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### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (67-90) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (71-87)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** The A's lost their 90th game of the season last night and have posted back-to-back 90-loss seasons for just the second time in Oakland history (1977-79)...went 68-94 last year...this is the first time the A's have finished with a losing record in back-to-back seasons since they had three straight from 2007-09...are in fifth place in the American League West, 3½ games behind fourth place Los Angeles...with a loss tonight, the A's would clinch a last place finish in the West for the second consecutive season...have finished last in consecutive seasons just once in Oakland history (1997-98)...are 67-90 (.449), which is the third worst record in the AL, and the 23 games under .500 is a season high...have lost seven of the last eight games after winning six of the previous seven...are a season-high tying 25½ games behind first place Texas (also Sept. 24)...have not been more than 26 games out of first place since finishing the 1979 season 34 games back of California...have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent 136 of 173 days this year in fourth or worst (66 days in fourth, 19 days tied for fourth and 51 days in fifth).

**OFFENSE:** The A's have been held to one run or fewer five times in the last seven games and are batting .190 (48-for-253) with 17 runs scored over the last eight games (2.1 runs per game)...have a .304 on-base percentage, which is currently tied for third lowest in Oakland history...have walked 429 times, which will likely be the second fewest walks in Oakland history in a non-strike season (433 in 1978, 472 in 1968)...rank last in the American League in runs (632), on-base percentage and slugging percentage (.393)...have finished last in the AL in runs four times in Oakland history (1977-79, 2008), last in on-base percentage five times (1977-79, 1994, 2008) and last in slugging percentage six times (1977-79, 1994, 2008-09)...are also last in the AL in hit by pitches (33), second in fewest strikeouts (1099), fewest extra base hits (437), fewest stolen bases (49) and fewest sacrifice hits (13) and third in lowest batting average (.246), fewest walks and fewest home runs (163)...the 13 sacrifice hits are currently the fewest in Athletics history...the record is 14 last year.

**PITCHING:** The A's compiled a 3.55 ERA over the first 27 games through May 2, a 5.09 ERA over an 82-game stretch from May 3 to Aug. 5 and have a 4.00 ERA (188 er in 423.0 ip) over the last 48 contests...have a 4.49 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have not finished in the bottom two in the AL in ERA since 1997 when they were last...have not finished the year with an ERA above 4.28 since 2000 (4.58)...have 1147 strikeouts, which is third fewest in the AL but fifth most in Athletics history (1244 in 2014, 1183 in 2013, 1179 in 2015, 1160 in 2011)...have allowed 177 home runs, which is tied for second fewest in the AL...however, it is tied for fourth most in Oakland history (205 in 1996, 197 in 1997, 179 in 1998, 177 in 1982)...surrendered their fifth grand slam of the season last night, which is tied for the AL lead...have 68 wild pitches, which is tied for third most in the AL and tied for third most in Oakland history (72 in 1979, 71 in 1989, 68 in 1998).

**STARTING PITCHING:** Daniel Mengden tossed 3.0 innings last night, which marks the 44th time this year an A's starter has tossed fewer than five innings...that is second most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 47) and the most by an A's team since 1997 (52)...it is the most by an AL team since Baltimore also had 44 in 2008 (Texas had 48 in 2007)...starters are 9-11 with a 3.68 ERA (74 er in 181.0 ip) over the last 33 games...are 42-66 with a 4.83 ERA (458 er in 853.0 ip) for the season...the wins are second fewest in the AL...have not won fewer than 47 games since 1997 when they had 29...the 853.0 innings pitched are second fewest in the AL...this will mark the third time in Oakland history the A's will finish with fewer than 900 innings pitched by their starters in a non-strike season (858.2 in 1997, 888.0 in 2009)...also rank second in the AL in most losses (66) and highest ERA (4.83)...have not finished with an ERA above 4.76 since 1999 (4.96).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed two errors in the last eight games but have 94 for the season, which is tied for third most in the American League...have not committed fewer than 97 errors in a season since 2007 (90)...are tied for fourth in the AL with 151 double plays.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-2 on their final road trip of the season, a seven-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-2) and Seattle (four games)...went 6-1 on the last road trip to Kansas City (4-0) and Texas (2-1), which tied for the seventh best road trip in Oakland history (min. six games)...are 33-43 (.434) on the road and have clinched a losing record on the road for the third consecutive season (40-41 in 2014, 34-47 in 2015) and eighth

time in the last 10 years...went 34-47 (.420) at home and have clinched the second worst home record in the American League...that matched the home record from last year for second worst in Oakland history (31-50 in 1979)...finished with a losing record at home in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1996-98 when they did it three straight years...are averaging 4.53 runs per game on the road (344 runs in 76 games) compared to 3.56 at home...have averaged a run or more per game on the road than at home three times in Oakland history (1.63 in 1973, 1.13 in 1990, 1.01 in 1994)...are batting .256 (683-for-2667) on the road compared to .236 at home...have hit 20 points higher on the road than at home four times in Oakland history (32 in 1973, 31 in 2007, 27 in 1979, 25 in 1971)...A's pitchers have allowed 95 home runs on the road, which is sixth most in Oakland history (103 in 1996, 101 in 1997, 101 in 1985, 101 in 1987, 96 in 1998).

**SCORING MARGIN:** The A's fell to 21-38 (.356) in games decided by four runs or more with the loss last night...the wins and record are the worst in the AL and third worst in the majors...are 46-52 (.469) in games decided by three runs or fewer...have lost each of their last four one-run games and six of the last seven...are 23-27 (.460) in one-run games for the season...rank fourth in the AL in one-run games (50) and losses...have a run differential of -103, which is second worst in the AL (Minnesota, -170) and seventh worst in Oakland history...it is the worst since 1997 (-182).

**ROSTER NOTES:** The A's have 34 players on the active roster (includes A. Alcantara, Triggs and Wendelken who are out for the season)...have employed an Oakland record tying 12 rookie pitchers (2009, 2012, 2015) and they have a combined 215 games pitched, which is third most in Oakland history (319 in 2012, 232 in 2009)...rookie pitchers have made 62 starts, including 16 of the last 21...have used 19 rookies overall and have had at least three rookies in the starting lineup (including the pitcher) in each of the last 25 games...started a season-high six rookies Sunday for the second time this year (Sept. 19)...have started five or more rookies 12 times this year and four or more 29 times...have used the disabled list an Oakland-record 27 times and those players have combined to miss an Oakland-record 1750 games (64.8 games per stint)...currently have 12 players on the DL, including 11 on the 60-day DL.

**A's vs. ANGELS:** The A's have lost the season series for the third consecutive season as they are 7-11 entering the final game today...are 4-5 in Anaheim and went 3-6 in Oakland...are 24-32 against the Angels over the last three years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 421-353 against the Angels...that includes 218-167 in Oakland and 203-186 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 470-430 against the Angels.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Khris Davis** is the fifth player in Oakland history and seventh in Athletics history to hit 40 home runs...is the first since Jason Giambi hit 43 in 2000...**Ryan Dull** made his 69th appearance of the season Monday, which leads American League rookies and is two short of the Oakland rookie record of 71 (Aaron Small, 1997; Ryan Cook, 2012)...**Ryon Healy** leads AL rookies in hits (77) since the All-Star Break, ranks second in doubles (18), home runs (12), RBI (34) and extra base hits (30) and tied for second in runs (32)...**Marcus Semien** has 26 home runs, which are the most among AL shortstops, tied for second most in the majors and fifth most in Athletics history.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1971** the A's win the fastest game in Oakland history 2-1 as the A's defeat the Royals in 1 hour and 35 minutes...in **1972** the A's score six times in the final three innings to defeat Minnesota 8-7 and clinch their second consecutive AL West title...in **1975** Vida Blue, Glenn Abbott, Paul Lindblad and Rollie Fingers combine to no-hit the California Angels, 5-0...Blue pitches five innings, Abbott and Lindblad one each and Fingers the final two in the first four-pitcher no-hitter in Major League history...in **1990** Dennis Eckersley breaks his own club record when he saves his 46th game of the season...he would go on to save 48 games while compiling a microscopic 0.61 ERA...in **1995** Terry Steinbach collects his 1000th career hit at California, a seventh inning single off Mark Langston...in **1996**, in his final at bat as an Athletic, Terry Steinbach hits his 35th home run of the season...it is his 34th as a catcher which breaks Carlton Fisk's American League record for home runs by a catcher.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (5-11, 5.74 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list today...is 5-11 with a 5.74 ERA in 21 starts in a season shortened by two stints on the DL...was 3-5 with a 6.19 ERA in nine starts when he was placed on the DL the first time May 22 retroactive to May 21 with a strained right trapezius...was reinstated June 5 and went 2-6 with a 5.43 ERA in 12 starts before going on the DL a second time Aug. 7 with a strained right forearm...did not have a rehab assignment following either DL stint.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Ranks second in the American League with 15 wild pitches, has the third lowest winning percentage (.313) and is tied for third in sacrifice flies allowed (7)...the winning percentage is the lowest by an A's pitcher since 2008 (Blanton, .294; Smith, .304)...the wild pitches match the most by an Athletic over the last 24 years...the last with more is Mike Moore with 22 in 1992...his 5.74 ERA is fourth highest in the AL among pitchers with 100 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, it is the highest by an A's pitcher since Omar Olivares had a 6.75 ERA in 2000.

**CAREER HIGHS:** Has career highs in losses (11) and home runs (18) and has matched his high in wild pitches (15)...his 74 earned runs are one short of his high (75 in 2014) and his 80 runs are four short (84 in 2014)...his 5.74 ERA is more than 2½ runs higher than his previous high (3.08 in 2014) and his .286 opponents batting average, .344 on-base percentage and .477 slugging percentage are also currently the highest marks of his career...is averaging a career-low 7.22 strikeouts per nine innings and has issued a career high 3.26 walks per nine innings...his five wins follow back-to-back 14 win seasons.

**THE BIG INNING:** Has allowed six runs in an inning once this year, five runs three times and four runs twice...when you combine the single biggest inning of his 21 starts, he has allowed 58 of his 80 runs for a 26.51 ERA (54 er in 18.1 ip)...has a 1.84 ERA (20 er in 97.2 ip) in all other innings.

**SPOTS IN THE ORDER:** The eight and nine hitters in the order are batting a combined .467 (42-for-90) with seven home runs and 21 RBI, while the four and five hitters are hitting a combined .214 (21-for-98) with two home runs and 13 RBI...the eight hitter is batting .468 (22-for-47) and the nine hitter is hitting .465 (20-for-43), both of which are the highest marks in the majors among pitchers with at least 100 innings...the five hitter is hitting .176 (9-for-51), which is second lowest in the American League (min. 100 ip).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has yielded a .330 (35-for-106) batting average with runners in scoring position, which is fifth highest in the American League among pitchers with 100 or more innings...has allowed a .315 (35-for-111) batting average with four doubles, a triple and seven home runs (.559 slugging percentage) to batters leading off an inning...opponents are batting .467 (28-for-60) with five doubles and five home runs (.800 slugging percentage) when putting the first pitch in play...has yielded a .233 (40-for-172) batting average the first time through the lineup and .318 (92-for-289) after that...has allowed a .283 (66-for-233) average against left-handed hitters compared to .289 (66-for-228) against right-handers...however, has surrendered 12 of his 18 home runs to righties (.531 slugging percentage by righties, .425 by lefties)...11 have been solo shots.

**BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK:** Is 2-3 with a 7.82 ERA (22 er in 25.1 ip) in five starts since the All-Star Break after going 3-8 with a 5.16 ERA in 16 starts before the break...the eight losses were two more than his combined pre-All-Star Break total from the previous two seasons (20-6, 2.42 ERA in 37 starts)...is now 23-14 with a 3.13 ERA in 54 career appearances before the All-Star Break compared to 15-17 with a 3.80 ERA (112 er in 265.0 ip) in 43 games after the break.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 3-8 with a 6.66 ERA (54 er in 73.0 ip) in 13 starts at night compared to 2-3 with a 4.19 ERA (20 er in 43.0 ip) in eight starts during the day...over the last two years, he is 7-5 with a 2.78 ERA (32 er in 103.2 ip) in 17 starts during the day, 12-13 with a 4.29 ERA (105 er in 220.1 ip) in 35 starts at night.

**DAY REST:** Is scheduled to make his first start since Aug. 6...is 2-8 with a 6.50 ERA (46 er in 63.2 ip) in 12 starts on four days rest compared to 3-3 with a 4.82 ERA (28 er in 52.1 ip) in nine starts on five days rest or more.

**INNING BY INNING:** Has a 2.79 ERA (13 er in 42.0 ip) and .195 (30-for-154) opponents batting average over the first two innings of the game compared to a 7.42 ERA (61 er in 74.0 ip) and .332 (102-for-307) opponents average from the third inning on.

**LAST START:** He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 4-0 loss to Chicago (NL) on Aug. 6 in Oakland...allowed two runs in five innings of work, both in the third inning and a two-run single by Zobrist...retired each of the final seven batters that he faced...Arrieta and Wood combined to shutout the A's on four hits and a walk.

**GRAY vs. LOS ANGELES:** Is 5-3 with a 3.25 ERA (83.0 ip, 66 h, 33 r, 30 er, 24 bb, 71 so, 6 hr) in 13 career appearances, including 12 starts... is 3-3 with a 4.05 ERA (24 er in 53.1 ip) in eight starts in Oakland and 2-0 with a 1.82 ERA (6 er in 29.2 ip) in five games at Anaheim...is 0-1 with a 3.65 ERA (12.1 ip, 12 h, 5 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 9 so, 1 hr) in two starts this year... the loss came in a 4-1 decision in Oakland on April 11...shut out the Angels on two hits and two walks over the first five innings but Tropeano
