OAKLAND ATHLETICS (66-88) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (92-63)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost the first five games of the homestand after going 6-1 on the last road trip...the five-game losing streak matches the A's second longest of the season...the season-high is seven (June 3-11)...are a season-high tying 22 games under .500 (also 60-82 on Sept. 11)...are 66-88 (.429), which is the third worst record in the American League...it is one game ahead of last year (65-89, lost game 155)...have clinched a losing record for the second consecutive season (went 68-94 last year)...this is the first time the A's have finished with a losing record in back-to-back seasons since they had three straight from 2007-09...are in fifth place in the AL West and trail first place Texas by a season-high 25½ games...that is the A's largest deficit in the West since Sept. 27, 1997 when they were 26 games behind Seattle...have not been more than 26 games out of first place since finishing the 1979 season 34 games back of California...also finished fifth last year...have finished in last place in consecutive seasons just once in Oakland history (1997-98)...have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent 133 of 170 days this year in fourth or worst (66 days in fourth, 19 days tied for fourth and 48 days in fifth).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-5 on the final homestand of the season against Houston (0-3) and Texas (0-2)...have never gone winless on a homestand of four or more games in Oakland history...the last time it happened in Athletics history was in Kansas City from Aug. 10-16, 1956 (0-6 vs. Cleveland and Chicago)...are 33-47 (.413) at home for the season, which is the second worst home record in the American League...a loss today would give the A's their second

worst home record in Oakland history (31-50 in 1979) and a win would match last years' home record for second worst...will finish with a losing record at home in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1996-98 when they did it three straight years...have lost each of their last eight home games, which matches the longest home losing streak by an A's team over the last 34 years (May 3-22, 1994 and April 8-May 1, 2001)... it is tied for fourth longest in Oakland history...have not lost more than eight consecutive home games since a nine-game streak from June 4-20, 1982...the longest season-ending home losing streak in Oakland history is five games in 1978...are batting .234 (613-for-2623) and are averaging 3.51 (281 r in 80 g) runs per game at home compared to .258 with 4.62 runs per game on the road...will finish last in the AL in runs scored at home and currently have the lowest batting average...the runs per game are currently tied for second fewest in Oakland history (3.23 in 1979, 3.51 in 1978, 3.57 in 1968, 3.73 in 1972) and the .234 batting average is third lowest (.225 in 1979, .229 in 1989, .235 in 2012, .236 in 1977, .236 in 1972, .239 in 1971)...went 6-1 on the last road trip to Kansas City (4-0) and Texas (2-1), which tied for the seventh best road trip in Oakland history (min. six games)...it was their best since going 6-0 against Houston and Los Angeles (AL), April 5-11, 2013...leave following the game today for the final road trip of the season, a seven-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Seattle (four games)...are 33-41 (.446) on the road and have clinched a losing record on the road for the third consecutive season (40-41 in 2014, 34-47 in 2015) and eighth time in the last 10 years.

OFFENSE: The A's have been shut out in back-to-back games for the first time since Aug. 29-30, 2014 at Los Angeles (AL)...it marks first time they have been blanked in back-to-back games on the same homestand since June 15-16, 1993 against Chicago...have been shut out 11 times this year, which is tied for second most in the American League...have scored eight runs in five games on the homestand after averaging 9.3 runs per game in seven games on the last road trip...are batting .158 (25-for-158) on the homestand after hitting .311 on the trip...rank last in the AL in runs (623), on-base percentage (.304) and slugging percentage (.394)...have finished last in the AL in runs four times in Oakland history (1977-79, 2008), last in on-base percentage five times (1977-79, 1994, 2008) and last in slugging percentage six times (1977-79, 1994, 2008-09)...the .304 on-base percentage is currently tied for third lowest in Oakland history...are also last in the AL in hit by pitches (33), second in fewest strikeouts (1087), fewest stolen bases (48) and fewest sacrifice hits (13), third in lowest batting average (.246) and fewest walks (421) and fourth in fewest home runs (161) and fewest extra base hits (431)...the 13 sacrifice hits are currently the fewest in Athletics history...the record is 14 last year...are on pace for 443 walks, which would be second fewest in Oakland history in a non-strike season (433 in 1978, 472 in 1968).

PITCHING: The A's compiled a 3.55 ERA over the first 27 games through May 2, a 5.09 ERA over an 82-game stretch from May 3 to Aug. 5 and a 4.00 ERA (177 er in 398.0 ip) over the last 45 contests...have a 4.50 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League... have not finished in the bottom two in the AL in ERA since 1997 when they were last...have not finished the year with an ERA above 4.28 since 2000 (4.58)...have 1131 strikeouts, which is third fewest in the AL but sixth most in Athletics history (1136 in 2012 is fifth, 1160 in 2011 is fourth)...have allowed 174 home runs, which is third fewest in the AL...however, it is sixth most in Oakland history (205 in 1996, 197 in 1997, 179 in 1998, 177 in 1982, 176 in 1987)...have 68 wild pitches, which is third most in the AL and tied for third most in Oakland history (72 in 1979, 71 in 1989, 68 in 1998)... have the third highest opponents batting average in the AL (.263).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 8-10 with a 3.51 ERA (64 er in 164.0 ip) over the last 30 games...are 41-65 with a 4.82 ERA (448 er in 836.0 ip) for the season...the 836.0 innings pitched are the fewest in the American League...have finished with fewer than 900 innings pitched by their starters in a non-strike season twice in Oakland history (858.2 in 1997, 888.0 in 2009)...the 41 wins are second fewest in the AL...have not won fewer than 47 games since 1997 when they had 29...rank second in the AL in most losses (65) and are third in highest ERA (4.82)...have not finished with an ERA above 4.76 since 1999 (4.96).

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 46-51 (.474) in games decided by three runs or fewer compared to 20-37 (.351) in games decided by four or more runs...the wins and record in games decided by four runs or more are the worst in the American League and third worst in the majors...are 23-26 (.469) in one-run games and rank fourth in the AL in one-run decisions (49) and losses...have a run differential of -101, which is second worst in the AL (Minnesota, -168)...the last time the A's were outscored by more than 62 runs in a season was in 1997 (-182).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have 33 players on the active roster (including A. Alcantara, Triggs and Wendelken who are out for the season)... have employed an Oakland record tying 12 rookie pitchers (2009, 2012, 2015) and they have a combined 208 games pitched, which is third most in Oakland history (319 in 2012, 232 in 2009)...rookie pitchers have made 59 starts, including 13 of the last 18...have used 19 rookies overall and have had at least three rookies in the starting lineup (including the pitcher) in each of the last 22 games...started a season-high six rookies Monday night...have started five or more rookies nine times this year and four or more 26 times...have used the disabled list an Oakland-record 27 times and those players have combined to miss an Oakland-record 1711 games (63.4 games per stint)...currently have 13 players on the DL, including 11 on the 60-day DL.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's have lost the season series for the second time in the last three years as they trail 8-10 entering the final game to-day...went 4-5 in Texas and are 4-5 in Oakland...are 48-46 against Texas over the last five years...are 340-353 all-time against the Texas Rangers... that breaks down to 177-169 in Oakland and 163-184 in Texas...are 96-96 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 437-435 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis is the fifth player in Oakland history (Canseco, Giambi, Jackson and McGwire) and seventh in Athletics history (Foxx, Zernial) to hit 40 home runs...is the first since Jason Giambi hit 43 in 2000... Ryon Healy leads AL rookies in hits (70) since the All-Star Break, ranks second in doubles (16) and home runs (11), tied for second in runs (31) and third in RBI (31)...Marcus Semien has 26 home runs, which ranks second among ML shortstops (Story, COL 27) and fifth in Athletics history among shortstops...has combined with Davis for 66 home runs, which are the most by an A's duo since Thomas and Swisher had 74 in 2006.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1987** Mark McGwire's ninth inning game tying homer breaks Reggie Jackson's Oakland home run record as it is his 48^{th} of the year…he would go on to hit a Major League rookie record 49 home runs…in **1990** Dave Stewart tosses a five-hit shutout at Kansas City to win his 22^{nd} game and clinch the A's third consecutive AL West title.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jharel Cotton (1-0, 1.50 ERA)

FIVE INNINGS OR MORE, ONE EARNED RUN OR FEWER: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville September 7 and is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season and his career...has allowed one earned run in each of his first three starts and has tossed at least five innings in each outing...ioins John Henry Johnson (April 10-23, 1978) and Rich Harden (July 21-31, 2003) as the only pitchers in Oakland history to begin their career with three consecutive outings of five innings or more and one earned run or fewer...since the earned run became an official stat in 1913, no A's pitcher has started his career with a four-game streak.

STARTING PITCHERS: Cotton is scheduled to make his fourth start today and all 14 of the starting pitchers the A's have employed this year have made at least four starts...the 14 pitchers with four or more starts are tied for the most in modern Major League history (since 1900)...the A's will become the fifth team to do it, joining Cincinnati (2003), Pittsburgh (1996), Cleveland (1993) and Baltimore (1955)...Cotton is one of 14 different starting pitchers the A's have used, which is second most in the American League (Los Angeles, 15) and tied for second most in Oakland history (1977 and 2009)...the record is (16 in 1983).

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in his Major League debut, a 4-1 A's win over Los Angeles (AL) September 7 in Oakland...became the 16th pitcher in Oakland history to win his debut...tossed 6.1 innings and allowed two hits to become the first Athletics pitcher with more than six innings and two hits or fewer in his debut since Porter Vaughan on June 16, 1940 (7.0 ip, 2 h)...his 6.1 innings were the most by an A's pitcher in his debut since Rich Harden tossed 7.0 innings on July 21, 2003 at Kansas City...retired the side in order in each of the first three innings to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to retire at least each of the first nine batters he faced in his career (12, Jay Marshall in 2007; 9, Billy Taylor in 1994; 9, Dave Beard in 1980)...struck out Cowart to end the second inning for his first strikeout...allowed a leadoff single to Simmons in the fourth inning for his first hit...surrendered his only run on a leadoff home run by Cron in the seventh.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win at Kansas City on September 13...allowed three runs but only one was earned...is the seventh starting pitcher in Oakland history to allow one earned run or fewer in each of his first two Major League games (last: Vin Mazzaro in 2009)... allowed two unearned runs in the fourth inning when a two-out error by Marcus Semien was followed by a two-run single by Orlando...Escobar added a RBI single in the fifth and Cotton was relieved by Hendriks with two outs in the fifth and the A's trailing 3-1...Oakland scored four times in the eighth for the win.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-2 loss to Houston on Monday in Oakland...retired 18 of the 20 batters he faced in his six innings of work...yielded a one-out home run to Gattis in the second inning and a two-out single to Correa in the fourth...left with a 2-1 lead but the bullpen allowed a run in the eighth for the blown save and Madson allowed two runs in the ninth for the loss

MINORS: Began the season at Triple-A Oklahoma City in the Los Angeles Dodgers organization and went 8-5 with a 4.90 ERA in 22 games, including 16 starts...was one of three players traded to the A's on Aug. 1 in exchange for Rich Hill and Josh Reddick...was assigned to Triple-A Nashville where he went 3-1 with a 2.82 ERA in six starts...combined with both clubs for an $\,$ 11-6 record and a 4.31 ERA in 28 games, 22 starts...led the Pacific Coast League, ranked second in Triple-A and tied for 12th in all of minor league baseball with a career-high 155 strikeouts...also led the PCL in opponents batting average (.214), tied for the league lead in shutouts (2), tied for second in complete games (2) and tied for 10th in wins (11)...surrendered 20 home runs, which tied for fourth most...was 10-4 with a 3.94 ERA in his 22 starts compared to 1-2 with a 9.00 ERA in his six relief appearances.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .214 opponents batting average, including .192 (38-for-198) against left-handed hitters compared to .229 (70-for-306) against right-handers...yielded 16 of his 20 home runs to righties...13 were solo shots...allowed a .198 batting average and .239

ALMOST PERFECT: Came within one out of a perfect game for Nashville on Aug. 9 in a 3-0 win at Round Rock...retired each of the first 26 batters he faced before allowing a two-out triple to Doug Bernier...then struck out Drew Robinson for his 12th strikeout of the game...it was his second complete game and shutout of the season...was named PCL Pitcher of the Week for the second time (also May 23-29).

THIS AND THAT: Was 9-4 with a 3.27 ERA in 21 games at night compared to 222 with a 7.84 ERA in seven games during the day...Oklahoma City was 7-9 in his starting assignments, Nashville was 5-1...tossed six innings or fewer in 18 of his 22 starts...walked two batters or fewer in 16 starts... had more strikeouts than innings pitched 15 times...hit .140 (3-for-20) with a run, triple, three RBI, a walk, eight strikeouts and a sacrifice hit with Oklahoma City

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed a complete game shutout in a five-inning rainshortened 4-0 win over Memphis April 19...allowed two hits and one walk while striking out six...also picked up the win in his next start on April 24 at lowa to improve to 2-1 with a 5.49 ERA...the pitched in relief in each of his next six appearances from April 29 to May 15 (1-2, 9.00 ERA)...returned to the starting rotation for good on May 23 at Fresno and went 3-0 with a 2.57 ERA and .144 opponents batting average over his first five starts following his return...was named Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week for the week of May 23-29 after going 1-0 with a 1.80 ERA in two starts... surrendered just four hits in 10.0 innings and struck out 15...including 10 strikeouts in the game at Fresno...picked up the win in his first start with Nashville on Aug. 4 at Colorado Springs allowing one run in 6.0 innings in a 5-4 win.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Was selected by the Los Angeles Dodgers in the 20th round of the 2012 draft and went 23-24 with a 3.77 ERA in 94 games, 59 starts, over his five seasons in the Los Angeles organization...was traded to the A's with Frankie Montas and Grant Holmes for Rich Hill and Josh Reddick on Aug. 1, 2016...is 26-25 with a 3.68 ERA in 100 games, 65 starts, overall...has 499 career strikeouts in 447.0 innings (10.05 per nine innings).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Sean Manaea (6-9, 4.03 ERA): Has a win and has not allowed a run in 11.0 innings over his last two starts after missing 15 days with a strained left rhomboid...ranks second among American League rookies in strikeouts (116), innings pitched (131.2) and games started (22) and tied for sixth in wins (6)...the strikeouts are tied for seventh most in Oakland history by a rookie ... is 3-4 with a 2.78 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in 11 games since the All-Star Break after going 3-5 with a 5.24 ERA and .278 opponents average in 12 games before the break...his post break ERA ranks sixth in the AL (min. 60 ip)...had a no decision in his last start, a 2-1 A's loss to Houston in 10 innings on Tuesday (6.0 ip, 3 h, 2 bb, 7 so)...now has a career-high 12.2 inning scoreless streak...was the losing pitcher in his only career start against Los Angeles, a 5-4 A's loss at Anaheim on Aug. 2 (5.2 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 4 so).

- The A's bullpen has allowed 16 runs over the last nine games (27.2 ip, 5.20 ERA)...has a 4.00 ERA (235 er in 529.1 ip) for the season, which is fifth highest in the American League.
- Has tossed 529.1 innings, which is second most in the AL, the most by A's relievers since 2009 when they pitched 559.1 innings and seventh most in Oakland history.
- Has allowed 63-of-235 (26.8%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the AL and fifth best in the majors.
