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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (67-91) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (84-74)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's were swept in a three-game series at Los Angeles (AL) to start the trip and that clinched a last place finish in the American League West for the second consecutive season...this is just the second time in Oakland history the A's have finished last in the West in back-to-back seasons (1997-98)...are a season-high 24 games under .500 at 67-91 (.424), which is the third worst record in the AL...went 68-94 last year and have posted back-to-back 90-loss seasons for the second time in Oakland history (1977-79)...it is the first time the A's have finished with a losing record in back-to-back seasons since they had three straight from 2007-09...have now lost eight of the last nine games after winning six of the previous seven...are a season-high 26½ games behind first place Texas, which is the A's largest deficit in the West since finishing the 1979 season 34 games back of California...have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent 137 of 174 days this year in fourth or worst (66 days in fourth, 19 days tied for fourth and 52 days in fifth).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .197 (57-for-289) with 23 runs scored over the last nine games (2.5 runs per game)...have been held to one run or fewer five times over that span...have a .304 on-base percentage, which is currently tied for third lowest in Oakland history (.302 in 1979, .303 in 1978, .304 in 1968, .306 in 1972)...have walked 431 times, which will likely be the second fewest walks in Oakland history in a non-strike season (433 in 1978, 472 in 1968)...rank last in the American League in runs (638), on-base percentage and slugging percentage (.394)...have finished last in the AL in runs four times in Oakland history (1977-79, 2008), last in on-base percentage five times (1977-79, 1994, 2008) and last in slugging percentage six times (1977-79, 1994, 2008-09)...are also last in the AL in hit by pitches (33), second in lowest batting average (.246), fewest strikeouts (1109), fewest stolen bases (49) and fewest sacrifice hits (13), third in fewest walks and fewest extra base hits (443) and tied for third in fewest home runs (165)...the 13 sacrifice hits are currently the fewest in Athletics history...the record is 14 last year.

PITCHING: The A's allowed 18 runs in the three-game series at Los Angeles (AL) and 16 of those came in the fourth inning...compiled a 3.55 ERA over the first 27 games through May 2, a 5.09 ERA over an 82-game stretch from May 3 to Aug. 5 and have a 4.07 ERA (195 er in 431.0 ip) over the last 49 contests...have a 4.51 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have not finished in the bottom two in the AL in ERA since 1997 when they were last...have not finished the year with an ERA above 4.28 since 2000 (4.58)...have 1153 strikeouts, which is tied for third fewest in the AL...however, it is fifth most in Athletics history (1244 in 2014, 1183 in 2013, 1179 in 2015, 1160 in 2011)...have allowed 178 home runs, which is tied for second fewest in the AL...however, it is fourth most in Oakland history (205 in 1996, 197 in 1997, 179 in 1998)...have 68 wild pitches, which is tied for third most in the AL and tied for third most in Oakland history (72 in 1979, 71 in 1989, 68 in 1998)...have the third highest opponents batting average in the AL (.262).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 9-11 with a 3.66 ERA (74 er in 182.0 ip) over the last 34 games...are 42-66 with a 4.83 ERA (458 er in 854.0 ip) for the season...the 854.0 innings pitched are the fewest in the American League and are on pace to be second fewest in Oakland history in a non-strike season (858.2 in 1997, 888.0 in 2009)...the 42 wins are second fewest in the AL and they will be the fewest by an A's team since 1997 (29)...also rank second in the AL in most losses (66) and highest ERA (4.83)...have not finished with an ERA above 4.76 since 1999 (4.96).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 96 errors, which is tied for second most in the AL...have not committed fewer than 97 errors in a season since 2007 (90)...rank fifth in the AL with 151 double plays.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-3 on their final road trip of the season, a seven-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-3) and Seattle (four games)...went 6-1 on the last road trip to Kansas City (4-0) and Texas (2-1), which tied for the seventh best road trip in Oakland history (min. six games)...are 33-44 (.429) on the road and have clinched a losing record on the road for the third consecutive season (40-41 in 2014, 34-47 in 2015) and eighth time in the last 10 years...went 34-47 (.420) at home and have clinched the second worst home record in the American League...matched the home record from last year for second worst in Oakland history (31-50 in 1979)...finished with a losing record at home in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1996-98 when they did it three straight years...are averaging 4.55 runs per game on the road (350 runs in 77 games) compared to 3.56

at home...have averaged a run or more per game on the road than at home three times in Oakland history (1.63 in 1973, 1.13 in 1990, 1.01 in 1994)...are batting .256 (692-for-2703) on the road compared to .236 at home...have hit 20 points higher on the road than at home four times in Oakland history (32 in 1973, 31 in 2007, 27 in 1979, 25 in 1971)...A's pitchers have allowed 96 home runs on the road, which is tied for fifth most in Oakland history (103 in 1996, 101 in 1997, 101 in 1985, 101 in 1987, 96 in 1998).

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 46-53 (.465) in games decided by three runs or fewer compared to 21-38 (.356) in games decided by four runs or more...the wins and record in games decided by four runs or more are the worst in the American League and third worst in the majors...have lost each of their last four one-run games and six of the last seven...are 23-27 (.460) in one-run games for the season...rank fourth in the AL in one-run games (50) and tied for fourth losses...have a run differential of -105, which is second worst in the AL (Minnesota, -173) and seventh worst in Oakland history...it is the worst since 1997 (-182).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have 34 players on the active roster (includes A. Alcantara, Triggs and Wendelken who are out for the season)...have employed an Oakland record tying 12 rookie pitchers (2009, 2012, 2015) and they have a combined 216 games pitched, which is third most in Oakland history (319 in 2012, 232 in 2009)...rookie pitchers have made 62 starts, including 16 of the last 22...have used 19 rookies overall and have had at least three rookies in the starting lineup (including the pitcher) in each of the last 26 games...started a season-high six rookies last Sunday for the second time this year (also Sept. 19)...have started five or more rookies 12 times this year and four or more 29 times...have used the disabled list an Oakland-record 27 times and those players have combined to miss an Oakland-record 1762 games (65.3 games per stint)...currently have 12 players on the DL, including 11 on the 60-day DL.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's have lost the season series for the fourth consecutive season as they trail 5-10 entering this final four-game series...it marks the first time in Oakland history the A's have lost four straight season series to the Mariners...are 4-2 in Seattle but went 1-8 in Oakland, which matched the A's worst mark ever against the Mariners in the Coliseum (2007)...have lost 12 of the last 13 games in Oakland but have won six of the last nine in Seattle...eight of the 15 games this year have been decided by one run...are 28-44 (.389) against the Mariners over the last four years, which is the worst record by any American League team against Seattle...all-time, the A's are 332-268 against the Mariners...that includes 180-122 in Oakland, 151-145 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 75-81 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis drove in his 100th run of the season last night to become the first Athletic with 100 RBI since Frank Thomas in 2006 (114)...**Ryan Dull** has pitched in 69 games, which leads American League rookies and is two short of the Oakland rookie record of 71 (Aaron Small, 1997; Ryan Cook, 2012)...**Ryon Healy** leads AL rookies in hits (79) and doubles (20) since the All-Star Break, is tied for the lead in extra base hits (32) and ranks second in home runs (12), RBI (35) and runs (34)...**Marcus Semien** hit his 27th home run of the season last night, which is tied for the most in the majors among shortstops (Story, COL) and tied for fourth most in Athletics history...has combined with Davis for 68 home runs, which are second most by an A's duo over the last 14 years (Thomas and Swisher, 74 in 2006).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1962** Bill Fischer walks Detroit's Bubba Morton on four pitches, snapping a string of 84 1/3 consecutive innings without walking a batter...in **1983** rookie pitcher Mike Warren, who started the year in Double-A, no hits the Western Division Champion Chicago White Sox in the A's 3-0 win...in **1988** the A's defeat the Minnesota Twins 6-2 for their 102nd win of the season, breaking the Oakland record of 101 set in 1971... Oakland would go on to win 104 games and sweep the Red Sox in the ALCS before losing to Los Angeles in the World Series...in **1991** Rickey Henderson is a perfect 5 for 5 as the A's defeat Texas 19-5...Jose Canseco is 4 for 4 and Henderson, Canseco and Dave Henderson drive in four runs each...in **2001** Miguel Tejada hits for the cycle, capping the feat with a seventh inning grand slam in the A's 8-4 win at Seattle.

- The A's bullpen allowed eight runs in 7.0 innings last night after surrendering nine runs in 30.1 innings over the previous 10 contests (2.67 ERA).
- Had five strikeouts last night and now have 514 for the season, which ties the Athletics for strikeouts by the bullpen (2009).
- Has tossed 544.1 innings, which is second most in the American League and fourth most in Oakland history.
- Has allowed 67-of-239 (28.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the third best percentage in the AL.
- Are tied for third in the AL with 21 blown saves...17 of those have come against AL West competition...have converted 16-of-33 (48.5%) save opportunities against the AL West, 25-of-29 (86.2%).
- Rank fourth in the AL in fewest walks per nine innings (3.11) and wild pitches (32) and tied for fourth in losses (25)...the 32 wild pitches tie the franchise record for the bullpen (1965, 1996)
- First batters faced are 102-for-442 (.231) with 33 walks...have the second lowest first batting slugging percentage in the AL (.328) and the fourth lowest batting average and on-base percentage (.283)...are tied for the fewest home runs (6).

- Compiled a 2.70 ERA over his first 26 games, had a 9.42 ERA over an 18-game span from June 15 to July 25, and has a 2.28 ERA (6 er in 23.2 ip) in 23 games since then...has not allowed a run eight of his last nine games (1 er in 10.1 ip, 0.87 ERA).
- Is tied for seventh among American League relievers in wins (6)...is tied for second in most blown saves (7) and tied for third in most walks (30).
- Has allowed 11 of his 30 runs (5.1 ip, 18.56 ERA) over innings three through six...has a 2.73 ERA (18 er in 59.1 ip) from the seventh inning on.
- Has a .305 (18-for-59) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position, including .387 (12-for-31) with RISP and two outs.
- Has a win, a loss and a blown save in six games against Seattle (5.2 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 2 so).

Last Year: Was 4-5 with a 4.20 ERA and a team-leading 25 saves in 60 relief appearances with Colorado...had a 2.70 ERA and .216 opponents average on the road, a 5.59 ERA and .298 opponents average at Coors Field.

- Has a 1.59 ERA (1 er in 5.2 ip) over his last six games...however, has a 6.75 ERA (14 er in 18.2 ip) over his last 15 games (since Aug. 11) after logging a 3.33 ERA over his first 18 contests.
- Has a 2.33 ERA (5 er in 19.1 ip) in 14 games on the road, a 6.49 ERA in 19 games at home.
- Has a .220 (36-for-164) opponents batting average, but opponents are hitting .333 (13-for-39) with runners in scoring position.
- Has faced the Mariners three times this year (6.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 8 so, 5.68 ERA).
- Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville July 19 for his fifth stint with the A's this year and has a 4.88 ERA (15 er in 27.2 ip) in 20 games since then.
- Was with Oakland for the first time for a one-day stint on May 10...pitched twice during his second stint from May 22-25...logged a 4.50 ERA in seven outings during his third stint from June 4-21...appeared in three games during his fourth stint from June 30-July 3.
- Had no decisions and a 1.08 ERA in 20 relief appearances for Nashville...his opponents had a .200 batting average and he did not allow a home run in 25.0 innings.

Last Year: Had no decisions and a 5.63 ERA in 14 relief appearances with the Dodgers and A's...spent the balance of the season at Triple-A Oklahoma City in the Dodgers farm system where he went 3-1 with a save and a 3.27 ERA in 38 games.

- Allowed eight runs in 2.2 innings last night at Los Angeles, which match the most runs allowed by an A's reliever over the 41 years (seventh time, last: Dan Otero, Aug. 16, 2015 vs. Baltimore).
- Is now 1-4 with a 7.50 ERA (30 er in 36.0 ip) over his last eight games, including six starts, after tossing 8.0 shutout innings for the win in his A's debut on Aug. 10.
- Is 2-3 with a 4.70 ERA (20 er in 38.1 ip) in his seven starts compared to 0-1 with an 11.32 ERA (14 er in 10.1 ip) in nine relief appearances.
- Has faced the Mariners twice this year, both in relief (1.1 ip, 1 bb)...is 0-1 with a 7.00 ERA (7 er in 9.0 ip) in four career appearances against the Mariners, including two starts.

- Was selected from Triple-A Nashville Aug. 10 and is 2-4 with a 6.34 ERA (31 er in 44.0 ip) in nine games, including seven starts, since then.
- Was traded to the A's organization in a minor league deal with Cleveland for cash considerations on July 17 and reported to Nashville.
- Combined for a 6-4 record and a 4.40 ERA in 16 games, including 15 starts, between Triple-A Columbus and Nashville...issued 21 walks in 62.2 innings with Columbus (3.02 per nine innings) but then walked just four batters in 23.1 innings with the Sounds (1.54 per nine innings).

Last Year: Split the 2015 season with Texas and Atlanta after spending the first seven seasons of his career with Washington (2007, 09-14)...combined for a 1-5 record and a 7.25 ERA in 41 games, including seven starts.

- Was reinstated from the disabled list Sept. 2 and has a 1.42 ERA (1 er in 6.1 ip) in seven games since his return.
- Has a .218 opponents batting average...that includes a .175 (10-for-57) average against left-handed hitters, .250 (19-for-76) against right-handers.
- Has a 1.10 ERA (2 er in 16.1 ip) in 19 games on the road, a 3.92 ERA (9 er in 20.2 ip) in 23 games at home.
- Has a win and a save in seven games against Seattle (6.1 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 7 so, 2.84 ERA)...has a 1.95 ERA (8 er in 37.0 ip) in 35 career appearances against the Mariners, including 0.51 (1 er in 17.2 ip) in 16 games at Safeco Field.
- First batters faced are batting .316 (12-for-38), which is third highest in the American League...has the fifth highest slugging percentage (.579).
- His five home runs allowed match his career-high (also in 2014).
- Logged a 6.75 ERA over his first six games, a 1.33 ERA over a 24-game stretch from April 16-June 12 and a 5.40 ERA over his last five contests before he was placed on the DL.
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 30 retroactive to June 26 with a strained left shoulder and missed 59 games.

Last Year: Missed 121 games due to two stints on the disabled list (strained left rotator cuff, strained left shoulder)...went 1-0 with four saves, a blown save and a 3.95 ERA in 12 relief appearances with the A's.

66 RHP RYAN DULL

- Has a 2.00 ERA (2 er in 9.0 ip) in nine games in September after logging a 4.22 ERA in 12 games in August.
- Has allowed 7 of his last 16 (43.8%) inherited runners to score after stranding each of his first 36 inherited runners, which was the longest streak by any pitcher in the expansion era.
- Has allowed 7-of-52 (13.5%) inherited runners to score for the season, which is the best percentage by an Oakland rookie (since 1974) and the third best percentage in the American League...the inherited runners rank second in the AL.
- Leads AL rookies, ranks third among rookies in Oakland history and tied for eighth among all AL pitchers in games pitched (69).
- Ranks second among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.219), sixth in innings (73.1) and opponents batting average (.182), eighth in strikeouts to walk ratio (5.54) and ninth in fewest walks per nine innings (1.60).
- First batters faced are 8-for-65 (.123) with two walks (.145 on-base percentage)...ranks second in the AL in first batter on-base percentage, third in batting average and sixth in slugging percentage (.215).
- Opponents are 5-for-68 (.074) with runners in scoring position, including 3-for-39 (.077) with RISP and two outs.
- Has faced the Mariners six times (5.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 5 so, 3.60 ERA).

Last Year: Was named the A's Organizational Pitcher of the Year after going 3-2 with 12 saves and a 0.74 ERA in 47 games with Midland and Nashville...made his ML debut in September and went 1-2 with a save and a 4.24 ERA in 13 games.

Saves/Opportunities: 0-1
Inherited Runners/Scored: 32/5
First Hitters: 12-49, bb

- Had his seven-game, 7.0-inning scoreless streak snapped in his last appearance on Saturday...however, has not allowed an earned run in 17 of his last 20 games for a 2.11 ERA (5 er in 21.1 ip) dating back to Aug. 7.
- Has allowed 5-of-32 (15.6%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth best percentage in the American League.
- Opponents are batting .273...that includes .232 (22-for-95) against left-handed hitters, .300 (45-for-150) against right-handers.
- Has not allowed a run in four games against Seattle this year (4.2 ip, 3 h, 6 so)...has an 8.2 inning scoreless streak against the Mariners and has not allowed a run against Seattle since Aug. 27, 2012 when he tossed his only career complete game, a 1-0 loss at Minnesota.
- Has a 1.66 ERA (7 er in 38.0 ip) in 29 games at night, a 7.23 ERA (19 er in 23.2 ip) in 21 games during the day.
- Has a 2.18 ERA (11 er in 45.1 ip) in 39 games since he was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list June 19...logged an 8.27 ERA in 11 games before he was placed on the DL with a strained right triceps.
- His 66 strikeouts are five short of his career-high of 71 from last year.

Last Year: Pitched exclusively in relief for the first time in his career and was 5-0 with a 2.92 ERA in 58 games with Toronto...had career highs in games and strikeouts (71) and career lows in ERA and opponents batting average (.240).

44 RHP RYAN MADSON

- Has allowed six runs over his last four games (4.0 ip, 13.50 ERA) to snap his 12-game, 13.2-inning scoreless streak.
- Has 30 saves, which is two short of his career high of 32 in 2011...the saves are the most by an A's pitcher since 2013 (Balfour, 38) and tied for seventh in the American League...however, is tied for second in most blown saves (7) and has the third lowest save percentage (81.1%).
- Is tied for 10th among AL relievers in opponents grounded into double plays (8)...is tied for third in losses (7).
- Has a 6.00 ERA (20 er in 30.0 ip) in 30 games against AL West teams, a 1.42 ERA (5 er in 31.2 ip) in 31 games against all other opponents...has all seven of his blown saves against AL West competition (Texas 3, Houston 2, Los Angeles 1, Seattle 1).
- Has two losses, two saves and a blown save in seven games against Seattle (6.2 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 4 so, 4.05 ERA).
- Has a 2.81 ERA (15 er in 48.0 ip) in 46 games with one days rest or more, a 6.59 ERA (10 er in 13.2 ip) in 15 games with no rest.
- Has a 1.57 ERA (4 er in 23.0 ip) in 23 games during the day and 2.41 ERA (9 er in 33.2 ip) in 33 games at home.

Last Year: Returned to the majors for the first time since 2011 and was 1-2 with three saves and a career-low 2.13 ERA in 68 appearances with Kansas City...also had career lows in opponents batting (.205) and on-base percentage (.254).

58 RHP ZACH NEAL

- Has not allowed a run in five of his last six games for a 1.80 ERA (2 er in 10.0 ip).
- Has issued just six walks in 65.0 innings, an average of 0.83 walks per nine innings...that is the second lowest mark in the majors among pitchers with 40 or more innings pitched (Kershaw, LAD 0.63)...has struck out just 24, an average of 3.32 per nine innings, which is the lowest in the majors using the 40.0 innings minimum.

- Also leads ML shortstops in double plays (109), total chances (719), put-outs (228) and assists (470)...the 109 double plays are fourth most in Oakland history by a shortstop (Bordick 121 in 1996, Tejada 115 in 2000, Tejada 110 in 1999).
- Has career highs in runs (69), doubles (24), home runs (27), RBI (73), walks (50) and strikeouts (135) and has matched his high in games (155)...his 551 at bats are five short of his best (556 in 2015)...his .232 batting average is currently a career-low but his .430 slugging percentage is a career-high.
- Leads the A's with 50 walks...the fewest walks by a team-leader in Oakland history is 53 by Mitchell Page in 1978.
- Has started games at every spot in the order this year except clean-up.
- Was placed on the paternity list August 24 and missed three games for the birth of his son, Isaiah...those are the only three games he has missed.
