#### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (67-91) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (84-74)

THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 29, 2016 — SAFECO FIELD — 7:10 P.M. PDT RHP KENDALL GRAVEMAN (10-11, 4.19) VS. LHP ARIEL MIRANDA (5-2, 4.10) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's were swept in a three-game series at Los Angeles (AL) to start the trip and that clinched a last place finish in the American League West for the second consecutive season...this is just the second time in Oakland history the A's have finished last in the West in back-to-back seasons (1997-98)...are a season-high 24 games under .500 at 67-91 (.424), which is the third worst record in the AL...went 68-94 last year and have posted back-to-back 90-loss seasons for the second time in Oakland history (1977-79)...it is the first time the A's have finished with a losing record in back-to-back seasons since they had three straight from 2007-09...have now lost eight of the last nine games after winning six of the previous seven...are a season-high 26½ games behind first place Texas, which is the A's largest deficit in the West since finishing the 1979 season 34 games back of California...have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent 137 of 174 days this year in fourth or worst (66 days in fourth, 19 days tied for fourth and 52 days in fifth).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .197 (57-for-289) with 23 runs scored over the last nine games (2.5 runs per game)...have been held to one run or fewer five times over that span...have a .304 on-base percentage, which is currently tied for third lowest in Oakland history (.302 in 1979, .303 in 1978, .304 in 1968, .306 in 1972)...have walked 431 times, which will likely be the second fewest walks in Oakland history in a non-strike season (433 in 1978, 472 in 1968)...rank last in the American League in runs (638), on-base percentage and slugging percentage (.394)...have finished last in the AL in runs four times in Oakland history (1977-79, 2008), last in on-base percentage five times (1977-79, 1994, 2008) and last in slugging percentage six times (1977-79, 1994, 2008-09)...are also last in the AL in hit by pitches (33), second in lowest batting average (.246), fewest strikeouts (1109), fewest stolen bases (49) and fewest sacrifice hits (13), third in fewest walks and fewest extra base hits (443) and tied for third in fewest home runs (165)...the 13 sacrifice hits are currently the fewest in Athletics history...the record is 14 last year.

PITCHING: The A's allowed 18 runs in the three-game series at Los Angeles (AL) and 16 of those came in the fourth inning...compiled a 3.55 ERA over the first 27 games through May 2, a 5.09 ERA over an 82-game stretch from May 3 to Aug. 5 and have a 4.07 ERA (195 er in 431.0 ip) over the last 49 contests...have a 4.51 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have not finished in the bottom two in the AL in ERA since 1997 when they were last...have not finished the year with an ERA above 4.28 since 2000 (4.58)...have 1153 strikeouts, which is tied for third fewest in the AL...however, it is fifth most in Athletics history (1244 in 2014, 1183 in 2013, 1179 in 2015, 1160 in 2011)...have allowed 178 home runs, which is tied for second fewest in the AL...however, it is fourth most in Oakland history (205 in 1996, 197 in 1997, 179 in 1998)... have 68 wild pitches, which is tied for third most in the AL and tied for third most in Oakland history (72 in 1979, 71 in 1989, 68 in 1998) ...have the third highest opponents batting average in the AL (.262).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 9-11 with a 3.66 ERA (74 er in 182.0 ip) over the last 34 games...are 42-66 with a 4.83 ERA (458 er in 854.0 ip) for the season...the 854.0 innings pitched are the fewest in the American League and are on pace to be second fewest in Oakland history in a non-strike season (858.2 in 1997, 888.0 in 2009)...the 42 wins are second fewest in the AL and they will be the fewest by an A's team since 1997 (29)...also rank second in the AL in most losses (66) and highest ERA (4.83)...have not finished with an ERA above 4.76 since 1999 (4.96).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 96 errors, which is tied for second most in the AL...have not committed fewer than 97 errors in a season since 2007 (90)...rank fifth in the AL with 151 double plays.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-3 on their final road trip of the season, a seven-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-3) and Seattle (four games)...went 6-1 on the last road trip to Kansas City (4-0) and Texas (2-1), which tied for the seventh best road trip in Oakland history (min. six games)...are 33-44 (.429) on the road and have clinched a losing record on the road for the third consecutive season (40-41 in 2014, 34-47 in 2015) and eighth time in the last 10 years...went 34-47 (.420) at home and have clinched the second worst home record in the American League...matched the home record from last year for second worst in Oakland history (31-50 in 1979)... finished with a losing record at home in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1996-98 when they did it three straight years...are averaging 4.55 runs per game on the road (350 runs in 77 games) compared to 3.56

at home...have averaged a run or more per game on the road than at home three times in Oakland history (1.63 in 1973, 1.13 in 1990, 1.01 in 1994)... are batting .256 (692-for-2703) on the road compared to .236 at home... have hit 20 points higher on the road than at home four times in Oakland history (32 in 1973, 31 in 2007, 27 in 1979, 25 in 1971)...A's pitchers have allowed 96 home runs on the road, which is tied for fifth most in Oakland history (103 in 1996, 101 in 1997, 101 in 1985, 101 in 1987, 96 in 1998).

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 46-53 (.465) in games decided by three runs or fewer compared to 21-38 (.356) in games decided by four runs or more...the wins and record in games decided by four runs or more are the worst in the American League and third worst in the majors...have lost each of their last four one-run games and six of the last seven...are 23-27 (.460) in one-run games for the season...rank fourth in the AL in one-run games (50) and tied for fourth losses...have a run differential of -105, which is second worst in the AL (Minnesota, -173) and seventh worst in Oakland history...it is the worst since 1997 (-182).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have 34 players on the active roster (includes A. Alcantara, Triggs and Wendelken who are out for the season)...have employed an Oakland record tying 12 rookie pitchers (2009, 2012, 2015) and they have a combined 216 games pitched, which is third most in Oakland history (319 in 2012, 232 in 2009)...rookie pitchers have made 62 starts, including 16 of the last 22...have used 19 rookies overall and have had at least three rookies in the starting lineup (including the pitcher) in each of the last 26 games...started a season-high six rookies last Sunday for the second time this year (also Sept. 19)...have started five or more rookies 12 times this year and four or more 29 times...have used the disabled list an Oakland-record 27 times and those players have combined to miss an Oakland-record 1762 games (65.3 games per stint)...currently have 12 players on the DL, including 11 on the 60-day DL.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's have lost the season series for the fourth consecutive season as they trail 5-10 entering this final four-game series... it marks the first time in Oakland history the A's have lost four straight season series to the Mariners...are 4-2 in Seattle but went 1-8 in Oakland, which matched the A's worst mark ever against the Mariners in the Coliseum (2007)...have lost 12 of the last 13 games in Oakland but have won six of the last nine in Seattle...eight of the 15 games this year have been decided by one run...are 28-44 (.389) against the Mariners over the last four years, which is the worst record by any American League team against Seattle...all-time, the A's are 332-268 against the Mariners...that includes 180-122 in Oakland, 151-145 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 75-81 at Safeco Field.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis drove in his 100th run of the season last night to become the first Athletic with 100 RBI since Frank Thomas in 2006 (114)...Ryan Dull has pitched in 69 games, which leads American League rookies and is two short of the Oakland rookie record of 71 (Aaron Small, 1997; Ryan Cook, 2012)...Ryon Healy leads AL rookies in hits (79) and doubles (20) since the All-Star Break, is tied for the lead in extra base hits (32) and ranks second in home runs (12), RBI (35) and runs (34)...Marcus Semien hit his 27th home run of the season last night, which is tied for the most in the majors among shortstops (Story, COL) and tied for fourth most in Athletics history...has combined with Davis for 68 home runs, which are second most by an A's duo over the last 14 years (Thomas and Swisher, 74 in 2006).

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1962 Bill Fischer walks Detroit's Bubba Morton on four pitches, snapping a string of 84 1/3 consecutive innings without walking a batter...in 1983 rookie pitcher Mike Warren, who started the year in Double-A, no hits the Western Division Champion Chicago White Sox in the A's 3-0 win...in 1988 the A's defeat the Minnesota Twins 6-2 for their 102<sup>nd</sup> win of the season, breaking the Oakland record of 101 set in 1971... Oakland would go on to win 104 games and sweep the Red Sox in the ALCS before losing to Los Angeles in the World Series...in 1991 Rickey Henderson is a perfect 5 for 5 as the A's defeat Texas 19-5...Jose Canseco is 4 for 4 and Henderson, Canseco and Dave Henderson drive in four runs each...in 2001 Miguel Tejada hits for the cycle, capping the feat with a seventh inning grand slam in the A's 8-4 win at Seattle.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (10-11, 4.19 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Went 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts, 9-2 with a 3.33 ERA over his next 16 starts from May 30 to Aug. 24, and is 0-3 with a 5.28 ERA (18 er in 30.2 ip) over his last five starts...is leading A's pitchers in wins (10), losses (tie, 11), games started (30), innings pitched (180.1), hits (189), runs (86), earned runs (84), home runs (22) and walks (46)...all those marks are career highs as are his 102 strikeouts... the walks will be the fewest in Athletics history by an A's team-leader, besting the previous low of 59 by Sonny Gray last year.

**STRIKEOUTS AND WALKS:** Has struck out just 102 batters in 180.1 innings, an average of 5.09 per nine innings...that is the second lowest mark in the American League (Perez, TEX 4.65) and is the lowest mark by an A's pitcher since Trevor Cahill in 2009 (4.53)...has walked one batter or fewer in 17 of his 30 starts and has issued 46 free passes for the season, an average of 2.30 per nine innings...has issued 35 of his 46 walks to left-handed hitters.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Is tied for second in the American League in shutouts (1), tied for fifth in complete games (2), ranks sixth in fewest pitches per game (90.8), tied for sixth in opponents reaching on an error (8), and 10th in hits (189).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** Ranks fourth among American League pitchers in total chances (41) and tied for seventh in putouts (14) and assists (27)... has not committed an error and his 41 total chances are the most in the American League and third most in the majors among pitchers with no errors...has a 48-game errorless streak dating back to his last miscue on April 20, 2015 at Los Angeles (AL).

**SUPPORT:** The A's were shutout in his last start, the third time in his last four starts he has received no run support...has received two runs of support or fewer in 11 of his starts this year and is 0-8 in those games...is 10-3 in 19 starts with support of three or more...is now 1-17 in 24 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 15-3 in 27 starts with three runs of support or more...has left with a lead five times this year only to have the bullpen blow the save (April 12 vs. Los Angeles-AL, June 17 vs. Los Angeles, June 28 vs. San Francisco, July 29 at Cleveland, Sept. 16 at Texas).

**THE FIRST INNING:** Has a 1.80 ERA (6 er in 30.0 ip) in the first inning compared to a 4.67 ERA (78 er in 150.1 ip) after that...has the second lowest ERA in the first inning in the American League among pitchers with 25 or more innings (Tanaka NYY, 1.16)...had a streak of 18 consecutive starts without allowing a run in the first inning from May 30 to Sept. 4.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 5-6 with a 3.39 ERA (34 er in 90.1 ip) in 14 starts at home compared to 5-5 with a 5.00 ERA (50 er in 90.0 ip) in 16 starts on the road...has surrendered seven home runs in 90.1 innings at home compared to 15 in 90.0 innings on the road.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** Is 3-5 with a 5.04 ERA (47 er in 84.0 ip) in 14 starts against American League West competition compared to 7-6 with a 3.46 ERA in 16 starts against everyone else...is now 6-8 with a 4.74 ERA (66 er in 125.1 ip) in 23 career games against the AL West, 10-12 with a 3.70 ERA in 33 games against all other teams.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has a .248 (122-for-493) opponents batting average the first two times through the lineup, .324 (67-for-207) after that... his career splits are .253 (214-for-487) the first two times, .321 (105-for-327) after that...has allowed a .311 (104-for-334) batting average to the opponents one through four hits and a .232 (85-for-366) average to the five through nine hitters.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Allowed four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts, joining John Odom (1969) and Mike Norris (1980) as the only pitchers in Oakland history on an Opening Day roster to allow four hits or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of their first three starts...picked up his first win of the season and struck out a career-high eight batters April 20 at New York (AL)...it snapped a career-high six-game losing streak dating back to July 10, 2015...then lost each of his next five starts from April 25 to May 19...snapped the losing streak in a 3-2 win over Minnesota May 30...tossed 8.0 innings July 9 at Houston, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer dating back to June 18 of last year...that was the fifth longest such streak in Oakland history...fired his second career complete game in the A's 4-3 win over Tampa Bay on July 23 in Oakland...it was his first complete game win...had his career high six-game winning streak come to an end in the A's 5-3 loss at Cleveland July 29...compiled a 3.25 ERA and .264 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 10 starts from May 30 to July 23 the A's 9-0 win at Chicago (AL) Aug. 19.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss to Texas last Friday in Oakland...retired each of the first 18 batters before allowing a

leadoff single to Gomez in the seventh...Desmond followed with a single and one out later, Beltre hit a three-run home run...Hamels, Bush and Dyson combined to shut out the A's on seven hits.

ballparks...is 1-3 with a 5.65 ERA (18 er in 28.2 ip) in his five starting assignments...is 0-3 with a 7.47 ERA (21.2 ip, 36 h, 18 r, 18 er, 7 bb, 12 so, 2 hr) in four starts this year...the only pitcher in Oakland history with an ERA above 6.08 against the Mariners is Jesse Chavez, who had an 8.41 ERA last year (min. 20 ip)...his first loss came in a 4-3 decision in Oakland on May 2...had a 1-0 lead when allowed a RBI single to Lind in the fourth and two more runs in the sixth...then had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Seattle May 24...yielded a RBI double to Cano in the first and a RBI single to Cruz in the third...took the loss in a 4-3 decision in Oakland on Aug. 13...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Cruz in the fourth...allowed three more runs in the fifth...then took the loss in a 14-3 decision in Oakland Sept. 10...allowed a career-high tying eight runs on a career-high 12 hits.

# RHP Raul Alcantara (1-2, 5.75 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nash-ville September 5 and is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season and his career...is 1-1 with a 4.15 ERA over his last three starts after allowing five runs in 3.0 innings for the loss in his first start...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 5-0 A's loss to Texas last Saturday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 1 bb, 6 so)...faced the Mariners once this year, a no decision on Sept. 11 in a 3-2 A's loss in Oakland (5.2 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, so)...started the season at Double-A Midland where he went 5-6 with a 4.80 ERA in 17 starts...was moved up to Nashville July 21 and was a perfect 4-0 with a 1.18 ERA in eight starts...his ERA with the Sounds was the lowest in the Pacific Coast League from July 21 through the end of the season...combined to go 9-6 with a 3.58 ERA in 25 minor league starts overall...walked
