OAKLAND ATHLETICS (0-0) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (0-0)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's open their 50th season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 4044-3763 (.518) record over the previous 49 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 117th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 8759-9235 (.487) in their previous 116 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's finished the spring with a six-game losing streak and went 16-18 (.471) overall, which was the fourth worst record in the Cactus League...went 12-17-3 (.422) last spring, which was fifth worst in the CL...this marks the first time Oakland has finished with a losing record in back-to-back springs since 2010-11...the A's compiled a 5.93 ERA, which was second highest in the majors to Cincinnati (6.13)...it was the second highest spring ERA by an Oakland team over the last 18 years (6.10 in 2016)...surrendered 37 home runs, which tied for fifth fewest in the CL...had the second fewest strikeouts (247) and tied for the fifth fewest walks (121)...the offense ranked fourth in the CL in walks (133), tied for fourth in triples (11) and fifth in on-base percentage (.351)...also tied for the fewest stolen bases (15), ranked third in fewest hit by pitches (10) and fourth in most strikeouts (300)...the strikeouts are the most by an A's team during the spring since at least 1990 (previous: 248 in 2009)...the defense committed 28 errors, which was fourth fewest in the CL...however, turned just 23 double plays, which was the fewest in the CL and tied for third fewest in the majors...went 9-7 at Hohokam, 0-1 in Oakland and 7-10 on the road

FOR OPENERS: The A's have lost 11 of their last 12 openers, which includes a Major League record 10-game Opening Day losing streak from 2005-14...their lone Opening Day win over the last 12 years came in 2015, an 8-0 win over Texas...are now 5-18 on Opening Day dating back to 1994...will open in Oakland for the fifth consecutive season and will be the home team for the eighth straight year (2012 in Tokyo)...this is the fifth time in Oakland history the A's have faced the Angels on Opening Day ...are 2-2 in the previous four meetings, including a 3-2 win in the only game in Oakland on April 6, 1982...last faced the Angels on Opening Day on April 6, 2009 at Anaheim, a 3-0 loss...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 21-28 on Opening Day, including 17-14 in Oakland, 4-11 on the road, 0-2 in Tokyo and 0-1 in Las Vegas...all-time, the Athletics are 53-63 in openers.

OPENING DAY STARTING LINEUPS: Four players return from last year's Opening Day starting lineup (K.Davis, Lowrie, Semien, Vogt)...Kendall Graveman will be the A's 11th different Opening Day starting pitcher in the last 12 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill)...Yonder Alonso will be the A's sixth different Opening Day starter at first base in the last six years.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's open the season with 13 pitchers and 12 position players...this marks the first time the A's have opened the season with more than 12 pitchers on a 25-man Opening Day roster since 1994 when they had 13 (had 14 on the 1995 Opening Day roster, which was expanded to 28 following the strike)...13 players return from last years Opening Day roster (Alonso, Axford, Canha, K. Davis, Doolittle, Dull, Graveman, Hendriks, Lowrie, Madson, Phegley, Semien, Vogt)...six other players on the roster played for the A's at some point last year (Alcantara, Cotton, Coulombe, Healy, Manaea, Triggs) and one was in the A's farm system (Montas)...five were signed as free agents (Casilla, R. Davis, Joyce, Plouffe, Rosales), which marks just the third time in the last 22 years the A's had five free agents make their Opening Day roster (also 1996 and 2011).

TENURE: Of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only two played for Oakland prior to 2014 without playing for another team (Doolittle since 2012, Vogt since 2013)...four other players played for Oakland prior to 2014 but have played for other teams in between: Santiago Casilla (2004-09), Rajai Davis (2008-10), Adam Rosales (2010-13) and Jed Lowrie (2013-14, 16)...Sean Doolittle has the longest uninterrupted tenure with

the A's organization as he was selected in the 2007 First-Year Player Draft...he is followed by Raul Alcantara, who was acquired from Boston on December 28, 2011, and Ryan Dull, who was drafted in 2012.

ROOKIE AND VETERANS: The A's have three rookies on the Opening Day roster (Alcantara, Cotton, Montas)...had one last year and five in 2015...seven players have six or more years of service: Madson (11 years, 155 days), R. Davis (9 years, 167 days), Casilla (9 years, 148 days), Lowrie (8 years, 111 days), Joyce (7 years, 123 days), Axford (6 years, 170 days) and Rosales (6 years, 163 days)...those are the most players with six or more years of service on an A's Opening Day roster since the 2007 club also had seven.

THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster is 29.24 years...that is Oakland's second oldest Opening Day roster over the last 13 years (29.28 last year)...Frankie Montas is the youngest player at the age of 24 years, 13 days...he is followed by Raul Alcantara (24 years, 120 days), Sean Manaea (25 years, 61 days), Jharel Cotton (25 years, 74 days) and Ryon Healy (25 years, 83 days)...there are 10 players that are at least 30 years old...Santiago Casilla is the oldest at 36 years, 252 days and two other players are also 36: Ryan Madson (36 years, 218 days) and Rajai Davis (36 years, 166 days).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's begin the season with five players on the disabled list for the second consecutive season (Bassitt, Gray, Mengden, Smolinski, Wendle)...the A's used the DL an Oakland record 27 times last year and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

NUMBER CHANGES: Frankie Montas will switch to number 47.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have four players under contract beyond the 2017 season...Santiago Casilla, Sean Doolittle, Matt Joyce and Ryan Madson are signed through 2018 with the A's holding club options on Doo-little for 2019 and 2020...Jed Lowrie has a club option for 2018.

RADIO: 95.7 FM The Game is in its seventh season as flagship of the A's Radio Network...due to conflicts with the Warriors and/or the Sharks, the following games will air in the Bay Area on different stations: Tuesday vs. Los Angeles (KBLX 102.9 FM), Wednesday vs. Los Angeles (KFOX 98.5 FM), Saturday at Texas (KBLX 102.9 FM) and next Wednesday, April 12 at Kansas City (KFOX 98.5 FM)...additional updates will be announced once the Warriors and Sharks playoff schedules are determined.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's lost the season series last year after going 7-12 against the Angels...were 3-6 in Oakland and 4-6 in Anaheim...have now lost each of the last three season series and are 24-33 against the Angels over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 421-354 against the Angels...that includes 218-167 in Oakland and 203-187 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 470-431 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Krhis Davis and *Marcus Semien* both hit six home runs against Los Angeles last year, matching the most by an Athletic against the Angels over the last 47 years...*Rajai Davis* is on his 10th consecutive Opening Day roster...has 199 career doubles and needs one more for 200 career...*Ryon Healy* has an eight-game hitting streak against Los Angeles (14-for-31, .452)...*Jed Lowrie* hit .314 in April last year and is a .310 (162-for-523) career hitter in the month, which is his best mark for any month...*Trevor Plouffe* is making his fifth consecutive Opening Day start at third base (previous four with Minnesota).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1984** the A's trail 5-2 entering the bottom of the ninth on Opening Night against Milwaukee but score four times to defeat the Brewers 6-5...Mike Davis starts the comeback with a leadoff home run and the other three runs score on a sacrifice fly, a fielder's choice and an error...in **2000** Jason Giambi becomes the first player in Oakland history to hit two home runs on Opening Day and the A's hit four home runs total but lose to Detroit, 7-4.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (10-11, 4.11 ERA in 2016)

FOR OPENERS: Begins his fourth season in the majors and is on his third consecutive Opening Day roster...is scheduled to make his first career Opening Day start...will be the A's 11th different Opening Day starting pitcher in the last 12 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill)...of the previous 10, only Sonny Gray has picked up a win (2015).

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-1 with a 2.29 ERA in five starts this spring...held the opposition to a .188 (13-for-69) batting average and walked just three batters in 19.2 innings (1.37 walks per nine innings)... allowed one run or fewer in four of his five starts...also started the exhibition game against Italy's World Baseball Classic team on March 8 and picked up the win (3.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 3 so)...pitched in a minor league game March 29.

GRAVEMAN vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 1-1 with a 3.38 ERA (34.2 ip, 36 h, 14 r, 13 er, 7 bb, 20 so, 4 hr) in six career starts...is 1-1 with a 4.57 ERA (11 er in 21.2 ip) in four starts in Anaheim and 0-0 with a 1.38 ERA (2 er in 13.0 ip) in two starts in Oakland...went 1-0 with a 3.80 ERA (23.2 ip, 24 h, 10 r, 10 er, 4 bb, 11 so, 3 hr) in four starts

last year...the bullpen blew the save in two of those starts...had a no decision in a 5-4 A's loss in Oakland on April 12...allowed just one run in 6.0 innings and it came in the second inning when Pujols scored when Simmons then grounded into a double play...left after six innings with a 3-1 lead and the A's increased the lead to 4-1 before Madson allowed two runs in the eighth and Doolittle surrendered two in the ninth...had another no decision in the A's 3-2 win in Oakland on June 17...allowed just one run in seven innings, a one-out solo home run by Calhoun in the third inning...left after seven innings with a 2-1 lead but Madson allowed a run in the ninth inning for the blown save...then picked up the win in a 5-4 victory at Los Angeles on June 23...shutout the Angels on three hits over the first three innings and had a 4-0 lead when he allowed two runs in the fourth on a Giavotella RBI single and a Bandy sacrifice fly...those were the only runs he would allow in 6.2 innings of work...had a no decision in the A's 8-6 loss at Los Angeles Aug. 3...Oakland scored a run in the second but he allowed a run in the bottom of the second on a Perez RBI single...the A's scored again in the third but he allowed a RBI single to Trout in the bottom of the third.. Oakland scored twice in the fourth but he allowed solo home runs to Marte and Pennington in the bottom of the fourth...allowed a RBI double to Puiols in the fifth and was relieved by Triggs, who allowed Pujols to score.

2016 RECAP: Compiled a 10-11 record and a 4.11 ERA in a team-leading 31 starts in his second season with the A's...went 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts, 9-2 with a 3.33 ERA over his next 16 starts from May 30 to Aug. 24, and 0-3 with a 4.71 ERA over his final six starts...in addition to starts, he also led the A's in wins, losses (tied), innings pitched (186.0), hits (196), runs (87), earned runs (85), home runs (22) and walks (47)...all those marks are career highs as are his 108 strikeouts...the 47 walks were the fewest in Athletics history by an A's team-leader, besting the previous low of 59 by Sonny Gray in 2015.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Averaged 5.23 strikeouts per nine innings, which was the third lowest mark in the American League...tied for second

in the AL in shutouts (1), tied for fifth in complete games (2), tied for sixth in opponents reaching on an error (8), ranked seventh in fewest pitches per game (91.4) and was ninth in hits (196).

SUPPORT: Averaged 4.16 runs of support per start, which was 10th lowest in the AL...received two runs of support or fewer in 12 of his 31 starts and was 0-8 in those games...went 10-3 in 19 starts with support of three or more...is now 1-17 in 25 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 15-3 in 27 starts with three runs of support or more...left with a lead five times in 2016 only to have the bullpen blow the save.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Had a .271 opponents batting average, which broke down to .270 (90-for-333) against right-handed hitters compared to .272 (106-for-390) with 35 of his 47 walks against left-handers...his career splits are .272 (157-for-577) with a .743 OPS against right-handers, .273 (169-for-620) with 59 of his 85 walks and a .740 OPS against left-handers...yielded a .302 average with runners on base but 14 of the 22 home runs he allowed were solo shots...24 of his 37 career home runs have come with the bases empty.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Tied for third among AL pitchers in total chances (42), tied for seventh in assists (27) and ranked eighth in putouts (15)...did not commit an error and his 42 total chances were the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors among pitchers with no errors...now has a 49-game errorless streak dating back to his last miscue on April 20, 2015 at Los Angeles (AL)

HOME AND AWAY: Went 5-6 with a 3.39 ERA in 14 starts at home compared to 5-5 with a 4.80 ERA in 17 starts on the road...had the ninth lowest home ERA in the AL...surrendered seven home runs in 90.1 innings at home, 15 in 95.2 innings on the road.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Was 3-5 with a 4.82 ERA in 15 starts against AL West competition compared to 7-6 with a 3.46 ERA in 16 starts against everyone else.

THIS AND THAT: Compiled a 1.74 ERA in the first inning, which tied Arrieta (CHC) for second lowest in the majors (Tanaka, NYY 1.16) among pitchers with 30 or more innings...using the same minimum, it was 10th lowest in Oakland history...logged a 4.59 ERA from the second inning on...his ground ball to fly ball ratio of 2.40 was fourth highest in the AL... the A's were 14-17 (.452) in his starting assignments...walked one batter or fewer in 18 of his 31 starts.

MORE 2016: Allowed four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts, joining John Odom (1969) and Mike Norris (1980) as the only pitchers in Oakland history on an Opening Day roster to allow four hits or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of their first three starts...picked up his first win of the season and struck out a career-high eight batters April 20 at New York (AL)...it snapped a career-high six-game losing streak dating back to July 10, 2015...compiled a 5.52 ERA and .276 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned nine starts...struck out in the fifth inning in his first professional at bat that day against the Yankees... went 0-for-4 with three strikeouts in 2016...lost each of his next five starts from April 25 to May 19...logged a 7.92 ERA and .361 opponents batting average during the losing streak...snapped his five-game losing streak in a 3-2 win over Minnesota May 30...that began a career-high six-game win-ning streak, which doubled his previous best (3, June 24-July 4, 2015) and matched the longest by an A's pitcher in 2016 (Hill)...compiled a 3.25 ERA and .264 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 10 starts from May 30 to July 23...tossed 8.0 innings July 9 at Houston, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer dating back to June 18, 2015...that was the fifth longest such streak in Oakland history...tossed a career-high 112 pitches in 7.0 innings in a 7-4 win over Houston July 18...fired his second career complete game in the A's 4-3 win over Tampa Bay on July 23 in Oakland...it was his first complete game win...allowed nine hits, which were the most by an A's pitcher in a complete game since Mark Redman allowed 12 on May 13, 2004 against Detroit. finished July 4-1 with a 2.68 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in five starts...the wins tied for third in the AL and were his most ever in a month...authored his third career complete game and his first shutout, a two-hitter in the A's 9-0 win at Chicago (AL) Aug. 19...tossed just 98 pitches, which were the fewest by an Athletic in a nine-inning complete game since Dana Eveland on May 21, 2008 against Tampa Bay (95)...became the ninth Oakland pitcher since 1987 to toss fewer than 100 pitches in a nine-inning shutout, the first since Rich Harden on July 14, 2005 against Texas (80)...faced just one batter over the minimum to become the 13th pitcher in Oakland history to face 28 batters or fewer in a nine inning complete game (last: Dallas Braden, May 9, 2010 vs. Tampa Bay)...had a no decision in the A's 1-0 win over Boston Sept. 4 in Oakland ... tossed 6.1 scoreless innings and a career-high tying 112 pitches.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Sean Manaea (7-9, 3.86 ERA in 2016): Is on his first Opening Day roster and is beginning his second season in the majors...went 1-1 with a 3.91 ERA in seven games, including six starts, this spring...surrendered just one home run in 23.0 innings...is 0-1 with a 3.55 ERA (12.2 ip, 10 h, 6 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 7 so, 3 hr) in two career starts against Los Angeles, both last year at Anaheim...made his Major League debut with the A's last year following an April 29 promotion and went 7-9 with a 3.86 ERA in 25 games, including 24 starts...ranked second among American League rookies in strikeouts (124), innings pitched (144.2) and games started and tied for fifth in wins...the strikeouts tied for sixth most in Oakland history by a rookie... was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 14 with a left pronator strain...was reinstated June 29 and went 5-5 with a 2.74 ERA in 16 games, 15 starts, following his return.

- The A's bullpen compiled a 3.99 ERA last year, which ranked 10th in the American League...were fifth in opponents on-base percentage (.308)
- and seventh in batting average (.245) and slugging percentage (.385).
 Converted 42-of-65 (64.6%) save opportunities...had the third most blown saves in the AL (23) and the fourth lowest save percentage...tied for 10th in saves...19 of the blown saves came against AL West competition...were successful in 17-of-36 (47.2%) save opportunities against the AL West, 25-of-29 (86.2%) against everyone else
- Had 561.1 innings pitched, which was second most in the AL (Minnesota, 567.2), second most in Oakland history (586.2 in 1997) and third most in Athletics history (588.1 in 1964)...struck out 530 batters, which was fifth most in the AL but set the Athletics record for strikeouts by the bulloen...also set a franchise record for most wild pitches (33).
