ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their five-game losing streak last night but have lost 10 of the last 12 games...are 68-93 (.422), which is the third worst record in the American League and is in a four-way tie for the fourth worst record in the majors...with a win today, the A's will tie for the seventh worst record in Oakland history...a loss would tie for fourth worst and would mark the second time in Athletics history the A's finished with identical records in consecutive seasons (77-85 in 1984 and 1985)...have clinched a last place finish in the AL West...went 68-94 (.420) last year and also finished last in the West...this marks just the second time in Oakland history the

A's have finished last in the West in back-to-back seasons (1997-98)...it is also just the second time they have posted back-to-back 90-loss seasons (1977-79)...it is the first time they have finished with a losing record in back-to-back seasons since they had three straight from 2007-09...are 27 games behind first place Texas in the West...the three largest deficits in the West in Oakland history are 38½ games in 1977, 34 in 1979 and 26 in 1993...have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...following today, the A's will have spent 141 of 178 days in fourth or worst (66 days in fourth, 19 days tied for fourth and 56 days in fifth).

OFFENSE: The A's scored nine runs on 16 hits last night after tallying 11 runs on 30 hits over the first five games of the road trip...are batting .212 (84-for-397) with 35 runs scored over the last 12 games (2.9 runs per game) and have scored two runs or fewer eight times over that span...have a .304 on-base percentage, which is currently fourth lowest in Oakland history (.302 in 1979, .303 in 1978, .304 in 1968, .306 in 1972)...have 13 sacrifice hits, which are currently the fewest in Athletics history...the record is 14 last year...are averaging 4.04 runs per game, which is currently eighth lowest in Oakland history...have walked 438 times, which will be second fewest in Oakland history in a non-strike season (433 in 1978)...rank last in the American League in runs (650), on-base percentage (.304) and slugging percentage (.395), are second in lowest batting average (.246), fewest strikeouts (1136) and fewest stolen bases (50), third in fewest walks (438), tied for third in fewest home runs (168) and fourth in fewest extra base hits (457)...have finished last in the AL in runs four times in Oakland history (1977-79, 2008), last in on-base percentage five times (1977-79, 1994, 2008) and last in slugging percentage six times (1977-79, 1994, 2008-09)...have been hit by a pitch the fewest times in the majors (33) and have the second fewest sacrifice hits (13).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed at least one home run in each of the last 10 games (16 home runs total) and now have 185 for the season, which will be the third highest total in Oakland history behind the 1996 (205) and 1997 (197) clubs...have 1178 strikeouts, which is third fewest in the American League...however, it is fourth most in Athletics history (1244 in 2014, 1183 in 2013, 1179 in 2015)...have 70 wild pitches, which is fourth most in the AL and third most in Athletics history (72 in 1979, 71 in 1989)...have a 4.52 ERA, which is second highest in the AL...have not finished in the bottom two in the AL in ERA since 1997 when they were last...have not finished the year with an ERA above 4.28 since 2000 (4.58)...have the third highest opponents batting average in the AL (.263).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 42-67 with a 4.85 ERA (467 er in 866.0 ip) for the season...the 866.0 innings pitched are the fewest in the American League to Los Angeles and Minnesota with 870.1 each...they are fourth fewest in the majors and will be second fewest in Oakland history in a non-strike season (858.2 in 1997)...starters have tossed fewer than five innings 47 times, which is tied with Pittsburgh for the most in the majors and is second most by an A's team over the last 31 years (52 in 1997)...it is the most by an AL team since Texas had 48 in 2007...the 42 wins are second fewest in the AL, fourth fewest in a non-strike season in Oakland history (a win today will make it tied for fourth), and will be the fewest since 1997 (29)...the 67 losses are second most in the AL, tied for sixth in Oakland history (a loss today will make it alone in sixth), and will be the most since 1997 (73)...the 4.85 ERA is second highest in the AL, seventh highest in Oakland history and the highest since 1999 (4.96).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 97 errors, which is tied for second most in the American League...it matches the 2013 club for the fewest over the last nine years...rank fifth in the AL with 151 double plays.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-5 on their final road trip of the season to Los Angeles-AL (0-3) and Seattle (1-2)...are 34-46 (.425) on the road

compared to 34-47 (.420) at home...with a win today, the A's will finish with a better record on the road than at home for just the fourth time in Oakland history (1971, 1990, 1994)...with a loss today, the A's will post identical records at home and on the road for the second consecutive season and third time in Athletics history (1947)...are batting .256 (719-for-2811) on the road compared to .236 at home...have hit 20 points higher on the road than at home four times in Oakland history (32 in 1973, 31 in 2007, 27 in 1979, 25 in 1971)...are averaging 4.53 runs per game on the road (362 runs in 80 games) compared to 3.56 at home...need to score seven runs today to mark the fourth time in Oakland history the A's averaged one or more runs per game on the road than at home (1.63 in 1973, 1.13 in 1990, 1.01 in 1994)...A's pitchers have allowed 103 home runs on the road, which ties the Athletics franchise record set in 1996.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's snapped a five-game losing streak in one-run games last night and are 24-28 (.462) for the season...are tied for third in the American League in one-run games (52) and rank fourth in losses...are 47-54 (.465) in games decided by three runs or fewer compared to 21-39 (.350) in games decided by four runs or more...the wins and record in games decided by four runs or more are the worst in the AL and third worst in the majors...have a run differential of -109, which is second worst in the AL (Minnesota, -170) and seventh worst in Oakland history (sixth is -128, eighth is -74)...it is the worst since 1997 (-182).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have employed an Oakland record tying 12 rookie pitchers (2009, 2012, 2015) and they have a combined 221 games pitched, which will be third most in Oakland history (319 in 2012, 232 in 2009)...Sean Manaea will make the 65th start by an A's rookie, which is sixth most in Oakland history...have used 19 rookies overall and have had at least three rookies in the starting lineup (including the pitcher) in each of the last 29 games...started a season-high six rookies a week ago today for the second time this year (also Sept. 19)...have started five or more rookies 14 times and four or more 31 times...have used the disabled list an Oakland-record 27 times and after today's game, those players will have combined to miss an Oakland-record 1810 games (67.0 games per stint)...finish the season with 12 players on the DL, including 11 on the 60-day DL.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's snapped their seven-game losing streak to Seattle last night, which matched their longest against Seattle (Sept. 26, 2008-May 1, 2009)...have lost the season series for the fourth consecutive season as they trail 6-12 entering the final game today...it marks the first time in Oakland history the A's have lost four straight season series to the Mariners...are 5-4 in Seattle but went 1-8 in Oakland, which matched the A's worst mark ever against the Mariners in the Coliseum (2007)...have lost 12 of the last 13 games in Oakland...10 of the 18 games this year have been decided by one run...are 29-46 (.387) against the Mariners over the last four years, which is the worst record by any American League team against Seattle...all-time, the A's are 333-270 against the Mariners...that includes 180-122 in Oakland, 152-147 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 76-83 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khrist Davis hit his 42nd home run of the season last night, which is tied for sixth most in Oakland history...**Ryan Dull** has pitched in 70 games, which leads American League rookies and is one short of the Oakland rookie record of 71 (Aaron Small, 1997; Ryan Cook, 2012)...**Ryon Healy** leads AL rookies in hits (82), doubles (20) and extra base hits (33) since the All-Star Break and ranks second in home runs (13), RBI (37) and runs (36)...**Marcus Semien** hit his 27th home run of the season Wednesday night, which is tied for the most in the majors among shortstops (Story, COL) and tied for fourth most in Athletics history...has combined with Davis for 69 home runs, which are second most by an A's duo over the last 15 years (Thomas and Swisher, 74 in 2006).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1925** Al Simmons goes 2-for-5 and Stan Baumgartner tosses a six-hit shutout in the A's 10-0 win over New York...the two hits bring Simmons' season total to 250 and he added three more the next day to finish the season with an Athletics record 253...in **1930** George Earnshaw tosses a six-hitter as the A's defeat St. Louis 6-1 in Game 2 of the World Series...in **2001** Miguel Tejada hits his 30th home run of the season, making the A's the first team in major league history to have both their shortstop and third baseman (Eric Chavez) hit 30 home runs.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (6-9, 3.89 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 1-0 with a 0.50 ERA (1 er in 18.0 ip) and .164 (10-for-61) opponents batting average in three starts since missing 15 days from Aug. 30 to Sept. 13 with a strained left rhomboid...was selected from Triple-A Nashville April 29 and is making his Major League debut...went 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA over his first nine starts before he was placed on the 15-day disabled June 14 with a left pronator strain...was reinstated June 29 and is 4-5 with a 2.72 ERA (27 er in 89.1 ip) in 15 games, including 14 starts since his return...has allowed one run or fewer in seven of those starts, including no runs five times.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Ranks second among American League rookies in strikeouts (119), innings pitched (138.2) and games started (23) and tied for seventh in wins (6)...the strikeouts are seventh most in Oakland history by a rookie (sixth is Straily with 124 in 2013, fifth is Hudson with 132 in 1999).

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 3-4 with a 2.64 ERA (21 er in 71.2 ip) and .219 (57-for-260) opponents batting average in 12 games since the All-Star Break after going 3-5 with a 5.24 ERA and .278 opponents average in 12 games before the break...has the fourth lowest post-break ERA in the American League.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 1.66 ERA (13 er in 70.2 ip) and .210 (53-for-252) opponents batting average over innings one through three and a 6.22 ERA (47 er in 68.0 ip) and .284 (77-for-271) opponents batting average from the fourth inning on...has allowed three runs in the first inning (23.0 ip, 1.17 ERA), all on May 10 at Boston...his first inning ERA is second lowest in the majors among pitchers with at least 20 innings (Tanaka, NYY 1.16)...using the same minimum, it is third lowest in Oakland history (Catfish Hunter, 0.66 in 1974; Ray Burris, 0.96 in 1984)...has allowed just four runs in innings one through three in 15 games since returning from the DL June 29 (2 er in 44.0 ip, 0.41 ERA) and just five runs over the first four innings of his last 11 starts (3 er in 43.1 ip, 0.62 ERA).

LEFT AND RIGHT: Left-handed hitters are 3-for-22 (.136) against him over his last nine games and they are batting .178 (16-for-90) with five extra base hits (two doubles, three home runs) overall...right-handers are batting .263 (114-for-433) with 17 of his 20 home runs and 32 of his 36 walks...based on a minimum of 130 innings pitched, his batting average against lefties is second lowest in the majors (Kershaw, LAD .138) and his .529 OPS is second lowest in the AL (Duffy, KC .449)...has a .758 OPS against righties.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-6 with a 5.20 ERA (32 er in 55.1 ip) and .278 (62-for-223) opponents batting average in nine starts on the road...started his career 0-6 on the road before picking up his first win on Sept. 14 at Kansas City...his career-opening six-game road losing streak matched the longest such streak in Oakland history (Mike Morgan, June 17, 1978-July 24, 1979)...went 5-3 with a 3.02 ERA and .227 opponents batting average in 14 games (13 starts) at home...has surrendered 11 home runs in 55.1 innings on the road (1.79 per nine innings), nine in 83.1 innings in Oakland (0.97 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .194 (18-for-93) with runners in scoring position, including .140 (6-for-43) with RISP and two outs...the mark with RISP is third lowest in the American League among pitchers with 130 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, he has the third highest opponents batting average in the AL against the opponents number four hitter (22-for-63, .349) and the seventh lowest against the number three hitter (12-for-58, .179)...opponents are 37-for-84 (.440) with eight doubles, six home runs and 21 RBI when putting the first pitch in play...has a .153 (40-for-261) opponents average with two strikes...has a .209 (42-for-201) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .242 (47-for-194) the second time and .320 (41-for-128) with 10 of his 20 home runs after that...13 of his 20 home runs have come after his 60th pitch in a game.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received one run of support or fewer in 10 of his 23 starts and is 0-6 with a 3.90 ERA (25 er in 57.2 ip) in those contests...in his four no decisions with support of one run or fewer, he has scoreless outings of 8.0, 7.0 and 6.0 and one outing where he allowed one run in 7.0 innings.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 2-1 loss at Los Angeles (AL) on Monday...did not allow a run over the first three innings to extend

and a walk over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the fifth inning...Marte had a RBI double, Cano a RBI single and Cruz a two-run home run...the A's then scored six times in the bottom of the fifth to give him an 8-4 lead but the bullpen allowed two runs in the sixth inning and three more in the seventh for the blown save (Axford)...then picked up the win in a 6-3 decision on Aug. 12...walked the leadoff batter in each of the first three innings but faced the minimum as he got a double play in each inning...did not allow a hit until Seager homered with two outs in the fifth...took a 3-1 lead in the sixth but allowed an O'Malley RBI triple and a Gutierrez sacrifice fly to tie the game...the A's scored three in the bottom of the sixth for the win.

NASHVILLE: Was 2-0 with a 1.50 ERA (18.0 ip, 16 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 21 so) in three starts with Triple-A Nashville...ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in ERA, fifth in strikeouts per nine innings (10.50) and tied for fifth in wins at the time of his April 29 promotion...allowed just one run in each of his starts...surrendered just one home run in 18.0 innings...allowed a .232 opponents batting average, including .077 (1-for-13) against left-handed hitters compared to .268 (15-for-56) against right-handers.

- The A's bullpen has a 3.67 ERA (103 er in 252.2 ip) and .230 (218-for-948) opponents batting average since the All-Star Break after recording a 4.30 ERA and .258 opponents average before the break.
- The pen has 558.1 innings pitched, which is second most in the American League (Minnesota, 563.2) and third most in Oakland history.
- Has allowed 67-of-243 (27.6%) inherited runners to score, which is the third best percentage in the AL.
- Rank third in the AL with 23 blown saves...19 of those have come against AL West competition...have converted 16-of-35 (45.7%) save opportunities against the AL West, 25-of-29 (86.2%)...are 41-for-64 (64.1%) for the season, which is the fourth worst mark in the AL.
- Rank fourth in the AL in wild pitches (33), tied for fourth in losses (26) and fifth in strikeouts (525)...the strikeouts and wild pitches are Athletics records for the bullpen (previous: 514 strikeouts in 2009, 32 wild pitches in 1965 and 1996).
- First batters faced are 104-for-450 (.231) with 34 walks...have the second lowest first batting slugging percentage in the AL (.329) and are tied with Chicago for the fewest home runs (6).
