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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (67-89) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (70-87)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost six of the last seven games after winning six of the previous seven games...are now 67-89 (.429) for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...with one more loss, the A's will post their second consecutive 90-loss season (went 68-94 last year)...have lost 90 games in consecutive seasons just once in Oakland history (1977-79)...this marks the first time the A's have finished with a losing record in back-to-back seasons since they had three straight from 2007-09...are a season-high tying 22 games under .500 for the third time this year (60-82 on Sept. 11, 66-88 on Sept. 25)...are in fifth place in the AL West, 2½ games behind fourth place Los Angeles...also finished fifth last year and have finished in last place in consecutive seasons just once in Oakland history (1997-98)...are 24½ games behind first place Texas, which is one short of the season-high...have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent 135 of 172 days this year in fourth or worst (66 days in fourth, 19 days tied for fourth and 50 days in fifth).

OFFENSE: The A's have been held to one run or fewer four times in the last six games and are batting .188 (42-for-223) with 16 runs scored over the last seven games (2.3 runs per game)...rank last in the American League in runs (631), on-base percentage (.304) and slugging percentage (.394)...have finished last in the AL in runs four times in Oakland history (1977-79, 2008), last in on-base percentage five times (1977-79, 1994, 2008) and last in slugging percentage six times (1977-79, 1994, 2008-09)...the .304 on-base percentage is currently tied for third lowest in Oakland history (.302 in 1979, .303 in 1978, .304 in 1968, .306 in 1972)...are also last in the AL in hit by pitches (33), second in fewest strikeouts (1095), fewest stolen bases (49) and fewest sacrifice hits (13), third in lowest batting average (.246) and fewest walks (426) and fourth in fewest home runs (163) and fewest extra base hits (436)...the 13 sacrifice hits are currently the fewest in Athletics history...the record is 14 last year...are on pace for 442 walks, which would be second fewest in Oakland history in a non-strike season (433 in 1978, 472 in 1968).

PITCHING: The A's compiled a 3.55 ERA over the first 27 games through May 2, a 5.09 ERA over an 82-game stretch from May 3 to Aug. 5 and have a 3.90 ERA (180 er in 415.0 ip) over the last 47 contests...have a 4.47 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have not finished in the bottom two in the AL in ERA since 1997 when they were last...have not finished the year with an ERA above 4.28 since 2000 (4.58)...have 1144 strikeouts, which is fourth fewest in the AL but fifth most in Athletics history (1244 in 2014, 1183 in 2013, 1179 in 2015, 1160 in 2011)...have allowed 176 home runs, which is second fewest in the AL...however, it is tied for fifth most in Oakland history (205 in 1996, 197 in 1997, 179 in 1998, 177 in 1982, 176 in 1987)...have 68 wild pitches, which is tied for third most in the AL and tied for third most in Oakland history (72 in 1979, 71 in 1989, 68 in 1998)...have the third highest opponents batting average in the AL (.262).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 9-10 with a 3.34 ERA (66 er in 178.0 ip) over the last 32 games...are 42-65 with a 4.76 ERA (450 er in 850.0 ip) for the season...the wins are second fewest in the American League...have not won fewer than 47 games since 1997 when they had 29...the 850.0 innings pitched are third fewest in the AL...the A's have finished with fewer than 900 innings pitched by their starters in a non-strike season twice in Oakland history (858.2 in 1997, 888.0 in 2009)...are tied with the Angels for second in the AL in most losses (65) and have the third highest ERA (4.76)...have not finished with an ERA above 4.76 since 1999 (4.96).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just one error in the last seven games but have 93 for the season, which is tied for third most in the American League...have not committed fewer than 97 errors in a season since 2007 (90)...rank fourth in the AL with 150 double plays.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on their final road trip of the season, a seven-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-1) and Seattle (four games)...went 6-1 on the last road trip to Kansas City (4-0) and Texas (2-1), which tied for the seventh best road trip in Oakland history (min. six games)...are 33-42 (.440) on the road and have clinched a losing record on the road for the third consecutive season (40-41 in 2014, 34-47 in 2015) and eighth time in the last 10 years...went 34-47 (.420) at home and have clinched the second worst home record in the American League...that matched the

home record from last year for second worst in Oakland history (31-50 in 1979)...finished with a losing record at home in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1996-98 when they did it three straight years...are averaging 4.57 runs per game on the road (343 runs in 75 games) compared to 3.56 at home...have averaged a run or more per game on the road than at home three times in Oakland history (1.63 in 1973, 1.13 in 1990, 1.01 in 1994)...are batting .257 (677-for-2637) on the road compared to .236 at home...have hit 20 points higher on the road than at home four times in Oakland history (32 in 1973, 31 in 2007, 27 in 1979, 25 in 1971)...A's pitchers have allowed 94 home runs on the road, which is tied for sixth most in Oakland history (103 in 1996, 101 in 1997, 101 in 1985, 101 in 1987, 96 in 1998, 94 in 1982).

SCORING MARGIN: The A's have lost each of their last four one-run games and six of the last seven...are 23-27 (.460) in one-run games for the season...rank fourth in the American League in one-run games (50) and losses...are 46-52 (.469) in games decided by three runs or fewer compared to 21-37 (.363) in games decided by four or more runs...the wins and record in games decided by four runs or more are the worst in the AL and third worst in the majors...have a run differential of -96, which is second worst in the AL (Minnesota, -169) and seventh worst in Oakland history...it is the worst since 1997 (-182).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have 33 players on the active roster (includes A. Alcantara, Triggs and Wendelken who are out for the season but does not include Gray, who is currently on the DL)...have employed an Oakland record tying 12 rookie pitchers (2009, 2012, 2015) and they have a combined 212 games pitched, which is third most in Oakland history (319 in 2012, 232 in 2009)...rookie pitchers have made 61 starts, including 15 of the last 20...have used 19 rookies overall and have had at least three rookies in the starting lineup (including the pitcher) in each of the last 24 games...started a season-high six rookies Sunday for the second time this year (Sept. 19)...have started five or more rookies 11 times this year and four or more 28 times...have used the disabled list an Oakland-record 27 times and those players have combined to miss an Oakland-record 1737 games (64.3 games per stint)...currently have 13 players on the DL, including 11 on the 60-day DL.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's have lost the season series for the third consecutive season as they are 7-10 with two games remaining...are 4-4 in Anaheim and went 3-6 in Oakland...are 24-31 against the Angels over the last three years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 421-352 against the Angels...that includes 218-167 in Oakland and 203-185 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 470-429 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis is the fifth player in Oakland history and seventh in Athletics history to hit 40 home runs...is the first since Jason Giambi hit 43 in 2000...**Ryan Dull** made his 69th appearance of the season yesterday, which leads AL rookies and is third most in Oakland history by a rookie...the record is 71 by Aaron Small (1997) and Ryan Cook (2012)...**Ryon Healy** leads AL rookies in hits (74) since the All-Star Break and ranks second in runs (32), doubles (17), home runs (12) and RBI (33)...**Marcus Semien** has 26 home runs, which are the most among AL shortstops, tied for second most in the majors and fifth most in Athletics history...has combined with Davis for 66 home runs, which are the most by an A's duo since Thomas and Swisher had 74 in 2006.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1912** Eddie Plank pitches 19 innings but the A's lose to Washington 5-4...in **1914** the A's defeat the St. Louis Browns 6-0 to clinch the American League pennant...in **1970** Reggie Jackson hits his 100th career home run in a 9-4 loss at California...he would go on to hit 563 home runs in his career...in **1989** Mike Moore, Rick Honeycutt and Gene Nelson combine on a four-hit shutout in a 5-0 victory over Texas to clinch the A's second consecutive AL West Championship...in **1997** Jason Giambi breaks his own club record with his 41st double of the season in the A's 9-3 loss at Seattle...in **1998**, one year after Jason Giambi breaks the Oakland record for doubles in a season, Ben Grieve ties the mark with his 41st double in the A's 4-2 loss to Anaheim.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Mengden (2-8, 5.74 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 2-8 with a 5.74 ERA in 13 starts over two stints with the A's...his .200 winning percentage is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors among pitchers with 10 or more decisions... it is tied for sixth lowest in Oakland history...with a loss today, he would have the sixth worst mark in Oakland history...is tied for fifth among AL rookies in games started...was selected from Nashville June 11 and made his Major League debut that day at Cincinnati after just 43 minor league appearances, including 34 starts, in three professional seasons...went 1-5 with a 5.73 ERA in nine starts before he was optioned to Nashville July 26...returned to Oakland September 3 and is 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA (13 er in 20.1 ip) in four starts since his return...had not pitched above Single-A prior to this year.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-1 with a 4.25 ERA (14 er in 29.2 ip) and .232 (26-for-112) opponents batting average in five starts on the road compared to 0-7 with a 6.86 ERA (30 er in 39.1 ip) and .293 (48-for-164) opponents average in eight starts at home...is just the third Athletics pitcher since at least 1912 to go 0-7 or worse at home...joins Tom Sheehan (0-7 in 1916) and Rip Coleman (0-7 in 1959)...his seven-game career-opening home losing streak is tied for second longest by an Athletic since 1913 with Wally Burnette (July 24-Sept. 9, 1956)...the longest is 11 by Bobby Hasty (Sept. 11, 1919-Aug. 11, 1921)...is tied for fifth in the AL in home losses...his 6.86 home ERA was third highest in Oakland history among pitchers with 30 or more innings at home and was the highest since Mark Redman had a 7.46 ERA in 2004.

STRIKEOUTS: Has 70 strikeouts in 69.0 innings over the first 13 starts of his career (9.13 per nine innings)...ranks 10th among AL rookies in strikeouts...since 1913, his 70 strikeouts are fifth most by an A's pitcher over the first 13 games of his career.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-2 with a 6.94 ERA (27 er in 35.0 ip) in seven starts at night compared to 0-6 with a 4.50 ERA (17 er in 34.0 ip) in five starts during the day...the six day losses are tied for fourth in the American League...his 0-6 record during the day is the worst in Oakland history among pitchers with at least five decisions during the day...the last A's pitcher to go 0-6 or worse during the day is Diego Segui, who went 0-9 for the Kansas City A's in 1965.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE ALL-STAR BREAK: Is 1-4 with a 7.02 ERA (26 er in 33.1 ip) in seven starts since the All-Star Break compared to 1-4 with a 4.54 ERA in six starts before the break...his post-break ERA is fourth highest in the American League among pitchers with 30 or more innings.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 2.42 ERA (7 er in 26.0 ip) and .211 (20-for-95) opponents batting average in innings one and two and an 7.74 ERA (37 er in 43.0 ip) and .298 (54-for-181) opponents average from the third inning on.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received 22 runs of support in his two wins (14.2 ip, 13.50 RSA) and just 18 runs of support in his other 11 starts (54.1 ip, 2.98 RSA).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .202 (22-for-109) opponents batting average and has surrendered one home run the first time through the lineup... has a .311 (52-for-167) average and seven home runs allowed after that... the opponents number five hitter is 4-for-33 (.121)...however, the seven through nine hitters are batting a combined .338 (27-for-80)...has yielded a .207 (6-for-29) batting average with runners in scoring position and two outs.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: He was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, a 2-1 A's loss at Cincinnati **June 11**...became the 46th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut and the first of those to take the loss since Brett Anderson on April 10, 2009 against Seattle...at the age of 23 years, 113 days, he became the youngest A's pitcher to start a game since Trevor Cahill on June 19, 2011 (23 years, 110 days)...struck out the first batter he faced (Cozart)...struck out a career high nine batters and tossed a career-high 108 pitches but fell to 0-3 in a 4-2 loss to Milwaukee **June 22**...joined Brad Rigby (1997) and Mike Morgan (1978) as the only three pitchers in Oakland history to lose each of the first three games of their career...is just the fourth Major League pitcher since 1913 to lose each of his first three career games while allowing three runs or fewer in each game...the others are Duane Pillette (1949 Yankees), Jim McAndrew (1968 Mets) and Kyle Drabek (2010 Blue Jays)...tossed a career-high 7.2 innings and picked up his first Major League win in his fourth start, an 8-3 victory at San Francisco **June 27**...retired each of the first 13 batters and shutout the Giants on two hits and a walk over the first seven innings...had an 8-0 lead when he

allowed his only two runs in the eighth inning...became the eighth pitcher in Oakland history to allow to allow three runs or fewer in each of his first four starts, the first since A.J. Griffin in 2012...fell to 1-4 with a loss in his fifth start on **July 3** against Pittsburgh...allowed four runs or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of his first five career starts...since 1913, the only other Major League pitcher to do that and lose at least four of those games is Tony Armas, who went 0-4 with a 2.97 ERA over his first five career starts with Montreal from Aug. 16, 1999-May 30, 2000...yielded a career-high seven runs in just 3.1 innings **July 15** against Toronto but had a no decision in a game the A's would come back to win 8-7...walked a career-high five batters in a 7-0 loss to Houston **July 20**...finished July 0-2 with a 9.00 ERA in five starts...that was the second highest July ERA in Oakland history among pitchers with 20 or more innings (Steve Karsay, 9.36 in 1997)...allowed a career-high tying seven runs on a career-high eight hits in a career-low 2.2 innings in an 11-2 loss to Boston on **Sept. 3**...snapped his career-high four-game losing streak in the A's 14-5 win at Kansas City **Sept. 15**...logged a 9.39 ERA and .328 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned seven starts from July 3 to Sept. 9.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-5 loss to Houston last Wednesday in Oakland...retired each of the first 10 batters he faced before allowing a one-out single to Gurriel in the fourth...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a run to score in the fifth on two walks, a wild pitch and a ground out...that snapped a career-high 13.0 inning scoreless streak... then allowed three runs in the sixth inning on a Correa RBI double and a Gattis two-run home run.

MINORS: Combined for a 10-2 record, a 1.46 ERA and .197 opponents batting average in 17 games, all starts, with Double-A Midland and Triple-A Nashville...tied for second in the A's farm system in wins...allowed just four home runs in 98.1 innings, an average of 0.37 per nine innings...struck out 95 and walked 29 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.28...began the season at Midland and went 2-0 with a 0.78 ERA in four starts before he was promoted to Nashville May 1...went 3-1 with a 1.39 ERA in seven starts with the Sounds before his promotion to Oakland on June 11...then went 5-1 with a 2.10 ERA in six starts following his July 26 option...was 8-2 with a 1.67 ERA in 13 starts overall at Nashville...his opponents batting average included a .190 (28-for-147) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .202 (41-for-203) against right-handers...yielded a .134 batting average with runners in scoring position...had a 1.19 ERA in the minors at the time of his first promotion to Oakland on June 11, which was sixth lowest in all of the minor leagues.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Sonny Gray (5-11, 5.74 ERA): Will be reinstated from the 15-day disabled list tomorrow...was 3-5 with a 6.19 ERA in nine starts when he was placed on the DL the first time May 22 retroactive to May 21 with a strained right trapezius...was reinstated June 5 and went 2-6 with a 5.43 ERA in 12 starts before going on the DL a second time Aug. 7 with a strained right forearm...ranks second in the American League with 15 wild pitches and his .313 winning percentage is third lowest...the wild pitches match the most by an Athletic over the last 24 years...his 5.74 ERA is fourth highest in the AL among pitchers with 100 or more innings pitched... was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-0 loss to Chicago (NL) on Aug. 6 in Oakland (5.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 so)...is 5-3 with a 3.25 ERA (83.0 ip, 66 h, 33 r, 30 er, 24 bb, 71 so, 6 hr) in 13 career appearances, including 12 starts...including 0-1 with a 3.65 ERA in two starts this year.

- The A's bullpen has a 4.88 ERA (45 er in 83.0 ip) in the month of September and a 3.99 ERA (236 er in 532.1 ip) for the season, which is sixth highest in the American League.
- Has tossed 532.1 innings, which is second most in the AL, the most by A's relievers since 2009 when they pitched 559.1 innings and sixth most in Oakland history.
- Has allowed 63-of-235 (26.8%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the AL and fifth best in the majors.
- Ranks fourth in the AL in walks per nine innings (3.11) and fifth in strikeouts (507), opponents on-base percentage (.310) and slugging percentage (.385)...is tied for third in most blown saves (21), fourth in most wild pitches (32), tied for fourth in most losses (24) and fifth in lowest save percentage (66.1%).
- First batters faced are 102-for-438 (.233) with 32 walks (.283 on-base percentage)...is tied for the fewest first batter home runs in the AL (6), ranks second in slugging percentage (.331) and fourth in batting average and on-base percentage.

- Has not allowed an earned run in 19 of his last 22 games for a 2.38 ERA (6 er in 22.2 ip) dating back to July 26...however, has a 5.11 ERA (21 er in 37.0 ip) over his last 40 games (since June 15) after logging a 2.70 ERA over his first 26 contests.
- Is tied for sixth among American League relievers in wins (6)...is tied for second in most blown saves (7) and tied for third in most walks (30).
- Has allowed 11 of his 30 runs (5.1 ip, 18.56 ERA) over innings three through six...has a 2.78 ERA (18 er in 58.1 ip) from the seventh inning on.
- Has a .316 (18-for-57) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position, including .400 (12-for-30) with RISP and two outs.
