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## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (67-88) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (69-87)

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 26, 2016 — ANGELS STADIUM — 7:05 P.M. PDT LHP SEAN MANAEA (6-9, 4.03) VS. RHP JERED WEAVER (12-12, 5.20) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their five-game losing streak yesterday...went 1-5 on the last homestand after going 6-1 on the last road trip...are 67-88 (.432) for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...with one more win, the A's will match their win total from last year when they went 68-94...this marks the first time the A's have finished with a losing record in back-to-back seasons since they had three straight from 2007-09...the 21 games under .500 are one short of the season high (60-82 on Sept. 11, 66-88 on Sept. 25)...are in fifth place in the AL West, 1½ games behind fourth place Los Angeles...also finished fifth last year and have finished in last place in consecutive seasons just once in Oakland history (1997-98)...are 24½ games behind first place Texas, which is one short of the season-high...have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent 134 of 171 days this year in fourth or worst (66 days in fourth, 19 days tied for fourth and 49 days in fifth).

OFFENSE: The A's scored seven runs yesterday, all in the second inning, after scoring just eight runs over the first five games of the homestand... batted .197 and averaged 2.5 runs per game on the last homestand after hitting .311 and averaging 9.3 runs per game on the last road trip...rank last in the AL in runs (630), on-base percentage (.305) and slugging percentage (.394)...have finished last in the AL in runs four times in Oakland history (1977-79, 2008), last in on-base percentage five times (1977-79, 1994, 2008) and last in slugging percentage six times (1977-79, 1994, 2008-09)...the .305 on-base percentage is currently fourth lowest in Oakland history...are also last in the AL in hit by pitches (33), second in fewest strikeouts (1091), fewest stolen bases (48) and fewest sacrifice hits (13), third in lowest batting average (.247) and fewest walks (424) and fourth in fewest home runs (162) and fewest extra base hits (434)...the 13 sacrifice hits are currently the fewest in Athletics history...the record is 14 last year...are on pace for 443 walks, which would be second fewest in Oakland history in a non-strike season (433 in 1978, 472 in 1968).

PITCHING: The A's compiled a 3.55 ERA over the first 27 games through May 2, a 5.09 ERA over an 82-game stretch from May 3 to Aug. 5 and have a 3.94 ERA (178 er in 407.0 ip) over the last 46 contests...have a 4.48 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League... have not finished in the bottom two in the AL in ERA since 1997 when they were last...have not finished the year with an ERA above 4.28 since 2000 (4.58)...have 1140 strikeouts, which is third fewest in the AL but fifth most in Athletics history (1244 in 2014, 1183 in 2013, 1179 in 2015, 1160 in 2011)...have allowed 175 home runs, which is tied for second fewest in the AL...however, it is sixth most in Oakland history (205 in 1996, 197 in 1997, 179 in 1998, 177 in 1982, 176 in 1987)...have 68 wild pitches, which is tied for third most in the AL and tied for third most in Oakland history (72 in 1979, 71 in 1989, 68 in 1998).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 9-10 with a 3.42 ERA (65 er in 171.0 ip) over the last 31 games...are 42-65 with a 4.79 ERA (449 er in 843.0 ip) for the season...the 843.0 innings pitched are the fewest in the American League behind Los Angeles (845.2), although Oakland has one fewer game...the A's have finished with fewer than 900 innings pitched by their starters in a non-strike season twice in Oakland history (858.2 in 1997, 888.0 in 2009)...the 42 wins are second fewest in the AL...have not won fewer than 47 games since 1997 when they had 29...are tied with the Angels for second in the AL in most losses (65) and have the third highest ERA (4.79)...have not finished with an ERA above 4.76 since 1999 (4.96).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 93 errors, which is third most in the AL...rank fourth with 149 double plays...A's outfielders have 14 assists over the last 42 games after tallying 14 over the first 113 contests.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin their final road trip of the season tonight, a seven-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (three games) and Seattle (four games)...went 6-1 on the last road trip to Kansas City (4-0) and Texas (2-1), which tied for the seventh best road trip in Oakland history (min. six games)...are 33-41 (.446) on the road and have clinched a losing record on the road for the third consecutive season (40-41 in 2014, 34-47 in 2015) and eighth time in the last 10 years...went 1-5 on the final homestand of the season against Houston (0-3) and Texas (1-2)...it matched the eighth worst homestand in Oakland history (min. 6 games) and was the worst since they went 1-5 on the final homestand last year...the lone win on the last homestand came on Sunday to snap an eight-game home losing streak...that tied for fourth longest in Oakland history and matched the longest home losing streak by an A's team over the last 34 years (May 3-22, 1994 and April 8-May 1, 2001)...finished the home portion of the schedule

34-47 (.420) and will finish the season with the second worst home record in the American League...it matched the home record from last year for second worst in Oakland history (31-50 in 1979)...have finished with a losing record at home in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1996-98 when they did it three straight years...are batting .258 (673-for-2607) and are averaging 4.62 (342 runs in 74 games) runs per game on the road... hit .236 and averaged 3.56 runs per game at home...will finish last in the AL in runs scored at home and are currently second to last in the majors (Philadelphia, 270 in 78 games)...currently have the second lowest home batting average in the AL (will not finish last)...the 3.56 runs per game at home ranked third lowest in Oakland history and was the lowest since 1979 (3.23)...had the lowest home on-base percentage in Oakland history (.291) and the fourth lowest batting average (.236).

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 46-51 (.474) in games decided by three runs or fewer compared to 21-37 (.363) in games decided by four or more runs...the wins and record in games decided by four runs or more are the worst in the American League and third worst in the majors...are 23-26 (.469) in one-run games...rank fourth in the AL in one-run decisions (49) and tied for fourth in losses...have a run differential of -95, which is second worst in the AL (Minnesota, -169)...the last time the A's were outscored by more than 62 runs in a season was in 1997 (-182).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have 33 players on the active roster (includes A. Alcantara, Triggs and Wendelken who are out for the season but does not include Gray, who is currently on the DL)...yesterday, Matt Olson became the 12th Athletic to play right field, which is tied for second most in Oakland history (13 in 1992)...have employed an Oakland record tying 12 rookie pitchers (2009, 2012, 2015) and they have a combined 210 games pitched, which is third most in Oakland history (319 in 2012, 232 in 2009)... rookie pitchers have made 60 starts, including 14 of the last 19...have used 19 rookies overall and have had at least three rookies in the starting lineup (including the pitcher) in each of the last 23 games...started a season-high six rookies yesterday and a week ago tonight...have started five or more rookies 10 times this year and four or more 27 times...have used the disabled list an Oakland-record 27 times and those players have combined to miss an Oakland-record 1724 games (63.9 games per stint)... currently have 13 players on the DL, including 11 on the 60-day DL.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's are 7-9 against the Angels and need to win each of the remaining three games to avoid losing the season series for the third consecutive year...are 4-3 in Anaheim and went 3-6 in Oakland...are 24-30 against the Angels over the last three years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 421-351 against the Angels...that includes 218-167 in Oakland and 203-184 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 470-428 against the Angels.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis is the fifth player in Oakland history and seventh in Athletics history to hit 40 home runs...is the first since Jason Giambi hit 43 in 2000...Ryan Dull made his 68th appearance of the season yesterday, which leads AL rookies and is tied for third most in Oakland history by a rookie...the record is 71 by Aaron Small (1997) and Ryan Cook (2012)... Ryon Healy leads AL rookies in hits (73) since the All-Star Break and ranks second in runs (32), doubles (16), home runs (12) and RBI (33)... Marcus Semien has 26 home runs, which are the most among AL shortstops, tied for second most in the majors and fifth most in Athletics history...has combined with Davis for 66 home runs, which are the most by an A's duo since Thomas and Swisher had 74 in 2006.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1954 the Philadelphia Athletics play at New York in their last game ever and defeat the Yankees, 8-6...in 1971 Vida Blue strikes out four Milwaukee Brewers in his final start to bring his season total to 301...he joins Rube Waddell (1903 and 1904) as the only two A's pitchers to fan 300 in a season...in 1974 Jim Hunter defeats Minnesota 2-1 for his 25<sup>th</sup> win...it is his fourth straight 20-win season...in 1996 Terry Steinbach hits an inside the park home run in the A's 7-5 win over Seattle in the Coliseum...the home run ties Carlton Fisk's record for most home runs by an American League catcher, a record Steinbach would later break...in 2002 the A's clinch their second AL West title in three years and win their 100<sup>th</sup> game in a 5-3, 10 inning win at Seattle...Miguel Tejada collects his 200<sup>th</sup> hit to become the first Oakland player to reach the 200 plateau.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (6-9, 4.03 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Has a win and has not allowed a run in 11.0 innings over his last two starts after missing 15 days with a strained left rhomboid...is now 4-5 with a 2.84 ERA (26 er in 82.1 ip) in 14 games, including 13 starts, since he was reinstated from the disabled list June 29...has not allowed a run in five of those starts...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day DL June 14 with a left pronator strain...was selected from Triple-A Nashville April 29 and is making his ML debut.

**ROOKIE LEADERS:** Ranks second among American League rookies in strikeouts (116), innings pitched (131.2) and games started (22) and tied for sixth in wins (6)...the strikeouts are tied for seventh most in Oakland history by a rookie (sixth in Straily with 124 in 2013).

**BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK:** Is 3-4 with a 2.78 ERA (20 er in 64.2 ip) and .225 (53-for-236) opponents batting average in 11 games since the All-Star Break after going 3-5 with a 5.24 ERA and .278 opponents average in 12 games before the break.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** Left-handed hitters are 2-for-20 (.100) against him over his last eight games and they are batting .170 (15-for-88) with five extra base hits (two doubles, three home runs) overall...right-handers are batting .270 (111-for-411) with 16 of his 19

home runs and 31 of his 35 walks...the batting average against lefties is second lowest in the majors among pitchers with 125 or more innings (Kershaw, LAD .140) and his .511 OPS is third lowest (Kershaw, .315; Duffy, KC .451)...has a .774 OPS against righties.

**INNING BY INNING:** Has a 1.73 ERA (13 er in 67.2 ip) and .215 (52-for-242) opponents batting average over innings one through three and a 6.47 ERA (46 er in 64.0 ip) and .288 (74-for-257) opponents batting average from the fourth inning on...has allowed three runs in the first inning (22.0 ip, 1.23 ERA), all on May 10 at Boston...his first inning ERA is second lowest in the majors among pitchers with at least 20 innings (Tanaka, NYY 1.16)...using the same minimum, it is third lowest in Oakland history (Catfish Hunter, 0.66 in 1974; Ray Burris, 0.96 in 1984)...has allowed just four runs in innings one through three in 14 games since returning from the DL June 29 (2 er in 41.0 ip, 0.44 ERA) and just four runs over the first four innings of his last 10 starts (2 er in 39.1 ip, 0.46 ERA).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-6 with a 5.77 ERA (31 er in 48.1 ip) and .291 (58-for-199) opponents batting average in eight starts on the road...started his career 0-6 on the road before winning his last road start on Sept. 14 at Kansas City...his career-opening six-game road losing streak matched the longest such streak in Oakland history (Mike Morgan, June 17, 1978-July 24, 1979)...went 5-3 with a 3.02 ERA and .227 opponents batting average in 14 games at home...has surrendered 10 home runs in 48.1 innings on the road (1.86 per nine innings), nine in 83.1 innings in Oakland (0.97 per nine innings)...has an .821 OPS on the road, .667 at home.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Opponents are batting .200 (18-for-90) with runners in scoring position, including .143 (6-for-42) with RISP and two outs... the mark with RISP is tied for sixth lowest in the American League among pitchers with 125 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, he has the highest opponents batting average in the AL against the opponents number four hitter (22-for-60, .367) and the third lowest against the number three hitter (10-for-56, .179)...opponents are 36-for-80 (.450) with eight doubles, six home runs and 21 RBI when putting the first pitch in play...using the 125 inning minimum, the batting average and slugging percentage (.775) are fifth highest in the AL...has a .212 (41-for-193) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .249 (46-for-185) the second time and .322 (39-for-121) with 10 of his 19 home runs after that.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Made his Major League debut on April 29 and had a no decision in a 7-4 A's win over Houston...had just 42 minor league appearances, all starts, in three professional seasons...became the 45th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the first since Dan Straily on Aug. 3, 2012 against Toronto...left with an 8-4 lead in his second start on May 4 against Seattle but the bullpen allowed two runs in the sixth inning and three more in the seventh for the blown save (Axford)...yielded a career-high eight runs on 10 hits in a career-low 2.2 innings for the first decision of his career, a loss in a 13-5 decision at Boston May 10...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to allow at least four runs in each of his first three Major League appearances...the other is Vida Blue (July 20-Aug. 3, 1969)...picked up his first Major League win in the A's 3-1 victory over Texas *May 16* in Oakland...had a 10-2 lead when he left the game on June 13 against Texas after 4.1 innings with a left pronator muscle strain...went on the DL the next day...tossed a career-high 106 pitches in 7.0 innings and did not allow a run or walk a batter on July 10 at Houston...ended up with a no decision in the A's 2-1, 10-inning loss... made his first career relief appearance July 17 against Toronto...entered

the game to start the second inning in relief of Andrew Triggs, who left the game with a left shin contusion...Triggs relieved Rich Hill who left after five pitchers with a blister...Manaea had been scheduled to start two days later...tossed 5.0 innings, which is a season-high for an A's reliever...had a no decision in the A's 1-0, 13-inning win over Tampa Bay *July 22* in Oakland...tossed a career-high 8.0 scoreless innings and allowed just five hits and no walks, but Odorizzi did the same for the Rays...struck out a career-high nine batters in 6.2 innings in a no decision at Texas *July 27*...walked Escobar with two outs in the fifth inning on *August 2* at Los Angeles to snap a streak of four games, 30.2 innings and 126 batters faced without a walk from July 10 to Aug. 2...the streak of 30.2 innings without a walk was the longest single season streak in Oakland history, topping the previous mark of 29.0 by Lary Sorensen (July 8-31, 1984)...it was fifth longest overall in Oakland history...left his start on *August 29* at Houston after 3.1 innings with a strained left rhomboid.

LAST START: Did not allow a run for the second consecutive start but had a no decision in the A's 2-1 loss to Houston in 10 inning last Tuesday in Oakland...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 12.1 innings...allowed just two base runners to advance as far as second base and retired each of the final seven batters he faced... left after six innings with a 1-0 lead but Axford allowed a run in the seventh for the blown save.

**NASHVILLE:** Was 2-0 with a 1.50 ERA (18.0 ip, 16 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 21 so in three starts with Triple-A Nashville...ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in ERA, fifth in strikeouts per nine innings (10.50) and tied for fifth in wins at the time of his April 29 promotion...allowed just one run in each of his starts...surrendered just one home run in 18.0 innings...allowed a .232 opponents batting average, including .077 (1-for-13) against left-handed hitters compared to .268 (15-for-56) against right-handers.

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Daniel Mengden (2-8, 5.74 ERA): Is 2-8 with a 5.74 ERA in 13 starts over two stints with the A's...his .200 winning percentage is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors among pitchers with 10 or more decision...it is tied for sixth lowest in Oakland history...is tied for fifth among AL rookies in games started...is 2-1 with a 4.25 ERA and .232 opponents batting average in five starts on the road compared to 0-7 with a 6.86 ERA and .293 opponents average in eight starts at home...is 2-2 with a 6.94 ERA in seven starts at night compared to 0-6 with a 4.50 ERA in five starts during the day...is 1-4 with a 7.02 ERA in seven starts since the All-Star Break compared to 1-4 with a 4.54 ERA in six starts before the break...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-5 A's loss to Houston last Wednesday in Oakland (5.2 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 7 so)...has never faced the Angels in his career.

- The A's bullpen has a 4.83 ERA (44 er in 82.0 ip) in the month of September and a 3.98 ERA (235 er in 531.1 ip) for the season, which is fifth highest in the American League.
