ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost each of the last five games, which matches the second longest losing streak of the season (7, June 3-11)...it is the A's seventh losing streak of five or more games...have now lost 10 of the last 11 games to fall a season-high 26 games under .500 at 67-93 (.419)...have clinched a last place finish in the American League West...have the third worst record in the AL and are tied for the fourth worst record in the majors...went 68-94 (.420) last year and also finished last in the West...this marks just the second time in Oakland history the A's have finished last in the West in back-to-back seasons (1997-98)...it is also just the second time they have posted back-to-back 90-loss seasons (1977-79)...it is the first time they have finished with a losing record in back-to-back seasons since they had three straight from 2007-09...are a season-high 28 games behind first place Texas in the West...have finished the season more than 26 games out of first place twice in Oakland history...were 38½ games out in 1977 and 34 back in 1979...have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent 139 of 176 days this year in fourth or worst (66 days in fourth, 19 days tied for fourth and 54 days in fifth).

OFFENSE: The A's were held to a season-low two hits for the fifth time this year last night...scored one run, marking the eighth time in the last 11 games they have tallied two runs or fewer...are batting .193 (68-for-352) with 26 runs scored over that span (2.4 runs per game)...walked five time last night to bring their season total to 436...that surpasses the Oakland record for fewest walks in a non-strike season (433 in 1978), but it will be the second lowest total in Oakland history...have a .303 on-base percentage, which is currently tied for second lowest in Oakland history (.302 in 1979, .303 in 1978, .304 in 1968, .306 in 1972)...have 13 sacrifice hits, which are currently the fewest in Athletics history...the record is 14 last year...are averaging 4.01 runs per game, which is currently seventh lowest in Oakland history...rank last in the American League in runs (641), on-base percentage (.303) and slugging percentage (.393), are second in lowest batting average (.244), fewest strikeouts (1124) and fewest stolen bases (50), third in fewest walks (436) and home runs (167) and tied for third in fewest extra base hits (449)...have finished last in the AL in runs four times in Oakland history (1977-79, 2008), last in on-base percentage five times (1977-79, 1994, 2008) and last in slugging percentage six times (1977-79, 1994, 2008-09)...have been hit by a pitch the fewest times in the majors (33) and have the second fewest sacrifice hits (13).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed at least one home run in each of the last nine games (14 home runs total) and now have 183 for the season, which will finish as the third highest total in Oakland history behind the 1996 (205) and 1997 (197) clubs...compiled a 3.55 ERA over the first 27 games through May 2, a 5.09 ERA over an 82-game stretch from May 3 to Aug. 5 and have a 4.09 ERA (203 er in 447.0 ip) over the last 51 contests...have a 4.51 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have not finished in the bottom two in the AL in ERA since 1997 when they were last...have not finished the year with an ERA above 4.28 since 2000 (4.58)...have 1166 strikeouts, which is third fewest in the AL...however, it is fourth most in Athletics history (1244 in 2014, 1183 in 2013, 1179 in 2015)...have 69 wild pitches, which is fourth most in the AL and third most in Oakland history (72 in 1979, 71 in 1989)...have the third highest opponents batting average in the AL (.263).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 9-12 with a 3.80 ERA (80 er in 189.2 ip) over the last 36 games...are 42-67 with a 4.85 ERA (464 er in 861.2 ip) for the season...the 861.2 innings pitched are the fewest in the American League, fourth fewest in the majors and will be second fewest in Oakland history in a non-strike season (858.2 in 1997)...the 42 wins are second fewest in the AL, are currently fourth fewest in a non-strike season in Oakland history, and will be the fewest since 1997 (29)...the 67 losses are second most in the AL, tied for sixth in Oakland history and will be the most since 1997 (73)...the 4.85 ERA is second highest in the AL, seventh highest in Oakland history and the highest since 1999 (4.96).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 96 errors, which is tied for second most in the AL...have not committed fewer than 97 errors in a season since 2007 (90)...rank fifth in the AL with 151 double plays.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-5 on their final road trip of the season, a seven-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-3) and Seattle (0-2)...are 33-46 (.418) on the road, which is the fourth worst record in the American

League...have clinched a losing record on the road for the third consecutive season (40-41 in 2014, 34-47 in 2015) and eighth time in the last 10 years...went 34-47 (.420) at home and have clinched the second worst home record in the AL...are batting .254 (703-for-22766) and are averaging 4.47 runs per game on the road (353 runs in 79 games) compared to .236 with 3.56 runs per game at home...A's pitchers have allowed 101 home runs on the road, which is tied for second most in Oakland history and is two short of the record of 103 set in 1996.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's lost 5-1 last night and are now 21-39 (.350) in games decided by four runs or more compared to 46-54 (.460) in games decided by three runs or fewer...the wins and record in games decided by four runs or more are the worst in the AL and third worst in the majors...have lost each of their last five one-run games and seven of the last eight...are 23-28 (.460) in one-run games for the season...are tied for third in the AL in one-run losses and rank fourth in games (51)...have a run differential of -110, which is second worst in the AL (Minnesota, -176) and seventh worst in Oakland history (sixth is -128, eighth is -74)...it is the worst since 1997 (-182).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have 34 players on the active roster (includes A. Alcantara, Triggs and Wendelken who are out for the season)...have employed an Oakland record tying 12 rookie pitchers (2009, 2012, 2015) and they have a combined 219 games pitched, which is third most in Oakland history (319 in 2012, 232 in 2009)...rookie pitchers have made 63 starts, including 17 of the last 24...have used 19 rookies overall and have had at least three rookies in the starting lineup (including the pitcher) in each of the last 28 games...started a season-high six rookies last Sunday for the second time this year (also Sept. 19)...have started five or more rookies 13 times this year and four or more 30 times...have used the disabled list an Oakland-record 27 times and those players have combined to miss an Oakland-record 1786 games (66.1 games per stint)...currently have 12 players on the DL, including 11 on the 60-day DL.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's have lost each of their last seven games, which matches their longest losing streak against Seattle (Sept. 26, 2008-May 1, 2009)...have lost the season series for the fourth consecutive season as they trail 5-12 with two games remaining...it marks the first time in Oakland history the A's have lost four straight season series to the Mariners...are 4-4 in Seattle but went 1-8 in Oakland, which matched the A's worst mark ever against the Mariners in the Coliseum (2007)...have lost 12 of the last 13 games in Oakland...nine of the 17 games this year have been decided by one run...are 28-46 (.378) against the Mariners over the last four years, which is the worst record by any American League team against Seattle...all-time, the A's are 332-270 against the Mariners...that includes 180-122 in Oakland, 151-147 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 75-83 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis drove in his 100th run of the season Wednesday night to become the first Athletic with 100 RBI since Frank Thomas in 2006 (114)...**Ryan Dull** has pitched in 69 games, which leads American League rookies and is two short of the Oakland rookie record of 71 (Aaron Small, 1997; Ryan Cook, 2012)...**Ryon Healy** leads AL rookies in hits (81), doubles (20) and extra base hits (33) since the All-Star Break and ranks second in home runs (13), RBI (36) and runs (36)...**Marcus Semien** hit his 27th home run of the season Wednesday night, which is tied for the most in the majors among shortstops (Story, COL) and tied for fourth most in Athletics history...has combined with Davis for 68 home runs, which are second most by an A's duo over the last 14 years (Thomas and Swisher, 74 in 2006).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1931** Lefty Grove defeats St. Louis 6-2 in the first game of the World Series...in **1950** Gus Zernial hits three home runs in the first game of a doubleheader against Chicago but the A's lose 4-3...he adds another home run in the nightcap, a 10-6 loss...in **1983** the A's use a club record 22 players in a 7-3 loss to Kansas City in the second game of a doubleheader...Oakland uses six pitchers including five in the ninth inning when the Royals scored four times to break a 3-3 tie...in **2000** Tim Hudson combines with Jason Istringhausen on a six-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over Texas in the final game of the season...it is Hudson's 20th win of the season and it clinches the A's 11th AL West Championship...in **2003** Ramon Hernandez has a "walk-off" bunt in the 12th inning as the A's defeat Boston 5-4 in Game 1 of the ALDS.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jhareel Cotton (2-0, 1.44 ERA)

FIVE INNINGS OR MORE, ONE EARNED RUN OR FEWER: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Sept. 7 and is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season and his career...has allowed one earned run in each of his first four starts and has tossed at least five innings in each outing...he is the first A's pitcher since the earned run became an official stat in 1913 to start his career with four consecutive games of five innings or more and one earned run or fewer...is the second Major Leaguer to do it this year (Maeda, LAD)...since 1913, only two pitchers have started their career with a five-game streak: Cliff Markle (New York Yankees, Sept. 18, 1915-April 26, 1916) and Ernie Wingard (St. Louis Browns, May 1-22, 1924).

2-0: Is 2-0 over the first four starts of his career...is the first A's pitcher to begin his career 2-0 since 2012 when Dan Straily and A.J. Griffin did it...Straily lost his third decision but Griffin would improve to 6-0 before suffering his first loss.

STARTING PITCHERS: Cotton is scheduled to make his fifth start today and all 14 of the starting pitchers the A's have employed this year have made at least five starts...the A's will become just the third team in Major League history to have 14 pitchers make at least five starts...they join the 1955 Baltimore Orioles and 1993 Cleveland Indians...Cotton is one of 14 different starting pitchers the A's have used, which is second most in the American League (Los Angeles, 15) and tied for second most in Oakland history (1977 and 2009).

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in his Major League debut, a 4-1 A's win over Los Angeles (AL) Sept. 7 in Oakland...became the 16th pitcher in Oakland history to win his debut...tossed 6.1 innings and allowed two hits to become the first Athletics pitcher with more than six innings and two hits or fewer in his debut since Porter Vaughan on June 16, 1940 (7.0 ip, 2 h)...his 6.1 innings were the most by an A's pitcher in his debut since Rich Harden tossed 7.0 innings on July 21, 2003 at Kansas City...retired the side in order in each of the first three innings to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to retire at least each of the first nine batters he faced in his career (12, Jay Marshall in 2007; 9, Billy Taylor in 1994; 9, Dave Beard in 1980)...struck out Cowart to end the second inning for his first strikeout...allowed a leadoff single to Simmons in the fourth inning for his first hit...surrendered his only run on a leadoff home run by Cron in the seventh.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win at Kansas City on Sept. 13...allowed three runs but only one was earned...is the seventh starting pitcher in Oakland history to allow one earned run or fewer in each of his first two Major League games (last: Vin Mazzaro in 2009)...allowed two unearned runs in the fourth inning when a two-out error by Marcus Semien was followed by a two-run single by Orlando...Escobar added a RBI single in the fifth and Cotton was relieved by Hendriks with two outs in the fifth and the A's trailing 3-1...Oakland scored four times in the eighth for the win.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-2 loss to Houston in Oakland on Sept. 19...retired 18 of the 20 batters he faced in his six innings of work...yielded a one-out home run to Gattis in the second inning and a two-out single to Correa in the fourth...left with a 2-1 lead but the bullpen allowed a run in the eighth for the blown save and Madson allowed two runs in the ninth for the loss.

LAST START: He improved to 2-0 in the A's 7-1 win over Texas last Sunday in Oakland...tossed a career-high 7.0 innings...the A's scored seven times in the second inning and he shutout the Rangers on two hits over the first six innings...allowed his only run in the seventh inning on a two-out solo home run by Beltre.

MINORS: Began the season at Triple-A Oklahoma City in the Los Angeles Dodgers organization and went 8-5 with a 4.90 ERA in 22 games, including 16 starts...was one of three players traded to the A's on Aug. 1 in exchange for Rich Hill and Josh Reddick...was assigned to Triple-A Nashville where he went 3-1 with a 2.82 ERA in six starts...combined with both clubs for an

11-6 record and a 4.31 ERA in 28 games, 22 starts...led the Pacific Coast League, ranked second in Triple-A and tied for 12th in all of minor league baseball with a career-high 155 strikeouts...also led the PCL in opponents batting average (.214), tied for the league lead in shutouts (2), tied for second in complete games (2) and tied for 10th in wins (11)...surrendered 20 home runs, which tied for fourth most...was 10-4 with a 3.94 ERA in his 22 starts compared to 1-2 with a 9.00 ERA in his six relief appearances.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .214 opponents batting average, including .192 (38-for-198) against left-handed hitters compared to .229 (70-for-306) against right-handers...yielded 16 of his 20 home runs to righties...13 were solo shots...allowed a .198 batting average and .239 on-base percentage to batters leading off an inning...opponents hit .310 with runners in scoring position with Oklahoma City, .208 with Nashville.

ALMOST PERFECT: Came within one out of a perfect game for Nashville on Aug. 9 in a 3-0 win at Round Rock...retired each of the first 26 batters he faced before allowing a two-out triple to Doug Bernier...then struck out Drew Robinson for his 12th strikeout of the game...it was his second complete game and shutout of the season...was named PCL Pitcher of the Week for the second time (also May 23-29).

THIS AND THAT: Was 9-4 with a 3.27 ERA in 21 games at night compared to 222 with a 7.84 ERA in seven games during the day...Oklahoma City was 7-9 in his starting assignments, Nashville was 5-1...tossed six innings or fewer in 18 of his 22 starts...walked two batters or fewer in 16 starts...had more strikeouts than innings pitched 15 times...hit .140 (3-for-20) with a run, triple, three RBI, a walk, eight strikeouts and a sacrifice hit with Oklahoma City.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed a complete game shutout in a five-inning rain-shortened 4-0 win over Memphis April 19...allowed two hits and one walk while striking out six...also picked up the win in his next start on April 24 at Iowa to improve to 2-1 with a 5.49 ERA...the pitched in relief in each of his next six appearances from April 29 to May 15 (1-2, 9.00 ERA)...returned to the starting rotation for good on May 23 at Fresno and went 3-0 with a 2.57 ERA and .144 opponents batting average over his first five starts following his return...was named Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week for the week of May 23-29 after going 1-0 with a 1.80 ERA in two starts...surrendered just four hits in 10.0 innings and struck out 15...including 10 strikeouts in the game at Fresno...picked up the win in his first start with Nashville on Aug. 4 at Colorado Springs allowing one run in 6.0 innings in a 5-4 win.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Sean Manaea (6-9, 3.89 ERA): Is 1-0 with a 0.50 ERA and .164 opponents batting average in three starts since missing 15 days from Aug. 30 to Sept. 13 with a strained left rhomboid...ranks second among American League rookies in strikeouts (119), innings pitched (138.2) and games started (23) and tied for seventh in wins (6)...the strikeouts are seventh most in Oakland history by a rookie (sixth is Straily with 124 in 2013, fifth is Hudson with 132 in 1999)...is 3-4 with a 2.64 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in 12 games since the All-Star Break after going 3-5 with a 5.24 ERA and .278 opponents average in 12 games before the break...has the fourth lowest post-break ERA in the AL...had a no decision in his last start, a 2-1 A's loss at Los Angeles (AL) on Monday (7.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...is 1-0 with a 5.73 ERA (11.0 ip, 10 h, 7 r, 7 er, 4 bb, 10 so, 2 hr) in two career starts against Seattle, both this year in Oakland.

- The A's bullpen has a 3.61 ERA (99 er in 247.0 ip) and .228 (211-for-924) opponents batting average since the All-Star Break after recording a 4.30 ERA and .258 opponents average before the break.
- The pen tossed 6.0 perfect innings of relief last night and now has 555.2 innings pitched for the season...that is second most in the American League (Minnesota, 561.0) and third most in Oakland history.
- Has allowed 67-of-243 (27.6%) inherited runners to score, which is the third best percentage in the AL.
- Are tied for third in the AL with 21 blown saves...17 of those have come against AL West competition...have converted 16-of-33 (48.5%) save opportunities against the AL West, 25-of-29 (86.2%).
