LEADING OFF: 2017 represents the Angels' 57th season in the Majors and 52nd campaign in Anaheim...Halos are 30-26 overall, 18-16 at home and 12-10 on the road alltime on Opening Day...Angels have won nine of last 13 Opening Day contests (losses in 2008 @ MIN, 2014 vs. SEA, 2015 @ SEA & 2016 vs. CHC) ... Angels have played extra innings on Opening Day four times in franchise history: 2013 at CIN (W, 3-1), 1986 at SEA (L, 4-8), 1982 at OAK (L, 2-3) & 1966 at CWS (L, 2-3)...Through 56 seasons, the Angels hold an all-time record of 4,477-4,465-3...A complete listing of the club's Opening Day results and lineups can be found on page 344 of the 2017 Angels Media Guide.

THE MANAGER: Mike Scioscia's Angels were 0-4 in his first four Opening Days (2000-03) - since then, the Angels are 9-4 (2004-16) in season openers...Scioscia enters 2017 as the longest tenured manager in the Majors (18 season) and the only active manager to collect over 1,000 victories with current club...His current .541 (1,490-1264) winning percentage and 1,490 wins are both tops in franchise history...Scioscia ranks 23rd on the all-time win list (one victory behind Clark Griffith for 22nd).

MAN ON THE MOUND: Ricky Nolasco will take the mound tonight for his fourth career Opening Day start and first as a member of the Angels...The Angels have a new Opening Day starting pitcher for a third consecutive season (Garrett Richards in 2016 & Jered Weaver in 2015)...Last time Angels had different Opening Day starter in at least three straight years was 2006-09 (Bartolo Colon, John Lackey, Jered Weaver & Joe Saunders).

**OPENING AGAINST THE A'S:** Tonight marks fifth Opening Day meeting between Angels and A's and first since 2009 (a 3-0 Angels win at Angel Stadium)...Clubs last Opening Day contest at the Coliseum came in 1982, with Oakland winning 3-2 in 11 innings after Angels reliever Don Aase yielded a walk-off walk to Davey Lopes.

VS. OAKLAND: LAA won 2016 series 12-7 and has won three consecutive season series against A's (2014-16)...Angels have homered in 15 of last 16 meetings with Oakland...Halos have won 30 of last 46 overall meetings...Last season, Mike Trout batted .418 (28/67) against Oakland, including two doubles, five home runs and 12 RBI.

WHO WILL BE MR. 1000 ?: The Angels enter 2017 having used 995 different players in franchise history...The fifth player to make their Halos debut this season will become the 1,000th different player in Club history.

START WITH A BLAST: Mike Trout owns two career Opening Day home runs (2014 & 2015, with both coming off Felix Hernandez in the 1st inning)...Joe Rudi and Tim Salmon hold Angels franchise record with three career Opening Day homers each.

VETERAN SQUAD: The Angels Opening Day roster does not feature any rookie players for the first time since 2012.

NEW HALOS: Angels Opening Day active roster features eight players new to the organization: Jesse Chavez, Danny Espinosa, Martín Maldonado, Cameron Maybin, Bud Norris, Blake Parker, Yusmeiro Petit & Ben Revere.

HOT SPRINGS: The Angels concluded Spring Training with a 20-14-1 record...Halos have posted a winning record in Spring Training for the 13<sup>th</sup> time in the last 16 years and reached the 20 Spring Training win mark for fourth time in franchise history (also, 1996, 2005 & 2009).

# MEMORABLE OPENING DAYS IN CLUB HISTORY:

April 6, 1973 - Nolan Ryan makes his first Opening Day start as an Angel, defeating Kansas City 3-2 in Anaheim with a CG and 12 strikeouts

April 6, 1977- Frank Tanana hurls a complete game shutout in Angels' 7-0 win at Seattle.

April 8, 1986 - Bobby Grich homers on the first pitch of the season at Seattle.

April 1, 2013 - In the first interleague Opening Day game in Major League history, the Angels topped the Cincinnati Reds 3-1 in 13 innings at Great American Ball Park.

NATIONAL SPOTLIGHT: Tonight's game is being broadcast nationally on ESPN2 with Karl Ravech calling the action alongside former Angels outfielder  $\ensuremath{\textbf{Raul}}$  Ibanez and  $\ensuremath{\textbf{Tim}}$ Kurkjian ... Additionally, Fox Sports West will air the game locally with Victor Rojas and Mark Gubicza in the booth beginning their eighth season as the Angels broadcast team.

LEFT FIELD TURNOVER: The 2017 season marks the sixth consecutive year that the Angels have a new Opening Day starting left fielder...The last player to start consecutive Opening Days in left for the Halos was Vernon Wells in 2011-12

ANOTHER RECORD FOR TROUT: With a start in center field tonight, Mike Trout (2013-17) will become the first player in Angels history to make five Opening Day starts in CF...Gary Pettis (1984-87), Jim Edmonds (1995-98) & Darin Erstad (2001-03, '06) each had four Opening Day starts in center.

MVP, MVP!: Mike Trout enters his sixth full Major League season in 2017...Last season, the 25-year-old hit .315 (173/549) with 32 doubles, five triples, 29 home runs, 100 RBI and a Major League leading 123 runs scored, 116 walks and .441 OBP...He earned his second career American League MVP Award, becoming the first player to win the award twice in an Angels uniform...Has finished in Top Two of MVP voting each of last five seasons, joining Barry Bonds (2000-04) as only players to accomplish the feat ... Trout also earned his fifth consecutive Silver Slugger Award and was selected to his fifth straight All-Star Game.

OPENING DAY START: Making first start of the season and fourth career Opening Day start (first Opening Day start with Angels)...Previous Opening Day starts came in 2009 & 2013 with Marlins (both vs. Washington) and most recently in 2014 with Twins (at White Sox)...In three previous Opening Day starts, is 1-2 with a 6.00 ERA (18 IP - 12 ER)...Also pitched three scoreless innings in relief for Marlins on Opening Day in 2008 vs. New York (N.L.). MAKING THE TEAM: 2017 marks 11<sup>th</sup> consecutive season making an Opening Day roster.

STILL STREAKING: Enters tonight's game with active streak of 21 consecutive innings pitched without allowing an

STRONG FINISH: In final six starts of 2016 regular season, went 4-2 with a 1.47 ERA (43 IP – 7 ER)...Did not allow an earned run in four of the six starts...His 1.47 ERA in that span (Aug. 31 – end of season) led the Majors (min. 30 IP). 2017 SPRING TRAINING: Finished the Spring with a 1-1 record and 3.52 ERA (15.1 IP – 6 ER) in four Cactus League starts...Recorded 10 strikeouts while walking three.

LAST TIME OUT: Did not factor in decision in final Spring start on March 23 at San Diego (Peoria) after tossing 6.1 innings and allowing two earned runs on five hits with one walk and four strikeouts...After allowing leadoff double to start game, retired next 12 batters faced before yielding a run in the 5<sup>th</sup> inning.

STRIKEOUTS/WALKS: Leads active pitchers (min. 1500 IP) with a 2.12 walks per 9 innings rate and ranks sixth with a 3.41 strikeout to walk ratio...Has collected 1370 strikeouts while walking 402...Among active pitchers with at least 1600 innings pitched, his 402 walks are the fewest in the Majors.

VS. OAKLAND: In seven career starts against the A's, is 3-2 with a 3.38 ERA (48 IP - 18 ER)... Was winning pitcher in final start of 2016 regular season on Sept. 27 vs. Oakland (8 IP, 5 H, 1 R, 0 ER, 2 BB, 4 SO)...Angels debut was also vs. A's on Aug. 4, 2016 at Angel Stadium

AT OAKLAND COLISEUM: In three career starts in Oakland, is 1-1 with a 2.35 ERA (23 IP - 6 ER) and 11 strikeouts...Made one start at the Coliseum last year (Sept. 6) and carried perfect game for 5.1 innings and lost shutout bid in 8<sup>tt</sup> inning...Only career win in Oakland was shutout for Florida on June 29, 2011 (9 IP, 5 H, 0 R, 2 BB, 3 SO).

**RELIABLE ARM:** His 279 starts since debut in 2006 rank 13<sup>th</sup> among all active players.

2016 REGULAR SEASON: Pitched to an 8-14 record and 4.42 ERA (197.2 IP - 97 ER) in 32 starts between Minnesota (21 GS) and Angels (11 GS)... Was 4-6 with a 3.21 ERA (73 IP – 26 ER) and 51 strikeouts after joining Angels.

CAREER NOTES: Owns a 108-103 record and 4.52 ERA (1706.2 IP - 858 ER) in 297 games (279 starts) for Marlins, Dodgers, Twins and Angels...Earned 100<sup>th</sup> career win on May 25, 2015.


