (2-1), which tied for the seventh best road trip in Oakland history (min. six games)...it was their best since going 6-0 against Houston and Los Angeles (AL), April 5-11, 2013...leave following the game tomorrow for the final road trip of the season, a seven-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Seattle (four games)...are 33-41 (.446) on the road and have clinched a losing record on the road for the third consecutive season (40-41 in 2014, 34-47 in 2015) and eighth time in the last 10 years.

OFFENSE: The A's were shut out last night for the 10th time this year, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...have scored just eight runs in four games on the homestand and are batting .159 (20-for-126)...hit .311 and averaged 9.3 runs per game in seven games on the last road trip...rank last in the AL in runs (623), on-base percentage (.305) and slugging percentage (.395)...have finished last in the AL in runs four times in Oakland history (1977-79, 2008), last in on-base percentage five times (1977-79, 1994, 2008) and last in slugging percentage six times (1977-79, 1994, 2008-09)...the .305 on-base percentage is currently fourth lowest in Oakland history (.302 in 1979, .303 in 1978, .304 in 1968, .306 in 1972)...are also last in the AL in hit by pitches (33), second in fewest strikeouts (1078), fewest stolen bases (48) and fewest sacrifice hits (13), third in lowest batting average (.246) and fewest walks (418) and fourth in fewest home runs (161) and fewest extra base hits (430)...the 13 sacrifice hits are currently the fewest in Athletics history...the record is 14 last year...are on pace for 443 walks, which would be second fewest in Oakland history in a non-strike season (433 in 1978, 472 in 1968).

PITCHING: The A's compiled a 3.55 ERA over the first 27 games through May 2, a 5.09 ERA over an 82-game stretch from May 3 to Aug. 5 and a 3.98 ERA (172 er in 389.0 ip) over the last 44 contests...have a 4.50 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have not finished in the bottom two in the AL in ERA since 1997 when they were last...have not finished the year with an ERA above 4.28 since 2000 (4.58)...have 1123 strikeouts, which is third fewest in the AL but seventh most in Athletics history (1124 in 2009 is sixth, 1136 in 2012 is fifth)...have allowed 172 home runs, which is third fewest in the AL...however, it is tied for sixth most in Oakland history (205 in 1996, 197 in 1997, 179 in 1998, 177 in 1982, 176 in 1987)...have 68 wild pitches, which is third most in the

AL and tied for third most in Oakland history (72 in 1979, 71 in 1989, 68 in 1998)...have the third highest opponents batting average in the AL (.263).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-2 with a 2.72 ERA (16 er in 53.0 ip) over the last nine games and 8-9 with a 3.42 ERA (60 er in 158.0 ip) over the last 29 games...are 41-64 with a 4.81 ERA (444 er in 830.0 ip) for the season...the 830.0 innings pitched are the fewest in the American League...have finished with fewer than 900 innings pitched by their starters in a non-strike season twice in Oakland history (858.2 in 1997, 888.0 in 2009)...the 41 wins are second fewest in the AL...starters have not won fewer than 47 games since 1997 when they had 29...are tied for second in the AL in most losses (64) and rank third in highest ERA (4.81)...starters have not finished with an ERA above 4.76 since 1999 (4.96).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone four consecutive games without an error but have 92 for the season, which is third most in the American League...rank fourth with 147 double plays...A's outfielders have 13 assists over the last 40 games after tallying 14 over the first 113 contests.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 46-51 (.474) in games decided by three runs or fewer compared to 20-36 (.357) in games decided by four or more runs...the wins and record in games decided by four runs or more are the worst in the American League and third worst in the majors...five of the A's last eight losses have been by one run...are 23-26 (.469) in one-run games and rank fourth in the AL in one-run decisions (49) and losses...have a run differential of -96, which is second worst in the AL (Minnesota, -169)...the last time the A's were outscored by more than 62 runs in a season was in 1997 (-182).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have 33 players on the active roster (including A. Alcantara, Triggs and Wendelken who are out for the season)...have employed an Oakland record tying 12 rookie pitchers (2009, 2012, 2015) and they have a combined 205 games pitched, which is third most in Oakland history (319 in 2012, 232 in 2009)...rookie pitchers have made 58 starts, including 12 of the last 17...have used 19 rookies overall and have had at least three rookies in the starting lineup (including the pitcher) in each of the last 21 games...started a season-high six rookies Monday night...have started five or more rookies nine times this year and four or more 25 times...have used the disabled list an Oakland-record 27 times and those players have combined to miss an Oakland-record 1698 games (62.9 games per stint)...currently have 13 players on the DL, including 11 on the 60-day DL.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's trail in the season series 8-9 with two games remaining...went 4-5 in Texas and are 4-4 in Oakland...have won three of the previous four season series (were 9-10 in 2014) and are 48-45 against Texas over the last five years...are 340-352 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 177-168 in Oakland and 163-184 in Texas...are 96-96 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 437-434 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khrist Davis was named American League Co-Player of the Week Monday...is the fifth player in Oakland history (Canseco, Giambi, Jackson and McGwire) and seventh in Athletics history (Foxy, Zernial) to hit 40 home runs...is the first since Jason Giambi hit 43 in 2000...**Ryan Dull** leads AL rookies and is tied for fourth among rookies in Oakland history with 67 games pitched...**Ryon Healy** leads AL rookies in hits (70) since the All-Star Break, ranks second in doubles (16) and home runs (11), tied for second in runs (31) and third in RBI (31)...**Marcus Semien** has 26 home runs, which ranks second among ML shortstops (Story, COL 27) and fifth in Athletics history among shortstops...has combined with Davis for 66 home runs, which are the most by an A's duo since Thomas and Swisher had 74 in 2006.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1975** Vida Blue wins his 21st game and Reggie Jackson hits two home runs as the A's defeat the Chicago White Sox 13-2 to clinch their fifth consecutive AL West title...in **1988** Dave Stewart strikes out 11 in the A's 5-2 win at Milwaukee to win his 20th game of the season...in **2000** Jason Giambi hits the 5000th home run in Oakland history, a two-run shot in the sixth inning of a 3-2 A's loss at Seattle.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Raul Alcantara (1-1, 5.65 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville September 5 and is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season and his career...has allowed four runs in his last two starts (11.1 ip, 3.18 ERA) after allowing five runs in 3.0 innings in his first start...had not pitched above Double-A prior to this year and is the third A's pitcher to make his debut this year without any Triple-A experience entering the season (Mengden, Overton)...became the 48th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut (Cotton became the 49th two days later) and is one of five to do it this year (Mannae, Mengden, Overton, Cotton)...this marks the second time in Oakland history the A's had five pitchers start in their ML debut in one season...the other time was in 1978 (Conroy, Johnson, Minetto, Morgan, Wirth)...is one of seven pitchers to make his first ML start for the A's this year (Neal and Triggs).

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, a 10-7 A's loss to Los Angeles (AL) on September 5 in Oakland...hit three batters, all in the first inning, to tie the ML record for most hit batters in an inning (30th time, last: Kirby Yates NYY vs. TEX, June 27, 2016)...is the first Athletic to do it...tied the Oakland record for hit batters in a game (10th time, last: Jesse Hahn vs. TEX, June 10, 2015)...the last Athletic to hit three batters in his debut was Bill Knowlton on Sept. 3, 1920...lasted 3.0 innings, which matched the second shortest outing by an Oakland starter in his ML debut...it was the shortest since Marcus Jones pitched 2.1 innings in the day game of a day/night doubleheader at Colorado July 17, 2000...allowed three runs in the first inning on a hit by pitch, walk and sacrifice fly...also surrendered a leadoff home run to Calhoun in the second and a sacrifice fly to Buss in the third.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2 loss to Seattle on Sept. 11 in Oakland...struck out Cano to end the first inning for his first career strikeout...retired each of the first five batters he faced before walking Lind with two outs in the second...Zunino followed with a home run but those were the only two runs he would allow in 5.2 innings of work...the A's came back with two runs in the bottom of the second and the Mariners won the game with a run in the ninth.

LAST START: He earned his first Major League win in the A's 11-2 victory at Texas a week ago today...shut out the Rangers on two hits over the first five innings and had a 7-0 lead entering the sixth...allowed a leadoff single to Andrus followed by a two-run home run by Gomez...was relieved by Axford with two outs in the sixth and a runner on second.

MINORS: Started the season at Double-A Midland, where he went 5-6 with a 4.80 ERA in 17 starts...was moved up to Triple-A Nashville July 21 and was a perfect 4-0 with a 1.18 ERA in eight starts...his ERA with the Sounds was the lowest in the Pacific Coast League from July 21 through the end of the season...combined to go 9-6 with a 3.58 ERA in 25 minor league starts overall...walked 30 batters in 135.2 innings (1.99 per nine innings), including just three in 45.2 innings with Nashville (0.59 per nine innings)...struck out 105 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.5...surrendered just one home run at Nashville after yielding 11 with Midland.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .266 opponents batting average, including .256 (51-for-199) against left-handed hitters compared to .273 (87-for-319) against right-handed hitters...surrendered 11 of his 12 home runs to right-handed hitters...opponents hit .230 with runners in scoring position, including .176 with Nashville...however, they were 17-for-55 (.309) with RISP and two outs.

THIS AND THAT: Allowed two runs or fewer in 17 of his 25 starts, including all eight with Nashville...had four starts with no runs and four with one run...walked two batters or fewer 21 times, including all eight with Nashville...his teams were 17-8 (.680) in his starting assignments, including 7-1 (.875) with Nashville...surrendered 20 of his 52 runs with Midland in the first inning (10.59 ERA)...did not allow a first inning run with Nashville (8.0 ip).

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Struck out a season-high nine batters in his first start of the season April 8 at Arkansas but took the loss after allowing two runs in 5.0 innings in a 2-0 decision...issued a season-high four walks April 19 against Northwest Arkansas...surrendered a season-high seven runs in a season-low 2.0 innings April 25 at Corpus Christi but ended up with a no decision in a game the RockHounds would win 8-7 in 14 innings...picked up his first win of the season in his next start April 30 against San Antonio to start a three-game winning streak (1.02 ERA)...finished April 1-1 with a 7.06 ERA in five starts...then went 3-2 with a 2.35 ERA in the month of May...tossed 6.0 no-hit innings May 5 against Corpus Christi and issued just one walk...was relieved by Bracewell to start the seventh inning after throwing 88 pitches...Bracewell allowed two hits in the RockHounds 13-0 win...yielded a season-high 11 hits in 6.0 innings in a 9-1 loss at Springfield May 26...then allowed eight hits in his next start, also against Springfield, on June 2 but allowed just one run in a season-high 7.2 innings for the win...allowed 10 runs in 8.2 innings over two losses on June 13 and 18 and was placed on the disabled list June 19 with a strained right shoulder...was reinstated July 4 and went 0-1 with a 5.17 ERA over his final three starts before he was promoted to Nashville July 21...did not allow an earned run over his first two starts with the Sounds (14.0 ip) and went 3-0 with a 0.59 ERA over his first five Triple-A starts...logged 5.0 innings in each of his final five starts beginning Aug. 7...went 3-0 with a 1.71 ERA in six starts in August...walked just three batters in 31.2 innings while striking out 24

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Was originally signed by the Boston organization July 2, 2009 out of the Dominican Republic and spent two years in the Red Sox farm system before he was dealt to the A's with Josh Reddick and Miles Head for Andrew Bailey and Ryan Sweeney, Dec. 28, 2011...is 35-32 with a 3.52 ERA (230 er in 588.2 ip) in 123 games, including 113 starts, in seven seasons as a professional...has issued just 125 walks in 588.2 innings, an average of 1.91 per nine innings...had "Tommy John" surgery on May 14, 2014.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jharel Cotton (1-0, 1.50 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville September 7 and is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season and his career...has allowed one earned run in each of his first three starts and has tossed at least five innings in each outing...joins John Henry Johnson and Rich Harden as the only pitchers in Oakland history to begin their career with three consecutive outings of five innings or more and one earned run or fewer...had a no decision in his last start, a 4-2 A's loss to Houston last Monday (6.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 6 so)...has never faced the Rangers in his career...was one of three players traded to the A's on Aug. 1 in exchange for Rich Hill and Josh Reddick...combined with Oklahoma City and Nashville for an 11-6 record and a 4.31 ERA in 28 games, 22 starts...led the Pacific Coast League, ranked second in Triple-A and tied for 12th in all of minor league baseball with a career-high 155 strikeouts

- The A's bullpen has allowed 15 runs over the last eight games (24.2 ip, 5.47 ERA)...has a 4.00 ERA (234 er in 526.1 ip) for the season, which is fifth highest in the American League.
